## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - The Cardinals have had some excellent QB's in the last 16 yrs including Chris Redman, Dave Ragone, Stefan LeFors and Brian Brohm, who all earned Conf Off POY honors and were drafted by the NFL. In '09 they had to replace their starter and then both of the proj'd replacements transferred after the spring (0 car att ret). Three diff QB's played and comb to hit 56% with a 9-11 ratio. 5'10" Will Stein started gms 8 and 9 and threw for 450 (55%, 0-1). In '10 Adam Froman PS#75JC), who had 7 st in '09 (1354, 60%, 6-5), took control but missed 4 gm (inj). He threw for 1,633 (61%, 11-4) while Stein was #3 hitting 9-14-72. The QB's improved their ratio to 22-7. LY only Stein ret'd but I proj'd true frosh Teddy Bridgewater (PS#7, IFS) as the st'r. Stein st'd the opener and Bridgewater came in for 1 series, threw an int and did not return. Stein threw for a career high 349 vs FIU but then inj'd his shoulder vs UK and the Bridgewater era began as he helped lead UL to their 1st win over UK in 4Y (2 td passes). Stein att only 5 passes after that. Bridgewater (2129, 64.5%, 14-12) started the final 10 setting a UL frosh passing rec (Chris Redman 1773 '96). UL finished #2 in the BE in pass eff and this year both QB's return. Bridgewater now is experienced and is one of the BE's best.

RUNNING BACKS - HC Charlie Strong would prefer to have one feature RB and in his first yr ('10), he had that in Bilal Powell. Powell (#3 rusher '09), rushed for 1,405 (6.1) finishing just shy of breaking Howard Stevens' 1971 (10 gm) mark of 1,429 despite missing nearly 2 full gms. Powell had seven 100 yd gms tying the UL record (Frank Moreau '99, Walter Peacock '73) while Jeremy Wright was #2 with 327 (5.5). Victor Anderson (PS#30) had 1,047 (5.7) in '08 but just 473 (5.3) in '09 and 286 (4.5) in '10. Anderson was the frontrunner LY and led the tm in rushing but with just 539 (4.7). They moved QB Dominique Brown (PS#64), who ran the wildcat, to RB and he finished #2 with 533 but with a pedestrian 3.8 ypc. Wright finished #3 (334, 4.6). The unit had just one 100 yd rusher (Wright, 108 vs Rut) all year with P Chris Philpott's 40 yard run on a fake punt being the longest run for the team over the first 7 games! Even with the loss of their starter, I look for improved production from the RB corps.

**RECEIVERS** - LY the Cards had to replace their top 2 rec's but they had just 470 and 440 yds. The leading returnees were Josh Bellamy (PS#57JC, 401, 13.8), Andrell Smith (377, 15.1) and TE Josh Chichester (PS#31, 317, 14.4). Despite their presence the top WR turned out to be rFr Michaelee Harris (PS#38) who tore his PCL in the winter and did not return until Aug but still led with 455 (12.3). True frosh Eli Rogers (PS#38) was a yard off the lead with 454 (11.1) while Chichester was #3 (393. 14.0). Smith had 207 (18.8) while soph Jarrett Davis (5'9" 174) had 102 (8.5). This year they lose Bellamy (5 st, 280, 11.7) and Chichester (12 st) but return their top 2 (Harris tore ACL prior

