POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - My '11 forecast for UW would have been different (I had tied for 1st Leaders) as I was anticipating inexp Jon Budmayr (134, 80%, 1-0) as the str. In June when my magazine was already on the newsstands, Russell Wilson made the decision to transfer to Madison after being released by NCSt. Wilson entered the ssn #3 among active QB's in tll yds (9,628) and td (93) and had a streak of 379 passes w/o an int in '08-'09. He led the ACC in TD passes for 3 str yrs. Yes, having a college QB of that caliber would have made a big difference in my forecast. Budmayr couldn't throw in Aug (shoulder) and DNP. RFR Joe Brennan (PS#47) was the only other schlp QB available and became the bkp. Wilson spent 10-12 hrs a day learning the new offense and was elected a team captain. He threw for 3,175 (72.8%) with an incredible 33-4 ratio (338 rush) easily surpassing John Stocco's single ssn UW record of 21 td passes. He departs as the NCAA's all-time single ssn (191.8) pass eff leader (Colt Brennan 186.0 Hawaii, '06) and with the FBS record of 38 str gms with a td. He would have been a Heisman finalist had UW not given up essentially 2 Hail Mary td's to lose to MSU and OSU. Brennan played in 6 (6-15-48). TY Brennan, Budmayr, Joel Stave (6'5" 223 rFr, PS#122) and Curt Phillips (PS#18) will all likely step aside as another "free agent" pickup in MD trans Danny O'Brien. While he was also the ACC FPOY ('10) like Wilson, he is NOT Russell Wilson (#3DC SEA) so I look for a drop in the #s even though O'Brien is a good fit for this offense.

RUNNING BACKS - UW had a streak of 10 str yrs with a 1,000 yd rusher until inj's slowed down the top back in '03 and '04. UW started a new streak in '05 which is now 7 yrs strong. John Clay (PS#3) was #2 in '08 with 884 (5.7). Clay rushed for 1,517 (5.3) in '09 with 18 td's. True frosh Montee Ball (PS#64) rushed for 391 (4.0). In '10 this unit nearly set an NCAA record, coming up just 4 yds short of having THREE 1,000 yd rushers. Clay rushed for 1,012 but his 5.4 ypc was the lowest of the 3. Bielema said the diff between the RB's was that Clay was 1st gear, Ball was 2nd gear and White was 3rd. True frosh James White (PS#59) led with 1,052 (6.7) and he and Ball became the 2nd duo in schl hist to top 150 in the same gm (Mich). Ball (996, 6.1, 18 td) had 132 in the bowl. LY Clay left early for the NFL. Ball dropped 25 lbs (quicker, faster) and led the FBS in rush yds (1923, 6.3). The schl record for td's in a season was 24 (Brian Calhoun, '05) and Ball crushed that with 33 rush and 6 rec tying the NCAA record (Barry Sanders, '88). He was also a Heisman finalist. UW had a streak of 916 consec touches

without a fumble by their RB's end vs Illinois while the RB streak for fumbles lost reached 1,011 (end PSU). White rushed for 713 (5.1) and Jeffrey Lewis (4.39 spd) had 187 (5.7) as a rFr. Dynamic Melvin Gordon (6'1" 205 rFr, PS#26) ply'd in 3 (98, 4.9) before being RS. FB Bradie Ewing (8 st, 246 rec yd, 12, #5DC ATL) departs but with Ball's return (turned down NFL), this is one of the top RB units in the country.

RECEIVERS - While the TE is usually a big part of UW's offense (TE #1 rec in '08 & '10), LY they had to replace their top TE and with the addition of a QB like Wilson, were able to get the ball downfield more. WR Nick Toon (PS#14) was the leading returnee and he finished #2 with 926 (14.5). Jared Abbrederis emerged and led with 933 (17.0). TE Jacob Pedersen was #3 with 356 (11.9). This year they lose Toon (#4DC NO) as well as TE Jake Byrne (13 st, 1 rec). With the top WR and top TE back, I'll call this unit up a notch.

