
(LAHOMA ST COWBOYS



ARTERBACKS - Mike Gundy has had a history of fine QB's that he's coached here in Stillwater with Zac Robinson topping Gundy ('86-'89) as the career leader ('06-'09) then Brandon Weeden doing the same ('08-'11). Weeden threw for 4,727 (72%) with a 37-13 ratio as a Sr and was a #1DC CLE (str). He was 23-3 as a starter. Clint Chelf (PS#97) played in 5 (307, 67%, 3-0) as the bkp to Weeden in '10. LY Chelf battled rFr JW Walsh (PS#10) and true frosh Wes Lunt (PS#21) during spg. Gundy named the Weeden-esque Lunt (6'4" 215) the starter. the 1st true frosh QB to start an opener since at least 1950. The first lesson for young QB's is: don't transfer when things don't look good. Chelf entered the spring as the st'r, was demoted to 3rd string but stuck around. Lunt was inj'd in Wk 3 on the first series (51-75-588 at time). JW Walsh, who is the most mobile of the 3 (290, 5.8 rush LY), guided the win vs Louisiana and st'd the next 3. He was inj'd vs ISt in the 1Q but gutted through the rest of the game hitting 32-47-415. He was originally thought to be OFY due to the injury but ret'd and they developed a J-Dub package with him running the ball (14 rushes last 4 gm). Lunt st'd vs TCU and K-St but was inj'd and it was Chelf's job the rest of the way, even in gm 12 when all 3 were healthy. As you can see by the stats to the right, all 3 topped 1,000 with Walsh having the best % (66.9%) and ratio (13-3) while Chelf led with 1,588 yds. Lunt (1108, 61.8%, 6-7) didn't abide by the first lesson deciding to leave the program in early May but quite a bit of talent still remains. I believe that the OSt QB's can only maintain better health and improve upon LY's 63% and 34-16 ratio.

S - OSt has now had six straight 1,000 yd backs. In '10 Kendall Hunter rushed for 1,548 (5.7) while Joseph Randle led the B12 Fr in all-purp yds (1160) as he was the best rec among the RB's (427, 11.5) and finished as the #2 rusher (452, 5.5). Jeremy Smith was the best downhill runner (262, 4.7) with most of his carries in the RZ (7 td). Randle kept the 1,000 yd streak alive in '11 rushing for 1,216 (5.8) and 24 td's (43 rec's) and Smith was #2 with 646 (7.1) and 9 td's. LY Randle was, by far, the key RB with 1,417 (5.2) and 224 (8.0) rec while Smith had 371 (5.3) and Desmond Roland (PS#52), who had 95 (5.6) as a true, was #3 with 301 (6.5). TY with Randle (#5DC DAL) leaving early, the streak is very much in question.

RS - OSt has had some fine receivers incl Dez Bryant (#1DC). In Aug of '10 then-OC Dana Holgorsen wondered if a go-to WR would emerge. Justin Blackmon answered with 1,782 (16.1) and 20 td's in '10 and 1,522 (12.5) and 18 td's in 111 winning the Biletnikoff Award an amazing 2 str years. LY they had to replace 3 of their top 4 (incl Blackmon, #1DC) and the top

returnee, Tracy Moore, played in just 4 (259, 12.9). Speedster Isaiah Anderson, their #2 returnee, was banged up (407, 18.5) Blake Jackson (PS#6JC) was #2 with 598 (19.9) but had 2 dropped td passes vs Baylor (settled for fg's). Josh Stewart (291, 15.3 '11) led with 1,210 (12.0). Charlie Moore (7 rec '10-'11) excited fan's with 243 yds in the spring game and had two 100 yd gms during the yr but just 3 rec in the last 4 reg ssn gms and finished #3 (542, 15.5). TY they only lose Anderson (5 st) and a bkp TE (1st). This group should put up improved numbers.

