POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

QUARTERBACKS - Iowa was one of a couple of QB units in '13 which lost a multi-yr str yet I still projected improved QB play. In '12 James Vandenberg took every snap at QB (2249, 57%, 7-8). LY it was a true 3-man battle that wasn't decided until Aug. It reminded me of 1987 when Ferentz was the OL coach here and they had Dan McGwire, Tom Poholsky and Chuck Hartlieb in a 3-man battle. Hartlieb was #3 out of spring but eventually led the team to wins in 7 of their last 8 and left with multiple schl records. Soph Jake Rudock (PS#53) was the bkp in '12 but never took a snap, although he was on the travel squad (signaled in plays). They added in Cody Sokol (PS#56JC) and rFr CJ Beathard (PS#76). While all 3 have good mobility, Rudock won the job becoming the first UI QB to make his debut in the ssn opener in 19Y. His stats weren't overwhelming (2383, 59.0%, 18-13) but Iowa still won 8 gms. Rudock looks like a drop back passer (6'3" 208) but ran for 218 (3.3, 5 td). Beathard played in 5 (9-27, 33.3%, 179 pass, 49 rush). TY Sokol trans but they go from 0 career pass att's to having 2 exp'd QB's. They are in the best shape at this position in years.

RUNNING BACKS - In '11 Marcus Coker became the 5th UI RB to top 1,000 under Ferentz. Speedy Jordan Canzeri was #2 (114, 3.7). In '12 Coker became at least the 14th RB to leave the program with eligibility left s/'02, while Canzeri tore his ACL. True frosh Barkley Hill (PS#66) was the #1 but tore his ACL in Aug and 3 other RB's were lost over the summer. Damon Bullock (20, 2.0 '11) rushed for 150 in the opener but was inj'd in Wk 3. He came back after Mark Weisman went down and had 513 (3.8) in just 6 gms. Weisman attended Air Force for 1 semester in '10 and lives in the weight room. He was at FB when Bullock & bkp Greg Garmon (122, 3.2) were both inj'd. Weisman ended up leading with 815 (5.1) incl 217 & 177 yd efforts. LY the AIRBHG "Angry Iowa RB Hating God" did not show up and the unit remained fairly healthy. Weisman had 180, 148 and 147 early but was banged up and didn't top 90 in the L/8, coming up 25 yds short of 1,000 (975, 4.3). Bullock had 85 vs Purdue and finished #3 (467, 4.0). After watching the spring game, I thought Canzeri would be a force but in the first 8 he carried the ball more than 3 times in a gm only once (13-73 vs WM). He broke out vs Purdue with 165 and finished #2 (481, 6.5). Everyone is back again. Not in the PSL are LeShun Daniels (6'0" 230 So, PS#85), Jonathan Parker (5'8" 180 rFr, PS#202) and Hill (6'0" 215 So). As long as the AIRBHG stays away, this is the deepest and strongest Iowa RB corps in quite some time.

RECEIVERS - Iowa ref'd 3 of their top 4 rec's LY but with healthy RB's they ran more and some rec's dropped. Kevonte

Martin-Manley led but with just 388 (9.7) which was their lowest total for a leading receiver here s/'81 (301 yds). 6'2" soph Tevaun Smith was #2 with 310 (12.9) and TE Jake Duzey was #5 w/270 (14.2). TY they lose 1st Tm B10 TE CJ Fiedorowicz (12 st, #3, 299, 10.0, #3DC HOU), Jordan Cotton (1 st, 2 rec) and Don Shumpert (4 st, 182, 12.1). Speedy JUCO Diamond Powell arrived late & had just 12 rec but they were for 291 yds (24.2). Adding depth are Blake Haluska (6'4" 212 Sr), Riley McCarron (5'9" 185 So) and TE Henry Krieger Coble (6'4" 250 Jr, PS#47). Even with the loss of an outstanding TE, this unit can only be more productive especially with an exp'd QB.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Ferentz was an NFL OL coach which means this unit is always one of his top priorities. He's had 13 OL drafted in his tenure. In '12 they had to replace a #1DC LT, a #5DC RG, a 2Y RT plus a bkp. They ret'd 53 car sts in '11 and 45 in '12. UI's entire starting OL on opening day consisted of native Iowans (1st time s/'80). In the first 6 they avg'd 155 ypg (4.5, 7 sk) but then LT Brandon Scherff (leg) and RG Andrew Donnal (knee) were both OFY. Over the last 6 they avg'd just 91 ypg (2.8, 15 sk). LY they lost a 2nd Tm B10 C (3Y str) and a 2Y str at LG. UI ret'd 3 str's (2 in '12) and I said they should remain healthier and be improved (45 car st). While the OL struggled vs Mich St (23, 1.4) and LSU (76, 2.1), overall they improved to 180 ypg (4.2, 15 sk). TY they lose 2nd Tm B10 RT Brett Van Sloten (13 st, 2Y str) and LG Conor Boffeli (13 st). They return 2nd Tm AA LT Scherff and TY's 2-deep includes 7 VHT's and the unit's car sts rise to 62 making this one of the stronger OL's in the B10.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Iowa had inexp'd DL's in both '11 and '12. In '11 they had to replace #1, #4 and #5 DC's and all 3 st'd NFL games. UI allowed its highest ypg and ypc rush (156, 3.7) s/'00. Ferentz usually signs smaller DL's that can get bigger but in '12 brought in 4 true frosh who all had the size to play right away. The unit ret'd just 13 car sts and the numbers got to new highs again at 162 ypg (4.1) with 13 sks (worst in B10). They burned the RS on true frosh Drew Ott after 7 gms. LY they had to replace 2 str's but trimmed the ypg rush to 128 (3.6, 24 sk). DT Carl Davis earned 2nd Tm B10. TY they lose DE Dominic Alvis (8 st, inj, 31 tkl, 3 sk, 3 fl) but have 7 of the top 8 back and are improved again up front.

