

QUARTERBACKS - Troy Smith departed after '06 as a #5DC and Terrelle Pryor's final ssn was '10 (#3DC Supplemental) In '11 Braxton Miller started the final 10 and earned B10 Fr POY (1159, 54%, 13-4, #1 rusher 715, 4.5). Miller is the perfect fit for Meyer's offense. In '12 he set the schl record for til offense w/3,310 yds as Pryor's 3,526 was vacated. Miller was named B10 OPÓY (2039, 58%, 15-6, #1 rush 1271, 5.6). Kenny Guiton threw for 139 (57%, 2-1) and directed or finished a td drive on 8 of his 15 series. LY Miller was my pick to win the Heisman but he missed a couple of gms w/inj. Guiton became a household name, setting a schl record w/6 td passes (all in the 1H) vs FAMU. Guiton st'd 2 and finished with 749 (68.8%) and an outstanding 14-2 ratio (#4 rusher, 330, 8.2) and was the only offensive player in the conf in to win Big 10 B2B POW awards. 3rd string QB, rFr Cardale Jones ply'd in 3 (3 yd pass, 128 rush, 7.5). JT Barrett (PS#11) RS. Miller threw for 2,094 (63.5%, 24-7, 1068 rush, 12 td). Guiton departs but Miller turned down the NFL and will again be a Heisman favorite this year. However, they are not in as good of shape at backup QB if he gets injured.

RUNNING BACKS - In '12 Carlos Hyde was the top returnee (566, 5.3) and was up to 242 lbs (4.45 spd) to fit his power running style. He led the RB's w/970 (5.2) and 16 td's incl 146 yds vs Mich. Rod Smith (PS#9) had just 116 (4.0) in '11 and 215 (6.7!) in '12. True frosh Bri'onte Dunn (PS#10) added 133 (5.3). Hyde was susp'd the first 3 of '13 and Jordan Hall had 402 yds in those gms. Hall tweaked a knee and he finished with just 536 (6.6). Hyde (#2DC SF) became the first RB to go over 1,000 yds rushing in Meyer's 12 yrs as a HC with 1,521, an outstanding 7.3 ypc and 15 td. His 226 yds vs Mich were the most ever for a Buckeye in the rivalry and he avg 155 ypg the L/9. True frosh Ezekiel Elliott (PS#14) added 262 (8.7) while explosive true frosh Dontre Wilson (PS#21) had 250 (8.1, 210 rec). Smith rushed for 117 (5.3). TY they lose their star and Hall but have a backfield loaded with talent. It will be interesting to see if Meyer can uncover a 2nd 1,000 yd rusher.

**RECEIVERS** - OSU had an inexp'd receiving corps in '11 (2 soph, 2 rFr, 2 true) that lacked big play ability. In '12 they ret'd their top 3 rec's incl Philly Brown whose 60 rec's were double that of #2 Devin Smith but he only had 669 yds (11.1). Smith had 618 (20.6!). LY they added PS#11JC Corey Smith and true frosh Dontre Wilson (PS#21). Philly led again (771, 12.2) while Devin Smith was #2 w/660 (15.0), TE Jeff Heuerman (PS#24) added 466 (17.9). TY they lose Brown (14

st) & Chris Fields (193, 12.1, 4 st). Keep an eye on Michael Thomas (PS#93) who RS LY and 6'5"Jeff Greene who led GT in rec w/284 (15.8) in '12. Even with the loss of their top guy, this unit could be more productive.