to LY's bowl, OFS) making this unit more exp'd. **OFFENSIVE LINE** - From '03-'06 the O-line paved the way for 5.7, 5.6, 4.8 and 5.0 ypc rushing. In former HC Steve Kragthorpe's 3 yrs ('07-'09) they dropped to 4.2, 4.3 and 3.5 ypc in '09 with just 125 ypg (lowest s/'02) with 37 sks (10.1%). That unit had to replace 2 st'rs (#1, #5 DC's) and in '10 they had 9 of then top 10 back (one of the 4 ret sts lost his job). The Cards improved mightily to 175 ypg rush (4.8) and all'd just 17 sks (4.7%). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm BE RG, 1st Tm BE LT (2Y st'r, #6DC) and a pair of 2Y st'rs as well as 2 bkps. The unit had just 25 car sts with 24 by C Mario Benavides who missed the first 3 gms (knee). Given that criteria, you would assume a large drop and as expected the Cards plummeted to 122 ypg rush (3.4) while they allowed 41 sks (10.8%), their most s/02. TY they lose RT Ryan Kessling (13 st) and LT Hector Hernandez (3 st) and with 74 car sts returning, this should be an improved line that is on par with the 2010's version.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - Former HC Bobby Petrino's final 3 DL's ('04-'06) allowed just 3.1, 3.0 and 3.4 ypc rush while avg 42 sks per year. In Kragthorpe's 3 yrs they yielded 4.4, 4.2 and 4.3 ypc while avg just 18 sks. They only had 1 st'r back in '09 and in '10 ret'd 2. Strong constantly referred to the DL as undersized (258 lb avg). DL coach Clint Hurtt wanted to split the snaps between the st'rs and bkps 60/40 and 3 frosh were in the 2 deep (2 true BJ Butler & Brandon Dunn comb 12 sts). Surprisingly the Cards improved to 144 ypg (4.0) with 39 sks. LY they had to replace 1 str and 2 other DL (5 st, 9 sk). While they went from 2 ret sts to 3 and gained some size. Hurtt said he had never been around a group of DL that were as beat up as they are now" in early Nov. No DL started more the 9 but the Cards still had their best mark s/'00 with 101 ypg rush (3.0, 33 sks). TY they lose DE Greg Scruggs (5 st, 19 tkl, 4 sk, #7DC SEA), Randy Salmon (6 st, 20 tkl, 5 tfl) and William Savoy (9 st, 27 tkl, 5 sk). They return 7 w/st exp and

are another yr bigger and can only remain healthier.

LINEBACKERS - In '10 the LB unit had to replace 2 st'rs (#1, #2 tkl'rs) and ret'd their #6 and #9 tkl'rs (comb 15 sts '09). HC Strong said "It's a LB friendly defense" and the new starting LB's had better PS#'s than the previous ones did. UL allowed just 19.4 ppg, their best s/'06. LY they had to replace 1 st'r (#3 tkl'r) and 2 bkps (6 st, 32 tkl). They ret'd their #4 and #6 tkl'rs and allowed 20.1 ppg. TY they lose 2nd Tm BE MLB Dexter Heyman (13 st, #1 tkl, 4.5 sk, 11.5 tfl, 3 int) and Terence Simien (10 tkl). They return their #3 and #7 tkl'rs and add in 3 VHT true frosh so even with the loss of their top guy, they look on par with LY's unit.

DEFENSIVE BACKS-The Cards had inexp'd and injury plagued secondaries and finished #113 in my PDR rankings in '07, #102 in '08 and #106 in '09. In '10 they returned 5 w/st exp but still had to replace 3 strs. The Cards avg'd just 18 sks ('07 to '09) and with a stronger front 7 (39 sks '10), UL to climbed to #41. LY they had to replace 2 st'rs (#3DC) then lost both FS Shenard Holton and CB Anthony Conner each after 6 sts. Not surprisingly the Cards dropped to #66 (60%, 20-10). TY they lose CB Conner (21 tkl, 1 int), NB Mike Evans (6 st, 51 tkl, 2 int, 3 pbu) and Holton (26 tkl). They have 6 back who st'd LY and add in VHT Gerod Holliman (PS#20). The Cards should

make a good size jump in my PDR this year.