VELINE - Part of the success of this OL can be attributed to the quick throws from the no-huddle offense. In '10 OSt had to replace a 1st Tm AA (#1DC) and two 3Y st'rs. They ret'd just 12 car sts (#117 FBS) but surprisingly rushed for 174 ypg (5.0, 10 sk). In '11 they had 5 ret st'rs (76 car sts) but avg only 159 ypg (5.3, 12 sk). LY they had to replace the B12 OL POY (2Y st'r at C), a 1st Tm AA OT (2Y st'r), another 2Y st'r and a LT. They had fewer car sts (58) returning but improved to 215 ypg rush (5.4). OSU has all'd just 73 sks s/07, the 3rd fewest among FBS opp's trailing only Air Force and Boise St. This vr they lose 1st Tm B12 RG Lane Taylor (13 st. 4Y st'r). C Evan Epstein (12 st) and LG Jonathan Rush (8 st). Brandon Webb st'd the final 5 at LG so they have 3 ret st'rs and while the car sts drop to 38, this will be another solid unit.

WE LINE - The Cowboys allowed a schl record low 96 ypg rush (3.0) in '09 but slipped to 134 ypg (3.5, 30 sk) in '10 and 185 ypg (4.4) in '11. LY they had to replace both DE's incl a 1st Tm B12 DE (8 sk). The top returning DL had just 2 sks but they added in PS#15JC Calvin Barnett making them more exp'd (1 ret st'r '11) and stronger. The rush D improved to 142 (3.8, 25 sk). TY they lose DE Nigel Nicholas (5 st, 4 sk), DE Ryan Robinson (13 st, 2.5 sk), DE Cooper Bassett (8 st, 0 sk) and 3 others (11 tkl). Barnett was the B12 D Newcomer POY and soph James Castleman (PS#101) began spring of '12 as 3rd string before starting 11 (3rd Tm B12). Despite losing 2 strs, the DL only accounted for 12.5 sks LY and the run D should remain solid with their 2 All-Conf players back.

ACKERS - In '11 OSt had to replace its #1 tkl'r (1st Tm B12), #2 tkl'r and a bkp (15 tkl). Johnny Thomas (#4 tkl'r in '10) lost his spot to impressive trué frosh Shaun Lewis (PS#14, #6 tkl'r, Fr AA). LY they had to replace Thomas (#14 tkl'r) but LB was the deepest area on the tm as the 3 st'rs had 3 solid bkps. The LB cch said the st'rs played 70-80 plays in '11, but would play just 40-50 in '12 because of the depth. Those 3 bkps comb'd for 77 tkl, 5.5 sk and 11 tfl. TY they lose #1 tkl'r Alex Elkins (12 st, 3.5 tfl) and Nico Ornelas (18 tkl) but have 4 of the top 6 back (Lyndell Johnson moves to S) incl VHT st'rs Caleb Lavey (PS#47, #3 tkl'r '11, #7 '12) and Lewis (PS#14, #6 tkl'r). S-In '11 OSt had to replace 2 st'rs yet climbed to #3 in my PDR (60%, 15-24). The 24 int's were #2 in the FBS as their CB combo of Brodrick Brown and Justin Gilbert comb'd for 10. Both Brown and SS Markelle Martin were semifinalists for the prestigious Thorpe Award. LY they had to replace SS Martin (#3 tkl'r, 11 pbu, #6DC) but had 7 of the top 8 back. Two bkp S's were dismissed in Oct. Their outstanding CB combo surprisingly had zero int's and OSt dropped to #40 (60.8%, 20-11). TY they lose CB Brown (12 st, 62 tkl, 2 pbu) but move in Johnson from LB Seven of the top 8 are back again and after they underachieved LY, they will more resemble their '11 version.

