## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

**QUARTERBACKS** - RFR Taylor Martinez took charge of the QB position in 2010. He got into the Heisman race after running for an NU QB record 241 yds vs K-St and also set a frosh record for pass yds in a game (23-35-323-5-0 vs Okla St) while becoming the 1st QB in NU hist with 300 pass and 100 rush in a gm. In the first 7 Martinez rushed for 870 (8.7) but he was inj'd and in the final 7 had just 95 (1.5). He threw for 1,631 (59%, 10-7). In '11 (1st yr in B10), Martinez started healthier and put up similar numbers (2089, 56%, 13-8, 874 rush). In '12 Martinez was tutored by QB guru Steve Calhoun in the offseason and was perhaps the most improved QB in the FBS. Martinez threw for 2,871 (62%, 23-12) w/1,019 rush (5.2, 10 td). Ron Kellogg (PS#226) played in 4 and true frosh Tommy Armstrong (PS#28) RS despite being the true bkp. LY Martinez started the 1st 3 but a foot inj had him hobbling vs UCLA, he sat out 3 then was OFY vs Minny (667, 62.7%, 10-2, 117 rush). Armstrong st'd 8 but split time with Kellogg, who st'd vs Iowa (Armstrong ankle). Armstrong (966, 51.9%, 9-8, 202 rush) was 7-1 as a st'r and hit a schl record 99-yd td pass in the bowl. After Martinez was officially declared out NU was -13 TO's in their L/6 gms. Kellogg had 919 (59.7%, 6-3, -11 rush). TY Martinez (20+ schl records) and Kellogg depart. Armstrong returns as does Johnny Stanton (PS#33) who OC Beck said has the "it" factor and they add in PS#32 true Zack Darlington (IFS). Martinez's injury all'd the Huskers to get a jump-start on 2014 and despite the loss of their career leader, the Husker QB numbers should improve.

**RUNNING BACKS** - Rex Burkhead had 346 (4.3) in '09 and 951 (5.5) in '10. Burkhead took command with 1,357 (4.8) and 15 td's in '11 while the speedy, talented true frosh Ameer Abdullah (PS#95) had 150 (3.6, 870 ret yd). In '12 NU was promoting Burkhead for the Heisman but he was banged up and missed 6 (675, 6.9). Abdullah came in a "rocked up" 185 lbs (squats 500+) and led with 1,137 (5.0) with 100 in each of his first 5 sts, the longest streak here s/97 (Ahman Green, 11). Imani Cross (PS#45) had 324 (5.9, 7 td). LY Abdullah & Cross both topped 100 in the opener. Abdullah would crack the century mark 11 times (incl 8 str) highlighted by 225 (11.3) vs Illinois. His lowest output was 85 (3.7, Iowa) as OC Beck said he rarely practiced due to inj's all yr but still led with 1,690 (6.0). Imani Cross had 330 (5.4) in the 1st 6 but just 117 (4.9) in the L/7. True frosh Terrell Newby (PS#22) had 290 (5.8) in the 1st 6 but only 4 att's in the L/7. TY they add in RFR Adam Taylor (6'2" 210, PS#32). While Cross was the star of the spg gm, Abdullah is one of the nation's best RB's and this unit is deep.

**RECEIVERS** - In '11 RFR Kenny Bell (1 of fastest NCAA), led with 461 (14.4) while 6'2" Quincy Enunwa had 293 (14.0). In '12 six of the top 7 were back and Bell became just the 4th NU

