POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - GT has not topped 50% comp for a season s/'03. In '10 GT launched a Heisman campaign for ret starter Joshua Nesbitt and while he became the career leading rusher among ACC QB's with 2,806 topping Woodrow Dantzler of Clemson (2761, '98-'01), he completed just 37% (674 yds, 7-4) that ssn. Nesbitt would have put more distance on his rushing record but broke his forearm and missed the final 4. Tevin Washington took over and threw for 417 (41%, 2-3) while rushing for 514 (4.4). LY Washington beat out Synjyn Days and started all 13. He got off to a hot start hitting 64.3% in the first 4 (#1 FBS pass eff) but over the final 8 hit just 38.7% finishing with 1,652 (49.3%, 11-8). Washington was the #1 rusher with 986 (4.1) incl a GT record 176 vs Clem (Nesbitt 151 '09). Days played in 6 hitting 8-12 passes and rushing for 237 (4.9). HC Paul Johnson contemplated playing true freshman Vad Lee (PS#36) but decided to RS him. TY they signed 2 QB's incl VHT Justin Thomas (PS#16) and also have Darryl Dickey (5'10" 203 So) who runs the scout tm. The unit is much more experienced and could finally top that elusive 50% barrier.

RUNNING BACKS - GT had 3 TB's that were very productive over a 5 year stretch. Oklahoma transfer Tashard Choice (PS#59) rushed for 1,473 (5.0) in '06 and 1,379 (5.3) in '07. True freshman Jonathan Dwyer (PS#5) was #2 in '07 (436, 5.3) and led with 1,395 (7.0) in '08 while being named ACC OPOY. Roddy Jones (PS#53) added 690 (8.5) that yr incl a GT rec 16.5 ypc (214 yd) vs UGA. In '09 they added Anthony Allen (PS#73) who rushed for 1,102 (4.6) in his 2 yrs at LVille (9 st). Dwyer led with 1,395 (5.9) and Allen avg 9.7 ypc on his 64 att's (618). In '10 AB Orwin Smith (PS#102) had 516 (9.7) and Jones added 353 (6.8). Dwyer left early for the NFL (#6DC) while Allen stepped into the BB role and rushed for 1,316 (5.5). LY they had to replace Allen (#7DC) and the 2 BB's who took most of the snaps were soph David Sims (PS#42) and Preston Lyons. Those 2 comb for just 8 rushes of 20+ yds. Sims was the #1 RB rusher but with just 698 (5.2). The AB's are known for their perimeter blocking but Smith was #3 with 615 (10.1) and Jones added 458 (8.0). TY they lose Embry Peeples (2 st, 481, 10.2), Jones (13 st), Lyons (1 st) and Richard Watson (12 gm) but the top 2 are back making them more exp'd and productive.

RECEIVERS - GT has had a pipeline to the NFL at WR. In '03 Jonathan Smith set GT season records with 78 rec and 1,138 yds (#7DC '04). Calvin Johnson then broke J Smith's record

with 1,202 (15.8) in '06 (#1DC '07). In '07, Demaryius Thomas was #2 with 558 (15.9) and then led in '08 with 627 (16.1) in the option offense. In '09 D Thomas set a school record avg 25.1 ypc on his 46 rec (1154 yd). True freshman Stephen Hill added 137 on 6 rec. In '10 D Thomas opted to leave early for the NFL (#1DC) and Hill (6'5") with blazing speed) was expected to have a big year but unfortunately dropped about as many passes as he caught early on and finished with just 291 (19.4). LY they ret'd their top 2 rec's and dropped passes were the norm again for Hill. He still led with 820 (29.3) but could have easily been over 1,000 with double his td's (5), Tyler Melton, who had just 16 rec in 3 yrs, was #3 with 263 (15.5) while AB Orwin Smith was #2 with 306 (23.5). TY they lose Melton, Daniel McKayhan (3 car rec) and Hill left early for the NFL (#2DC NYJ). This unit returns zero career receptions!

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '07 Tech's OL ret'd 113 car sts. I called it the top OL of HC Chan Gailey's tenure and indeed it was. The OL paved the way for a Gailey-era high 199 ypg rush (4.7), their best totals s/'99 despite their QB rushing for -13 yds (22 sks). Naturally with the switch to the option the rush numbers have increased dramatically to 273 ypg (5.6) in '08 and 295 (5.2) in '09 (3 ret sts). In '10 they had to replace 3 st's but did return 1st Tm ACC C Sean Bedford and still improved to 323 ypg (5.6) with 16 sks (9.5%). LY they lost their 2x 1st Tm ACC C and 2 others (comb 18 sts). They still had 3 back with 8+ sts (38 car sts) and put up similar numbers (316, 5.7, 13 sk, 7.8%). TY the line, which featured 3 full-time soph st's, returns 1st Tm ACC RG Omoregie Uzzi and only loses Phil Smith (8 st, 2 yr st'r) who transferred. ACC defenses won't be pleased as this is the best O-line in Paul Johnson's tenure (83 car sts).

