POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

QUARTERBACKS - AU has now had 7 diff passing leaders over the L7 yrs. In '10 Cam Newton became the 3rd Tiger Heisman Trophy winner (Pat Sullivan '71, Bo Jackson '85) and was the #1 overall pick in the NFL Draft. Three QB's shared the job in '11 and comb for 2,018 (57%, 16-11, 308 rush). In '12 three QB's started again. Kiehl Frazier (PS#3) st'd the first 5. Jonathan Wallace (PS#61) st'd the final 4 and set an AU frosh record in pass eff. This time the 3-headed monster threw for just 1,846 (57%, 7-15, 43 rush) as the shift to the pro-style attack did not fit well. LY they switched back to former OC and now HC Gus Malzahn's offense. They also added in true frosh PS#13 Jeremy Johnson and PS#34JC Nick Marshall. I proj'd Marshall as the st'r even though he was not IFS. He got better as the season went on and threw for 1,976 (59.4%, 14-6) while becoming only the 4th SEC QB to top 1,000 rush (AU Jimmy Sidle '63, Cam Newton '10 and Manziel '12). Wallace was the bkp the 1st 5, but when Marshall was inj'd vs Ole Miss, they took off Johnson's RS and he st'd vs WC and the tm set a schl rec with 712 yds. Johnson finished w/422 (70.7%, 6-2) while Wallace was only 2-4 for 24 yds. In his 9 yrs as a college OC/HC, this will be the 1st time Malzahn has had the same QB in B2B yrs and Marshall is a Heisman candidate.

RUNNING BACKS - It is hard to believe that Auburn just set an SEC record by producing a 1,000 yd rusher for the 5th consec yr. Yes, even teams like Bama and LSU have never produced 5 str 1,000 yd rushers. On Tre Mason's final carry of '12 (5 yds) he went over that mark (1002, 5.9). LY they had to replace their #2 and #3 rushers (comb 723, 5.7). OC Rhett Lashlee said that Mason, a physical runner, got stronger as the game and season went on. Mason had 753 yds after 8 and then #83 over the next 4 incl 304 in the SEC Title gm (1816, 5.7, 23 td). Corey Grant (PS#30) led Wk 1 w/146 but finished a distant #2 (647, 9.8) at RB. A lot was made after the spring about Cameron Artis-Payne (PS#45JC) who had a pair of 100 yd gms (Ark St, WC) and finished #3 RB w/610 (6.7). TY they lose solid b'king HB Jay Prosch (11 st, #6DC HOU) and Mason (#3DC STL) who set the AU record for single-ssn all-purp yds (2374) and rush yds (both previously held by Bo Jackson, '85). It will be tough to duplicate LY's numbers with the loss of Mason but "Tail Lights" Grant was timed at an astonishing 4.18 40 in spring.

RECEIVERS - In '12 Emory Blake had over 5 times the rec yds (789, 15.8) of #2, TE Philip Lutzenkirchen (139, 9.3) who both had to be replaced LY. They once again had one feature WR in soph Sammie Coates (PS#60 one of AU's fastest) who tallied 902 (21.5) and the #2 WR was Ricardo Louis (PS#28, 325, 11.6) who hauled in the deflected 73 yd td pass on 48:18 w/25 left vs UGA (The Prayer at Jordan-Hare). Jaydon Denison was OFY after 4 sts and true frosh Marcus Davis was #3 (217, 9.4). CJ Uzomah had 154 (14.0) but still earned 2nd Tm SEC honors. TY the unit

returns intact and they add in PS#1JC D'haquille Williams and will easily have their best numbers in the L3Y.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '12 Aub had to replace a #4DC RT (13 st) and their LT (12 st). They went to more of a pro-style offense (QB's 32 yds rush) and dropped to 148 ypg rush (4.1, 37 sk, 14.4%). LY they had to replace 1 st'r but had plenty of VHT's, 70 car sts and most of the OL's were recruited for the spread. I wrote, "this could be the most improved OL in the country." This time, with Marshall rushing for 1,000+, Aub had even better totals than Cam Newton's title tm (285, 6.1) as they opened holes for 328 (6.3) and allowed 18 sks (best s/04). The Tigers led the nation in rush yds, the first ever SEC team to do so and were the 1st BCS tm to rush for 320 ypg and have a ypc over 6.0 since the '00 Neb tm! LT Greg Robinson left early for the NFL (#1DC STL) but eight of the top 10 are back incl C Reese Dismukes who was a Rimington finalist. It will be tough to top LY's amazing stats, especially with the loss of their star but this remains one of the best O-line's in the country (113 car sts).

