POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - In '10 the Ducks had to replace 1st Tm P10 QB Jeremiah Masoli (2147, 58%, 15-6). While Nate Costa was #1 out of the spring, I proj'd Darron Thomas (PS#22) as the starter. Thomas did win the job and even earned some mention in the Heisman race. Thomas (2881, 62%, 30-9) had a better year passing than Masoli and was the #3 rusher (486, 5.2). Costa suffered his 3rd torn ACL and true frosh Bryan Bennett (PS#28) was the bkp late but still RS. LY Thomas improved his ratio setting a school td record throwing for 2,761 (62.2%, 33-7, 206 rush) despite missing the Colo gm with a knee injury. Bennett started vs the Buffs (11-20-156-2-0) then came off the bench vs Wash St after Thomas threw 2 int's. He threw for 369 (54.3%, 6-0, 200 rush) in 8 gms. Marcus Mariota (PS#31) was the star of the spring gm incl an 82 yd td run and will resume his battle with Bennett in Aug. Adding depth is Dustin Haines (PS#334) and two true frosh. Thomas (13 st) surprised many by declaring early for the draft (UFA) and this unit goes from a 3rd yr to a 1st yr st'r.

RUNNING BACKS - UO always has a highly productive RB. Jonathan Stewart (PS#1) had 1,722 (6.2) in '07 and was a #1 DC. In '08 Jeremiah Johnson led with 1,201 (7.1) while LeGarrette Blount had 1,002 (7.3) and 17 td's (2nd UO duo to each top 1,000). In '09 rfr LaMichael James was the Pac-10's #2 rusher (P10 OPOY) with 1,546 (6.7). Kenjon Barner (PS#115) moved over from DB and rushed for 366 (6.0). In '10 James was a Heisman finalist rushing for 1,731 (5.9) and breaking Stewart's '07 single season record. Barner missed a few gms but was #2 (551, 6.1). Those 2 ret'd LY and they added in true frosh De'Anthony Thomas (PS#2) to make up my #1 rated RB corps in the preseason. James set UO's single gm record with 288 vs AZ (Onterio Smith, 257 vs WSU '01). Despite missing 2 gms, James led the nation in ypg rushing breaking his own schl rec with 1,805 (7.3) and 18 td's. In the 2 gms that James missed (Ariz St and Colo), Barner ran for 171 (5.5) and 115 (11.5). He finished #2 with 939 (6.2) and 11 td's. Thomas not only was #3 with 595 (10.8) incl a Rose Bowl record 91 yd td run, but was the leading rec with 605 (13.2) and earned P12 Co-FPOY honors. TY they lose James who left early for the NFL (#2DC SF). This still remains one of the premier RB units in college football.

RECEIVERS - UO has surprisingly lacked true game breaking WR's recently. LY they had to replace their top 2 rec's with the leading returnees being TE David Paulson (PS#26, 418, 17.4), along with WR's Lavaris Tuinei (396, 11.0) and Josh Huff (303, 15.9). They brought in a solid class of true frosh to add speed but Kelly opted to go with the veterans. Tuinei was the top WR with 599 (12.5) incl 158 (19.8) in the Rose Bowl while Paulson had

438 (14.1) and Huff 430 (13.9) missing two with injury. Rahsaan Vaughn (PS#20JC) only had 184 (13.1) and true frosh Colt Lyerla (PS#5) moved to TE (147, 21.0). This year UO loses Tuinei (14 st) and 2nd Tm P12 TE Paulson (13 st, #7DC PIT) but I will call it their most athletic receiving corps in a few years.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Naturally in the Ducks' spread offense which features the run, they've put up some incredible totals. In '09 they had to replace 4 st's (#2 and #5 DC's) and had just 20 car sts ret (#118 FBS). The unit outperformed my expectations with 232 ypg rush (5.5, 13 sk). In '10 the entire 2 deep was back (85 car st) so I said they should be one of the nation's top O-lines and they set schl rec's with 286 ypg rush (5.9) while allowing just 10 sks. LY they had to replace three multi-yr st's (1st & 2nd Tm Pac-10) and 2 bkps. They did have 7 VHT's in the 2 deep and 3 who had 7+ sts in '10 (56 car st). The unit paved the way for 299 ypg rush, an amazing 6.7 ypc (#1 FBS) and 14 sks (3.6%). TY they lose HMP12 RG Mark Asper (14 st, 3Y st'r, #6DC BUF) and LT Darrion Weems (14 st, 2Y st'r) but have 8 of the top 10 back (65 car st). While I cannot reasonably expect much improvement over LY's numbers, this is a more exp'd unit.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '10 UO had to replace 2 st's and moved in TE Dion Jordan. They also added VHT frosh Ricky Heimuli (PS#21). DL coach Jerry Azinaro molded another solid unit but I was surprised that despite being more exp'd, the numbers were similar (128 ypg, 3.5, 33 sk). Giving up 254 rush yds to Auburn did not help (118, 3 sk without). LY they had to replace 3 st's incl a 2nd Tm P10 DE (7 sk, 9.5 tfl) and a 2nd Tm P10 DT (16 tfl). I mentioned that despite being less exp'd and losing their top 2 DL, UO would come close to '10's numbers and they did (143 ypg rush, 3.6) with the D recording 45 sks, topping their modern day high of 39 ('08). TY they lose HMP12 DE Terrell Turner (14 st, 49 tkl, 5.5 sk), DE Brandon Hanna (2 st, 33 tkl, 2 sk) but have 3 st's back incl 1st Tm P12 DE Dion Jordan (7.5 sk). They were able to RS PS#12JC Jared Ebert and I look for Heimuli (skipped mission LY) to finally emerge into a dominant DT. This is the Ducks' best D-line in a few years.