DEFENSIVE LINE - GT had just 1 st'r back on the D-line in '09 and allowed 152 ypg rush (4.9) with the D having just 25 sks (fewest s/'99). In '10 GT switched to a 3-4 but had to replace a 1st Tm AA (#1DC). Still, with 3 ret sts to 3 spots, I expected improvement but the unit yielded 170 ypg rush (4.5, 17 sks). LY they were in the 2nd year of the 3-4 and only had to replace a pair of bkps (comb 14 tkl). Surprisingly GT only improved slightly to 161 ypg rush (4.5, 22 sk). TY they lose DT Logan Walls (13 st, 36 tkl, 2 tfl) and DE Jason Peters (13 st, 41 tkl, 2 sk). While the numbers were not as good as expected LY, this unit goes from 3 ret sts down to 1.

LINEBACKERS - In '10 GT had to replace 1 st'r (#3 tkl'r) but ret'd their #1, #7 and #8 tkl'rs. Surprisingly GT slipped to allowing 25.2 ppg and 372 ypg on D, their weakest numbers s/'99 as they struggled in the switch to DC Groh's 3-4. LY they had to replace 2 st's (#2, #5 tkl'rs) and two bkps (comb 21 tkl). Paul Johnson felt Julian Burnett may just be the team's top player (#1 tkl'r) and he ret'd along with their #6 tkl'r Steven Sylvester. Jeremiah Attaochu was the Nagurski DPOV vs UNC and started 10 (#3 tkl'r, 6 sk, 5.5 tfl). GT all'd 26.1 ppg but 359 ypg. TY they lose Sylvester (10 st, #10 tkl'r, 5 tfl), BJ Machen (13 tkl), Morgan Carter (1 tkl) and Burnett, who suffered an inj in the bowl and won't play in '12 (#1 tkl'r, 9.5 tfl, career in question). They do have 5 back w/st exp, incl 3 who started 6+ LY.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - In 2009 this unit ret'd intact but surprisingly slipped from #58 in my PDR to #88 (62%, 23-12). In '10 they had to replace 1 st'r (#3DC, #2 tkl'r) but had 7 back w/st exp. The veteran unit only finished #79 (61%, 14-8). LY they had to replace all 4 st's (105 car sts). Paul Johnson said the DB's were probably the most talented and athletic since he arrived in '08 but they were inexp'd (20 car sts). FS Isaiah Johnson (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 3 int) and CB Rod Sweeting (13 st, #4, 3 int) earned 3rd Tm ACC honors while Jemea Thomas was POW vs Clem with 2 int's. Again, surprisingly GT moved up, this time to #34 (56.0%, 23-14). TY they lose S Rashaad Reid (13 st, #7

tkl'r, 2 pbu) and CB Michael Peterson (1 st, 9 tkl). Louis Young (PS#32), who is considered one of the top DB's in the ACC, was suspended for LY's bowl and it may roll over into this ssn. Assuming he ret's, they are much more exp'd with 6 of the top 8 back (3 st's), but might not move up much in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - GT's '07 unit finished #5 but in Paul Johnson's first 3 yrs here they plummeted to #97, #64 and #105. LY they had to replace their K and top PR. ST were a trouble spot with some in the press calling for Johnson to hire a full-time ST coach instead of splitting the duties among his asst's. The return game was below avg but P Sean Poole improved the tm net from 32.2 to 36.9. New soph K Justin Moore (PS#22) nearly lost his spot after misses vs MD and VA but hit 11-17 FG (L41). GT moved up to #82 and with both specialists back, should have their highest finish in Johnson's five years here as they do bring in STC David Walkosky.

COACHES - Paul Johnson was 62-10 at GA Southern earning IAA National COY for three straight seasons ('98-'00). In six years at Navy, he guided them to 5 bowls and 5 str Commander-in-Chief's Trophies. In '04 he was named the Bobby Dodd Nat'l COY. In his first 2Y here Johnson was named the ACC COY. Johnson serves as his own OC as he did at Navy. The DC for a 3rd str ssn is former UVA HC Al Groh who won ACC COY in '02 and '07 (59-53, 9 yrs). Prior to UVA Groh was HC of the NY Jets in '00 and also DC of the NE Patriots from '93-'96.

