

QUARTERBACKS - NW has had a great run of QB's with Brett Basanez leaving as the career passing leading after '05 and CJ Bachér leaving as the #3 career passer in '08. Mike Kafka set bowl and schl records in his final gm in '09 (47-78-532, 4 td) vs Aub (2nd Tm B10, #4DC). Dan Persa was the tm MVP in '10 accounting for an FBS best 75% of NW's offense. Persa (73.5%, #1 FBS '10) shattered UW's Darrell Bevell's Big Ten comp % record (67.8% '93). When Persa was inj'd they burned the RS on speedy Kain Colter (3 gms, half snaps in bowl). Colter started the first 3 in 11, giving them a 2-QB attack with Persa the pocket passer and Colter the #1 rusher. Persa left as the all-time career comp % leader here (72.7%) throwing for 2,376 (73%, 17-7) in '11 while Colter added 673 (67%, 6-1) as the Wildcats' 254 ypg passing led the Big Ten. In '12 Colter was the st'r but Trevor Siemian (PS#43) att'd a comb 68 passes vs Ind & Penn St (Colter 3 att vs Ind). Colter started to see action at WR (9-131 vs Ind). After Penn St, they alt'd at QB. With Colter behind center, they had 85% runs (Siemian 63% pass). Siemian threw for 1,312 (59%, 6-3, 48 rush) while Colter threw for 872 (68%, 8-4, 894 rush, 5.3). 6'4" rFr Záck Oliver (PS#39) played in 3 (2-2). LY Colter was inj'd in the opener (ret for 2nd gm). Siemian's best moment came in the ssn finale vs III when he hit 31-44-414. TY Colter departs after throwing for 577 (78.8%, 3-4, 489 rush). Siemian threw for 2,149 (59.7%,11-9, 33 rush). Oliver ply'd in 5 (2 att). expect rFr PS#17 Matt Alviti (9750 yds pass HS, 65.3%, 2040 rush, 128 ttl td) to take over as the running QB and contend for the job. Even with the loss of Colter. I could see improved numbers from a position that was banged up LY.

RUNNING BACKS - NW's leading RB had just 302 (3.7) in '09, 530 (4.6) in '10 and 471 (4.4) in '11. Mike Trumpy was the leader in '10 but had an ACL inj after 3 gms in '11 (183, 5.5). The leading returnee from '11 was Treyvon Green (362, 3.7 true). The key move of '12 was sliding slot WR Venric Mark to RB. Mark was a revelation becoming the Wildcats' first 1,000 yd rusher s/'06 (Tyrell Sutton) w/1,366 (6.0, 696 ret yds, 104 rec yds, #1 B10 all purp yds) and was 2nd Tm B10. Trumpy was the #2 RB (349, 4.6) and Green slipped to 73 (3.3). In '13 Mark was injured and played in just 3 (97, 3.1). Showing how banged up the unit got, vs Neb, they were down to 6th string RB Tim Hanrahan (6'0" 210 Sr). Stephen Buckley (6'0" 180 So) was OFY after 9 (265, 5.3). Trumpy was the #2 RB w/370 (3.8). Green led with 736 (5.4) incl 158 vs WM, 129 vs Cal & 149 vs Neb. Adding depth are Xavier Menifield (5'10" 190 rFr, PS#102)

& Warren Long (6'0" 180 So, PS#109). Mark returns (only lose Trumpy) and that should make this a vastly improved group and they also add PS#16 true frosh Justin Jackson.

