## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

**QUARTERBACKS** - In '11 I proj'd true frosh Teddy Bridgewater (PS#7, IFS) as the st'r. Will Stein (3 st '11) won the job but inj'd his shoulder vs UK (gm #3) and the Bridgewater era began as he led UL to 2 t'ds and their 1st win over UK in 4Y and for the season had 2,129 (65%, 14-12). Stein att only 5 passes after that (620, 62%, 5-1). Bridgewater had a storied career incl a Sugar Bowl victory over Florida in '12. He threw for 3,718 (69%, 27-8) in '12. LY he was a frontrunner for the Heisman Trophy and threw for 3,970 (71%, 31-41). He had a couple of miracle plays vs Cincy to keep drives alive but did not get invited to New York for the Heisman. Will Gardner (PS#59) played in 7 LY as a rFr (8-12-112-2-0). Bridgewater left early for the NFL (#1DC MIN). Battling Gardner will be Sr Brett Nelson (PS#146JC), rFr Kyle Bolin (PS#36), JC Pat Thomas (PS#291JC) and VHT true frosh Reggie Bonnafoa (PS#25). Naturally there will be a drop off losing the 3rd overall passer in UL history to a unit with just 12 career passing att's returning.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In '12 the Cardinals had to replace their #1 and #2 rushers (Dominique Brown 533, 3.8 '11 inj RS). Senorise Perry (22 yds '11) led with 705 (5.2) but tore his ACL in gm #10. Jeremy Wright (334, 4.6 '11) finished #1 with 824 but only a 3.9 ypg. LY the Cardinals brought in Michael Dyer (PS#2) who had B2B 1,000 yd ssns at Auburn but after transferring was dismissed from Ark St. Perry made a fast comeback from his Nov ACL and st'd 6 (#2, 677, 4.8). Dyer made a 1 st (7 gm, 223, 5.1) while Brown (off his '11 inj) started 6 and had just 98 after 3 but finished #1 with 825 (5.1, 228 rec). This year they lose Perry and FB BJ Butler (1 st, 24 tfl yds). Not in the PSL are Corvin Lamb (5'9" 200 Jr, PS#157, 4.3 spd) and FB Lamar Atkins (5'11" 218 So, 1 st). Dyer did rush for 150 & 3 t'ds in the spring game and true frosh LJ Scott had 128. With the top guy back and most of the returnees being big RB's like HC Petrino covets, I'll call for them to be improved.

**RECEIVERS** - In '12 UL had to replace their #3 and #5 rec's, then lost Michael Harris (PS#38, #1 rec '11, ACL Aug) giving them just 2 of the top 5 back. DeVante Parker led with 744 (18.6) while Eli Rogers (PS#38, 454, 11.1 '11) was #4 (505, 11.0). Damian Copeland was #2 (628, 12.6). LY they ret'd their #1, #2 and #4 rec's. Parker missed 1 gm but led with 885 (16.1) with 28 t'ds in 3Y. Copeland led in rec (58) but was #2 with 780 (13.4) while Rogers was #3 (536, 12.2). TE Gerald Christian (PS#2) had 3 sts at Florida in '11 and RS in '12. He was #4 LY w/426 (15.2) and could be poised for a breakout year in Petrino's TE friendly offense. TY they lose Copeland (12 st) and TE Ryan Hubbell (10 st, 236, 16.9) but with Parker turning

