POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

QUARTERBACKS - In '12 Tyler Russell (PS#7) took over after 2Y st'r Chris Relf graduated. Russell had 4 sts in '11 (1034, 54%, 8-4) and st'd all 13 (2897, 59%, 24-10) in '12. He became the first MSU QB to be chosen for the then 76 year old Maxwell Award Watch List and broke/tied 11 schl records. RFR Dak Prescott (PS#47) played in 12 (194, 62%, 4-0, 118 rush). 2013 was supposed to be Russell's big year but he was inj'd in the opener and a couple of other gms. He ply'd in just 7 (875, 65.1%, 5-3). The team was orig built around Russell's throwing and it took Mullen a few gms to tailor the offense to the more mobile Prescott. Prescott had just 3 int's in the first 7 but then had 3 int's and a fmb'l that led to 20 pts for SC. He did well throwing for 1,940 (58.4%, 10-7). He missed Bama and Ark and did not start vs Ole Miss (pinch nerve left arm). True frosh Damian Williams (PS#96) got the start with Russell also out and hit 8-18-82. Prescott came off the bench and hit 11-20-115 guiding MSU to the win and bowl eligibility. Williams did have the GW 25 yd td run vs Ark in OT and had 112 (3.0) rush on the year. Prescott was the team's leading rusher w/829 (6.2, 13 td) and had 2 td rec's. As long as Prescott improves on his passing eff, this unit will be stronger despite the loss of the sch'l's #3 career passer.

RUNNING BACKS - In '12 the Bulldogs had to replace Vick Ballard (PS#16JC, #5DC) who led in rushing in '10 (968, 5.2) and '11 (1189, 6.2, 2nd TM SEC). LaDarius Perkins (PS#99) was #2 w/422 (4.9) and rfr Nick Griffin (PS#95) added 108 (6.8). Perkins topped 100 in 4 of 5 and was one of 5 FBS RB's that had a td in each of his first 5 but only had 2 over the final 8. He got past 1,000 in the bowl (1024, 5.0). Nick Griffin (PS#95) st'd vs LSU (38) and finished with 223 (7.0). RFR Josh Robinson (PS#78) was the star of bowl practices in '11 but only had 244 in the reg ssn before 91 (13.0) in the '12 bowl. LY they added in PS#27 true Ashton Shumpert but for the first time in the Mullen tenure did not have a true FB. Perkins was never really 100% but still led the RB's with 542 (4.0). Robinson had 73 vs A&M and 101 vs Ark finishing w/459 (5.9). Shumpert had 98 vs Alcorn St but only had 190 (4.1) on the yr. Not in the PSL is Brandon Holloway (5'8" 160 So, PS#184) who had 115 tly yds at WR LY. Despite the loss of Perkins, I look for more production.

RECEIVERS - LY they had to replace their top 4 rec's and the leading returnees were TE Malcolm Johnson (171, 17.1) and WR Robert Johnson (PS#53, 164, 9.6). Jameon Lewis (5'9", PS#107) had 251 (14.8) in his first 2Y but became the feature WR and set a sch'l record with 220 in the bowl (923,

14.4). Twice already he's had a td rushing, throwing and rec in the same game (3 td passes, 117 rush). R Johnson was #3 w/389 (11.4) and M Johnson was #2 w/391 (13.0). True frosh DeRunnya Wilson dropped a td pass vs Bama but otherwise was a revelation w/351 (13.5). 6'4" soph Joe Morrow (PS#48) was supposed to be the breakaway threat but never emerged (211, 11.7). Not in the PSL is TE Gus Walley (6'4" 230 So, PS#63). This unit goes from practically having 0 exp to having everyone back.

OFFENSIVE LINE - After having 79 and 85 career sts returning in '10 and '11 MSU dropped to 43 car sts in '12 and their young OT's got overpowered by some elite DE's at the end of the year and they dropped to 144 ypg (4.4, 19 sk). LY they ret'd four 13 gm st'rs incl 2nd TM AA LGabe Jackson (95 car st back). RG Justin Malone (4 st '12) was OFY after Wk 1. At midseason they were banged up as 6 OL's who had st'd in '12 missed practice prior to BG. Still, the numbers improved to 190 ypg (4.7, 23 sk). TY they lose 2nd TM AA Conerly Trophy winner Jackson (13 st, 4Y st'r, #3DC OAK) who became one of the first two Bulldogs to play in 4 straight bowls, RT Charles Siddoway (PS#46JC, 13 st, 2Y st'r) and Dylan Holley (1 st). This unit still looks strong with 3 ret st'rs 81 car sts.