DEFENSIVE LINE - Led by DT Nick Fairley, AU's '10 title team had a solid rush D (109 ypg, 3.4, 35 sk). In '11 they had to replace Fairley (#1DC), a 2nd Tm SEC DE and 2 bkps (3 st, 48 tkl). The lightly exp'd group (1 ret st'r) slipped to all'g 189 ypg (4.6, 22 sk). In '12 the entire 2-deep ret'd incl 3rd Tm AA PS#8 DE Corey Lemonier. When DE Dee Ford missed the last 7, Lemonier had just 1 sk in that span. The more veteran unit surprisingly slipped to 198 (4.9, 22 sk). LY Lemonier was a #3DC but the rest of the 2-deep was back and they added in PS#2, PS#5 and PS#10 true frosh along with a PS#6JC. In April, DC Ellis Johnson called it the deepest position in spring in his 30+ yrs. They improved but only to 162 ypg (4.6) with 32 sks. TY they lose DE 1st Tm SEC Dee Ford (11 st, 29 tkl, 10.5 sk, 4 tfl), DT Nosa Eguale (12 st, 22 tkl, 2 sk, 3.5 tfl), Craig Sanders (3 st, 22 tkl, 3 tfl) and Kenneth Carter (9 tkl, 3 tfl). They get back Jeffrey Whitaker (PS#31) who Malzahn called the leader of the team (13 st '11, 6 st till inj '12, OFY LY). They go from 3 ret st'rs to 2 and Ford was a #1DC (KC), but I can see this unit continuing to improve.

LINEBACKERS - LY the Tigers had to replace their #1 tkl'r (3rd Tm SEC) and a bkp (4 st, 20 tkl). They only ret'd their #4, #14 and #21 tkl'rs but much was expected of STAR LB Justin Garrett (Tm MVP spg, ferocious tkl'r). He was inj'd and RS. They had 1 st'r back and that was Jake Holland (10 st '12) but he basically split snaps with PS#12 Kris Frost. AU's D improved to all'g 24.7 ppg. TY they lose Holland (13 st, #9 tkl'r) but return their #1, #5 and #6 tkl'rs and also get back Garrett. This is a deep, improved group with added talent.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Even in AU's Nat'l Title year they only finished #84 in my PDR and were #92 and #98 the next 2 yrs. LY the Tigers had a veteran secondary with 3 st'rs back. Five st'rs missed time in Aug. They got healthier as the season went on and moved up to #42 (57.9%, 19-13). TY they do lose their top guy in 2nd Tm SEC CB Chris Davis (#2 tkl'r, 15 pbu), CB Ryan White (2 st, #8 tkl'r, 6 pbu), S Ryan Smith (8 st, #3 tkl'r, 3 int, 4 pbu) who st'd after Joshua Holsey was OFY (6 st) and FS Trent Fisher (9 st). In '12 Aub had just 2 int's and LY improved to 13. They ret their #4 & #7 tkl'rs. They add in WR Trovon Reed (PS#5) and Derrick Moncrief (PS#11JC). They are a little less exp'd, but I'll call them to move up some in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - LY K Cody Parkey was solid (15-21, L52) and had 69 TB on 98 KO while P Steven Clark avg 42.6 (40.5 net, #9!). Malzahn used many st'rs on the return units as RB Mason avg'd 26.3 on KR (1 td) while S Chris Davis (18.7) had 72 & 85 yd PR's (AU's longest s/70) and had the famed 109 yd fg return vs Bama (4th 100 yd ret missed fg NCAA hist). For the 1st time in schl history they had both a PR & KR td in the same gm (Tenn) and their 44.9 avg on 7 KR/PR in that game was an NCAA record

(Fla St 41.8 '74). They moved up to #14 (best s/08). TY they lose Parkey, Clark, Davis and Mason but bring in solid replacements incl K Daniel Carlson (PS#6) who had 54 TB as a senior in HS.