RÉCEIVERS - In '12 NU had to replace their top 2 rec's (comb 1582, 13.2) and 12's #3 rec, Kain Colter (466, 10.8) played mostly at QB. Tony Jones' nickname is "4.2 Tony" as he benches 325 and was #2 in 12 w/335 (11.6). The top 5 comb for just 1,661 and NW as a team avg'd just 9.5 ypc (#122 FBS) Christian Jones (PS#71) led with 412 (11.8) and 6'2" Rashad Lawrence added 321 (9.4). LY the top 3 ret'd. Tony Jones had 255 (18.2) in the first 2 but surprisingly just 375 (9.1) the L/10 and finished #2. Christian Jones had 182 yds on 13 rec vs III and led w/668 (12.4). TY they lose Lawrence (12 st, 463, 14.9) and Mike Jensen (106, 15.1). They not only have the top 2 back but I expect Kyle Prater (PS#1, USC) and Miles Shuler (PS#22, Rutgers), a pair of transfers, to live up to their VHT billings. This is one of the Big Ten's best receiving corps.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Pat Fitzgerald likes an athletic O-line. As an example, Jack Konopka had been an SB in '11 (1 rec) and moved to RT in '12 (13 st). With 73 car sts back, the '12 version saw the rushing numbers skyrocket to 226 (4.9), their best ypg s/'00 while trimming the sks from 43 to just 16 (4.3%). LY they had to replace a 3Y st'g LT, a 2nd Tm B10 LG (3Y st'r), a 2Y st'g RG and a bkp (2 st). With the loss of 3 st'rs (as well as RB Mark). the car sts dropped to 40 and the rushing numbers dropped to 172 (4.1) while the sks rose to 36 (9.4%). Fitzgerald has done a good job recruiting here and TY's line returns intact (100 car st) which should make them a vastly improved unit in '14.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Three times in the last 6 yrs, NW has all'd less than 4.0 ypc rush incl '08 when they set the schl record yielding just 126 ypg (3.6) and led the B10 in sks w/34. Just 2 yrs later in '10 they yielded 5.1 ypc (17 sk). In '12 they had to replace 4 DL (comb 36 sts) and ret'd 1.5 st'rs incl Tyler Scott (lost after 6 st in '11). Scott led w/9 sks and the Cats yielded just 128 ypg (3.8, 28 sk). LY they had to replace 2 st'rs but ret'd 6 of their top 8 and added in PS#25 rFr Ifeadi Odenigbo. Scott was named tm MVP but they still slipped to 167 ypg rush (4.1, 27 sk). After 5 gms, DT Sean McEvilly (10 st '12) was OFY. TY they lose Scott (12 st, 6 sk, 4 tfl) and McEvilly's replacement, Will Hampton (9 st, 22 tkl). Getting McEvilly back is like having 3 ret st'rs and Odenigbo had 5.5 sks as a bkp LY, so despite the loss of their top guy, they should improve upon LY's numbers.

LINEBACKERS - In '12 NW ret'd 3 LB's who had 7+ sts (#3, #7, #10 tkl'rs). Collin Ellis (9 st, 28 tkl '11) was beat out by Chi Chi Ariguzo (PS#125) who was very dynamic (91 tkl, 3 sk, 7.5 tfl). NW all'd just 22.5 ppg (best s/08) and 3 st'rs made HM B10. LY they had to replace their #2 tkl'r but ret'd their #1 and #3 plus inserted Ellis to the open slot so it was like having 3 full-time st'rs back. All 3 st'd all 12 so they maintained good health. NW's D slipped to allowing 27.1 ppg. TY they lose Damien Proby (12 st, #1 tkl'r, 5 tfl), and Timmy Vernon (5 tkl). They do return their #2, #3 and #12 tkl'rs and move a S (#8 tkl'r) in. Despite being a little less exp'd, I look for better play from the Wildcats' D.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - In '12 NW had to replace 3 st'rs and the unit was my main? but they actually improved to #48 in my PDR (58%, 18-13). LY they had to replace 2 CB's (comb 9 st, 62 tkl) and their st'g S (12 st). They ret'd Ibraheim Campbell (2 int, 12 pbu) who had been the #1 tkl'r in '11 & #4 in '12. Daniel Jones (7 st '12) was OFY in Wk 1 so they had a little less than 2 st'rs back. NW slipped to #66 (59.9%, 20-19). Campbell had an int in 5 consec games, breaking the schl record (Brett Whitley, 4 st, '85). TY the only losses are CJ Bryant (12 tkl) and Davion Fleming (7 tkl). Since they get Jones back, it's like returning 6 full-time st'rs plus they add Parrker Westphal (PS#22) who was IFS. I'll call for NW to finish in the Top 40 of my PDR for the first time s/'05

