POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

QUARTERBACKS - In '11 VT had to replace ACC POY Tyrod Taylor (2743, 60%, 24-5, 659 rush) who left (#6DC) as the car passing and tll off leader. Logan Thomas (PS#3TE) played in 7 (12-26-107) in '10. When I spoke with Frank Beamer, he expressed great confidence in the 6'6" 257 lb Thomas (strong arm, great mobility). Thomas started off slow but got better each week in '11, finishing w/3013 (60%, 19-10, 469 rush). Prior to '12 Thomas was listed as a potential 1st Rnd DC by most, even drawing Cam Newton comparisons but he had a disappointing season. He threw for just 2,976 (51%, 18-16, #1 rusher 524). Soph Mark Leal (PS#83) ply'd in 2 (4-6-26) and Brenden Motley (PS#51) RS. Thomas did not leave early for the NFL and despite the addition of QB cch Scot Loeffler, had an uneven season. In his defense, he was under heavy pressure most of the year (leaky O-line) and while he made his 40th straight start in the bowl, he was KO'd in the 2Q (2907, 56.5%, 16-13, 344 rush, #4DC ARZ). Leal surprisingly ply'd in just 2 gm vs Ala and WCar (comb 3-4-25) before filling in vs UCLA (12-25-130, 0-2, 3 sk). Despite the loss of a 3Y starter they could produce similar stats and I expect VHT Texas Tech transfer Michael Brewer (PS#19) to win the starting job.

RUNNING BACKS - Prior to '12, VT had no problems replacing a 1,000 yd rusher as long as they had a VHT waiting in the wings (see '13 mag). I pointed out in '12 that they did not have a VHT and they had to replace David Wilson (PS#8, schi rec 1709, 5.9, #1DC). They used a 4-man RB rotation and JC Coleman had the fewest yds (492, 4.5) for a #1 RB here s/'67. Tony Gregory added 299 (4.7) while rF Michael Holmes (PS#88) had 280 (4.0). They managed to RS Trey Edmunds (PS#35) and Chris Mangus (PS#57). Over the summer they lost both Holmes and Gregory but as I had projected, rF Edmunds won the starting role. Edmunds had 132 on 20 carries vs Bama but over the next 8 he had just 315 (3.0). In the final 3, he had 228 (5.6) but missed the bowl (675, 4.1). rF Chris Mangus was moved to WR in Aug but moved back to RB due to all of the inj's. He had a 76 yd run vs WCar but just 65 more yds the rest of the ssn. WR Joel Caleb (PS#12) moved to RB but had just 41 (5.1, 2 rec). With the entire unit back and some solid frosh additions, I expect much improved numbers (4 VHT's in unit).

RECEIVERS - The L2Y the Hokies have suffered some big losses at rec. LY they had to replace their top 3 rec's (comb 2166, 17.1). The leading returnee was Demetri Knowles (240, 12.6). The unit had a lot of drops in the opener (4 by Knowles). They expected to get more use out of the TE and the clear #1 was Ryan Malleck (7 sts '12) but he was OFY late Aug. Knowles was #2 w/641 (14.2). Willie Byrn (PS#431), who was labeled

a poss rec, led with 660 (12.9) incl an 83 yd rec vs NCar. Rf Joshua Stanford was #3 w/640 (16.0). TY they only lose DJ Coles (8 st, 387, 15.5) and get back Malleck (upgrade at TE) and have 2 conv QB's that should make an impact (see below). Adding depth are TE's Jack Willenbrock (6'2" 215 So, PS#122) and Dakota Jackson (6'3" 256 So, PS#44). This is the most exp'd the VT rec's have been in years.

