POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

QUARTERBACKS - HC Art Briles reportedly told Robert Griffin III that if he came to Waco he'd be a Heisman finalist. RG3 became BU's first Heisman winner in '11 as he was #2 in the FBS in pass eff (4293, 72%, 37-6, 699 rush). In '12 Nick Florence took over for RG3 and was #2 in the FBS in tfl off setting the single gm tfl off record w/581 vs WV (RG3 479 vs Okla '11) and setting the new single season passing yds schl record with 4,309 (62%, 33-13) with 568 (4.1) rush. Over the summer of '12, Gil Brandt told me to keep my eye on soph Bryce Petty (PS#48). Petty's career stats heading into LY were 10-14-148-1-0 (11 gm 2Y). Despite that fact, I placed him 1st on my preseason B12 Team and gave him a shot at becoming the 3rd straight QB to set the single season schl record. He came close throwing for 4,200 (62%) with an amazing 32-3 ratio (209 rush, 2.2, 14 td). Petty turned down the NFL making him a Heisman frontrunner and a probable 1st Rnd DC in '14.

RUNNING BACKS - From 1899-2009 BU had just six 1,000 yd RB rushers but has now had 4 in 4Y. In '11 everyone wondered who would replace Jay Finley whose schl rec 1,218 (6.2) in '10 topped Walter Abercrombie's 1,187 from '80. Terrance Ganaway set a new schl rec 1,547 (6.2, 21 td). In '12 I proj'd soph Lache Seastrunk (PS#3, 205 lbs, 4.4 spd, Oregon trans) as the st'r. Seastrunk avg just 26 ypg the F/7 but 139 ypg down the stretch finishing w/1,012 (7.7). Glasco Martin, a bulldozer in short ydg, added 889 (5.0). LY Seastrunk opened with 111, 150, 156 & 172 giving him 8 straight 100 yd efforts, the longest in the nation before 59 vs KSt. He had 3 more (banged up) finishing w/1,177 (7.4). Martin was also banged up and Shock Linwood had 126 vs WV and 106 vs KU, before bursting out w/182 vs OU and 187 vs TT (#2, 881, 6.9). Martin plugged along w/509 (4.2) missing 2. Not listed below is Anthony Webb (6'0" 190 Jr, PS#107) who ran for 150 (5.6) LY. Although Linwood showed what he could do as the feature back, this unit has less depth with the loss of Seastrunk (8 st, #6DC WAS) and Martin (1 st) despite the addition of 2 frosh VHT's.

RECEIVERS - Kendall Wright led BU in rec for 4 str yrs ('08-'11) getting better each yr with 1,663 (15.4, 14 td) in his final ssn (1st Tm AA, #1DC). They had 6 of their top 7 back in '12 with 3 having 1,000 car yds. Terrance Williams earned 1st Tm AA w/a BU record 1,832 (18.9) and Tevin Reese (877, 17.2 '11) had 957 (18.1). LY they had to replace 2 (comb 2478, 16.6) of their top 3 (Williams #3DC). Reese led the nation each of the L2Y in ypc but missed 4 (wrist) and was #2 w/867 despite having 9 less rec's than #3. Levi Norwood had 487 (12.2) in '12 and followed that up with 733 (15.6) LY incl 388 when Reese was out. Briles said Antwan Goodley was set for a breakout season (171, 10.1 '12) and proved to be quite the prognosticator as Goodley led

w/1,339 (18.9!, 13 td). Briles called true frosh Robbie Rhodes (PS#5) the best WR in America but he had just 157 (15.7). TY they lose Reese (8 st, #7DC SD) and TE's Jordan Najvar (8 st, 10 rec) & Jerod Monk (1 st, 2 rec) but add in a PS#4 & #8 true. This has the potential to be Briles' best receiving corps yet.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '12 BU had to replace a 1st Tm B12 C (#4DC) and a 2nd Tm B12 RG (#6DC) but had 77 car sts back for a 2nd straight yr. After Briles switched the unit around, they took time to gel but in the final 6, they avg'd 299 ypg (5.5). LY they had to replace a 2nd Tm B12 C (4Y st'r) and a 3Y starting RG. RT Troy Baker (13 st) inj'd his knee and didn't earn back his starting spot until the final 2 gms (ply'd 9) so they had 2 st'r's back and LT Spencer Drango was OFY after 9 sts. The Bears improved to 260 ypg rush (5.4, 22 sk). TY they lose 1st Tm AA LG Cyril Richardson (13 st, 3Y st'r, #5 DC BUF), C Stefan Huber (13 st) and OT Kelvin Palmer (13 st). Despite losing 3 st'r's, they add in Blake Muir who st'd 12 w/Hawaii in '12 and getting Baker back healthy is like having 3 st'r's back which is one more than LY (now 64 car st).