down the NFL, this unit is loaded with VHT's and while their receiving stats may not go up much w/o Bridgewater, they are more exp'd and talented.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In '11 UL had to replace a 1st Tm BE RG, 1st Tm BE LT, two 2Y st'rs plus 2 bkps. The unit had just 25 car sts with 24 by C Mario Benavides, who missed the first 3. Given that criteria, you would assume a large drop and as expected UL plummeted from 175 ypg rush to 122 (3.4) and all'd their most sks s'02 (41, 10.8%, 17 sk '10). In '12 they had to replace 1 st'r but had 74 car sts back. I thought UL would get back to '10's numbers but they stayed the same (123, 3.5) trimming the sks to 31 (6.8%). LY they lost their top 2 OL in 1st Tm BE C Benavides (4Y st'r) and a 2nd Tm BE LT. They ret'd 3 soph st'rs from '12 (64 car sts). This time UL made the improvement I expected in '12 (147, 4.2, 26 sk). Three OL st'd all 13 (1 st'd 12). TY they only lose RG's Kamran Joyer (7 st) and Chris Acosta (5 st). The career sts increase to 121 (#7 FBS) as they return 1st Tm AAC C Jake Smith, 1st Tm AAC LT Jamon Brown and 1st Tm AAC LG John Miller and add in Florida transfer Ian Silberman (PS#24). The Cardinals do take a step up in level of competition but this is their best OL in at least 4 yrs.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '12 UL had 7 back with starting exp losing 3 DL who had a comb 20 sts. Their numbers were decent (148 ypg rush, 4.3, 22 sk). LY the entire 2 deep ret'd. DE Marcus Smith (PS#112QB) who came to UL as a QB became a QB's nightmare and registered 14.5 sks taking home 1st Tm AA honors. At the other DE spot, Lorenzo Mauldin was in a scooter accident late Aug but still st'd all 13 and goes 100 mph everyday, at every practice. Mauldin had 9.5 sks (1st Tm AAC). The Cards improved to all'g 81 ypg rush (2.6) with 43 sacks. TY they lose 3 st'rs in Smith (13 st, #1DC PHI), DT Roy Philon (12 st, 42 tkl, 4 sk, 9 tfl) and DT Brandon Dunn (13 st, 43 tkl, 4.5 tfl) but are moving to a 3-4. The now 3-man unit has 40 car sts returning but clearly with the losses, they won't match LY's numbers (also a tougher schedule TY).

**LINEBACKERS** - In '12 UL had 3 LB's with the last name of Brown on the D so you had a pretty good shot that one would be the leading tkl'r and MLB Preston Brown (84 tkl '11) earned that spot (109) and Keith was #5 w/57. George Durant, who moved from DE to LB in '11 (2 tkl), st'd 8 and was #6 (4.5 tfl). LY they had to replace 1 bkp (4 st, 17 tkl). With all 3 st'rs back they almost cut the ppg in half from 23.8 in '12 to 12.2. TY they lose 2nd Tm AAC MLB Preston Brown (13 st, #1 tkl'r, 4.5 sk, 8 tfl, #3DC BUF), Durant (6 st, 15 tkl), Champ Lee (1 st, 17 tkl, 1 sk) and Deon Rogers (13 tkl). Keith Brown (PS#26) was inj LY (4 gm, 1 st) but now is back. This year they move to a 3-4 and since 2 of LY's ret st'rs com for just 18 tkls, they are close in terms of experience for '14.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - LY UL had to replace 1 st'r but ret'd 4th Tm AA Calvin Pryor (#2 tkl'r) and 3x All-BE Hakeem Smith. I said they could easily have their best finish in my PDR s'04 (#21) but they did even better (#10, 51%, 8-16). Charles Gaines is one of the team's fastest players and QB Bridgewater dubbed him "Black Badger" as his play reminds him of Tyrann Mathieu. They were great in run support highlighted by FS Calvin Pryor who at 6'2" 210 played like a LB. TY they lose 1st Tm AAC FS Pryor (12 st, 2 tkl'r, 3 int, 4 pbu, #1DC NYJ), 1st Tm AAC SS Hakeem Smith (13 st, #5 tkl'r, 3 int, 5 pbu) but return 5 of the top 8. They also add in JC Jeremy Sample (PS#30, orig @ Wash). They lose their top 2, play a tougher schedule and it'll be tough to top their highest finish s'01 (#7) in my PDR.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - As you can see to the right, Charlie Strong had success on the ST unit his first 2Y (#18, #27). In '12 they had to replace their P (36.4 net), K (12-18, 2 from

50+) and top KR (23.6) but it still surprised me that the bottom dropped out (#122). New P soph Ryan Johnson had just a 32.0 net. Most of the key players were back LY and I thought it could be one of the most improved ST units and they moved up to #56. John Wallace hit 20-24 (L43) and of his 4 misses, 3 were blk'd. Wallace had 14 TB on 80 KO (4 TB '12). Johnson improved his avg to 41.2 (tm net 37.4). UL was +6.4 on PR and even on KR. TY everyone returns including KR Charles Gaines (30.1, 1 td) and I will call for solid improvement for a 2nd straight year.

**COACHES** - Bobby Petrino left Louisville after a 12-1 season in 2006 and the Cardinals won a combined 15 gms over the next 3Y. Charlie Strong took Louisville to a BCS bowl in '12 and matched Petrino's 12-1 mark LY before leaving for Texas. It's full circle as Petrino returns after spending LY at WKU. His first stint was from '03-'06 before leaving for the Atlanta Falcons ('07) and Ark ('08-'11). OC Garrick McGee was Petrino's OC at Ark and spent the L2Y as the UAB HC. DC Todd Grantham was the DC the last 4Y at Georgia. He spent the 11 yrs prior in the NFL incl 2Y as the Cowboys DL cch ('08-'09) and 3Y as the Browns DC ('05-'08).

