## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

**QUARTERBACKS** - Christian Ponder (#1DC) was a 3Y str but was inj'd allowing EJ Manuel (PS#4) to start a comb'd 6 gms in '09 and '10 (incl both bowls). Manuel st'd the next 2Y and in '12 threw for 3,392 (68%), 23-10. He was a #1DC of BUF and won their starting job, but the FSU position actually improved with an untested rFr. I summed up LY's QB paragraph by saying Jameis Winston could be another rFr that contends for national honors and that he did. In his first start, Winston set FSU's record for comp % (92.6%, 25-27-356, 4 td) in a gm (Danny Kanell '95 w/87.5%). After 2 gms he had hit 40-45 att's (89%). He had a 23-4 ratio in the first 7 and finished 40-10 having a positive ratio in every game except Miami (1-2). He became the first frosh QB to win the BCS Nat'l Champ, first frosh to be named ACC POY and the youngest player to ever win the Heisman Trophy (7th largest MOV in modern era despite being left off of 115 of the 900 ballots). Winston threw for 4,057 (66.9%, 219 rush). His bkp, Jacob Coker (PS#38), whose arm strength HC Fisher compared to JaMarcus Russell, played in 7 (250, 50%, 0-1) but has now transferred to Alabama. 6'3" rFr Sean Maguire (PS#42) played in 8 (13-21-116-2-2) and added in rFr Kelvin Franklin (PS#66). I think it will be nearly impossible for Winston to surpass LY's achievements as he attempts to match only Archie Griffin as a 2-time Heisman winner.

**RUNNING BACKS** - With all of the VHT's and NFL caliber talent the Seminoles have compiled at RB, it's amazing that FSU had not had a 1,000 yd rusher since Warrick Dunn in 1996! Heading into LY FSU had just 3 RB's top 900 with none in the previous LBY! In '11 Devonta Freeman (PS#28) led w/579 (4.8) while James Wilder Jr (PS#3) had 160 (4.6). In '12 Chris Thompson (PS#29) appeared on his way to 1,000 w/687 (7.5) but tore his ACL in wk 8. Freeman finished #2 w/660 (5.9) while Wilder added 635 (5.8). True frosh Mario Pender (PS#6) RS. LY they had to replace Thompson (#5DC) and both FB's. A different player led the team in each of their first 4. Wilder finished #3 (563, 7.0). They moved S Karlos Williams (PS#2) to RB and he finished #2 (730, 8.0) with his first carry as a RB being a 65 yd td run vs Nevada. True frosh Ryan Green (PS#9) added 163 (4.9). Freeman finally ended the 16Y drought finishing with 1,016 (5.9, 278 rec) thanks to 164 yds in the ACC & Nat'l Champ gms. Both Freeman (#4DC ATL) and Wilder (UFA) left early for the NFL. FSU also loses FB Chad Abram (7 st). They remain loaded as the other 3VHT's return and they add in true frosh Dalvin Cook (PS#2, IFS).

**RECEIVERS** - The top 4 rec's ret'd in '12 plus they added in rFr Kelvin Franklin (6'5" 242). Rashad Greene (PS#27) led in both '11 (596, 15.7) and '12 (741, 13.0). Kenny Shaw (PS#29) was #2 in '12 w/532 (16.1) and Benjamin was #4 with 495 (16.5). LY 7 ply's from the 4-deep were lost from the end of spg to the