**DFFENSIVE LINE** - In '11 the O-line only opened holes for 191 ypg (4.4, lowest ypc s/'04) and all'd 46 sks (18.8%) despite having 77 car sts and a mobile QB. In '12 they had to replace 2Y, 3Y and 4Y st'rs (1st Tm AA, #2DC). They dropped to 42 car sts but co-OC/OL cch Ed Warinner did a great job as they jumped to 242 (5.2, 30 sk). All 5 st'rs st'd all 12. LY they had to replace a #7DC but had 4 st'rs back (81 car sts) and Meyer complimented the OL all season long ("OL-driven team"). OSU avg 309 ypg (6.8) while cutting the sks to 22 (6.0%). The Buckeyes were the first BCS team s/95 (Neb) to rush for over 300 ypg with a + 6.8 ypc. TY the unit goes from the team's biggest strength to its biggest ? as they lose 2nd Tm AA LT Jack Mewhort (3Y st'r, #2DC IND), 1st Tm B10 C Corey Linsley (14 st, 2Y st'r, #5DC GB), 1st Tm B10 LG Andrew Norwell (14 st, 3Y st'r), HM B10 RG Marcus Hall (13 st, 2Y st'r) and bkp Ivon Blackman (13 gm). Naturally, Meyer has plenty of VHT's to turn to and they add in Alabama transfer Chad Lindsay but the career sts drop to 32.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '11 the Steelers drafted their 3rd OSU DL (#1DC) in 2Y prompting HC Mike Tomlin to remark that OSU's D is the closest in the college game to what the Steelers run. In '12 the line ret'd intact and they added in 4 of my top 15 frosh DL. OSU improved to all'g 116 ypg rush (3.6) with 30 sk (tied highest here s/'07). LY they had to replace all 4 st'rs incl #2 and #4 DC's. I wrapped up LY's DL's by saying that the '12 line underachieved and that the '13 version which was the first in 28 yrs here that had 0 ret sts, would probably do better than expected. They even exceeded my expectations improving their rush D to 109 (3.3) with 42 sks (3rd most FBS). DE Noah Spence (PS#2) earned 1st Tm B10 while DE Joey Bosa (PS#13) & DT Michael Bennett (PS#11) each were named 2nd Tm B10 as the trio totaled 22.5 sks. TY the unit returns intact and is one of, if not the top DL in the country (see pg 21)

LINEBACKERS - In '13 the Bucks had to replace 3 LB's who comb'd for 16 sts (113 tkl). They played a NB 80% with that being the good-sized Joshua Perry (PS#15, 250 lbs). Curtis Grant finally appeared ready to live up to his PS#1 billing (10 tkl 1st 2 yr) but was banged up late (missed III) and was the #8 tkl'r. Ryan Shazier who was the #1 tkl'r in '11 (44 more than #2) had 49 more tkl's than #2 LY (1st Tm AA, 143 tkl, 6 sk, 16.5 tfl). OSU had all'd just 14.4 ppg from '02-'10 but the last 3 yrs has yielded 22.1 incl 22.6 LY. TY the loss of a veteran talent like Shazier (#1DC PIT) is big but I'll just call them equal to LY's edition as they add '14's PS#1 & PS#6 true frosh.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Since '97 OSU has had 8 DB's drafted in the 1st RD with 26 drafted overall. They had to replace 3 st'rs (#4, #5DC) in '11 incl a 1st Tm AA and dealt with some susp and inj's and fell to #63 (lowest s/'99). In '12 all 4 st'rs were back and I called them one of the nation's most improved secondaries. CB Bradley Roby led the B10 in pd's and OSU climbed back to #27 (15-14 ratio). LY they had to replace 2 CB's (20 st, 79 tkls). They did return their #2, #3 and #4 tkl'rs. Meyer was visibly upset when SS Christian Bryant (leader of D) was OFY after 5 sts. Roby did not have the year expected and it was shocking that they finished #88 (worst ever) in my PDR (61.8%, 31-16). TY they lose 1st Tm B10 CB Roby (11 st, #3 tkl'r, 3 int, 13 pbu, #1DC DEN), Bryant (22 tkl, #7DC STL), his replacement Corey "Pitt" Brown (9 st, #6 tkl'r) and S CJ Barnett (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 4 int). Generally when a unit loses 3 st'rs, the forecast is for weaker numbers but I cannot imagine OSU having such a poor finish again.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Meyer places an emphasis on the punt blk team which he calls "The Freakshow" and plays many starters in the group. In '12 this unit finished just #56. LY they had to replace their P but they signed Australian Cameron Johnston who avg 44.0 and the 40.8 net was #5 in the FBS. K Drew Basil hit 16-19 fg's (L/47) in '11 and he hit 8-11 (L52) in '12. LY he hit 9-10 (L45) and had 27 TB on 104 KO. In '12 Philly Brown was the top PR (221, 12.3) with 2 td's. LY he was again the top PR (178, 7.8) with a long of 65 and had a 60 vd PR td called back. Dontre Wilson

