

QB Marcus Mariota

QUARTERBACKS—The Ducks always have a productive QB. In '10 they had to replace 1st Tm P12 Jeremiah Masoli (2147, 58%, 15-6). As I recall, Darron Thomas (PS#22) won the starting job (2881, 62%, 30-9, #3 rush w/486) and already had a better year passing than Masoli. Bryan Bennett (PS#28) was the bkp late but still RS. In '11 Thomas set a school td record (33) throwing for 2,761 (62%, 7 int, 206 rush). Bennett got the start in gm 7 vs Colo (11-20-156-2-0) and later came off the bench vs Wash St after Thomas threw 2 int's. He threw for 369 (54%, 6-0, 200 rush) in 8 gms. LY Bennett battled Marcus Mariota (PS#31) who was the star of the spring. Mariota won the job becoming the first Fr Duck QB to start the opener s/9/11 (Danny O'Neill). He earned 1st Tm P12 (2677, 68.5%, 32-6, 752 rush) while Bennett played in 10 (2037-211). Mariota had an 86 yd td run vs Arizona St (longest QB run in UO hist) and became the first Duck since Joey Harrington ('00) to run, pass and catch a td in 1 gm. TY RfR Jake Rodrigues (PS#15) and Jeff Lockie (PS#70) will battle for the bkp spot as Bennett trans. As long as Mariota stays healthy, he could improve on LY's numbers and is an early Heisman contender.

RUNNING BACKS—UO has had a long list of outstanding RB's and now has a streak of 6 str yrs with a 1,000 yd rusher. It began with Jonathan Stewart (PS#1) who had 1,722 (6.2) in '07 (#1DC). In '08 Jeremiah Johnson led with 1,201 (7.1) while LaGarrette Blount had 1,002 (7.3) and 17 td's (2nd UO coach to each top 1000). In '09 r/r LaMichael James was the P1000 OPOY with 1,546 (6.7). James was then a Heisman finalist in '10 breaking Stewart's single season record with 1,731 (5.9). Kenjon Barner was #2 (551, 6.1). Those 2 ret'd in '11 and they added in true frosh DeAnthony Thomas (PS#2) to make up my #1 rated RB corps. James led the nation in ypg rushing breaking his own schl rec with 1,805 (7.3, 18 td) while Barner ran for 939 (6.2). LY James left early for the NFL (#2DC). Thomas (595, 10 rec) (11) rushed for 701 (7.6) and led in rec's (45) finishing #2 in rec yds (445, 9.9). True frosh Byron Marshall (PS#12) added 447 (5.1). Barner rushed for a schl rec 321 yds and 5 td's vs USQ and was a 1st TM AA. Former walk-on Ayele Forde (given schl spg) added 139 (5.1). Barner was #1 (1767, 6.4, 21 td's, 256 rec, 12.8, #6DC CAR) but as usual it's next man up and UO will again have one of the top RB corps in the country.

RECEIVERS - UO has surprisingly lacked true game-breaking WR's recently. It was a very inexp'd group in '11. HC Chip Kelly brought in a solid class of true fresh to add speed, but opted to go with the veterans. The #1 and #5 rec were both RB. LY they had to replace their top 2 WR's (comb 1037, 13.1). The leading returnee was Josh Huff (430, 13.9). Huff missed 2 with a leg inj early and had just 3 rec over the next 3 (not 100%) before posting 27 rec's over the last 6. He was #1 in yds (493, 15.4) with a tm-high 7 t'ds. Once again RB's were 2

of the top 4 rec's. TE Colt Lyerla who has the size, speed and athleticism to be an NFL prospect was #3 (392, 15.7). Keanon Lowe (PS#26) had 244 (11.1) and true fro Bralon Addison (PS#26) had 243 (11.0). 6'4" Daryle Hawkins (PS#161) had 202 (8.1). RfR BJ Kelley (6'2" 181, PS#178) added 103 (17.2). TY they lose Will Murphy (2 st, 181, 9.5) and Rahsaan Vaughn (7 rec) but have by far their most exp'd rec corps in yrs and continue to upgrade the talent.