start of the ssn (3 of top 4 TE's) but 4 of their top 6 still ret'd including PS#4 TE Nick O'Leary (252, 12.0). Greene became the first rec here s/'02 (Anquan Boldin) to top 1,000 (1128, 14.8) while Benjamin also joined that elite club w/1,011 (17.8, 15 td). O'Leary was a Mackey finalist w/557 (16.9). TY they lose Shaw (7 st, 933, 17.3) and Benjamin (#1DC CAR). Four of their top 6 return again as Greene tries to be #1 for a 4th straight year and is just 1133 shy of the school's career leader.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In '11 FSU's O-line was decimated by injuries and ended the ssn with 4 true frosh starting (112 ypg, 3.3, 41 sks). In '12 they nearly doubled their rushing total up to 206 ypg (5.6) while all'g just 26 sks (6.1%). LY they had to replace a #2DC RT but had 96 car sts back. I don't want to nitpick on a National Title team, especially an O-line that opened holes for 203 ypg rush (5.6) and avg an amazing 52 ppg, but I still thought this unit underperformed a little, considering they only lost 1 start to inj all year. They allowed 33 sks (7.5%) which tied for 10th in the ACC. TY they lose 1st Tm AA C Bryan Stork (Rimington winner, 3Y str, #4DC NE) & 3 bkps but return 114 car sts, add in 2 VHT JUCO's and will be one of the best OL's in the country.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '12 I called this the best D-line in the country saying their 3rd string would likely make my preseason top 39. They needed a lot of depth as preseason 1st Tm AA Brandon Jenkins was OFY in wk 1 and PS#1 Jacobbi McDaniel RS. FSU still all'd just 92 ypg (2.8, 36 sk). LY they had to replace 4 NFL DC's (#1, #2, #5 & #7) plus their other starting DT and a bkp. Mario Edwards (PS#1) & Eddie Goldman (PS#3) who both played as true's, started while Timmy Jernigan (PS#4) became one of the top DL in the country. TY they do lose 2nd Tm AA Jernigan (#3 tkl'r, 4.5 sk, 6.5 tfl, #2DC BAL), McDaniel (29 tkl, 2.5 tfl) and Demonte McAllister (22 tkl, 1 sk). FSU actually all'd 125 ypg (3.3) w/35 sks. While they have some big losses, this unit is more exp'd (2.5 str's back) and remains one of the elite units in the country.

**LINEBACKERS** - In '12 FSU had to replace Nigel Bradham who was the 1st Nole s/Marvin Jones ('90-'92) to lead FSU in tkls for 3 straight yrs but they still had 4 of their top 6 back incl 2 str's. LY they had to replace two #6DC's and despite just 1 ret str, the top 2 LB tkl'r's were back and they added in 5 VHT true's and a PS#9 rFr. The ppg improved from 14.7 to 12.1. TY they once again lose 2 str's in 3rd Tm AA WLB Telvin Smith (14 st, #1 tkl'r, 9.5 tfl, 3 int, #5DC JAX) and 2nd Tm ACC Christian Jones (12 st, T-55 tkl'r, 2 sk, 6 tfl) along with Dan Hicks (4 st, 25 tkl). Unlike LY they don't rec as much (#4, #8 & #9 tkl'r's) and are slightly less exp'd but the entire 2-deep is made up of VHT's.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - It surprised me when FSU finished #102 in my PDR in '09. However, they improved to #32, #18 and in '12 finished #3 (49%, 13-11). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm ACC CB (#9 tkl'r, #1DC) but ret'd 7 of their top 8. FSU held Taj Boyd to 17-37-156 and finished as my #6 pass D (52%, 14-26). They cross-train their DB's to play CB, S and even LB and Lamarus Joyner (1st Tm AA) began at CB and finished at NB/LB. TY they lose Joyner (14 st, #2 tkl'r, 6 pd, 5.5 sk, #2DC STL) as well as 1st Tm ACC FS Terrence Brooks (13 st, #5 tkl'r, 7 pd, #3DC BAL) and Gerald Dumps (10 tkl, 2 pbu). Seven of their top 9 return incl Jalen Ramsey (PS#5) who st'd 14 at 3 diff positions (CB/SS/FS) as a true as well as CB Ronald Darby (PS#4). Even with the losses, this remains one of the nation's elite secondaries.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - FSU always finishes high in my ST rankings. After a #1 finish in '11, they had to replace their outstanding P (41.3 net) and PR (416, 11.2) but again finished #1 for a 2nd straight year guided by ST cch Eddie Gran. Dustin Hopkins was a Groza finalist in B2B yrs (25-30, L56). True frosh P Cason Beatty (PS#14) only avg'd 38.3 (net 34.3) in '12 but the RM were dangerous. LY they had to replace Hopkins (#6DC, NCAA