OFFENSIVE LINE - VT's rushing numbers have now dropped 4 consec seasons. In '07 and '08 they actually allowed 96 sks combined, then a comb'd 65 the next 2 yrs and 42 from '11-'12. LY VT had to replace 3 str's but did return 4 who had st'd 5+ in '12 (44 car st) so I expected improvement. VT slipped to 120 ypg rush (3.2, 33 sk). Jonathan McLaughlin became the 1st true frosh LT to start under Beamer (1st gm vs Bama) and the 1st true frosh OL to start an opener s/'06. Thanks to a 77 yd run they had 153 yds rush vs Ala. VT had 6 gms where they had 76 yds or less rush. TY they lose 2nd Tm ACC RG Andrew Miller (13 st, 3Y str). They improve to 73 car sts with 5 back that had 6+ sts LY, I'll call for them to stop the streak of declining rush numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - VT always has a solid defense. In '11 they all'd just 104 ypg (3.2) rush with 41 sks. Corey Marshall (then 250 lb) became the first true frosh to start here s/'02 and later was replaced by another frosh in Luther Maddy. In '12 the line ret'd mostly intact. The first 6 gms stunned me as VT all'd 197 ypg rush (4.6, 8 sk). Over the final 7 it looked more like a VT defense (80 ypg, 2.4, 27 sk) despite facing 5 bowl eligible tms. LY Marshall RS, so they had 3 ret str's and as expected (my computer proj'd 110 ypg) the unit improved to allowing 111 ypg (3.2, 39 sk). TY they lose DE JR Collins (12 st, #7 tkl'r, 5 sk, 6 tfl), DT Derrick Hopkins (13 st, #6 tkl'r, 5 sk, 4 tfl), DE James Gayle (13 st, #9 tkl'r, 6 sk, 4.5 tfl) and bkp Tyrel Wilson (13 tkl, 1 sk). DC Bud Foster will put together another solid D-line but with just 1 ret str (they got back Marshall) and with LY's starting 4 comb'd for 22.5 sks (best s/'99), they figure to be less formidable in '14.

LINEBACKERS - LY VT had to replace their #3 tkl'r (11 st) and 2 LB's (comb 7 st, 66 tkl). Both '11 & '12 were injury-plagued seasons so despite losing 3 of the unit's top 4 tkl'r's, I thought they could be improved. The injuries cropped up again. The Vandyke brothers (Ronny PS#64DB & Devin PS#69) both basically missed the season. VT's D improved a little to 19.3 ppg all'd. TY they lose ILB Jack Tyler (13 st, #1 tkl'r, 4.5 sk, 6.5 tfl), ILB Tariq Edwards (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 3.5 sk, 7.5 tfl) and NB Kendall Fuller (PS#3) is now at CB. With the loss of their top 3, this unit is clearly weaker but is also promising with Dahman McKinnon running a 4.4 in the spring.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - VT always fields a solid secondary with Top 15 finishes in my PDR in 9 of the L10Y. In '12 they had 32 sts ret from '11 and finished #8 (50%, 17-13). LY they only had to replace 1 DB (4 st, 43 tkl) and added in a PS#3 true frosh so I had big expectations for them. Their star CB Antone Exum tore his ACL in January (3 st, 4 tkl). Starting CB Kyle Fuller inj'd his groin (8 st, 24 tkl). They st'd 2 true frosh CB's most of the year in Kendall Fuller (#4 tkl'r, 6 int, 11 pbu) and 6'2" PS#88 Brandon Facyson (#11 tkl'r, 5 int, 8 pbu) and the duo finished 1st and 3rd for the ACC Rookie DPOY. Their S's were the #3 and #8 tkl'r's. VT actually finished #1 in my PDR (48.5%, 12-19). While they lose 2 very talented CB's in Kyle Fuller (2 int, 10 pbu, #1DC CHI) and Exum (#6DC MIN), they did not play much LY and this unit is stronger than LY's and will be a favorite to take home B2B top honors despite not having the same type of front 7 ahead of them.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Beamer coaches this unit himself and VT almost always finishes near the top of my ST rankings (#1 in '07). After a #6 finish in '10 they had mediocre (for them)

#44 and #37 finishes. LY everyone was back so I expected big things. Shockingly, VT dropped to #106, its lowest finish ever. It started in the opener vs Bama when they gave up a 72 yd PR td (first s/'08) and a 94 yd KR td. VT was -7.2 on PR's. P AJ Hughes improved to 44.1 (37.3 tm net). Cody Journell hit 20-25 (L42) in '12 but was susp in gm #4 and his replacement went 0-3. Journell then hit a 56 yd fg, the longest in Beamer's tenure (3rd longest VT hist) and made 10-16 fg's (L56) before being booted with 3 games to go. Four players in all kicked fg's but the 3 not named Journell were only 5-10 (L38). TY they used a scholarship on a K for the first time s/'09. Given Beamer's history they should have one of the most improved ST units in the country.