OFFENSIVE LINE - When I think of Wisc, I think of big O-lines and power rush attacks. In '10 the unit had 9 of their top 10 in the (107 car sts) and avg 320 lbs. I called them the #2 OL in the country. The huge OL opened holes for 246 ypg rush (5.5) with just 14 sks (5.1%). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm AA LT (#1DC), 1st Tm AA LG (#3DC) and their RG (8 st, #7DC). They got back Josh Oglesby (10 st '09, inj '10) so they basically had 3 str's back. The #s were slightly down at 236 ypg (5.4) with 25 sks (7.6%). TY they lose 1st Tm AA C Peter Konz (11 st, 3Y str, #2DC ATL), 1st Tm AA RG Kevin Zeitler (14 st, 3Y str, #1DC CIN) and 1st Tm B10 RT Oglesby (13 st, 2Y str). They go from 74 car sts to 49 and must replace 3 VHT str's but this is still a large group (avg 6'5" 321) and remains one of the B10's strongest units.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '09 UW's inexp DL all'd a B10 best 88 ypg rush (2.9). Despite JJ Watt's emergence in '10, the DL slipped to 128 ypg (3.9, 23 sks). LY they had to replace Watt (#1DC) but had 7 of the top 8 back (most exp in 3Y). David Gilbert was very impressive but OFY (4 st). The numbers slipped again to 153 ypg and their 4.3 ypc was their weakest s/'05 (25 sks). TY UW loses DE Louis Nzegwu (14 st, 38 tkl, 4.5 sk, 2.5 tfl) and DT Patrick Butrym (14 st, 23 tkl, 3.5 tfl) but have 8 of the top 10 back plus Gilbert returns. The staff was also high on rFr Jesse Hayes (PS#58) and James Adeyanju (PS#84) LY. Despite going from 3 ret sts to 2, UW should be stouter up front in '12.

LINEBACKERS - In '09 rFr Mike Taylor (PS#66) was the #1 tkl'r before he was OFY after 7 gms. True frosh Chris Borland took his place and earned Big Ten FPOY (#5 tkl'r). The Badgers allowed an impressive 306 ypg (#17 FBS). In '10 the Badgers had 2 ret sts at LB for the 3rd str yr. Borland was OFY after 2 sts while Taylor was slowed by a knee brace. They had their top 4 LB's all available for a total of just 6 plays on the ssn but still all'd just 322 ypg (#20 FBS). LY they had to replace 2 str's (#1 and #2 tkl'r) and 1 bkp. UW allowed just 19 ppg (best s/'06) with Taylor and Borland both earning 1st Tm B10 (comb 293 tkl, 28 tfl). TY they only lose SLB Kevin Claxton (10 st, #6 tkl'r, 6.5 tfl) but this remains one of the Big Ten's best LB corps.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - UW finished #7 in my PDR in '04, #19 in '05 and #2 in '06. They slipped to #57 in '07, #35 in '08 and #45 in '09. In '10 the unit ret'd intact so it surprised me that they only finished #43. LY they had to replace 2 str's. Bielema said that Antonio Fenelus was the best CB he's had here but the other CB Devin Smith was OFY after 2 gm. Inconsistency haunted the unit (big plays all'd vs MSU and OSU) and UW slipped to #61 (60.8%, 15-16 vs light slate opp). TY they lose 1st Tm B10 CB Fenelus (14 st, 51 tkl, 4 int, 5 pbu) and 1st Tm B10 FS Aaron Henry (14 st, 67 tkl, 4 int, 4 pbu). Despite losing their top 2 DB's, they could move up a little in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In Bielema's first year UW finished #44 in my ST rankings, moved up to #13 in '07 but only #93,

#89 and #84 heading into '11. LY they ret'd their P and K but had to replace their top PR (10.2) and KR (24.4). Philip Welch was UW's #2 all-time career FG% heading into the season (77.1%, 54-70, L57) but was banged up (quad) and hit just 5-6 (L52). He missed 4 gms with Kyle French (PS#9) hitting 3-5 (both miss 50+). Alec Lerner and Welch combined for 17 TB on 102 KO. Nortman who avg 42.7 (37.6 net) in '10, avg 42.2 (net 37.9) but he had 2 pivotal blk'd P in the losses to MSU and OSU thanks to breakdowns up front. Jared Abbrederis was an outstanding PR (#3 FBS 15.8) and KR (24.6). This year they lose 4 yr starters Nortman (#6DC CAR) and Welch and may take a step back in my ST rankings (#54 LY).

