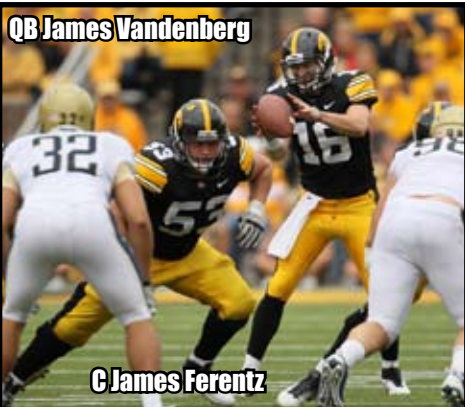


# IOWA HAWKEYES

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

**QUARTERBACKS** - In '09 ret st'r Ricky Stanzi was inconsistent throwing for 2,417 (56%, 17-15) but with 4 IR td's. Stanzi was inj'd in the 2Q vs NW in Iowa's 1st loss of the yr when bkp James Vandenberg struggled in relief. Vandenberg got his first start in Columbus with the Big Ten Title on the line. He threw for 233 yd and 2 td but also 3 int incl the gm sealer in OT. He finished with 470 (48%, 2-5). In '10 Stanzi set a sch record for pass eff (157.6), just beating out Brad Banks (157.1 '02). He threw for 3,004 (64%, 25-6) and became the first Iowa QB to win 3 bowls. Stanzi was the first UI QB selected in the NFL draft (#5DC) s/92 (Matt Rodgers). Vandenberg played in 3 (8 att) in '10 but entered LY as the clear-cut starter and became just the 4th UI QB to top 3,000 (3,022, 58.7%, 25-7). His 25 td's just missed Chuck Long's sch record of 27 (1985). John Wienke (PS#26) was the bkp (0-1). Rfr Jake Rudock (PS#53) and Cody Sokol (IFS) are expected to battle for the bkp job TY and for the starting job in '13. This unit is a lot more exp'd and Vandenberg should be one of the Big Ten's top QB's.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In '10 UI's top rusher ret'd in Adam Robinson (834, 4.6) and he nearly reached the 1,000 yd plateau before being susp for the bowl (941, 4.6). Marcus Coker (PS#41) then rushed for a UI bowl record 219 (6.6, MVP). LY they had to replace Robinson and Coker (622, 5.5) was voted the Preseason Big Ten OPOY by some sources. Coker was the 5th UI RB under Ferentz to top 1,000. His 281 rush att's was #11 FBS (1,384, 4.9), but he was susp for the bowl. True frosh Mika'il McCall (PS#54) broke his ankle in the opener and played in just 1 more gm. Speedy Jordan Canzeri (5'9" 180 So, PS#227) finished #2 with 58 in the bowl. FB Brad Rogers (3 att) was a key cog in the UI rush game with his blocking ability. Coker and McCall both transferred (14 RB's left program w/elig left s/'02). Canzeri tore his ACL in the spring and is expected to RS leaving UI with just 2 ret schlp TB's (99 car yd, 3.5). I expect a true frosh to win the job and for the unit to come close to LY's totals.

**RECEIVERS** - In '09 Marvin McNutt (PS#43QB) was #2 (674, 19.8) and he led the tm in '10 with 861 (16.2). LY they had to replace 4 of their top 5 rec's including their then all-time career rec. Keenan Davis (PS#14) has good leaping ability but had a problem with drops (just 15 rec '09-'10). He matured into a fine #2 LY (713, 14.3). McNutt trimmed his 40 from 4.72 to 4.5 and set Iowa's single season and career marks (1315, 16.0). Rfr Kevonte Martin-Manley (PS#183) had 323 (10.8). CJ Fiedorowicz at 6'7" 265 could be Iowa's next great TE and finished #4 (167, 10.4). Not one Hawkeye WR that Ferentz recruited has caught

a single pass in the NFL but McNutt figures to end that streak (13 st, #6DC PHI). Also gone is TE Brad Herman (3 st, 8 rec). While more exp'd as a unit, I'll call this group down a notch with the loss of the Big Ten's WR of the Year.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - Kirk Ferentz was an NFL OL coach which means this unit is always one of his top priorities and he's had 13 OL drafted in his tenure. LY they had to replace 1 st'r (#5DC) and 2 bkps (comb 5 st). They then lost RG Nolan MacMillan (6st '10) so they had 53 carsts back. The Hawkeyes' numbers were disappointing at just 138 ypg rush (3.9, 29 sk, 7.0%) despite the presence of super LT Riley Reiff. TY they lose Reiff (13 st, 3Y st'r, 4th Tm AA, #1DC DET), RT Markus Zusevics (13 st, 2Y st'r), RG Adam Gettis (13 st, 2nd Tm B10, #5DC WAS) and bkp Woody Orne (9 gm). They are a little less exp'd (45 car st) but even with the loss of their top guy I felt the unit underachieved and could be stronger this year under new OL cch Brian Ferentz (Kirk's son).