OFFENSIVE LINE - LY UO had to replace a #6DC RG and a 2Y starting LT. They then lost LG Carson York (3y str) after 2gms giving them just 2 str's back (7 of top 10). Returning str RT Nick Cody was moved to RG and only std 6. Naturally in a spread offense which features the run, they've put up some incredible totals. The rush ypg climbed for a 3rd str yr to 315Y ypg although their ypc "fell" from an FBS best 6.7 to 6.0 (19 sk, 5.1%). TY they lose G Ryan Clanton (13 st), Cody, York and LG Kyle Long (5 st, #1DC CH) but ret 7 of the top 10 incl 4th Tm AA C Hroniss Grasu, 1st Tm P12 LT Tyler Johnstone and 3rd Tm P12 RT Jake Fisher. Those 3 all-stars were all underclassmen LY and with 55 car sts. they are more exp'd and stronger.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '11 the Ducks had to replace 3 st/rs incl two 2nd Tm P12 DL. I mentioned that despite being less exp'd, UO would come close to '10's numbers and they did all'g 143 ypg rush (3.6) with 45 sks, topping their modern day high of 39 ('08). LY they had to replace an HM P12 DE (14 st, 5.5 sk) and another DE (2 st). They retd 1st Tm P12 DE Dion Jordan (7.5 sk). Unfortunately the unit was hit hard by injuries late in the year with 3 DL st/rs out vs Cal and 2 true frosh making their first sts. UO allowed nearly the same ypg (145) but the ypc rose to 4.0 with just 28 sks. TY they lose 2x 1st Tm P12 Jordan (12 st, 44 tkl, 5 sk, #1DC MIA) and DT Isaac Remington (10 st, 22 tkl, 4 tfl) but 3rd Tm P12 DT Taylor Hart (8 sk) and 6 of the top 8 return. Jordan was the 3rd overall pick, the highest a UO defensive player has been drafted (DB Alex Molden 11th overall in 1996). After underachieving a little LY, this unit can only stay healthier down the stretch and will produce stronger numbers.

LINEBACKERS - UO usually does a good job replacing their LB's because they play their bkps so much. In '10 they had a veteran LB corps (#2, #3, #12 and #14 tk'l's back) and allowed just 18.7 ppg (best s'/92). In '11 they had to replace 2 st'r's (#1, #3 tk'l'r's) returning just their #8, #10 and #13 tk'l'r's. The Ducks slipped to allowing 24.6 ppg. Boseko Lokombo (PS#39) was the most athletic of the LB's but surprisingly did not start. Michael Clay (PS#52) was tied for the P12 lead in tkls when he missed 3 (inj). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm P12 SLB (#6 tk'l'r, #5DC) and their #3 tk'l'r (13 st). UO had 3 solid proj st'r's and 3 VHT bkps. Michael Clay (Tm MVP) was the #1 tk'l'r adding 10 tfl while Kiko Alonso (#2DC BUF) was the #2 tk'l'r with 14 tfl. Both earned 2nd Tm P12. TY those 2 depart and once again 7 of the top 9 are back led by their #8, #10 and #12 tk'l'r's with 11 VHT's in the group incl a PS#48JC (IFS). Still, this unit is a little less exp'd than LY and might be down just a notch.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Ducks have finished in the Top 25 of my PDR in 8 of the last 9 yrs. In '11 they were #20 (59%, 25-17). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm P12 ROV (#4 tkl'r) and a CB (8 st, 24 tkl). 1st Tm P12 FS John Boyett (PS#39) was OFY in the opener. Avery Patterson moved into his spot and had 2 IR td's and an int in 3 str gms but then was OFY vs Cal. Still, the Ducks moved up to #7 (58.8%, 19-26) and their 26 int were #1 in the NCAA. TY they lose Boyett (#6DC IND) but return everyone else incl soph CB ffo Ekpre-Obomu (PS#21) who earned 3rd Tm AA (20 pd, 3rd best mark FBS, 4 int, 16 pbu). While they won't move up much in my PDR, they are more exp'd and boast 2 NFL caliber CB's.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In '07 UO had to replace its P and K but brought back their excellent ST coor Tom Osborne. In his previous 6 yrs here ('95-'00), they finished #30, #22, #4, #15, #13 and #47 in my ST rankings. Jackson Rice was a Ray Guy finalist in '11 (41.4 net, #1 FBS) but LY his avg dropped to 40.0 (37.4 net). Alejandro Maldonado improved to 13 TB on 98 KO (only 1 of last 27) while Rob Beard had 0 TB on 11 KO. The Ducks only avg 20.0 on KR (#97) because of many squibs as their net KR start was the 37 yd line (#22). De'Anthony Thomas avg 17.1 on PR with 1 td but the Ducks plummeted to #77. Despite losing their K & P, they added in a PS#1K and a JUCO P and should improve in Osborne's 7th year.