CIAL TEAMS - Joe DeForest is one of my favorite ST cchs and in his 11 yrs ('01-'11) OSt had 8 Top 20 finishes incl #1 in '10. Quinn Sharp had a tremendous career. He had to wait behind Ray Guy winner Matt Fodge ('08) and a Lou Groza winner Dan Bailey ('10). In '11 Sharp handled all 3 specialty chores for the 1st time hitting 22-25 fg's (L46), an amazing 61 TB on 114 KO's (#1 FBS by 21) and a 46.3 avg on punts (tm net 38.8). He

earned 1st Tm FWAA AA. LY Sharp hit 28-34 fg's ST RANK LGY: (L51) incl a schl rec tying 5 vs TCU. Three of his misses were from 50+. He avg 46.3 on punts (40.9 net!) and also had an FBS leading 71 TB on 103 KO. Justin Gilbert is one of the nation's most explosive RM (3x All B12 KR). In '11 he had 703 (27.0) on KR's. He notched a schl record with his 5th career 12 Tm Net Ave KRtdLY and had 827 (25.8). OSt was #14 in '11 and while DeForest left, Sharp led them to a #8 finish. With Sharp graduating they may have one of the country's largest drops in my ST rankings despite the addition of PS#4 UCLA trans Kip Smith.

ICHES - Mike Gundy was a star QB here and later was the QB coach and OC in the early '90's. He ret'd here in '01 as the asst HC/OC and took over as HC in '05. Gundy, at 38, was the youngest HC in the FBS when hired and he led OSt to a school record 12 wins in '11. Their 3rd OC in 4Y is Mike Yurcich who was OC at Div II Edinboro and at Shippensburg ('11-'12). Glenn Spencer was the asst HC at Duke from '04-'06 before joining the Cowboys. He was a LB cch prior to getting promoted to co-DC LY and he will now handle those duties alone.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In '06 and '07 OSt barely qualified for bowls at 6-6 but recorded B2B bowl wins for the 1st time s/87. In '08 they were 9-4 and #16 (best s/'03). When they knocked off Georgia in '09, OSt entered the Top 5 for the 1st time s/85. Dez Bryant was lost after 3 sts while a banged up RB Hunter had just 3 sts. With a Fiesta Bowl bid on the line vs rival OU, OSt was outgained 367-109 and finished 9-4 (NR). In '10 they were one of the FBS's most inexp'd tms (8 ret sts, 42% lett ret). OSt was picked 5th by the B12 media but the offense emerged under new OC Holgorsen. In the bowl they beat Ariz and finished #13. In '11 they had to replace Holgorsen and RB Hunter from an offense which avo 44.2 ppg but ret'd Weeden and Blackmon. OSt nearly played in the Nat'l Title with a loss on a Thurs night at Iowa St in 2OT costing them that berth. OSt beat #4 Stan and finished #3. LY they had just 12 ret sts (2nd fewest B12) and lost Weeden and Blackmon, They were +21 in TO's in '11 and had 2 net close wins. They had to start 3 diff QB's due to injury. After an 84-0 blowout win over Sav St, they were trading points with Ariz but Lunt threw 3 int and Ariz won by 21. Lunt was inj'd on the first poss vs UL but Walsh threw for 347 (led 58-10 4Q). Texas got a controversial td with :29 left and despite a 576-440 vd edge OSt lost at home. In the rain they led KU 20-0 in the 4Q but only won by 6. They blew out ISt & TCU. Despite K-St's QB Collin Klein missing most of the 2H, OSt trailed 38-17 and lost on the road. They took on their old OC Dana Holgorsen and destroyed WV 55-34 in QB Chelf's first start. They beat TT by 38. They then led Okla the majority of the game despite being outgained 618-490 but the Sooners got a td with :13 left 1H and another with :04 to force OT and OSt lost by 3. In their 2nd str AG they lost by 7 to Baylor. OSt finished tied for 3rd in the B12 but was the 8th pick by the bowls. They were a huge fav vs Purdue and won 58-14 finishing 8-5 (NR). TY OSt has 15 ret sts and they were +47.6 ypg in the B12 (3rd best). The Stock Market Indicator is bullish (+3.5). They had 2 net close losses and 2 net upsets. Two of my 9 sets of power ratings call for an unbeaten year and the other 7 all call for 11 wins making OSt one of my Surprise Teams and a Darkhorse National Title contender.