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - Last year they had to replace Adrian Clayborn (#1DC) and both DT's (#4 & #5DC). All 3 players started NFL gms LY. The inexp'd line allowed their highest ypg and ypc rush (156, 3.7) s/'00 with just 22 sks. This year they lose 2nd Tm B10 DT Mike Daniels (13 st, 67 tkl, 9 sk, #4DC GB), 2nd Tm B10 DE Broderick Binns (13 st, 60 tkl, 5 sk, 7 tfl), DT Thomas Nardo (7 st, 68 tkl, 6.5 tfl), DE Lebron Daniel (5 st, 30 tkl, 1 sk) and DE Joe Forgy (11 tkl, 1.5 tfl). Iowa adds a pair of VHT frosh who should contribute but longtime OL cch Morgan ('03-'11) moved to the other side of the ball to shepherd this lightly seasoned crew. This is the D's biggest ?.

**LINEBACKERS** - The Hawkeyes ret'd their top 6 LB's in '09 (#1, #2 and #6 tkl's all VHT's) and had one of the best corps in the country. In '10 they had to replace 2 st'rs (#2 & #4 DC). The unit was hit hard by inj's with only 1 LB starting 8+ yet they only slipped to allowing 17.0 ppg (15.4 '09). LY they had to replace a 2nd Tm B10 WLB (#1 tkl'r) and 2 others (comb 10 st, #7, #10 tkl'rs). They ret'd 4 who comb for 17 sts (#4, #12) so I listed them as having 1 st'r back. 2010 was the first time s/'02 that the LB's did not finish #1 and #2 in tkl's but James Morris and Christian Kirksey tied for the team lead LY. The Hawks, however, slipped to 23.8 ppg (most s/'00). TY they lose LB Tyler Nielsen (12 st, #5 tkl'r, 4 tfl) but Morris should be one of the top LB's in the Big Ten.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - In '08 Iowa finished #7 in my PDR (9-23 ratio). In '09 the Hawks lost 2 st'rs but were still one of only 6 tms to allow less than 50% (#6 PDR, 9-21). In '10 they had to replace 1 st'r (#3DC). They had just 1 VHT in the 3 deep but ret'd 1st Tm Big Ten SS Tyler Sash and FS Brett Greenwood (3Y st'r). Surprisingly the veteran unit slipped to #20. LY they had to replace 2nd Tm B10 FS Greenwood and 1st Tm B10 SS Sash (#6DC). They did return 1st Tm B10 CB Shasta Prater (#5 tkl'r) but I called for them to drop and they plummeted to #85 (62%, 21-10). The safety play was inconsistent although FS Tanner Miller did have a 98 yd IR td (tie longest sch hist) vs NW. TY they lose 1st Tm B10 Prater (51 tkl, 4 pd, #5DC CIN) and SS Jordan Bernstine (11 st, 89 tkl, #7DC WAS) who was the lone VHT (PS#11). This unit is on par with LY in terms of exp and can only improve upon LY's poor finish.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - Ferentz believes his ST unit should be the great equalizer allowing Iowa to contend with teams with superior talent. Heading into '06, Iowa had finished #3, #6, #18 and #20 in my ST rankings. They surprisingly finished #76 in '06, #62 in '07 and #48 in '08. They rose to #27 in both '09 and '10 but LY had to replace their P (37.8 net), top KR (29.3) and PR (8.3) and slipped to #57. Mike Meyer, who had hit 14-17 FG (L42, only 3 att 40+) in '10, hit 12 of his last 14 FG and was a semifinalist for the Groza but then hit only 2 of his last 6 (2 key

misses vs Minny). Meyer had 4 TB's on 66 KO. The sizeable Eric Guthrie (6'6" 245) avg 41.2 (38.5 net) and he along with the top KR (23.8) depart. In the 13Y under Ferentz this unit has avg'd a #33 finish so I expect them to move up.

