

OUARTERBACKS - In '10 Taih Boyd got his feet wet as a rFr playing in 7 (329, 52%, 4-3). In '11 I had big expectations for Boyd and he was 1st Tm ACC setting CU single season records for pass yds, ttl off, pass td's and td's responsible for (ACC rec 38). He was the 1st CU QB to lead the ACC in pass and ttl off in the same ssn s/57. True frosh Cole Stoudt (PS#40) played in 6 (115 yd). The previous two CU QB's had suffered the soph jinx but Boyd did not and even entered the Heisman race throwing for 3,896 (67%, 36-13, #2 rush w/514). He became the 1st ever ACC ply'r to have 2 seasons with 4,000+ yds of ttl off. Stoudt played in 8 and hit 69% (212 yd, 3-1). In '13 Boyd set an ACC record with 107 career to passes (Philip Rivers NCSt) and added another ssn w/4,000 yds of ttl off. LY he threw for 3.851 (68.5%, 34-11, #2 rush w/400) and leaves with more than 50 schl records. Stoudt relieved a banged up Boyd vs SCSt and hit 19-20, the best single game showing % wise ever at CU (topped Woodrow Dantzler). Stoudt, played in 8, throwing for 415 yds but hit 47-59 (79.7%, 15-0). Stoudt was named the st'r post-spg, but I expect the battle between him, true frosh Deshaun Watson (PS#2, IFS) and Nick Schuessler to resume in the fall. HC Dabo Swinney will develop a solid QB, but they won't match Boyd's (#6DC NYJ) outstanding numbers.

RUNNING BACKS - The Tigers have had no problems producing 1,000 yd rushers with James Davis in '06 and '07, CJ Spiller in 09 and Andre Ellington in 11 & 12 (1081, 5.1). Each of them spent at least some time with NFL squads. Roderick McDowell (PS#30) was the #2 RB in 12 (450, 5.4) and DJ Howard (PS#61) was the #3 RB (138, 3.9). McDowell opened with 132 vs ÙGA but was banged up (conc & sprain ankle) and had a streak of 6 gms without topping 100. With the other RB's banged up he became the workhorse back and OC Chad Morris said he got better with the more carries he received. He went over 1.000 in the bowl (1025, 5.4, 199 rec). Howard was the #3 RB (213, 3.7) and 6'1" Zac Brooks (PS#29) was the #2 RB (246, 5.1). Former track athlete, CJ Davidson, led with 63 vs SCSt and had 155 (4.6). TY's feature back could be one of the frosh that RS LY in Tyshon Dye (PS#20, tore Achilles in Feb) or Wayne Gallman (PS#33). While they must replace a 1,000 yd rusher and are a little less exp'd, they could be just as productive.

RECEIVERS - In '11 CU had 7 of their top 8 back and got the huge addition of true frosh Sammy Watkins (PS#3) who finished with a then-CU record 1,219 (14.9). DeAndre "Nuke" Hopkins (PS#23) who led the team in 10 (637, 12.3) finished #2 (978, 13.6) while TE Dwayne Allen (598, 12.0) won the John Mackey Award. In '12 they had to replace Allen (#3DC) and Watkins was susp the first two. Hopkins became the go-to