SPECIAL TEAMS - UL finished #65, #102 and #60 in my ST rankings from '07-'09 but despite having to replace their top RM, K and P, they surprisingly moved up to #18 in '10 as Chris Philpott and Josh Bleser comb for a net of 37.1 while Philpott had 16 TB on 69 KO and hit 14-18 FG (L46). Victor Anderson and Jeremy Wright avg'd 30.4 on KR. Last year everyone but PR Doug Beaumont (15.2) ret'd but they dropped slightly to #27. Philpott tied the UL rec with a 52 ydr (bounce off upright) vs Rutgers (also 51 yd'r vs UC). The PR avg plummeted to 4.9 (#102) which doesn't even incl 2 muffed punts vs Pitt. This year they lose Philpott and Bleser but rFr K John Wallace (PS#6) hit 11-14 as a Sr in HS (misses 57 & 59) Still, after B2B solid finishes, expect a dropoff this year.

COACHES - Charlie Strong served as the Florida DC ('03-'09) under Ron Zook and Urban Meyer and as SCar's DC under Steve Spurrier and Lou Holtz. Strong led the Cardinals to their first winning season in 4 yrs while earning BE co-COY honors in his first season here. Strong replaced OC Mike Sanford in Oct LY with 1st yr QB cch Shawn Watson (Neb OC '07-'10) taking over (will continue on in that role). 3rd yr DC Vance Bedford was the DB cch at Florida ('08-'09) and for the Chi Bears ('99-'04). The Cards finally have some stability on defense as they had 4 diff DC's the 4 previous seasons.

# PHIL'S FORECAST

When former HC Howard Schnellenberger got UL's program turned around, he said the Cardinals were on a collision course for the Nat'l Championship. The '06 season was probably that year. Despite losing star RB Michael Bush to injury and QB Brohm for 2 gms, they blew a 25-7 lead vs Rutgers or they would have played in the Nat'l Title game. Then-HC Bobby Petrino left for the NFL and the next 3 yrs UL failed to have a winning record under Steve Kragthorpe, despite entering '07 ranked #10. After being picked #1 or #2 in the Big East every yr since joining in '05, they were picked 7th in '08 and after a 5-2 start, finished just 5-7, which was their first losing season s/'97 (tied last BE -6). Kragthorpe was let go after a 4-8 record in '09 (-104 ypg BE). Charlie Strong had just 12 ret sts in '10 and UL was picked last in the Big East but he guided the Cards to their first bowl in 4 yrs. They tied TCU with 27 Sr's (2nd FBS) but did play 9 true frosh. UL also added an upper deck and new suites to its stadium (cap 42,000 to 55,000). They beat SM in the bowl to finish 7-6. LY they only had 10 ret sts (fewest BE). They had 3 net close losses in '10 which gave them an 81% chance of improvement. Despite their 3-4 BE record in '10 they were +28 ypg (4th best). UL beat FCS Murray St but then allowed 74 and 83 yd td rec by T.Y. Hilton and a 71 yd IR td and despite a 24-9 FD edge, lost to FIU 24-17. They upset rival UK 24-17 and in their next gm Bridgewater got his first start but Marshall got a td with 1:49 left to beat them 17-13. They were tied with NC 0-0 at half but trailed 14-0 when they got a garbage td with :41 left to lose by 7. Their record dropped to 2-4 as they blew a 16-7 halftime lead vs Cincy. Rutgers missed 31 and 25 yd FG's in the 2Q and UL pulled the 16-14 upset at home to start their 2H turnaround (5-1). They whipped Syr 27-10 and then upset WV (key play blk FG td) despite being outgained 533-351. They had 16 Sr's in their FHG but Pitt led 21-7 when UL got a td with :12 left to "only" lose by 7. UL got a 100 yd KR td on the 1st play and a lateral for a td on the last play to win 34-20 at Conn. They trailed USF 17-3 with :35 left in the 1H but rallied for the improbable 34-24 win and actually had a shot at the BE Title if Cincy lost their finale, but UC won and UL was relegated to the Belk Bowl in NCSt's backyard. Despite a 391-329 yd edge, UL lost by 7. TY the Cards are much more exp'd (15 ret sts) and had 2 net close losses LY. They had a def ypp of 16.3 and while they were 5-2 in the BE, they were -31.0 ypg (7th best). They are the preseason favorites to win the BE led by QB Bridgewater and this is Strong's best team in his 3 years.