## PHIL'S FORECAST

When former HC Howard Schnellenberger ('85-'94) got UL's program turned around he said the Cardinals were on a collision course for the Nat'l Title. In '06 they blew a 25-7 lead vs Rutgers or they would have been in that Nat'l Title gm. Bobby Petrino left after that season where they were 12-1 and finished #6. The next 5 years, the Cards were 29-33 but did not go to bowls in each of Charlie Strong's F2Y ('10 & '11, 7-6 each yr). In '12 they had just 9 seniors and Bridgewater's heroic effort vs Rutgers on the road (trailed 14-3 when he came off bench) had them win the final Big East Title and they ambushed #4 Florida in the Sugar Bowl (finish #13). LY the Cards played my #98 rated sked and did not face a ranked team (at time of game) all year. After blowing out their first 2 opp's they had a 492-376 yd edge at Kentucky and won 27-13. UL almost got B2B shutouts but a blk'd punt led to a Temple td w/38 left (beat FIU & TU by comb 102-7). Despite a 461-240 yd edge vs Rutgers they only won by 14 in a lackluster Thurs Night matchup. They led UCF 28-7 early 3Q but the Knights would get a td w/23 left for the upset, 38-35. UL rolled past USF and Connecticut on the road but then needed a late stop to get past Houston, 20-13. UL led Mem 24-3 but the Tigers got within 24-17 in a game that was much closer than expected. They needed OT to get past Cincy on the road, another close win. Strong has been tremendous in bowls and they whipped Miami 36-9. Despite finishing 12-1, UL was just #15 in the AP. TY Petrino returns and inherits 11 ret st'rs but one of those is NOT Teddy Bridgewater. He does have a veteran O-line, top RB and WR Parker back plus a D that all'd just 12.2 ppg and 251 ypg (#1 NCAA!). While only one letter changes in the name of the conference they play in, the step up in level of competition is huge moving from the AAC to the ACC. They should face at least 3 ranked teams on TY's sked after facing zero LY. They rate a -3.0 in the Stock Market Indicator, benefitted from great off ypp (13.1) and def ypp (20.7, pg 25) had 2 net close wins and were +17 in TO's all signs of pointing downward. Still this is a talented team and while they won't match LY's 12 win total, they will have another solid season.

UL's inaugural ACC gm (1st time opening ssn w/a conf opp s/73). In LY's Russell Athletic Bowl, UL trailed 2-0 1Q but scored the next 36 into the 4Q (Bridgewater had a career high 447 pass yds).

Louisville is 12-6 but L/loss was in '84. In the L/gm ('11) the Cardinals won 21-9. UL led 21-0 w/13:20 2Q but gained just 126 yds the rest of the gm. The Racers went 6-6 LY incl 0-2 vs the FBS (Missouri & BG).

UL is 1-1 vs UVA. LTH ('89), also the L/meeting, UL lost 16-15. Louisville is 10-3 in road openers incl 3 str wins by 9 ppg. UL was a BE/AAC member the L9Y going 16-16 in conf AG's (11-3 L4Y).

Fourth str ssn these tms will meet. LTH UL trailed 14-7 mid-2Q but scored the next 21 pts to lead by DD's. FIU did out the deficit to 7 w/4:53 left but after the deep KO UL ran out the clock (36/11p) w/3 FD's.

In the only prior gm ('06 Orange Bowl) UL won 24-13. UL trailed by 3 just 14 seconds into the 4Q. UL went on B2B 4Q td drives (81/8p & 71/10p) while WF had to punt and was int'd at the UL15.

Former BE opps from 2005-'12. Schools last gm ('12) was also at the Carrier Dome. UL came in 9-0 (ranked #11) but trailed 38-13 late 3Q (45-19 w/11:14 left) despite being outgained by just 52 yds.

**Notre Dame:** First meeting. TY Bobby Petrino begins his 2nd stint at the helm in Louisville guiding the Cardinals to a 41-9 mark from 2003-'06. He also was the HC at Arkansas from '08-'11 (34-17) & at WKU LY (8-4).

Played every yrs '94. LY was tied 3-3 2Q but UL led 20-3 after 3Q's. UK gained 37% (139) of their yds in the 4Q.