COACHES - Gus Malzahn spent 3Y as the OC here departing after '11. After his lone season at Ark St he ret'd and shocked the college football world by getting to the Nat'l Championship. He won my COY Award with the spectacular season (+8.5 wins tied largest turnaround in NCAA history). Rhett Lashlee, who was a GA here for 2Y and only 29 when hired as OC returns, as does co-OC alum QB Dameyune Craig. At Fla St Craig (QB cch) won ACC Recruiter of the Year. SEC vet, 62 yr old Ellis Johnson returns as DC. He spent '12 as the S Miss HC and was the DC at SC, Miss St and Bama among others. Co-DC Charlie Harbison returns. He spent 4Y as the Clemson co-DC.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Tommy Tuberville's teams won or shared the SEC West Title in 5 of his 10 yrs here ('99-'08). In '04, AU was undefeated in the SEC but not invited to play in the Nat'l Title game (#2, 13-0). They finished #14, #9, #15 and then 5-7 in '08 and Tuberville was shown the door. Fans were not thrilled with the hiring of Gene Chizik (5-19 at Iowa St) but AU made my Most Improved List in '09 and went 8-5. I mentioned in the '10 magazine that my main set of PR's called for Auburn to be 11-0 when they faced Bama. AU had a dream ssn as they won some close games led by Cam Newton and Nick Fairley. They trailed Bama 24-0 (could have been 38-0) and rallied for a 28-27 win, rolled over SC in the SEC Title game then beat Oregon to win the Nat'l Title. At a perfect 14-0 they delivered as one of my Surprise Teams (non-Top 10 tm I think could win Nat'l Title). They had been picked as low as 4th in the West in '10! In '11 all of the key indicators were pointing down: 7 net close wins, 6 ret st'rs. They did a good job getting to 8-5 (bowl win). In '12 OC Malzahn left for Ark St and Auburn dropped to 3-9 (0-8 SEC). Chizik was shown the door. Auburn earned the 2nd highest grade ever in my Stock Market Indicator at +8.0 and they were -12 in TO's in '12 and had the personnel recruited for the spread offense, which they would move back to. Aub became the first team to go winless in their conf then win their conf outright the next year since '72 (1st ever SEC). Malzahn said the team was average at best early in the year. Wash St outgained them 464-394 (28-16 FD) but the Tigers escaped with a 7 pt win. They only had a 468-422 yd edge vs Ark St, but won 38-9. They needed an 11 yd td pass with :10 left to pull out a home win vs Miss St. They trailed #6 LSU 21-0 at half and had 333 yds in the 2H but lost by 14. Ole Miss was off Bama and Aub led 6-3 then got a 14 pt swing with a 78 yd IR td. The Rebels had a 232-186 yd edge at half but trailed 20-6. The Tigers blasted WC then took the lead vs A&M with 1:19 left. Johnny Football got A&M to the AU18 but was sk'd on 2 of the final 3 plays. Auburn blew out their next 3 foes incl Ark and Tenn. They did have a 27-7 lead vs UGA but needed the "Immaculate Deflection" to pull out the win. They trailed Bama by 7 late. Bama scored 0 pts on 4 fg tries (kick Bama kick) and Auburn ret'd the final one 109 yds for a td and the 2nd stunning win in a row. They rolled to a 59-42 win in the SEC Title gm and led FSU 21-3 before a fake punt late 2Q turned the momentum. FSU got a td w/:13 keeping the Nat'l Title from AU. TY they come up a -.65 in the Stock Market Indicator, benefitted from 4 net close wins and lose OT Robinson, RB Mason and DE Ford. Still, they have 14 ret st'rs and are a legitimate Nat'l Title contender.

AU has won 8 str home openers (L/3 by just 4, 3 & 7 pts). LY Auburn had just 20 more yds (-7 FD) but led 28-3 w/6:39 3Q. AU took advantage of 3TO's incl a int at their 19 and SOD at the AU29.

First meeting. Tigers have won 23 str non-conference home gms, their last loss was in wk 2 of the '07 ssn (in OT 26-23 vs USF). SJSU was one of 6 bowl eligible tms LY that didn't get an invite.

Tigers are 3-0 vs the Wildcats incl a 45-32 win in '78, last/only time here. Rare reg ssn non-conf 'true' AG, AU has dropped 5 str to SU, USC, GT, WV & Clemson (last win at UVA in '97's opener).