car leader pts by K). PS#5 rFr Roberto Aguayo hit 21-22 fg's (L53), had 45 TB on 120 KO and took home the Groza Award after setting a single-ssn record for pts by a kicker. Beatty improved to a 41.1 avg but his net (34.5) was about the same (#112) probably costing them a 3rd str ST Title. FSU was +9.6 on KR's but -6.9 on PR as they finished #3. Kermit Whitfield was the top KR with 619 (36.4, 2 td's) and had the school's first KR td s/'08 plus the key 4Q 100 yd ret td in the Nat'l Title game. They lose their top PR but have a decent shot at their 3rd #1 ST Title in 4Y.

**COACHES** - While many will always think that Florida ST football is synonymous with HOF HC Bobby Bowden, Jimbo Fisher has made his mark. Prior to FSU Fisher spent 7Y as LSU's OC, 5 of them with Nick Saban. After 3Y as the OC here he was promoted in '10 and the only HC to top his 45 wins the L4Y is Saban (46). Fisher who had been his own OC promoted WR cch/pass gm coor Lawrence Dawsey and QB cch Randy Sanders to co-OC TY. The Seminoles had just 2 DC's in 29Y and now they have their 2nd in 2Y. TY's DC is Charles Kelly who was the LB/ST's cch here LY. Previously he was at GT for 7Y (DB's cch) and was the interim DC their L/8 gms in '12. He was previously a DC at Nich St, Henderson St and Jax St.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

FSU had an amazing run of 14 str top 5 finishes. Not only did that end in '00 but the Seminoles went through 12 str yrs of zero Top 5 finishes (just 1 Top 10). In '12, I looked at all of the talent on hand, had FSU favored in all of their gms and picked them #1. As it turned out, FSU was basically a 2 td favorite in every game but 1 (7 pt HF vs Fla). They did lose AA CB/PR Reid in Aug, then AA DE Jenkins in the opener. Against NCSt they blew a 16-0 HT lead (221-68 yds) and gave up three 4th down conv on the final drive incl one w/16 left and lost. Later, QB Manuel fumbled after a hard hit vs Florida and was inj'd with FSU leading 20-13 in the 4Q and they lost. LY they had to replace 11 NFL DC's and had just 11 ret str's. They were almost a consensus pick for 2nd place in their own div (I had FSU #1) behind Clemson and were not even in the preseason AP Top 10 (#11). I had FSU as my #1 Surprise Team or my top Non-Top 10 team that I thought could win the Nat'l Title (pg 35). Despite losing a QB that started in the NFL LY and all of those DC's, FSU still had enough talent on hand to once again be favored by DD in all but 1 and that was a road trip to Clemson. CU was ranked #3 and in Death Valley at night, #5 FSU was favored by 3 and Jameis Winston put himself on the Heisman map leading a convincing 51-14 win. That came one week after they beat #25 MD 63-0. Their next showdown vs a ranked tm came vs #7 Miami (41-14 win). Their road trip to UF was vs a banged up Gators' squad and after a close 1H, FSU won 37-7. Duke came in #20 AP in the ACC Title gm but after a 45-7 win, FSU had beaten 4 ranked foes 200-35. Their toughest contest came in the Nat'l Champ gm vs Auburn. Down 21-3, a fake punt helped them get back in it in their exciting 34-31 win. FSU's 723 points is an all-time FBS record (Okla 716 in '08). They hadn't been ranked #1 s/Oct 2000 but held that spot the final 2 gms and finished that way. TY FSU will surely be the preseason AP #1 tm. They lose less than they did LY with 13 ret str's incl Heisman winner Winston and a plethora of talent on both sides of the ball. The toughest gms are on the road vs Okla St, L'ville & Miami. This should be another yr where FSU is probably a DD fav in every single game.