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '12 Baylor had to replace 2.5 st'r's but the less exp'd unit improved to 179 ypg (4.5, 19 sk). LY they had to replace 2 st'r's but unlike '12 they didn't lose an all-conf player and the top 2 tk'l's and sackmen Terrance Lloyd and Chris McAllister both ret'd. They also added Penn St transfer Shawn Oakman. He had a hamstring inj in Aug and did not start but still earned HM B12. In early October, BU was holding opp's to 112 ypg rush, and a B12 low 2.5 ypc. They did give up 327 (5.6) to K-St and 255 (5.8) in the bowl (145 ypg, 3.5 on yr). The sks increased to 32. TY they lose 1st Tm B12 DE McAllister (13 st, 40 tk'l, 6.5 sk, 5.5 tfl) and DE Lloyd (13 st, 2.5 sk). They had a true frosh and soph starting at DT and Briles is high on the D-line with Oakman & Jamal Palmer (new DE's) comb for 23.5 tfl as LY's starting DE's had just 14.5.

LINEBACKERS - In '12 the Bears had to replace their #1 tk'l but had 5 of the top 6 back (#4, #6, #11 tk'l's). They also added in PS#97JC Eddie Lackey who wasn't recruited out of HS due to his size (6'). DC Phil Bennett compared him to Dat Nguyen who he co'h'd at A&M, an aggressive tk'l'r with the ability to cover. Lackey had 104 tk'l & 10.5 tfl w/2 IR td's (2nd Tm B12). Bryce Hager beat out a ret st'r and was #1 w/124 (9.5 tfl, 2nd Tm B12). LY they switched #3 tk'l'r Ahmad Dixon to S and moved S Sam Holl (#4 tk'l'r) to NB. I called it their best LB corps s/09 (1st Tm B12 Joe Pawelek's unit). Lackey earned 1st Tm B12 finishing as the #1 tk'l'r (4.5 sk, 8.5 tfl, 3 int). BU trimmed the ppg all'd from 37.2 down to 23.5 (best s/95) despite their fast paced offense. TY they lose Lackey (13 st), Holl (13 st, #4 tk'l'r, 3.5 sk, 6.5 tfl), PS#46 Prince Kent (11 tk'l) and Brody Trahan (3 st, #7 tk'l'r, 1.5 sk). Hager only st'd 9 (inj'd) but was 2nd Tm B12 (#3 tk'l'r) and returns but LY's BU LB corps was something special.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - BU finished #91 and #95 in my PDR in '10 and '11 but the entire 2-deep was back in '12. They only moved up to #82 (63%, 36-18) but did only have 1 DB start all 13. LY the unit went from 4 ret st'r's to 2 but I mentioned that they didn't make the climb I'd expected so they still could move up again. BU did much more than that with their highest finish in my PDR s/95 (#8, 47.7%) as they were #9 (48.2%, 23-19). TY the unit is a major + as they lose 3rd Tm AA DS Ahmad Dixon (PS#8, 12 st, #2 tk'l'r, 7 pd, #7DC DAL), CB Demetri Goodson (10 st, 3 int, 13 pbu, #6DC BG), CB Joe Williams (4 st, 2 int, 8 pbu) and CB KJ Morton (12 st, 3 int, 10 pbu). They only return 1 st'r (#5 tk'l'r) but also have productive bkp Orion Stewart (#9 tk'l'r) back. Still, with TY's inexp'd group and a rare top 10 finish LY, I don't see the Bears finishing in that same stratosphere in '14 (but do have only 1 less ret st'r's than '13).

SPECIAL TEAMS - In '12 BU was #90 in my ST rankings. LY everyone was back. As if BU's offense needed any help, Norwood had 2 PR td's (240, 9.6; 247, 20.6 KR) and KR

Corey Coleman had 1 td (483, 28.4). Aaron Jones became the BU career leader in fg's in the 1st gm then the NCAA career leader for xp's vs TT (old record 253 Art Carmody L'ville '04-'07). Jones hit 14-23 fg's (L51) and had an outstanding 40 TB on 99 KO. P Spencer Roth avg 40.5 (32.6 tm net) in '11, 43.8 (36.4 net) in '12 and improved to 45.8 (38.4 tm net) in '13. TY they lose the B12's #1 (overall) and NCAA's #2 (among K) all-time kicking scorer in Jones but could move up in my ST rankings once again.