LINEBACKERS - The Ducks had a veteran LB corps in '10 (#2, #3, #12 and #14 tkl's back) and only had to replace 1 st'r (#6). I said they would be one of the P10's better LB corps and the D allowed just 18.7 ppg (best s'92). LY they had to replace 2 st's (#1 and #3 tkl's). They ret'd just their #8, #10 and #13 tkl's and were clearly less exp'd. The Ducks slipped to allowing 24.6 ppg. Boseko Lokombo (PS#39) was the most athletic of the LB's but surprisingly did not start. Michael Clay (PS#52) was tied for the P12 lead in tkls when he missed 3 gms (inj). This is a more exp'd and talented group than LY despite losing 1st Tm P12 SLB Josh Kaddu (14 st, #6 tkl'r, 6.5 sk, 3 tfl, #5DC MIA) and Dewitt Stuckey (13 st, #3 tkl'r, 3 sk, 1 int). Four of the top 6 are back and while I like all 3 proj st's, they have 3 VHT bkps who could win jobs.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Ducks had 4 straight Top 15 finishes in my PDR from 2004-'07. It was surprising that in '08 with 3 ret sts, they dropped to #47. In '09 they had an injury plagued group but still rose to #25. In '10 they had to replace 2 DB's (comb 10 st, #2 and #4DC's) but did return 4 w/10+ sts. CB Cliff Harris (PS#19) earned 1st Tm P10 while leading the nation in pd (23). The Ducks rose to #6 (54%, 15-21). LY they had to replace 1 st'r and 4 bkps (comb 73 tkl), then Harris only played in 6 (susp) so they basically had 2.5 st's back. After 5 gms the Ducks had just 3 int's but actually finished with 17 (#2 P12). The Ducks slipped a little to #20 (59.2%, 25-17). TY they lose 1st Tm P12 ROV Eddie Pleasant (13 st, 61 tkl, 3 int, 8 pbu), CB Anthony Gildon (8 st, 24 tkl, 1 int, 4 pbu) and Harris (9 tkl). Once again they return 2.5 st's including 2x 1st Tm P12 FS John Boyett (PS#39) and this unit looks just as strong.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In '07 UO had to replace its P and K but brought back their excellent ST coor Tom Osborne. In his previous 6 yrs here ('95-'00), they finished #30, #22, #4, #15, #13 and #47 in my ST rankings. In his first 4 yrs back ('07-'10) the Ducks finished #32, #27, #21 and #3. Cliff Harris was my 1st Tm AA PR in '10 with 546 (18.8) and 4 td's while Josh Huff avg 24.7 on KR. K's Rob Beard and Eric Solis comp to hit 13-17 FG. LY the unit ret'd intact but Harris was susp (9 PR, 7.6) with LaMichael James taking over (10.7 and 1 td). KR De'Anthony Thomas had 2 td's and was #10 in the FBS (27.3). Surprisingly, soph Alejandro Maldonado (PS#32) hit 7-12 FG's (L40) while Beard only hit 2-2 FG (banged up). Jackson Rice led the team to a 37.9 net in '10 and was a Ray Guy finalist (41.4 net #1 FBS) in '11. TY they only lose James and with Osborne still the ST coach, they should match LY's #7 ranking.

