



POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - In '08 Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 (61%, 25-10) and was the #1 overall pick in the NFL draft. Joe Cox (PS#8, 58 car att) took over in '09 as a 5th yr Sr. He threw for 2,584 (24-15) but only comp 56%. UGA's 17 int's were their most s/'84. RFr Aaron Murray won the job in '10 and actually had a higher pass eff rating (154.5) than Stafford did as a Jr and higher than Andrew Luck in his rFr ssn. Murray finished #14 in pass eff (3049, 61%, 24-8) which was the 2nd highest ever for a frosh in the SEC (UK's Jared Lorenzen 3.687 in '00) and showed mobility (358 gross rush). True frosh Hutson Mason (PS#43) played in 4 (9-17-102) becoming the 2nd QB in NCAA history to throw a td on his 1st career pass. Added to the mix LY was VHT Christian LeMay (PS#4) and Parker Welch (6'3" 204 So). Murray had similar numbers (3149, 59.1%, 321 gross, 1st Tm SEC) but set a schl record with 35 td (14 int).

Mason who played in 4 (254, 60%, 2-0) will RSTY and Murray should be one of the top QB's in the entire country. **RUNNING BACKS** - Heading into '07 UGA surprisingly had just one 1,000 yd back s/'92! In '07 rFr Knowshon Moreno (PS#14, 1334, 5.4) was the first 1st Tm SEC RB here s/'92 (Garrison Hearst). In '08 Moreno became the 2nd back in UGA history (Herschel Walker) to have B2B 1,000 yd efforts (#1 SEC, 1400, 5.6). RFr Caleb King (PS#7) rushed for 247 (4.0). Moreno left early (#1DC) and King missed the first 2 (inj). Richard Samuel (PS#10) led in each of the first 3 and finished with 395 (4.5). King was #2 with 594 (5.2) in 5 sts. They took the RS off Washaun Ealey (PS#3) in the 3Q of gm 5 and he led with 717 (5.7). In '10 Ealey led with 811 (5.2) while King was #2 (430, 5.4). Samuel moved to LB. Ealey decided to transfer LY after the spring as VHT true frosh Isaiah Crowell (PS#4) figured to become the feature back. King was lost over the summer (acad). Crowell had an avg game vs Boise but then vs SC had 118 (7.4). When healthy (oft inj), he was solid and led with 850 (4.6, 2nd Tm FRAA). Carlton Thomas (PS#35) had 361 (4.9). They moved Samuel back from LB and he st'd 3 (240, 2.9). All 3 RB's missed NMSt and walk-on Brandon Harton (5'6" 174 Jr) who won the 300m hurdles in GA twice, led and was #3 (247, 4.7). This year they lose FB Bruce Figgens (8 st, 96 yd) and Thomas. Crowell should stay healthier and they add another VHT in PS#2 Keith Marshall (IFS) and are much deeper and more experienced.