**COACHES** - Kirk Ferentz took over for legendary Hayden Fry in '99. In '02 he led Iowa to its first Big Ten Title s/'90 and also the most wins in sch history (11) which he tied in '09. Ferentz was named the Big Ten COY in '02, '04 and '09. For the first time in 13 ssns, however, there is a large scale staff turnover, with four new asst's incl both coo's. OC Ken O'Keefe left for the NFL and Greg Davis who was Mack Brown's OC for 15 yrs at Tex and NC takes over. DC Norm Parker (Broyles Award finalist in '04 and '05) was the AFCA asst COY LY. Parker retired after struggling with diabetes. The new DC is Phil Parker (no relation) who has also been here 13Y (DB cch). A nation high 16 Div I HC's and asst's are Iowa alums.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Kirk Ferentz was 2-18 in his first 20 gms at Iowa but is 94-48 since then. His best stretch came from '02-'04 when Iowa finished AP #8 each season winning a share of the Big Ten Title in both '02 and '04. Iowa went just 7-5, 6-7 and 6-6 only getting to 2 bowls in the next 3 yrs. In '08 they beat SCar in the bowl to finish 9-4. That '08 Iowa team had 4 losses but all were by 5 or less. In '09 they improved to 11-2 with a BCS bowl win over GTech and a #7 finish. They opened '09 at 9-0 but lost QB Stanzi vs NW and he was also out vs Ohio St. They lost both, costing them a shot at the Big Ten title. In '10 Iowa had 14 ret sts, a veteran senior QB and a great schedule as they did not have to face any of the other Big Ten contenders (PSU, UW, MSU, OSU) on the road. A couple of factors pointed downward in that they were just +27.8 ypg (4th best) in the Big Ten in '09 with 2 net close wins. They were picked 2nd in the Big Ten, the highest ever. When the dust cleared, Iowa finished the '10 ssn 8-5 and NR upsetting Missouri in the bowl. Iowa was -15.6 ypg in the Big Ten, +13 in TO's, had a def ypg of 19.5 and had just 8 ret sts LY. All of the factors pointed down. Iowa was coming off a ssn where their losses were by 7, 1, 4, 3 and 3 but they had the Rhabdo incident in winter conditioning and 58% lett ret (fewest Big Ten). Iowa beat Ten Tech 34-7 but lost in 3 OT's at Iowa St. They trailed Pitt 27-10 in the 4Q but had the biggest comeback in sch hist for a 31-27 win using an uncharacteristic hurry-up shotgun 3 WR offense. After beating ULM (45-17) coming out in a no huddle they lost at Penn St, 13-3. They were outgained 213-180 at half by NW but led 17-7 (98 yd IR td) and won 41-31 and beat Ind by 21. They dominated the first 3Q's vs Minn but the Gophers got 80 and 59 yd 4Q drives and Iowa had 5 trips into Minn territory result in 0 points and they lost, 22-21. They led Mich 24-9 in the 4Q but the Wolves were SOD on 4 passes at the end and UI won. They were crushed by Mich St (trail 31-7 half) but then beat Pur (31-21) on the road. On a short week and travelling, they trailed Neb 20-0 in the 4Q and lost by 13. Without RB Coker in the bowl Iowa was down 24-14 when they were SOD then Okla got a late td. Iowa was -30.6 ypg in the Big Ten (8th best). Despite the inexperience, Iowa's schedule gives them a great shot at a potential 5-0 start and a chance to top LY's 7 win total.

Iowa is 7-0 vs NIU with an avg MOV 31 ppg. Last meeting ('07) was also in Chicago & the opener (16-3 UI win +3 TO). Hawkeyes have won 11 straight season openers.

UI has won 11 str home openers by 33 ppg. LY saw 8 lead changes but UI allowed a 59/13pl td drive w/17. In the 1st OT UI allowed a td on 4&gl from the 4 & eventually lost in the 3OT after yet another lead.

Iowa is 14-1 vs N Iowa (14 str wins, loss in 1898). In the L/gm ('09) UI escaped with a 17-16 win as they blk'd 2 fg's in the final 7 sec (40 & 41 yds). The 1st blk was on 1D & rec by NI w/01.

Hawkeyes have won the only 2 meetings ('94 & '98). In the L/gm they beat CM 38-0 w/a 348-227 yd & 7-1 sk edge. UI enters 2012 w/12 str wins hosting non-conf opp's (28-4 under Ferentz).

The Hawkeyes have lost B2B gms to the Gophers but have won 5 straight at home. LY UI led 21-10 early 4Q but allowed a 80/11pl td drive, onside kick & 59/12pl GW td drive w/2:48.

**Bonus:** Under Ferentz UI was just 2-6 their first 2Y in B10 HG's but the L11Y has gone 33-11.

LTH ('09) the Hawkeyes went 70/10pl tossing a 7 yd td pass on 4&gl as time expired (4Q saw 3 lead changes). Iowa is 1-4 in trips to MSU & just 2-6 in "true" road openers.

LY the Hawkeyes only trailed 6-3 into the 4Q but committed 3 4Q TO's (all near midfield) to eliminate any comeback. Iowa is 8-2 vs Penn St and hasn't dropped B2B gms since '94 & '95.

LTH Iowa led 17-7 into the 4Q before allowing td drives of 85/13pl & 91/11pl (the last score w/ just 1:22 left). Hawkeyes are just 2-5 their L7 trips to Evanston (wins by 27 ppg & losses 4 ppg).