COACHES - Frank Beamer played CB here ('66-'68) and now stands as the FBS's active leader in wins. He had 4 losing ssns in his F/6 but has now taken the Hokies to 21 straight bowls. Beamer started his HC career at Murray St ('81-'86). Second year OC Scot Loeffler was Auburn's OC in '12, Temple's in '11 and Florida's QB cch the 2 years prior. Bud Foster has been the DC s/'95 and won the Broyles Award in '06 (only 4x finalist in award's history).

PHIL'S FORECAST

VT is just 1 of 2 active NCAA teams (Fla St the other) that have been to 21 straight bowls. In '99 the Hokies played in the National Title game and went 22-2 in the 2yr stretch finishing #2 in the final polls in '99 and #6 in '00. Since then, the Hokies have finished the season ranked 10 of 13 yrs incl #10 in '04, #7 in '05, #9 in '07 and #10 in '09. Unfortunately, two of the 3 non-ranked yrs have come the last 2 seasons. Since VT joined the ACC in '04 they have been the most dominant team going 62-18 (reg ssn) in conf play and playing in 5 of 9 ACC Title games, with 4 ACC Titles. Coming into '12 VT was the only FBS team that won 10+ gms in each of the previous 8 yrs. VT was picked first in the Coastal by 83 of the ACC's 95 media members but they finished even lower than my projection (2nd) at #4 going just 4-4 in ACC play. They needed OT to win at BC, edged past Virg by 3 and then beat Rutgers in OT just to finish with a winning record at 7-6. LY my Stock Market Indicator was bullish at +4.0 and they had been -3 net upsets in '12. They had 14 ret str's incl what looked to be one of the best D's in the nation. VT's D lived up to its billing early, holding the defending Nat'l Champ Alabama to just 206 yds as the Tide used 2 return td's to blow it open 35-10. VT had a 311-204 yd edge vs EC but only won 15-10. The next week in the rain vs Marshall, they could have easily lost numerous times but in 3OT's prevailed 29-21. They shut down GT's option leading 14-3 and held them to 273 yds. VT led NC 27-10 before allowing a gbg td w/1:09 left to "only" win by 10. Pitt also went 75/7 for a gbg td w/2:01 left to only lose by 10. At 6-1 VT was #16 but suffered their first defeat to Duke s/'81 despite a 387-198 yd edge. They had a 446-289 yd edge at BC but a 4-0 TD deficit saw them upset again. They crushed Miami, FL (26-12 FD) with QB Thomas having a career game (25-31-366). VT trailed MD 21-7 but stormed back to force OT before losing in the extra frame by 3. While they beat instate rival Virginia for a 10th str time, it was 6-6 late 2Q and they only won by 10. They only trailed UCLA 14-10 after 3Q's but QB Thomas was inj'd in the 2Q and VT allowed 28 AQ pts to finish 8-5. TY VT again has 14 ret str's but lose 5 of their top 9 tkl'r's on D. They do draw BC and WF from the Atlantic but face 4 bowls teams on the road in Ohio St, NCar, Pitt and Duke. VT still has a great shot at a double digit win season and a possible return to the ACC Title game.

63rd meeting. VT has won 10 str incl a 44-3 win in the L/gm ('07), last series loss was in '76. Hokies are 17-1 in Blacksburg openers (lost to FCS James Madison '10). Tribe went 7-5 LY incl a 24-17 loss to WV.

First meeting. The Hokies are 19-2 in 'true' road openers (lost at #2 LSU in '07 & at Pitt in '12). VT is 3-7 L3Y vs ranked opp's. VT last beat a Top10 ranked squad in '09 (#9 Miami, FL), dropping 3 str since.

VT is 10-1 s/'93. LYVT trailed 7-0 just 1:39 in. Gm was tied at HT & VT trailed again in the 2H 10-7 w/8:49 3Q. VT got a GWtd on the next drive (75/10p) holding EC to just 21 yds their L4 poss incl 2TO's & a SAF.