rec with 800 yds (863, 17.3, 8 td) in a season (Johnny Rodgers '71, '72, Maurice Purity '07, Nate Swift '08). Enunwa was #2 (470, 11.2) and Jamal Turner finished #3 (417, 13.0). LY they lost both of their HM B10 TE's (comb 596, 14.2). Enunwa led with 753 (14.8, 12 td) but didn't crack the 100 mark until the bowl, where he had a schl record 99 yd td. Bell was #2 (577, 11.1) and RFR Jordan Westerkamp was #3 (283, 14.1) incl his 49-yd Hail Mary td rec vs NW. TE Jake Long missed 3 (121, 15.1) while true frosh TE Cethan Carter had 127 (12.7). Turner played in just 8 (102, 7.8). TY they lose Enunwa (13 st, #6DC NYJ) and Long (9 st). Not listed below are TE's David Sutton (6'3" 240 Jr, PS#99) and Connor Ketter (6'5" 235 rFr, PS#181). Despite the loss of their top guy, they have 5 of the top 6 back.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In '12 NU had to replace a 2nd Tm B10 C (2Y st'r), a 2Y starting RT (#7DC) and their LT and had 44 car sts back. NU used a 7-man rotation which kept them fresher and they improved to 253 ypg (5.4, 35 sk, 9.3%). LY they had to replace 2 st's but ret'd 2 All-B10 players incl 2nd Tm AA RG Spencer Long (78 car sts ret). Injuries hit the unit hard as they were missing 3 st's vs Mich St. Long was OFY after 6 and later they moved LT Jeremiah Sirles to RT and RT Andrew Rodriguez to RG. NU slipped to 216 ypg (4.8) but allowed just 17 sks (4.5%). TY the losses are heavy as gone are 2nd Tm B10 C Cole Pensick (12 st), RG Long (2.5Y st'r, #3DC WAS), 3rd Tm B10 Rodriguez (13 st, 2Y st'r), 3rd Tm B10 Sirles (13 st, 3Y st'r) and LT Brent Qvale (L/5 st, 18 car st). This will be the major ? on TY's squad with just 32 car sts incl Colorado transfer Alex Lewis' 15 but LY's inj's did allow some younger players to gain exp.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - With 1st Tm AA Ndamukong Suh at DT, NU all'd just 93 ypg rush (2.8) with 44 sks. The next 3Y, the numbers got weaker and in '12, with 3 st's back, they yielded 193 (4.8, 31 sk). Ironically, had they not made the B10 Title gm (all'd 539, 10.8) their ssn avg would have been 166 ypg (4.1). LY they had to replace 3 st's incl a 1st Tm B10 DE (8.5 sk), a 2nd Tm B10 DT and 2 bkps. They added in 2 VHT rFr and a PS#5JC in Randy Gregory (not enrolled until summer) and I said despite just 1 st'r back the numbers couldn't get any worse. They knew there would be some growing pains on the D-line. Gregory got an IR td, the first for a NU DL s/Suh, showing the kind of athlete he is (#3 tk/r, 10.5 sk, 8.5 ft, 10 sts, 1st Tm B10). TY they lose DE Jason Ankrath (13 st, 36 tk, 4 sk, 5 ft) & DT Thad Randle (11 st, 31 tk, 3 ft). I do like their DT combo of Maliek Collins and Vincent Valentine. This group is much more exp'd and will have their best rush D numbers s/09.

**LINEBACKERS** - LY NU had to replace 3 LB's who were the #1, #4 and #9 tk/r's (62 car sts ret) so it was a lightly exp'd group. They had expected big things from PS#17JC Zaire Anderson in '12 but he RS (ACL). LY Anderson only st'd 5 gms but was the #5 tk/r. Soph David Santos st'd 10 and was the #2 tk/r w/87. RFR Michael Rose st'd the final 6 at MLB (#3 tk/r, 6 ft) and true frosh Josh Banderas (PS#29) st'd 4 (28 tk, 2 sk). The unit returns intact and they add a VHT rFr who will challenge. This unit is the polar opposite of LY in terms of exp and has plenty of VHT's taking it from a ? to a strength.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - In '12 NU had to replace the B10 DBPOY in Alfonzo Dennard (#7DC) and their FS but finished #12 in my PDR (47%, 18-13). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm B10 S (#2 tk/r, #7DC), an HM B10 FS (#3 tk/r) and 2 bkps (24 tk). Stanley Jean-Baptiste (6'3" 220, 4.4 spd) took over at CB moving Andrew Green to FS. NU slipped some to #26 (54.1%, 17-14). TY the losses are heavier as gone are 2nd Tm B10 CB Jean-Baptiste (13 st, #7 tk/r, 4 int, 12 pbu, #2DC NO), CB Ciente Evans (2Y st'r, #6 tk/r, 4 int, 6 pbu), FS Green (10 st, t-#7 tk/r, 3 pbu), Mohammed Seisay (PS#25JC, 9 tk, 1 pbu) and FS Harvey Jackson (3 st, 33 tk). CB Josh Mitchell has 15

car sts and joins SS Corey Cooper (#1 tk/r) so this unit is on par with '13 exp-wise plus adds in PS#11 Auburn trans Jonathan Rose.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - In the last 20 yrs NU has ranked in the top 10 of my ST rankings 8 times. LY they lost their triple threat, K/P Brett Maher (96 KO, 57 TB, #4 FBS, 20-27 fg, L54, 41.8, 35.6 net). For a 2nd straight year they struggled with fmb's while fielding punts and avg'd just 3.0. They avg'd 22.8 on KR led by WR Bell who had a 99-yd KR td vs PSU. Western Illinois trans Pat Smith took over the fg duties and was 12-13 (L46) while RFR P Sam Foltz avg'd 41.6 (net 37.9) and they finished #26. TY Smith departs but they signed Drew Brown (PS#10) the younger brother of Neb great and NFL PK Kris. Everyone else returns and they could finally jump back into the upper echelon of my rankings provided they get better production from their PR.

**COACHES** - Bo Pelini was the DC here in '03 and the interim HC for that year's bowl win. He was Okla's co-DC in '04 and LSU's DC from '05-'07 before returning as HC in '08. Pelini's name has been mentioned as being on the "hot seat" for several different reasons but the reality is he's led NU to 9+ wins in all 6Y (only Saban at Bama and Petersen at Boise St did so). Tim Beck is in his 7th ssn here (4th as OC). John Papuchis is in his 6th ssn here (3rd as DC).