DEFENSIVE LINE - DC/DL cch Chris Wilson called '12's group the largest (17 DL) he has had at one time that can really play. Surprisingly the unit all'd 166 ypg rush (4.3), their highest s/04 with just 19 sks. LY they ret'd 3 of their top 4 DL tkl'r's only losing a #5DC and 3 bkps (9 st, 43 tkl). They all'd 144 (4.2, 20 sk). True frosh Chris Jones (PS#6, 32 tkl, 3 sk, 4 tfl) drew raves all year from DC Geoff Collins. TY they lose DE Denico Autry (13 st, 31 tkl, 2 sk, 4.5 tfl) but return 7 of their top 8 and get back Nick James (PS#44) who RS LY.

LINEBACKERS - In '12 MSU had 2 ret st'rs (#1, #5 tkl'r's). LY they had to replace their #1 tkl'r whose 10 tfl were double that of any other LB but ret'd 2 st'rs (#2 and #5 tkl'r's) incl Benardrick McKinney who is just the 4th player in MSU hist to be chosen as a Frosh AA (Corey Browning '09, Billy Jackson '80, Mardye McDole '77). Despite a brutal schedule, MSU's def improved by 38 ypg (349 ypg). TY they lose LB Deontae Skinner (10 st, #2 tkl'r, 4.5 tfl) but return 5 of the top 6 incl rfr Beniquez Brown (PS#50) and Richie Brown (PS#70) who comb for 77 tkl's and 7.5 tfl. This time they return their top LB and are even deeper (49 car st).

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Johnthan Banks st'd as a frosh in '09, MSU finished #49, #30, #46 and #50 (64%, 17-19) in his 4 yrs. That '12 finish was surprising as Banks won the Jim Thorpe Award and CB Darius Slay had 5 int's. LY they had to replace Banks (#2DC), Slay (#2DC) and their SS (#7 tkl'r). The unit was less talented but after underperforming in '12, I said they might not drop much in my PDR and they finished #56 (61.9%, 18-14). Soph Taveze Calhoun picked off Bama's AJ McCarron twice and also ret'd a blk'd fg 68 yds vs Okla St proving to be a playmaker. Nickoe Whitley came up 1 int shy of tying the sch'l car record (Banks and Walt Harris '92-'95) finishing w/15. TY they lose 2nd TM SEC FS Whitley (11 st, #4 tkl'r, 5 int, 2 pbu) but return 3 st'rs and I expect more out of PS#13JC 6'3" Justin Cox (t-12 tkl'r) and they also get back SS Jay Hughes (PS#105) who tore his Achilles in the 1Q of the opener LY which Mullen called a "huge loss" at the time.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Prior to HC Mullen taking over, this unit had not finished higher than #81 in 5Y. In his first 4Y they finished above that each time incl #39 in '12. LY they only had to replace their top PR. K Devon Bell (14-21 fg as true) hit just 6-14 fg's with a long of 40 and Evan Sobieski hit 3-6 fg's (L38). Bell had 25 TB on 66 KO. P Baker Swedenburg improved to 42.5 but split duties with Bell (41.2). The team net dropped from 39.9 to 36.8. They avg'd just 3.6 on PR (-2.4) and 21.7 on KR plus had

3 punts either blk'd or dropped snaps (2 safeties). The unit had a disastrous gm vs A&M with a punt blk'd, a fg blk'd, a roughing the P and a 97 yd KR. The unit dropped to #120. Mullen had cch'd the ST unit himself but split those duties up LY. TY RB cch Greg Knox is the ST coach. They lose Swedenburg but should make a good sized climb.

COACHES - No Miss St HC had ever taken the Bulldogs to 4 straight bowl games but that was prior to Dan Mullen. Mullen, now in his 6th year here, was Urban Meyer's QB cch at both BG and Utah and was his OC/QB cch at Florida. Les Koenning was the OC here the L5Y before leaving for Texas and they have co-OC's in Billy Gonzales (WR cch LY, Illinois co-OC '12) and John Hevesy (MSU OL cch 5 yrs). However, Mullen calls his own plays. DC Geoff Collins is in his 4th season here with the first 2 as co-DC. He was previously the FIU DC ('10) and the UCF LB coach ('08-'09).