LINEBACKERS - When Christian Kirksey (6 tkl true), James Morris (6 st, 70 tkl true) and Anthony Hitchens (9 tkl true) entered as frosh (in '10) it was the first time s/'02 that LB's did not finish #1 and #2 in tkls. That trio dominated this position their final 3 yrs. In '11 Morris and Kirksey tied as the #1 tkl'rs. In '12 they had to replace 1 str (#5 tkl'r) and Iowa fielded one of the fastest threesomes to start here at LB for quite some time (#1, #2, #3 tkl'rs). LY they were a big reason Iowa made my Most Improved List. The trio finished #1 (Hitchens, #4DC DAL), #2 (Morris) and #3 (Kirksey, #3DC CLE) again and the D all'd just 303 ypg, the best 4 in yrs. The top returnee is Quinton Alston (PS#49) who was #14 w/12 tkls. Naturally, TY the unit goes from a strength to a ? as it loses 73 of 75 sts from the L2Y.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Since '06, UI has had 9 diff full-time starting CB's. Seven of those 9 were in the NFL LY. Is it any wonder that UI finished #7, #6 and #20 in my PDR from '08-'10? In '11 they had to replace a 1st Tm B10 SS (#6DC) and a 2nd Tm B10 FS and plummeted to #85 (62%, 21-10). In '12 they had to replace a 1st Tm B10 CB (#5DC) and their lone VHT (PS#11, 89 tkl, #7DC) and were #78 (64%, 16-10). LY they had to replace the B10 DBPOY in CB Micah Hyde (#5DC), their SS (F/8 st, #8 tkl'r) and 2 bkps (36 tkl). I said that I could see UI moving up to the top half of my PDR for the first time s/'10 and they were #45 (54.9%, 20-13). Soph Jordan Lomax (PS#84) was inj'd early and impressive true frosh Desmond King (who was not on the opening 2-deep) st'd the final 12 (#6

tkl'r, 8 pbu). TY they lose 1st Tm B10 BJ Lowery (13 st, #7 tkl'r, 3 int, 16 pbu) and FS Tanner Miller (13 st, #5 tkl'r, 3 int). Iowa has 2 str's back just like LY and could move up again in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Ferentz believes his ST unit should be the great equalizer allowing Iowa to contend with teams that have superior talent. Iowa had 4 Top 20 finishes in my ST rankings into '06. As you can see on the chart to the right, they have not been back since. LY they brought in a new ST cch in Chris White (4 yrs NFL Vikings). They had their P, K & top KR back and rose to #42. Mike Meyer hit 16-22 fg's (L49) after hitting 45-58 the prev 3 yrs. Connor Kornbrath (PS#15) had only a 37.9 avg (34.4 tm net) as a true frosh and avg 40.0 (37.5 net) LY. KR Jordan Cotton (536, 28.2 '12) had 731 (25.2) getting a 96 yd non-td KR in the bowl. Since '10 Iowa has been burnt by a fake punt at least six times. Against WM, Kevonte Martin-Manley became the first ever B10 ply'r with B2B PR td's (184 yds on PR) and finished with 314 (15.7). TY they lose 2nd Tm B10 K Meyer and KR Cotton.