COACHES - Barry Alvarez hand picked Bret Bielema to replace him. In '04 Bielema was brought in from K-St as the DC, and was the NCAA's 2nd youngest HC when he took over. After a 12-1 debut in '06, he was the B10 COY. In '10 UW shared the conf title and won the inaugural B10 Title game LY. In the L2Y 2 coor's have moved on (HC's N III & Pitt). The new OC is Matt Canada (OC Indy and NI). Chris Ash, who spent 8 of the previous 10Y as the Iowa ST DB cch (SDST DB cch '07-'08) and in his 2nd ssn as co-DC along with Charlie Partridge (DL cch here s/'08). 2012 will mark the staff's biggest turnover s/'06.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Bret Bielema has done a fine job taking over for B10 legend Barry Alvarez and is now 60-19 finishing #7, #24, NR, #16, #7 and #10. Ironically, his weakest ssn came in '08 when they had 16 ret sts and were #13 preseason (finished '7-6). That put them well under the radar in '09 and despite opening 5-0 they were unranked. UW's '08 squad was -8 in TO's, had 48 sts lost, and a def ypg of 12.4, all signs which pointed towards '09 success. UW went 10-3 including a win over Miami, FI in the Champs Sports Bowl. That '09 squad had just 10 ret sts and in '10 they had 16 back from a tm that was +81 ypg in B10 play. At 5-1 they had ESPN Gameday on hand for a night game in Madison where they upset #1 Ohio St. They won a share of the B10 Title for the first time s/'99 rising to #4 but lost to #3 TCU 21-19 in the Rose Bowl getting stopped on a 2 pt conv with 2:00 left. UW was +81 ypg in B10 play (84 ypg weaker than #1 OSU). LY they had just 13 ret sts and lost the B10's pass eff leader. I mentioned they benefitted from +14 in TO's and signs pointed to not matching their 11 wins from '10. However, over the summer UW got the huge addition of Russell Wilson (led ACC in td passes prev 3Y). Given that info along with the fact that neither Jim Tressel or Joe Paterno would be around when they faced UW (both HC when mag was published), I would have picked UW for 1st as opposed to TIED for 1st in the Leaders div. With Wilson and RB Ball they dominated their first 6 foes (incl Neb) by 40.5 ppg. The next 2 wks they took on motivated Hnd's and lost to Mich St and OSU. Both gms were similar as they trailed by 2 scores in the 4Q but rallied to either tie or lead only give up a long td pass in the final seconds. UW whipped Pur and Minn but vs Ill were outgained 301-285 and trailed 17-7 at half. Thanks to TO's and ST errors which gave them a short field, UW rallied for a 28-17 win. In the game which determined the division, they destroyed PSU 45-7. In the B10 Title gm, UW benefitted from a 4&5, 36 yd comp which set up their go ahead td and a roughing of the P pen which overturned a Mich St return to their 3. In the Rose Bowl they were outgained 621-508 by Oreg and finished with 3 losses. TY they only have 11 ret sts. The Badgers were +155.5 ypg (B10 best) and did have 2 net close losses but also benefitted from +16 in TO's and had an off ypg of 10.6. They signed another ACC QB, RB Ball turned down the NFL and the D should be improved. UW will return to the B10 Title game.

First meeting. Wisconsin has won 16 str Camp Randall openers by 20 pgg. Panthers went 10-3 LY (FCS playoffs) incl a 20-19 loss vs Iowa St. UNI had a 385-328 yd edge but allowed the GW td w/40 left.

This will mark the first trip to Corvallis for Wisconsin (2-0 vs OSU). Under Bielema, the Badgers are 4-0 when traveling out west/HI. The Badgers have won 10 str road/neutral openers by 13 ppg (4 vs BCS).

The only time these schools played was in 1968 in Madison with Utah St pulling the shutout 20-0. UW has won 26 str reg ssn gms vs non-conf FBS tms (18-0 under Bielema) by an avg of 21 ppg.

First meeting. Wisconsin has won 10 str in games prior to their conference opener, avg score 34-12. UW has opened up 4-0 each of the L3Y and 4 of Bielema's 6 yrs at the helm (3-1 other 2 ssn).

UW has made just 2 prior trips to Lincoln, in 1965 they lost 37-0 and in '73 lost 20-16. Since '05 the Badgers have gone just 1-6 in Big Ten road openers, with losses the L2/Y at MSU.

LY UW trailed 17-7 at HT but limited Illinois to just 82 yds and forced 4 TO's in their five 2H possessions. The Badgers have won 10 str hosting Big Ten foes with an avg score 52-16.

UW has won 6 str overall (L4 by 31 ppg) & 4 str trips to West Lafayette (L2 trips by 21 pts each). LTH UW trailed 10-6 at HT but allowed just 5 FD's and 130 yds in the 2H.

LY the Badgers raced out to a 21-0 lead and never looked back, 28-6 at HT limiting Minn to 80 yds on 25 plays (3.2 ypp). UW has won 8 str in this series & their last loss hosting Minn was in '94.

LY UW led 14-0 but MSU stormed back to lead 31-17 mid-4Q. UW went on B2B td drives but w/the score tied MSU tossed a "Hail Mary" that was caught near the GL for a td as time exp'd.

Seven str series wins for UW by an avg score of 51-17. LTH ('09) Wisconsin was up by just 3 w/4:01 left getting 3 FD's to seal the win. Wisconsin outrushed IU 294-63 (5.7-2.4).