COACHES - A new standard has been set among college coaches as Chip Kelly departed after a 4 year stretch with 46 wins and 4 BCS Bowl appearances! The torch has been passed to 4Y OC Mark Helfrich who was previously the OC/QB cch at Colo ('06-'08). Scott Frost was named the OC after 4Y's as WR cch here. Frost (#3DC NYJ) was the starting QB for the 13-0 '97 Nat'l Champ Nebraska team. DC Nick Aliotti (15th yr) continues on his 3rd stint here. He was the architect of the "Gang Green" D ('94) that started the UO revival and ret'd to the school in '99 after being the DC at UCLA in '98.

In '04 UO had a streak of 10 straight winning yrs snapped (5-6). In '05 they were my #4 Most Improved team and almost made it to a BCS bowl at 10-2 (#12). In '07 UO was one of my Surprise Teams (non-top 10 with chance at title) and they were headed for the BCS Title game but lost QB Dennis Dixon to injury when ranked #2 and lost their final 3 reg ssn gm to finish 9-4. In '08 they finished #10 and in '09 #11. In '10 eight of my 9 sets of PR's called them the best team in the P10. The Ducks avg'd 47.0 ppg and 531 ypg while holding opp's to just 18.7 ppg. UO had just one close game, a 15-13 escape at Cal and played in the BCS Title game. They were the AP #1 for the first time in school history for 7 wks (6 grns) but lost to Aub by 3. UO benefited from +13 in TO's and had just 6 sts lost to injury all year. In '10 they used a 25 man rotation on the D but were not as deep in '11. While I picked the Ducks to win the inaugural Pac-12 Title, I did not place them in the Nat'l Title game. They entered the ssn as the AP #3 (highest ever pressn) but in front of basically an LSU home crowd in Cowboys Stadium, they lost the opener 40-27 (335-273 yd edge). The Ducks would bounce back and win their next 9, even blowing out #3 Stanford 53-30 but then were upset by USC at home, 38-35. They beat Wisc in the Rose Bowl and finished #4. LY the Ducks had just 10 ret sts and had to face pressn #1 USC on the road. I said they would be 8-0 for their showdown with USC on Nov 3rd and they were. UO had an interesting pattern early in the season in the fact that they would jump out to huge leads like 50-3 vs Ark St or 56-0 to Col but would then let up in the 2H. They beat USC 62-51 (737 yds!) and appeared headed for the Nat'l Title but Stanford, a team they had handled easily each of the last 2 years, beat them in Autzen, 17-14 in OT, their 2nd Nov loss at home in 2Y. UO came into that game #1 in the AP. They whipped OSU 48-24 but didn't even play for the P12 Title game then beat K-St 35-17 in the Fiesta Bowl to finish #2. TY the Ducks have 15 ret sts and were +144.8 ypg in P12 play (#1 conf play by 66 ypg). They lose HC Kelly and did benefit from +21 in TO's LY. TY UO has to play Stanford on the road but avoids USC and Ariz St out of the South. The Ducks figure to be a tdl+ favorite in all of their games TY with the exception of Stanford. They did knock off #3 Stanford on the road in '11 and are a legitimate National Title contender despite the loss of Kelly.