PHIL'S FORECAST

In Dan Mullen's first year, they had just 10 ret st'rs but guided the team to a 5-7 record (3-5 SEC) which were more wins than I expected. He beat my expectations a 2nd straight yr in '10 as MSU went 9-4 and finished ranked (#15) for the first time s/00 (#24). Interestingly, from 1997-'00, MSU actually had the best record of all the SEC West teams. In '11 I pointed out that MSU had a schedule tailor-made for either greatness or disappointment. Expectations were high as they were #20 in the preseason but they hosted LSU, SC and Bama which meant most of their winnable games were on the road. They were even favored over an undefeated defending National Champ on the road in Wk 2 but lost to Auburn. They needed a Music City Bowl win to get a winning record at 7-6 (NR). In '12 they had 12 ret st'rs and a more favorable schedule. I picked them higher than everyone else. MSU opened up 7-0 but the schedule got tougher and they went just 1-5 down the stretch incl a Gator Bowl loss to NW and finished 8-5. They had gotten as high as #13 when they were undefeated and played Alabama but finished NR. They were favored in 9 gms in '12 and I said LY they would only be favored in 4 or 5 in '13 and that was the case. They trailed Okla St 3-0 late 2Q but lost 21-3. They outplayed the eventual SEC Champ Auburn on the road but AU got an 11 yd td pass with :10 left. After blowing out Troy 62-7 they only trailed LSU 28-26 late 3Q but LSU went on a 31-0 run. MSU jumped out to a 21-10 lead vs BG but held on for a 21-20 win. On a Thurs night they jumped out to a 21-7 lead vs Kentucky but had to hold on for a 28-22 win (UK SOD at MSU29 w/21 left). MSU had a 385-307 yd edge and 23-12 FD edge at SC but had poor clock management to end the half and 2 of Prescott's int's came off his WR's hands and they lost by 18. They trailed A&M 51-27 in the 4Q before getting a couple of late td's. At home they only trailed Bama 10-0 at half and lost 20-7. Mullen's job was probably in jeopardy as they could have easily lost their last 2 to finish 4-8 but Ark fumbled deep in MSU terr and the Bulldogs won in OT, 24-17. QB Prescott was doubtful for the Egg Bowl, but came off the bench and MSU got a 36 yd fg w/2:21 left to force OT and won to get MSU to the Liberty Bowl where they routed Rice, 44-7. Despite being 3-5 in the SEC, Miss St was +2.6 ypg in conf play and TY draws Vandy and Kentucky from the East. They also have 16 ret st'rs incl QB Prescott and 9 of their top 11 tkl'r's (19 of top 22 on D). They did benefit from 3 net close wins LY but are +1.5 in my Stock Market Indicator, 2 facts that offset each other. They should be favored in 8 or 9 games and this could be the year they sneak into contention in the SEC West.

MSU has won the L/2 but the L/meeting (13-10 win) was in 1990. The Bulldogs are 8-4 s/o/2 in home openers but 2-4 vs FBS opp's. SMISS won its final gm LY snapping a 23 gm losing streak.

MSU is 4-1 (all gms after '04). In the L/meeting ('11) the Bulldogs won 21-3. UAB led 3-0 at HT but in the 2H MSU outgained the Blazers 318-159 forcing 2 TO's on just 4 UAB poss.

In the schools only prior meeting ('12), MSU won 30-10. MSU led 20-0 at HT w/a 204-104 yd edge (30-3 until garbage td all'd w/4:14 left). MSU is 4-9 s/o/1 in road openers but has won 2 of L/3.

The last time MSU won in Baton Rouge was in '91 (11 str losing trips). LTH MSU led 7-6 mid-2Q & only trailed 20-17 w/12:52 3Q. From that pt LSU scored the L/17 pts capped off w/a 100 yd IR td.

L/time MSU beat A&M in the reg ssn was 1915. LY even though MSU scored 41 they trailed wire to wire. In the 2H MSU never got closer than 9 pts. Their 556 yds was the most in a SEC gm under Mullen.

MSU is 2-11. LY MSU trailed 11-0 but led 20-17 until all'g a 88/12pl drive, capped off by a GW 11 yd td pass w/10. MSU has lost at least 2 SEC HG's in 12 of the L13Y (last sweep in '99).

Bulldogs have won 5 str incl a 27-14 win LTH. MSU led 14-0 & 27-7 early 3Q coasting the rest of the way w/a 25-13 FD & 427-228 yd edge. Into '14, MSU is 3-9 L3Y in SEC AG's (2 wins at UK).

MSU is 4-15 but has won B2B gms. LY MSU was down 10-0 and 17-10 after 3Q's. They tied it up early 4Q but missed a 42 yd fg w/18. In OT they got a 25 yd td run on their 1st play & int'd UA 4 plays later.

In the schools only prior meeting, MSU won 55-17 on HC in '11. MSU led 35-3 late 3Q but only had a 570-454 yd edge (+4 FD). The Skyhawks went 7-5 LY incl losses vs Boise St & Memphis.

MSU is 0-3 L/3 trips being outscored 33-8 & outgained 410-241. LTH was #13 vs #1, MSU trailed 38-0 4Q.

Bulldogs have won B2B w/o topping 17 pts. L/gm ('09) MSU held VU to 10 FD & 157 yds (long drive was 32 yds).

Visitor is 2-13 in the Egg Bowl. LTH it was tied 17-17 at HT but MSU all'd 24 str 2H pts (gbg td w/07).