COACHES - Many overlook the stability of the HC position here but Iowa is only 1 of 3 schools (VT & Fla St) that have only had 2 HC's since 1979. Kirk Ferentz took over for legendary Hayden Fry in '99 and has been named the Big Ten COY 3 times. Third year OC Greg Davis was Mack Brown's OC for 15 yrs at Texas and UNC. DC Phil Parker, who has also been here 15Y (DB cch) is in his 3rd ssn as DC.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Kirk Ferentz was 2-18 in his first 20 gms at Iowa but is 106-61 since. His best stretch came from '02-'04 when Iowa finished ranked AP #8 in each season winning a share of the Big Ten Title in both '02 and '04. That was followed by a 3 year stretch where they went just 19-18. In '08 they finished 9-4 (#20) and in '09 moved all the way up to 11-2 beating GT in the Orange Bowl to finish #7. Ferentz appeared to have lost his magic as the Hawkeyes struggled. In '10 Iowa earned their highest B10 media poll at #2 (avoided the other four B10 contenders, 14 ret str's, SR QB) but slipped to 8-5 and after being ranked all season, dropped out in the final wk (NR), despite a bowl win over Missouri. Their record slipped each of the next 2 yrs to just 7 and 4 wins and LY they were picked 5th by the media in the Legends div. I pointed out they were +3.5 in the Stock Market Indicator, had -3 net upsets and their off ypg was poor (16.1) in '12, all factors pointing up. What wasn't pointing up was that they drew both Ohio St and Wisc out of the Leaders. My power ratings varied greatly on Iowa ranging them from 2-10 to 9-3 but it was a veteran group. Even with that criteria, Iowa made my Most Improved List and actually was stronger than their 8-5 record. The Hawkeyes' first 3 losses (NIU, Mich St, Ohio St) were to teams that combined for 1 loss during the reg ssn. Iowa led eventual B10 Champ Mich St 14-10 at half and Ohio St 17-10 at half. After beating NW to move to 5-3, they lost to Wisc 28-9 trailing just 14-9 after 3Q's. After blasting Purdue, they outgained Mich 407-158 but needed a 34 yd fg w/6:02 left to take the lead. They then crushed Neb on the road, 38-17. Iowa gave LSU a good game in the bowl but came up a td short. They finished 8-5 and were +53 ypg in B10 play. TY the Hawkeyes return 13 str's incl QB Rudock, all of their top RB's, the top 2 rec and 3 stg OL. They also draw a favorable schedule (Indy & MD from East) and their B10 opp's had a comb 23-41 record in conf play LY. They get their main contenders in the West at home in Neb, Wisc and NW. The talent and schedule make them a prime contender in the new Big Ten West.

Iowa is 15-1 (only loss in 1898). In the L/gm ('12) Iowa won 27-16. They trailed 10-7 into the 2Q and only led by 8 after 3Q's but forced a punt & stopped UNI at UI 43 their two 4Q drives. Iowa is 2-0 outscoring BSU 101-0. In the L/gm ('10) the Hawkeyes won 45-0 all'g just 56 pass yds & 8 comp passes. BSU didn't cross midfield till the 3Q and never ran a play in the UI redzone. For 3 str yrs the Cy-Hawk Trophy has been decided by 6 pts or less. LY Iowa led 27-7 late 4Q but all'd B2B 82 & 59 yd td drives. The Hawkeyes finally sealed the gm rec an onside kick w/2:25 left. Iowa is 4-6 in their L/10 true'road openers (have won B2B). Visitor is 0-4. LTH ('08) Iowa lost 21-20. UI led 17-14 into the 4Q but down 1 was forced to punt 2x's & fumbled (UI20) their L/3 drives. Hawkeyes are 18-6-1 in this series s/'83 (3-1 since '05 in West Lafayette). Under Ferentz UI is just 7-8 in their B10 ssn opener (4-1 L5Y). UI is 0-3 the L/4 ssn in the 2nd of B2B AG's (no byes).

Bonus: Hawkeyes are 48-5 all-time vs current FCS opponents and all 5 losses were prior to 1939.

Hawkeyes are 7-3 s/'01 vs the Hoosiers but did lose the L/gm ('12) 24-21. Iowa jumped out to a 14-0 lead & led 21-17 4Q. After all'g a td w/10:58 left, UI didn't cross the 50 their L/3 drives. First meeting. Into 2014, under Ferentz the Hawkeyes overall are 26-34 on the B10 road and 11 times in his 15 yr tenure have finished .500 or below (only once sweeping the conf AG slate; '02).

Iowa is 3-6 s/'05 but the home team has won 4 str. Under Ferentz UI was 2-6 their first 2Y in B10 HG's but into '14 the L13Y has gone 36-16. Into '14, UI is 3-1 after a reg ssn bye since 2010.

Iowa is 10-3 s/'01. LY in the Floyd of Rosedale Trophy series the Hawkeyes limited the Gophers to just 80 yds the 1H. In fact in the L/2 ssn Iowa has led at HT 17-0 & 24-0. LTH ('08) Iowa lost 27-24.