COACHES - Former HC Mike Bellotti ('95-'08) had the most wins (116-55) of any Pac-10 HC when he stepped aside prior to the spg in '09. HC Chip Kelly was the OC here in '07-'08 and was at New Hamp prior ('99-'06). Kelly has led UO to their most successful 3 yr run in schl hist (34-6) and to 3 straight conf titles (first ever). He was AP COY in '10, has a 26-2 conf record and has appeared in the Nat'l Champ gm and 2 Rose Bowls. OC Mark Helfrich (4th yr) was previously the OC/QB cch at Colo ('06-'08). DC Nick Aliotti (14th yr) was the architect of the "Gang Green" D that std the UO revival and ret'd to the schl in '99 after being the DC at UCLA in '98.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In '04 UO had a streak of 10 straight winning yrs snapped (5-6). In '05 they were my #4 Most Improved team and almost made it to a BCS bowl at 10-2 (#12). In '07 UO was one of my Surprise Teams (non-Top 10 with chance at title) and they were headed for the BCS Title game but lost QB Dennis Dixon to injury when ranked #2 and lost their final 3 reg season gms to finish 9-4. In '08 they finished #10 and in '09 #11. In '10 eight of my 9 sets of power ratings called them the best team in the P10. They also benefitted from the numerous sanctions placed on USC. The Ducks avg'd 47.0 ppg and 531 ypg while holding opp's to just 18.7 ppg. UO had just one close game, a 15-13 escape at Cal and played in the BCS Title game. They were AP #1 for the first time in school history for 7 wks (6 gms) but lost to Aub by 3. UO benefitted from +13 in TO's and had just 6 sts lost to injury all year. In '10 they used a 25 man rotation on the D so with less depth they were only expected to use 18 LY. While I picked the Ducks to win the inaugural Pac-12 Title, I did not place them in the Nat'l Title game. They entered the ssn AP #3 (highest ever) but in front of basically an LSU home crowd in Cowboys Stadium, they lost the opener 40-27 (335-273 yd edge). The Ducks would bounce back and win by 49, 49, 25, 28, 14 and 43 pts. In that span they did trail Cal 15-14 at half but still won big. They beat WSU by 15 and UW by 17 setting up their big showdown at Stanford where they upset #3 SU, 53-30. USC then came in #18 and the #4 Ducks were thinking National Title. USC led 38-14 late 3Q but UO missed a late FG giving the Trojans the win in Autzen, 38-35. The Ducks blew out rival Oregon St (led 42-7 4Q) then in the P12 Title game were huge fav's but only won by 18. In the Rose Bowl they got past #9 Wisc 45-38 with a 621-508 yd edge for their first Rose Bowl win s/1917 and finished #4. TY they have just 11 ret sts with both RB James and QB Thomas opting to leave early for the NFL. They must face USC on the road and were +9 in TO's and had an off ypg of 11.3. Despite those factors, the Ducks have their best defense in years and even with the loss of their QB and top RB, could be just as explosive. They will be 8-0 on Nov 3rd for their showdown with the Trojans and that game will determine if they are a legitimate Nat'l Title contender.

First meeting: Oregon has gone 18-1 in home openers w/7 str wins by 36 ppg (only loss vs Indiana in '04). Since 2005 the Ducks are 13-1 hosting non-conference foes (loss in '08 vs Boise St.).

UO is 6-2 vs Fresno St & have won the L/6 meetings (last series loss in '82). In the L/gm ('07) UO jumped out to a 14-0 lead (25 yd FR td) and by HT the gm was decided 42-14 (led at one point, 52-14 in 2H).

First meeting: Golden Eagles finished 7-4 LY incl a 34-7 loss at Iowa but were OVC co-Champs making it to the FCS playoffs (first time in program history). OU is 16-2-2 vs FCS programs (last loss in '38 vs Fordham).

UO is 15-3 & has won 4 str, avg 51 ppg and 504 ypg. LY RB James set the UO rec for rush/all-purpose yds in a gm (288, 12.5 & 363). Oregon led 35-9 at HT and UA got no closer than 11 pts in the 2H.

The Ducks are 19-7 & have won 5 str by 35 ppg vs the Cougars. UO is 8-3 their first gm away from Autzen St/'01. LY OU was outgained & needed a blk'd punt td & KR td for the win.

UO has won 8 str vs UW winning each game by 17 pts or more. LY UO only led 24-17 with 8:33 3Q but locked down defensively limiting UW to 97 yds. Into '12, UO is 18-1 L4Y in conf HG's.

UO has won 4 str trips to Tempe but LTH was very misleading. The Ducks were outgained by 212 yds (-9 FD) and trailed 24-14 late 2Q as the Sun Devils penetrated UO territory 7x's with 0 pts and 7 TO's.

OU has won 5 of L/6 regn gms incl 3 str. LY QB Bennett got his 1st career start w/Thomas out (11-20-55%-156-2-0 & 69 net rush yds, 11.5). RB Barner gained 100+ yds in place of James as UO led 45-0 mid-3Q.

Both schools have been ranked the L/7 (higher ranked tm is 5-2). LTH UO trailed 32-29 w/11:19 3Q but went on 4 str scoring drives (3 ending in a td) to pull away. Into '12, OU has won 10 str conf AG's.

Oregon won LTH but is just 1-3 the L/4 trips. LTH Cal was held to season lows in FD's (20) and yds (317, next lowest was 447). Oregon up 2 4Q ran out the L/9:25 (6 FD's).

UO is 9-1 vs SU. LY UO never trailed & up just 22-16 at HT exploded in the 2H limiting SU to 154 2H yds.

116th Civil War (longest rivalry west of Rocky Mountains). UO has won 4 str but the visitor is 3-12. LTH

the Ducks were down 7-0 but after taking a 9-7 lead never trailed again turning 4 Beaver int's into 17 pts.