guy and re-set the single season record with 1,405 (17.1, 18 td's). Soph Martavis Brvant (PS#19. fast) missed 3 (305, 30.5). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm ACCTE, Hopkins (#1DC) and another starting WR (#4 rec). They were expecting big things from 6'3" Charone Peake (PS#6) and he had 8 rec the F/2 gms before an ACL. Watkins (708, 12.4, 3 td '12) who had a schl record 16-227 in the bowl, reset the ssn record for a 3rd str ssn w/1,464 (14.5, 12 td's). Bryant, a deep threat, was #2 w/828 (19.7!). Adam Humphries was #3 w/483 (11.8) and true frosh Mike Williams (PS#26) had 316 (15.8). Daniel Rodriguez, a Purple Heart recipient, caught a td pass vs The Citadel (7 rec on yr). TE Jay Jay McCullough (6'3" 230 So, PS#35) added 60 ttl yds. Watkins (#1DC BUF) & Bryant (#4DC PIT) both left early for the NFL. While the unit remains talented, having to replace 2 DC's, makes it clearly weaker.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Heading into LY CU had not had an OL drafted in the first 3 NFL rounds s/79. In '12 they had to replace 3,363 plays from the OL (48 car st ret) but after underachieving in '11, they improved to 191 ypg rush (4.2, 31 sk). OL cch Robbie Caldwell prefers to put his best athlete at C and Dalton Freeman st'd 49 straight gms there (2nd Tm AA in '12). LY they had to replace Freeman but did have 9 of their top 10 back (64 car st). Surprisingly the numbers dropped a little to 175 (4.2) with 35 sks. TY they lose 1st Tm ACC LT Brandon Thomas (13 st, 3Y st'r, #3DC SF), who finally ended the draft streak, RG Tyler Shatley (12 st, 2Y st'r) and Gifford Timothy (6 st, inj, 11 st '12). Despite having 1 less starter back (49 car st) this group could improve on LY's numbers.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '11 CU had to replace 1st Tm AA Da'Quan Bowers (#2DC) and a 1st Tm ACC DT (#2DC). They dropped to all'g 177 ypg rush (4.4, 24 sk). In '12 they had to replace a 2nd Tm AA DE (#2DC), a 1st Tm AA NG (#3DC) and a DT (12 st, 18 gbh) plus a bkp. Ten of the top 11 DL's were underclassmen. The only loss LY was a starting DE (13 st, #4DC) They all'd the same 156 ypg but did trim the ypc to 3.7 and had 38 sks. Not in the PSL are DE Roderick Byers (6'2" 275 Jr, PS#147, 19 tkl), DT Kevin Dodd (6'4" 280 So, PS#207, 7 tkl but RS LY). DE Martin Aiken (6'2" 255 So, PS#47, 8 tkl) and Dane Rogers (6'3" 245 rFr, PS#81). Vic Beasley turned down the NFL (13 sk, 10 tfl) which means the entire 3-deep returns. They led the nation in tfl in '13 and make my list of top D-line's!

LINEBACKERS - In '11 Clemson added the best rated class of true frosh LB's in the country (PS#2, PS#3 & PS#18). In '12 everyone ret'd (#3, #5 and #12 tkl'rs). Stephone Anthony PS#3) lost his starting spot at midssn and CU all'd 24.8 ppg. LY they had to replace 1 st'r (#1 tkl'r, 10.5 tfl) and 2 bkps (40 tkl). They still had 4 of the top 6 back (#2 and #4 tkl'rs). Anthony came back in '13 with a new attitude and was the #1 tkl'r (4 sk. 9.5 tfl), GT OL Will Jackson commented on the CU LB's calling them physical and fast while making really impressive reads. CU improved to all'g 22.2 ppg. TY they lose 3rd Tm ACC WLB Spencer Shuey (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 7.5 tfl) and Quandon Christian (10 st, #8 tkl'r, 8 tfl). They do have 4 of their top 6 back including Tony Steward (PS#2, 37 tkl) and LY added 2 true frosh in Dorian O'Daniel (PS#13) and Ben Boulware

(PS#24, 25 tkl). While solid, they are less exp'd. **DEFENSIVE BACKS** - CU finished #14, #25, #22, #24 #21, #15 & #39 in my PDR from '04-'10. They had to replace 3 st'rs in '11 and dropped to #71 (58%, 26-14). The Tigers had to replace 1 st'r and 3 bkps in '12 but had 7 back with starting exp. CU surprisingly only finished #65 (58%, 23-13). LY they had to replace their SS (#6 tkl'r, #5DC), 2nd Tm ACC FS (#3 tkl'r), a CB (#5 tkl'r) and a bkp. CB Bashaud Breeland (5 st 12 inj) returned to health so it was like having 2.5 st'rs back. I proj'd they would climb and they moved up to #36 (53.4%, 14-18).

