

QUARTERBACKS - In '08 rFr Jarrett Lee made 8 sts and threw for 1,873 (53% 14-16) but had 7 IR td's. They burned the RS on Jordan Jefferson and he played in 7 gms starting the last 2 (bowl Off MVP) throwing for 419 (49%, 4-1). Jefferson threw for 2,166 (62%, 17-7) in '09. Lee, who was booed often in '08, threw for 197 (40%, 2-1). In '10 Jefferson was LSU's most exp'd QB s/'06 when they threw for 252 ypg (67%). Jefferson st'd all 13 and threw for 1,411 (57%, 7-10) and was the #2 rusher (450, 3.7). Lee threw for 573 (61%, 2-1) and led some late comebacks. Both ret'd LY but many expected strong armed PS#4JC Zach Mettenberger, who threw for 2,678 (59%, 32-4) at JC, to win the job. Jefferson held onto the spot but then was susp'd for the opener and Lee had a better season than many expected. He threw for 1,306 (62.3%) with a 14-3 ratio. Two of those int's came against Ala in the regissn and Jefferson st'd the final 5 gms (737, 61%, 6-2). Mettenberger hit 8-11-92. LSU had their best comp % (62.0) s/'06 and a solid 21-5 ratio. Jefferson and Lee both depart and Mettenberger will battle Phillip Rivers brother rFr Stephen (PS#35) and Jerrard Randall (PS#15). Despite the loss of their top 2 QB's, it wouldn't surprise me and in fact I expect LSU to have a more dangerous pass attack TY. **RUNNING BACKS** - In '09 Stevan Ridley (PS#36) st'd

the L/2 (180, 4.0) and was the leading returnee into 2010 finishing #1 with 1,147 (4.6). QB Jefferson was #2 and Michael Ford (PS#11, 4.4 spd) was #3 (244, 5.4). Spencer Ware (PS#14) was #5 and had 102 of his 175 (7.3) in the bowl. LY they had to replace Ridley. Ford led with 756 (6.0). Alfred Blue (6'2" 215 Jr, PS#131) was the big play RB with 539 (6.9) and Kenny Hilliard (PS#12) was the short yardage back with 336 (5.4). Ware was held out vs Auburn and was the leading rusher at the time. He finished #2 with 707 but just 4.0 ypc yet still earned 2nd Tm SEC. Naturally, since the top 4 were all soph and frosh, this unit is stronger and one of the best in the country.

RECEIVERS - LSU WR's have been loaded with size and speed in recent years but spotty QB play had kept down their production. In '10 they had to replace their top WR (579, 14.1) but ret'd Rueben Randle (PS#1), who was #2 with 544 (16.5), #3 Russell Shepard (PS#1QB, 254, 7.7) and #4 TE Deangelo Peterson (198, 12.4). Randle earned 1st Tm SEC and led with 917 (17.3 ypc!). Trué frosh Odell Beckham Jr (PS#24, father played here '89-'92) was #2 (475, 11.6). Shepard missed 3, but still surprisingly only had 190 (13.6). TY they lose Peterson (3 st, 179, 9.9), Mitch Joseph (10 st, 2 rec) and Randle (#2DC NYG). They are a little less exp'd but could put up better numbers with more emphasis on the pass game.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '09 LSU's O-line had 79 career sts back but the tm had their lowest ypg rush (123, 3.7) s/99

while all'g 37 sks (tied last SEC, 11%). In '10 they had to replace 2 st'rs incl the SEC Jacobs Trophy winner. I said that despite being less exp'd, they could actually improve and they did (186, 4.5, 24 sk, 8.0%). LY they had to replace a 2nd Tm SEC LT (#3DC) then lost starting LG Josh Dworaczyk (25 st '09-'10) in Aug. They had 56 car sts ret and improved slightly to 203 ypg rush (4.8) and all'd just 18 sks. TY they lose 2nd Tm AA G Will Blackwell (14 st), T Bob Hebert (8 st) and Greg Shaw (1 st). With Dworaczyk being granted a 6th year, this unit has 5 back who have been full-time st'rs (104 car sts, #5 FBS) and it looks to be their best unit in some time.