RECEIVERS - LY UGA had to replace one of the top WR's in college football in AJ Green (#1DC) along with their #2 rec Kris Durham (#4DC). The unit was loaded with big, fast VHT's with the leading returnees being WR's Tavarres King (PS#6, 504, 18.7), Marlon Brown (PS#3, 133, 12.1) and TE Orson Charles (PS#2, 422, 16.2). Charles was a Mackey finalist (#3, 574, 12.8). King had 205 in the bowl and finished #1 with 705 (15.0) and true frosh Malcolm Mitchell (PS#18) was #2 (665, 14.8, 3rd Tm FRAA). Brown had just 234 (15.6) in 5 sts. TY they lose 2nd Tm AA TE Charles (14 st, #4DC CIN), TE Aron White (1 st, 101 yds) and Mitchell was at DB in the spg. This group is more exp'd.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '10 UĞA had 155 car sts ret so I expected big time improvement. Surprisingly they slipped to 143 (4.1) rush and 25 sks (7.0%). LY they had to replace 3 st'rs (9Y st exp) incl a 1st Tm SEC OL then lost Trinton Sturdivant to an ACL (7 st '10). The unit ret 2 st'rs but 86 car sts. While the ypg improved to 164, the ypc slipped to 3.9 (33 sk, 7.6%). TY they lose 4th Tm AA C Ben Jones (14 st, #4DC HOU), 3rd Tm AA OT Cordy Glenn (14 st, #2DC BUF) and RT Justin Anderson (14 st, #7DC IND) who comb for 125 car sts! While they have 2 ret sts again (3 that st'd 7+) they drop to 31 car sts TY. Still, I felt the L2Y's units underachieved and TY's could match their production.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '10 they had to replace 3 DL's (comb 26 sts) who were #4, #7 and #7 DC's. DC Grantham's system is similar to Bama's and requires a massive NT. They had 1 str back and slipped allowing 147 ypg (3.7, 24 sk). LY they had to replace 1 str and 2 bkps but landed 351 lb, PS#5JC John Jenkins and moved PS#3 DeAngelo Tyson to DE. I said they would be much stronger up front and UGA finished #11 in the FBS allowing just 101 ypg rush (3.2) and had 35 sks. This year they lose DE Tyson (11 st, 20 tkl, 1.5 sk, #7DC BAL) but have 7 of the top 8 back and Jenkins didn't arrive until the fall LY. They also move in OLB's Cornelius Washington (6 st, 5 sk) and PS#3 Ray Drew. The proj st'rs are all PS#24 or better and this is one of the best D-lines in the country.

LINEBACKERS - In '10 UGA had to replace a 1st Tm SEC LB (#1 tkl'r, #3DC) and 2 bkps (7 st, 32 tkl). They shifted to a 3-4 and 2nd Tm SEC DE Justin Houston moved to LB. Houston (1st Tm AA) was the #3 tkl'r but also had 10 sks, 8.5 tfl and 44 qbh. UGA's LB corps were banged up in both '08 and '09 but healthier in '10 (22.1 ppg). LY they had to replace Houston (#3DC), a 2nd Tm SEC LB (#1 tkl'r, #3DC), their #4 tkl'r (2 st) and #7 (7 st). They did add in USC transfer Jarvis Jones (PS#23). I noted that UGA's D had underperformed recently and while it was less exp'd they could surprise and they allowed 20.6 ppg (best s/'07, 52 ypg less). Jones earned 1st Tm AA (70 tkl, 13.5 sk, 6 tfl, 49 qbh) and turned down the NFL. This year the 2 deep returns intact (#2, #3, #7, #9, #10 tkl'rs) and they add in VHT Josh Harvey-Clemons (PS#1). This is one of, if not the best, LB corps in the nation.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - UGA had a veteran secondary in '08 but after finishing #8 and #17 in my PDR, they surprisingly dropped to #57. In '09 they had to replace 2 st'rs (#3DC) and dropped to #74. In '10 they had to replace 3 st'rs (#5DC) The unit played better than expected (#29, 55%, 15-16). After giving up 380 pass yds to Ark, they benched their SS and ČB (Šhawn Williams and Sanders Commings took over) and allowed 170 ypg pass the final 10. Last year they basically had all 4 starters back and the Bulldogs improved to #11 (50.7%, 12-20). S Bacarri Rambo earned 1st Tm AA. This year they lose 4th Tm AA CB Brandon Boykin (14 st, 55 tkl, 3 int, 9 pbu, #4DC PHI) but return 4 of their top 5 and add in PS#5 and PS#17 soph's. It'll be tough to move up much in my PDR, especially without their top CB and 3 starters susp for at least the opener but this unit is even stronger.