TY they lose 2nd Tm ACC Breeland (12 st, #5 tkl'r, 4 int, 13 pbu, #4DC WAS) and CB Darius Robinson (13 st, #12 tkl'r, 3 int, 2 pbu). True frosh PS#8 MacKensie Alexander would have played but was injured. He should have a big impact as a rFr and this unit is on par w/LY in terms of exp. **SPECIAL TEAMS** - CU finished in the Top 45 of my ST rankings for 4 straight yrs but dropped to #60 in '12. LY they had to replace their P. Bradley Pinion (PS#6) had 9 punts (tm net 36.8) as a true and LY avg 39.4 (tm net 37.7). K Chandler Cantazaro was highly accurate again (18-19 '12) hitting

13-14 fg (L51) and broke CU's record (Chris Gardocki '88-'90) for most made fg's of 40 yds or longer. Ammon Lakip (PS#34) was 1-2 on fg's (L41). Pinion had 38 TB's on 78 KO's. Watkins only had 293 (20.9) on KR while Adam Humphries was a solid PR (212, 10.6). CU ret'd to their normal finish #39. Despite losing their top-notch KTY, they could still have a solid finish.

**COACHES** - After 6 games in 2008 Tommy Bowden was fired and the resounding question was Dabo who? Six years later Dabo Swinney is the only Tigers HC to lead Clemson to B2B seasons with 11+ wins and CU is one of only 8 teams to have 10+ wins each of the L/3 ssns. Chad Morris is in his 4th ssn as OC here and is currently the highest paid asst in CFB earning the AFCA Asst COY Award LY. Third yr DC Brent Venables is also one of the top 10 paid asst's and spent the previous 13Y at Oklahoma (DC '99-11).

## PHIL'S FORECAS

From 1978-'91 (14Y) Clemson had 2 or fewer losses in a season 10 times. From '92-'11 (20Y) they had 2 or fewer a grand total of zero times as their two 3-loss seasons ('93, '00) were their best finishes. Many of those years CU had the talent to beat anyone, but also had the tendency to lose games they were expected to win. In '11, coming off a 6-7 season, they made my Most Improved List. They became the first ACC team to knock off ranked foes in 3 consec weeks and won their first ACC Title in 20 years. The 10 win season was their first s/'90 and they made it to their first ever BCS bowl game. Unfortunately, WV put up 70 pts on them in the bowl. In '12 CU had 14 ret st'rs and opened 10-1 (lone loss to FSU). They led rival SC 14-10 at half but lost by 10. They trailed #9 LSU 24-13 in the bowl but rallied for a 25-24 win and finished #11. LY they ret'd QB Boyd, WR Watkins and 10 other st'rs. When they beat #5 Georgia in the opener, they became the first non-SEC team in NCAA history to win consec game vs Top 10 SEC foes. They got one 1st place vote in the AP Poll (1st s/91) and they were ranked #4 (highest s/88, #3). They moved up to #3 with an easy win over SC St. They stayed at #3 with 4 straight wins over ACC opp's (comb 155-49). Their showdown with #5 Florida St was one of the most anticipated games but they were pummelled at home, 51-14. They rebounded to blow out their next 4 foes (comb 206-74) winning 10+ gms for the 3rd season in a row (1st time s/'90). They dropped their 5th consec game to rival SC but beat #7 Ohio St in the bowl. In Dabo Swinney's first 2 full seasons he lost a total of 12 gms but has now put together B2B 11-2 seasons. CU joins Bama and Baylor as the only teams with at least one win over a Top 10 team each of L3Y. TY CU loses QB Boyd, 1,000 yd RB McDowell and their top 2 WR's in Watkins & Bryant. They did benefit from great off (12.6) and def ypp (16.1, see pg 25), 2 net close wins and had 2 net upsets. They draw GT and UNC out of the Coastal, UGA and SC out of the SEC and naturally face #1 Fla St but TY on the road. With the tougher schedule and big player losses, I don't see CU matching LY's 11 win total.