DEFENSIVE LINE - LSU had to replace 3 NFL DC's in '06 but yielded just 97 ypg rush (3.2). Surprisingly the next FOUR yrs the rush D totals went up yielding 106 ypg (3.2), 110 (3.4), 133 (3.5) and 137 (3.7) in '10. At least one LSU DL has been picked in each of the last 9 drafts. In '10 they had to replace 3 st'rs for the 2nd str yr and LY they had to replace 2nd Tm AA DT Drake Nevis (#3DC) and a #7DC DT. I said it was the most exp'd LSU front recently and would stop the weakening rush D trend and they did as LSU allowed just 90 ypg (2.7) with 39 sks (most s/06). TY they lose DE Kendrick Adams (11 st, 22 tkl, 2.5 sk, 4 tfl) and DT Michael Brockers (14 st. 54 tkl. 2 sk. 8 tfl. #1DC STL) but I list them with 3 sts back. The D-line accounted for 28.5 sks and most of them return (Montgomery 9 and Mingo 8). They should get a much bigger season out of soph DT Anthony Johnson (PS#2). This is one of the top D-Lines in the country

LINEBACKERS-In'10LSU had to replace their team MVP LB (#3 tkl'r), #2 tkl'r (#4DC) and #4 tkl'r (1 st). Kelvin Sheppard was the #1 tkl'r in '09 and turned down the NFL but the other 2 starting LB's comb for just 25 tkls. LSU allowed 18.2 ppg. LY they had to replace 1st Tm SEC MLB Sheppard (#1 tkl'r, #3 DC) but had 5 of their top 6 back (#2, #3 tkl'rs). With a more exp'd LB corps, the Tigers improved to yielding just 11.3 ppg. TY they lose 2nd Tm SEC WLB Ryan Baker (#4 tkl'r, 3.5 tfl), SLB Stefoin Francois (9 st, 11 tkl) and Karnell Hatcher (24 tkl). They return 1 st'r (#5 tkl'r) and their #14 and #18 tkl'rs. Miles signed 5 VHT LB's, many of whom I expect to play immediately as surprisingly there was just 2 VHT's among the returnees. This unit is less exp'd and is my only question mark on the team.

DEFENSIVE BACKS-The Tigers finished #6, #1, #5, #5, #1 and #3 in my PDR from '02-'07 but had a very inexp'd unit in '08 (#33). In '09 LSU ret'd 5 DB's (comb 40 sts '08) and moved back up to #19. In '10 they had to replace 2 st'rs (#3DC) but returned the nation's best CB combo in Patrick Peterson and Morris Claiborne. Peterson earned SEC DPOY and won the prestigious Jim Thorpe and Bednarik Awards. LSU finished #13 in my PDR (57%, 15-19). LY they lost Peterson (#1DC) and 2 bkps (42 tkl). The secondary had a tremendous yr. Tyrann "Honey Badger" Mathieu won the Bednarik and Claiborne won the Thorpe Award (both 1st Tm AA). Eric Reid (2nd Tm SEC) made the huge play vs Bama wrestling the ball away from TE Williams at the goal line. LSU finished #2 in my PDR (52.4%, 7-18). TY they lose Claiborne (14 st, 51 tkl, 6 int, 6 pbu, #1DC DAL), SS Brandon Taylor (14 st, #3 tkl'r, 2 int, 5 pbu, #3DC SD), CB Ron Brooks (3 st, 30 tkl, 2 int, 6 pbu, #4DC BUF) and FS Derrick Bryant (28 tkl. 2 pbu). LSU has just 2 ret sts but remains one of the elite secondaries

SPECIAL TEAMS - HC Les Miles' Okla St tms ('01-'04) finished #3, #18, #3 and #11 in my ST rankings. His first unit here was #10 in '05 but surprisingly dropped to #80 and #81 in '06 & '07. They were #13 in '08, #7 in '09, #2 in '10 but LY had to replace AA K Josh Jasper, super P Derek Helton (39.2 net) and Patrick Peterson (29.1 KR, 16.1 PR) who clearly would have won the Johnny "The Jet" Rodgers award had it started a yr earlier. I figured they would drop out of the top 10 but I was wrong They finished #5. Drop Allorgen bit 16.19 (14.4) PTS Dro wrong. They finished #5. Drew Alleman, hit 16-18 (L44). RFr P