SPECIAL TEAMS - I was shocked at where UGA finished in my ST rankings in '11. In the L10Y UGA has had 8 Top 24 ST finishes (5 top 7). K Blair Walsh (#6DC MIN) was a 2-time Groza semi and P Drew Butler (Ray Guy '09) both ret'd along with some dangerous RM like Brandon Boykin (24.3 KR) and Brandon Smith (14.3 PR). They finished #7 in my ST rankings in '10 and I called them the best ST unit in the country. It was shocking as Walsh (55-68 car FG's) hit just 21-35 (L56). Butler still avg 44.2 but his net dropped from 40.6 in '10 to 35.8. UGA avg 6.7 on PR before a 92 yd td in the bowl and avg 21.6 on KR. They all'd 4 return td's and Richt said "Our ST's were mostly average to scary." UGA plummeted to #81 and TY lose their K/P combo plus their top RM and could drop even further.

OACHES - Mark Richt is in his 12th ssn here and earned SEC COY honors in '02 and '05. He was the OC at Flor St from '94-'00. Richt turned the play calling over to Mike Bobo prior to the GT game in '06. Bobo was a QB here and the QB cch s/'01 and became the youngest coor (32) in the SEC in '07.DC Todd Grantham has 11 yrs of NFL coaching exp (DAL DL'08-'09, CLE '05-'07). He is currently one of the highest paid FBS asst

PHIL'S FORECAST

In Richt's 2nd ssn ('02) he led UGA to their first SEC Title in 20 yrs and set a schl record with 13 wins (#3 AP). In '03 they finished 11-3 and #7. In '04 they beat FL for the 1st time s/97 and finished 10-2 (#7). In '05 they had to replace 6 NFL DC's and my publication was the only one to call for UGA to win the SEC East (most had them 3rd). They thrashed LSU 34-14 in the SEC Title game but after an upset loss to WV in the Sugar Bowl, only finished #10. Only UGA and USC finished in the Top 10 each year from '02-'05. UGA's D finished in the top 20 for 7 str yrs ('01-'07). Richt became just the 5th SEC HC to win 10+ in 4 straight yrs (Bryant, Dooley, Fulmer, Spurrier). In '06 they had just 9 ret sts and finished 9-4 (#23). In '07 the SEC media picked hem #3 in the East. I was the only magazine to pick them to win the SEC East and I had them tying for the Title and that they did. After beating Hawaii in the Sugar Bowl 41-10, they finished #2. In '08 they were tagged #1 in the pressn AP poll. In '08 of the 14 sources from football.stassen.com, 10 had UGA either #1 or #2 in the country, but I had UGA 2nd in the East mostly due to a killer schedule. UGA finished 10-3 (#13). In '09 they were #13 a killer scriedule. OdA lillished 10-3 (#13). Iff 09 filey Weller #13 in the pressn AP but surprisingly slipped to 8-5 (-21 ypg SEC). In '10 I did not put Richt on my "Coaches On The Hotseat" list as I figured he could survive a losing season and that proved accurate. UGA lost to UCF in the bowl and had their first losing ssn s/96 at 6-7. That tm did have 4 net close losses. LY UGA only had 12 ret sts but I called them one of the Most Improved Teams and they were my upset pick to win the SEC East as they did not have to face LSU, Ala or Ark out of the West. Things didn't look good early as they lost to Boise then had an amazing loss to Car (basically allowed 4 D/ST td's). UGA then won their next 10. In their closest wins they led Vandy 23-7 but settled for 6 FG's and only won by 5. Vs Fla they had a 354-226 yd edge but due to poor ST play, only won by 4. They had clinched a berth in the SEC Title game when they beat GT 31-17. They held #1 ranked LSU to zero FD's in the 1H and had a 135-12 yd edge. Unfortunately they gave up a PR for a td and later an IR td and actually lost by 32 despite a 296-237 yd edge. It was another hard luck loss in the bowl to Mich St in 3OT. TY they again avoid SU, Ala and Ark and have 16 ret sts and were +155 ypg in the SEC, 3rd best. If you incl the results of the SEC Title gm, they were #2. LY they did have just 3 true SEC AG's and TY have just 3 SEC HG's. UGA a legitimate Nat'l Title contender.