COACHES - All Art Briles has done at each stop is win. He guided Stephenville HS (TX) to 4 state titles (90-2-1 in 6Y stretch) and after moving up to the college ranks he coached the Houston Cougars to 4 bowls in 5 yrs. When Briles took over in '08, Baylor had posted 12 str losing seasons (2.9 wins/yr). After 2 seasons of getting his recruits and systems in line, Briles led BU to its first bowl s/94. OC Philip Montgomery followed Briles from UH. DC Phil Bennett (4th yr) has 21Y of DC exp and was previously at Pitt ('08-'10) while also having HC exp w/SMU ('02-'07).

PHIL'S FORECAST

Prior to Art Briles arrival, Baylor had been the doormat of the Big 12 being outscored by an avg of 41.5-14.7 from '99-'07 in conf play. In '08 with exciting frosh RG3, Briles was a respectable 4-8 in his first year (only -7.2 ppg B12). RG3 was inj'd in '09 and BU was 4-8 again (-18 ppg B12). With RG3's return in '10, Baylor actually made my Most Improved List which meant that I was calling for them to get to their first bowl since 1994! They were picked to finish last (media) but had their highest finish ever in the B12 South (4th, +39.3 ypg)! BU did only beat 1 FBS team that finished with a winning record (KU St 7-6). They set or tied 55 of the sch'l's off records with 471 pass and 468 rush att's (balance) and went to the Texas Bowl. Coming into '11 Baylor was the worst team in Big 12 history with an 18-102 league record. In '11 they had to replace a pair of #1 DC's for the first time s/57. RG3 took them to new heights as they finished 10-3 and ranked #13 (6-3 B12, BU's most wins in B12 ever). They beat #14 TCU and #5 Okla. In '12 they had to replace 5 NFL DC's incl RG3 and signs were pointing down. They won their first 3, dropped to 3-4, then rebounded to go 5-1 incl an OT win vs TT and a bowl blowout of UCLA 49-26. BU was ranked #25 for 1 wk (3-0) putting them in the AP Poll 3 str yrs (1st time 36 yrs). They also upset #2 K-St, tying for the highest AP team they'd ever beaten (#2 Tenn, Sugar Bowl '56). BU was the first school with a losing record to knock out a #1 BCS team. BU was +61.1 ypg in B12 play (2nd best). LY they had 12 ret st'r's and I mentioned the Bears would open up either 6-1 or 7-0. They had only 1 test early and BU needed a td w/1:16 left to clinch a 35-25 win at K-St. At 7-0 they had a Thurs night showdown vs #12 Okla and after a close 1.5Q it turned into a blowout, 41-12. They were a surprising td+ fav at #11 Okla St but blew numerous chances and lost 49-17. With BU no longer unbeaten and in a letdown role, TCU had a 410-370 yd edge in BU's 3rd straight road trip but the Bears got a tipped pass in the EZ for an int to hold on for a 3 pt win. When Okla St lost, BU was playing Texas for the Big 12 Title. They were tied 3-3 at the half but they won 30-10. The Bears were the biggest favorite in the bowls but were upset by UCF 52-42 in the Fiesta Bowl. BU got as high as #3 (prev high #3 '53) and the 681 pts Baylor scored is the all-time NCAA record (13 gms). BU destroyed tms at home (61-13 avg). The Bears did benefit from +13 in TO's and have just 10 ret st'r's but do return QB Petty, 6 of their top 7 rec's and figure to be favored in 10 or 11 games this season. They are a National Title contender.

BU has won 12 str HG's (by 38 ppg) vs non-conf foes. BU has won 10 str (L/loss in '86). L/gm ('12) BU won 59-24 but only had a 106 yd edge (-2 FD) as 3 SMU TO's resulted in 21 pts.								
BU has hosted & beaten an FCS tm each of L13Y. Under Briles they have won by 45 ppg. BU is 3-0 vs NSU, won 68-13 in '09 (L/gm). Demons went 6-6 LY incl losses to Cincy (66-9) & UAB (52-28). The Bears only led 10-7 at HT but outscored the Bulls 17-0 in the 3Q (172-47 yd edge).