SPECIAL TEAMS-The Cats had struggled STRANK on ST, never finishing above #65 in a 6Y stretch prior to the arrival of Venric Mark in '10, when they moved up to #28. They regressed in '11 (#67) but moved back up to #24 in '12. Mark was named 1st Tm FWAA AA in '12 (1st here s/'05) but was ini'd LY (1 ret, 3 gms). Matthew Harris was the top KR LY w/484 (23.0) and Tony Jones the top PR TmP but with only 64 (7.1). Jeff Budzien hit 6-10 fg's K/O (40.4)... (L47) in '11 and improved to an almost perfect +/- td/blk 19-20 (L44) in '12 and then hit 23-25 (L43) in '13. Opp (36.8). He had 21 TB on 65 KO. Brandon Williams avg'd (38.7).

39.9 (37.6 net) in '12 but dropped to 36.0 (33.2 tm net, #121). TY they lose Budzien and Williams but with the return of Mark, they have the potential to top LY's #73 finish

CÓACHES - The Wildcats are only 1 of 4 schools to have the same HC, OC and DC the L6Y. Pat Fitzgerald was hand picked by the late Randy Walker as his replacement and became the youngest coach in the NCAA in '06' at 31. He is now in his 9th season. Seventh year OC Mick McCall was BG's OC in '07 (QB cch '03-'06) and QB/RB cch at WY ('01-'02). Also in his 7th year here is DC Mike Hankwitz, who was the DC at Wisconsin ('06-'07), Colorado ('04-'05) and A&M ('97-'02).

PHIL'S FORECAST

Northwestern actually won or shared 3 Big Ten Titles in a 6 year stretch from 1995-2000. Pat Fitzgerald had the unenviable task of stepping in after the team suffered the sudden loss of HC Randy Walker over the summer of '06. He did a good job, just getting the team to 4-8. In '07 I called for the Cats to be bowl eligible and they were at 6-6 (not invited). Fitzgerald then guided them to 5 consec bowls with his high water marks being 9-4 in '08 and in '12 when, despite being ranked just 1 week during the reg season, after they beat Miss St, they finished #17 at 10-3. The amazing thing about '12 was that NW was just 5:03 away from an unbeaten record. That win over Miss St was their first bowl win since the 1948 Rose Bowl. LY they entered the season #22, their first preseason AP ranking s/'01! I pointed out that NW was -3.5 in my Stock Market Indicator, had benefitted from +14 in TO's and +3 net upsets and had beneficial ypp's. They had 14 ret strs and opened 4-0 and were #16 for their showdown with #4 Ohio St. GameDay was on hand as well as National TV. OSU got a td w/5:22 left to take the lead. NW tried a lateral play which fumbled into the EZ and OSU fell on it for a td and a misleading 40-30 win. The next week, after giving their A++ effort vs the Bucks, they had nothing left on the road vs a Wisc team coming off a bye and were trampled 35-6. They then lost vs Minn as the injuries piled up. They had a 329-305 vd edge vs lowa but lost by 7 in OT. It didn't help that 13 key players were inj'd heading into Nov. NW still had Neb beat by 3 when the Huskers got a Hail Mary pass on the final play. They had Mich beat but UM hurried their fg unit on to the field with the holder sliding into position. I don't know if they were ever completely set, but the fg counted on the last play, sending it to OT for another tough loss. After getting whipped by Mich St, they rebounded to beat rival III 37-34 and finished 5-7 in a season they could have easily been 9-4. Naturally, TY things are pointed in the upward direction. They are +3.0 in the Stock Market Indicator, Ohio St and Mich St drop off the schedule, they had 4 net close losses LY and -2 net upsets. They also have 17 ret st'rs. A huge addition is RB Venric Mark who was a 1st Tm AA PR in '12 and was greatly missed LY. NW is one of the teams on my Most Improved List (pg 38) and a surprise contender in the Big Ten West.