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Nebraska has had a long history of success winning B2B National Titles in '94 and '95 and finishing ranked in the top Ten 8 of 9 yrs from '93-'01. The Huskers have not finished in the top 10 since. They went through a regrettable 4 yrs from '04-'07 (27-22) when Bill Callahan tried to switch them from their power option rush attack to a pass attack. In Pelini's first year, NU made my Most Improved List despite having just 10 ret st's and they did not disappoint going 9-4. In '12 they had 14 ret st's and even with Mich & Mich St the favorites to win the Legends, I went out on a limb and picked the Huskers for the Big Ten Title game. NU had 29 seniors and got to the title game but were steam rolled by Wisc 70-31 and then lost by 14 in the bowl to Georgia. Interestingly, Frank Solich and Callahan comb for six 4-or-more loss seasons. If there is one thing Pelini has been during his 6 yrs, it is consistent as NU has lost exactly 4 gms each and every year although LY they had their lowest reg ssn win total s/08 at 8-4. They opened up 2-0 and had an 18 pt lead over UCLA but lost. The Huskers rolled over their next 3 opp's and led Minn 10-0 but got outplayed the rest of the game and were upset on the road, 34-23. They needed a Hail Mary td pass vs NW with no time left bringing up memories of the miracle at Missouri in '97 to escape with a 3 pt win. They had a 273-175 yd edge vs Mich but needed a late td to pull out the win. They had a 392-361 yd edge vs eventual Big Ten champ Mich St but were -5 TO's and lost. They were down to their 3rd string QB most of the game vs Penn St but got it to OT and pulled out the win. At home on the Friday after Thanksgiving, Iowa started 7 drives from Neb terr and while NU had a 288-282 yd edge, Iowa won 38-17. In the bowl they were outgained by Georgia 416-307 but pulled out the 24-19 win, their 9th straight win in games decided by 7 or less, a nation leading streak. TY NU has just 11 ret st's. Despite the record LY, the Huskers benefitted from 5 net close wins and draw Mich St out of the East. They were -11 in TO's LY but keep in mind, they haven't won a conf game since 1999 and could be a dog in all 4 Big Ten road games.

Last home opener loss was in '85, 17-13 vs #17 FSU (28-0 since). In the only prior gm ('09) NU won 49-3 but had just 132 more yds (FD even) as FAU missed a fg, had 3 TO's & were SOD 2x's.

The only other meeting was in '02, NU won 38-14. The Cowboys went 10-3 LY (FCS playoffs). MSU has beat a FBS opp each of the L2Y (27-21 at Middle Tennessee in '12 & 53-21 at USF LY).

NU beat FSU 42-29 in '11 (only prior gm). NU trailed 20-14 until a 16 yd td pass w/8:20 3Q put them up by 1 (never trailed again). In the 4Q FSU cut the deficit 2x's to 6 or less but NU responded.

Series is tied 5-5. The L/meeting was the '01 ssn Rose Bowl with the L/reg ssn gm in 1976. Into '14, NU is 49-4 s'96 hosting non-conf opp's (Ls vs Smiss '04, USC '07, VT '08 & UCLA LY).

Cornhuskers are 8-2-1 vs the Illini with the last series loss in 1924 but the L/meeting prior to LY was in 1986. Nebraska is 9-3 hosting Big 10 opp's since joining the league in 2011 (2 losses LY).

NU is 2-0 all-time in East Lansing. LTH NU trailed 24-14 early 4Q but down 3 w/1:20 went 80/9pl getting a GW 5 yd td run w/0:06. NU is 15-5 LSY on the conference road (8-4 vs Big 10 foes).

Last time here Nebraska trailed 28-16 before going on drives of 80/10pl & 76/6pl. The GW td came w/2:08 left (2ptng). The Wildcats missed a 53 yd fg w/1:10 left in the game, down one.

Nebraska beat Rutgers 28-0 in their only series game (1920, New York, NY). The Cornhuskers are 6-0 since 2007 at home after 2+ AG's. RU along w/Maryland join the Big 10 this year.

Just the 3rd series game. LY Nebraska hammered Purdue. NU led 44-0 as PU gained 25% of their tll yds on a 55 yd pass with :39 left. The only other gm in this series, NU lost 28-0 in 1958.

NU hasn't won here s'66. LTH ('11) #8 NU lost 48-17 vs #7 UW. NU led 14-13 before allowing 28 straight.

LY's loss snapped a 16 gm series win streak. NU is 21-5 in home finales, last time lost B2B '03 & '04.

LTH NU trailed 7-3 at HT but limited UI to just 70 LTH yds (2.6 ypp). NU is 4-1 in recent gms (s'99).