PHIL'S FORECAST

GT has now been to a school record 15 straight bowls. In five of ex-coach Chan Gailey's six seasons, they finished with exactly 7 wins and in '06 GT got to the ACC Title game (9-5). That '06 squad was led by AA WR Calvin Johnson and they landed their first Jan 1 bowl s/'99 getting as high as #13 AP. Gailey was let go after losing to UGA a 7th straight time and going 7-5 in '07. In Paul Johnson's first year they had 75 frosh and soph making them the youngest tm in the ACC. GT also had just 76 schlp players. They exceeded my expectations by going 9-3 while ending their losing streak to Georgia. GT was a league best +68.1 ypg but in the bowl was thrashed by LSU 38-3. They had 17 ret sts in '09 and caught some breaks again (see '10 mag forecast). GT got their first ACC Title s/'90 when they beat Clem 39-34 moving to #9 but lost to Iowa in the Orange Bowl and finished #13. It was their first major bowl s/'66-'67. In '10 they brought in Al Groh's 3-4 defense to team with Johnson's option offense. GT did manage to get back to a bowl at 6-6 but in a battle of option offenses and despite a 320-287 yd edge, lost to AF to fall to 6-7, their first losing season s/'96. LY their 12 ret sts were their fewest in the ACC but Johnson usually does well with inexp'd squads. The highest anyone picked GT LY was 4th in the Coastal (where I had them) with some pegging them 5th or 6th. GT managed a tie for 2nd. GT steamrolled their first 3 foes but did see their off production take a 5 gm slide going from a GT rec 768 (incl a NCAA 12.1 ypc rush) vs Kansas to 496, 413, 386, 296 and finally 211 vs Miami. They rebounded in their final 5 to avg 427 ypg despite facing Clemson, VT, Georgia and Utah. Their 6-0 start was their best s/'96 and they were #12 when they were upset at Virginia (off a bye), 24-21 and the next wk lost at Miami 24-7. They then dealt #6 Clemson their first loss of the year but lost to VT at home on a Thur night being outaged 476-340 and surprisingly out rushed. They got past Duke 38-31 and had the benefit of playing UGA with the Bulldogs looking ahead to the SEC Title game the following wk but still lost by 14. In the bowl they had a 449-337 yd edge but lost to Utah by 3 in OT but still improved to 8-5. TY GT has 13 ret sts and LY was #4 in the ACC at +23.2 ypg. GT has 443 wins in Bobby Dodd Stadium, most of any school at their current site. GT does have to face VT, Clem, NC and UGA all on the road but should make it to their 16th straight bowl!

GT is 3-6 vs VT. LTH GT led 14-0 and did not trail till 6:34 left. GT tied the gm at 21 but allowed a 90 yd KR td. With their bkup QB Washington, GT drove to the VT16 but was int'd in the EZ w/08.

GT is 3-0 vs Presbyterian w/3 shutouts but the L/meeting was in 1937. The Blue Hose went 4-7 LY incl a 63-12 loss at Cal. Yellow Jackets are 12-1 in home openers with 5 str wins by 35 ppg.

HT is 14-3. LY GT came into this gm off its best start S/66 (6-0). GT trailed 14-0 but cut the deficit to 3 into the 4Q. They shutout UVA in the 2H but after punting w/5:58 left never got the ball back (UVA 5 FD's).

GT has dropped 3 str but the home team has won 3 of the L/4. LY GT was held to ssn lows in pts (7), yds (211, 182 rush yds below ssn avg) and FD's (14). Yellow Jackets had just 2 drives over 5 plays.

GT is 2-0 vs Middle Tenn (both gms L2Y). LY the Yellow Jackets led 28-0 and 42-7 into the 4Q as the Blue Raiders got 8 of 21 FD's and 36% (122) of their yds in the 4Q.

Georgia Tech is 7-2 vs CU the L8Y (played 2x's in '09) but lost LTH. GT trailed 17-0 late 2Q and never got within 11 pts. LY Georgia Tech returned the favor and led 24-3 at HT.

Bonus: For 8 str yrs GT has finished .500 or better in ACC AG's, 19-13 S/'04 into '12. **Bonus:** Into 2012, Georgia Tech has won 12 straight non-conf HG's (not incl UGA).

The home team has dropped 5 str. The L/meeting was in '08, GT won 19-16. GT overcame 3 1H turn getting the win on a 43 yd 4Q td run. Into '12, GT is 13-4 their L/17 ACC home gms.

GT is 1-1 vs BYU but the HT is 2-0. The L/gm was in '03. GT led 13-7 at HT after a blk'd punt ret for a td but was being outgained 181-110. Tech had 3 of 4 2H drives end in TO's as they were shutout 17-0.

GT is 8-3 vs Maryland but did lose the LTH ('07), 28-26. GT had a 38/10 at the MD25 (potential 42 yd fg) but holding was called and the 52 yd att sailed wide right w/54 left.

GT is 12-2 but the visitor is 2-7. LTH saw 6 lead changes. GT trailed 24-17 3Q but went on 3 str scoring drives. Yellow Jackets are 6-3 S/'05 in the 2nd of B2B true AG's.

GT has won 8 str at home vs Duke by 23 ppg. LY GT led 31-17 into the 4Q and up 7 sealed the win w/a int at their 44 w/2:20 left. GT is 6-1 in home finales S/'98 (not incl UGA).