Brad Wing (PS#45) from Australia was the MIP of spring. He missed 2 gms early and was trying to regain leg strength but avg 44.4 with a tremendous net of 41.2 (#3 FBS). His field flipping punts gave them a huge ST edge incl the #1 and #3 longest P in SEC Title games (67 & 56 yds). The Honey Badger avg 15.6 on PR and Morris Claiborné was the top KR (25.1). This year they return both K & P along with Mathieu and again look like one of the premier ST units in college football

COACHES - When Les Miles took over at Okla St the Cowboys had been to one bowl in 12Y. He left taking them to 3 str. Miles led the Tigers to a Nat'l Title in his third season and after a 3Y drought without an SEC Title took them back to the Nat'l Title game LY earning AP COY. Steve Kragthorpe (7Y HC exp Tulsa '03-'06, L'ville '07-'09) was brought in as OC LY but health issues caused him to limit his role to QB coach. Greg Studrawa was promoted in Aug '11 to OC. He's been the OL cch here s/'07 and was the OC at BG prior ('03-'06). SEC veteran John Chavis is in his 4th season as DC here (DC Tenn 14 yrs!).

Phil Steele's College Football Preview was the ONLY magazine to forecast LSU to win the SEC West in '03.1 called the Tigers my #2 surprise team and they took home the BCS Nat'l Title when they upset Oklahoma. In Saban's last year ('04) they went 9-3 finishing ranked #16 after entering the ssn #4. In Les Miles' first 2 seasons they went 11-2 finishing #6 and #3. In '07 they lost 2 gms in OT and appeared out of the Nat'l Title picture but then not only landed in it but they whipped Ohio St 38-24 for a 2nd BCS Title in 5 yrs. There were some negative factors heading into '08 as they had benefitted from +20 in TO's, had just 12 ret sts and lost 24 pts in my NFL Draft Day Party Hangover (pg 310). LSU did become bowl eligible for a school record 9th straight year but it was an up and down 8-5 ssn (NR!). Miles had quite a few fortunate wins in '09-'10. In '09, the Tigers were actually outgained by 33 ypg in SEC play but finished 9-4 and #17. In 10 LSU got past UNC 30-24 (NC 9 susp sts) when 2 passes into the EZ fell incomplete. It was ruled the game was over vs Tenn and they had lost, but a penalty gave them another play and LSU got the 2 pt win. Vs UF they faked a 53 yd FG that bounced off the turf but the K caught it for a FD. LSU finished 11-2 and #8 (#21 pressn). LY they had 14 ret sts and did have to play two top 5 tms away from home (Oreg, Ala). LSU almost had a dream ssn. The Tigers were outgained by Oregon 335-273 but were +3 in TO's and won 40-27. They were outgained by WV 533-366 but rolled to a 47-21 win finishing +4 in TO's. In Wks 6-8 LSU took on QB's making their first sts. They got their largest margins of victory in series history vs Tenn (31 pts) then Aub (35 pts) in B2B wks. In the #1 vs #2 showdown they upset Ala on the road, 9-6 (outgained 295-239). Ole Miss started their 3rd string QB and vs Ark, LSU trailed 14-0 in the 2Q but roared back to a 41-17 win. In the SEC Title game, LSU had an amazing 0 FD's at half but only trailed 10-7 thanks to Mathieu's 62 yd PR. They dominated the 2H to win 42-10 to win. In the Nat'l Title gm they were thrashed by Bama not crossing midfield until mid 4Q, being outgained 384-92 and outFD'd 21-5. TY LSU gets Bama at home and were #2 in the SEC at +167.1 ypg. LSU benefitted from +20 in TO's LY, had an off ypp of 9.9 and a def ypp of 23.2 (see pg 309). They are -3.0 in my Stock Market Indicator (pg 27) and draw UF and S Car out of the East but are an even stronger team than 2011. Unlike LY where LSU was a dog 3x they could be favored in every game TY and are a legitimate National Title contender.