became the top KR (523, 24.9). OSU moved up to #9. TY they do lose K Basil and PR Brown and whether they rise or fall in the rankings will greatly depend on their new K.

**DACHES** - Urban Meyer reenergized Buckeye Nation. After his one year retirement his 24 wins over the L2Y are the 2nd best ever (Larry Coker '01-'02 25 wins) to start a career at a school. Meyer had 2 Nat'l Titles at Fla ('05-'10) after going 22-2 at Utah ('03-'04) and 17-6 at BG ('01-'02). Luke Fickell (here s/'02) was the interim HC in '11 and was retained as co-DC LY's other co-DC Everett Withers took the James Madison HC job but filling his spot is Chris Ash who was the Wisc DC '11-'12 and Ark's DC LY. They also hired Larry Johnson as a DL/asst HC after he spent 18Y at Penn St. OC Tom Herman's previous stops incl OC at Iowa St ('09-'11), Rice ('07-'08) and TXST ('05-'06). Ed Warinner is the co-OC with stops for 2Y at ND (OL, run gm coor) and 5Y at Kan ('03-'04, OC '07-'09).

## L'S FORECAS

Jim Tressel won a Nat'l Title in his 2nd yr ('02) and had eight Top 10 finishes in his final 9 yrs. The Buckeyes had an interim HC in '11 in Luke Fickell (now co-DC) and had their 1st losing season s/'88 (3rd s/'60). OSU was -45.5 ypg in B10 play. It was surprising that they went to a bowl because the NCAA handed them a 1 year bowl ban and had it been retroactive, the Buckeyes would have been in the Nat'l Title game in '12. Things were pointing upward in '12. OSU was a +5.5 in my Stock Market Indicator (pg 32), had 15 ret st'rs and was my #2 MIT. OSU doubled its win total from 6 to 12. They finished 12-0 and #3 AP. LY OSU had 13 ret st'rs incl QB Braxton Miller. I did point out they had benefitted from 6 net close wins in '12 but I expected an unbeaten reg ssn. The Buckeyes' closest non-conf gm was an 18 pt win at Cal but after an FAMU blowout, they then had tough B2B tests only getting past Wisc by 7 at home. They led NW 34-30 but got a FR td on the last play to win by 10 (making some OSU backers happy). After only beating lowa by 10, they needed some style points and steam rolled through their next 4 B10 gms winning by an avg of 40 ppg. They needed to stop a Mich 2 pt conv to hold on to a 42-41 win but after Mever had opened up 24-0 at OSU, they lost the B10 Title gm to Mich St and then dropped the Orange Bowl to Clemson and finished outside of the Top 10 (#12). Meyer became the first coll HC to tally 3 separate 20 gm win streaks. OSU usually travelled with 61 ply'rs (70 all'd) as they entered '13 under the NCAA schlp limit and suffered some attrition. OSU was +137.6 ypg in B10 play. TY the Bucks have 12 ret st'rs incl Miller. The biggest ? on offense will be replacing RB Hyde and 4 OL st'rs. They figure to have one of the best D-line's in college ball and 7 ret st'rs on D so they will be much stronger than the 377 ypg they all'd LY. On the negative side, they are -3.0 in my Stock Market Indicator and come up poor in my ypp indicator (pg 25). On the positive side, they avoid the top 4 out of the West (Wisc, NW, Iowa, Neb) and figure to be favored in 11 of their 12 gms.
