POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

OUARTERBACKS - The attrition that UM QB's suffered in '12 was mind-boggling. CJ Brown (PS#42) had 5 sts in '11 (842, 49%, 7-8) and set a single ssn schl record for QB rush yds w/574 (7.3). He entered '12 as the clear-cut st'r but tore his ACL in Aug. The injury left true frosh Perry Hills (PS#67) and Caleb Rowe (PS#64) as the only QB's. Hills led them to a 4-2 start and was clutch, hitting 69% in the 4Q of those 6 gms. He was OFY (ACL) in the 2Q of Wk 7. By the time the ssn ended 5 had taken snaps at QB incl LB Shawn Petty, who ran a Navy-style option offense in HS. He st'd the L/4. LY Brown st'd the F/5 but suffered a conc vs Florida St. Gunslinger Caleb Rowe st'd vs Virg and threw for 332, 2nd most of any QB in Edsall's 3Y here. Brown ret'd vs WF but was pulled in the 2H. Rowe threw for 207 yds in the 2H (12-27) and then 20-46-287 vs Clem. He would not att another pass as Brown started the L/4. In 7 gms Rowe had 989 but just 48.9% (5-3). Brown threw for 2,242 (58.9%, 13-7) and was the #2 rusher w/576 (4.1). TY both return as does Hills (6'2" 215 So) who RS LY and Shane Cockerille (6'2" 220 rFr, PS#37). This is a much more exp'd unit with 2 back who have been full-time st'rs and improved numbers are a distinct possibility.

RUNNING BACKS - Davin Meggett led the team in rushing in both '10 (720, 5.7) and '11 (896, 5.2). In '12 the most exp'd returnee was Justus Pickett (274, 3.7). RFr Brandon Ross (PS#112) was #1 out of spring and they added 2 VHT's in Wes Brown (PS#20) and Albert Reid (PS#39). All 3 were banged up in '12. Ross led w/390 (4.6) while Brown was #2 (382, 4.2) and Pickett a distant #3 (142, 2.1). Brown is the most difficult of RB's to bring down. Unfortunately, Brown was susp'd for the '13 ssn. Reid, who had 92 (2.6) as a true, had 45 in the opener. Ross was the top RB rusher in the next 3 (149 vs ODU). Jacquille Veii (5'9" 180 So, PS#292) was one of the summer's most impressive players. He had 96 (5.3) over the first 2 but only 50 (2.4) after. Ross had 116 in the bowl and led w/776 (4.7). QB Brown was #2 while Reid was #3 w/294 (4.2). TY everyone is back incl Brown. Adding depth is Joe Riddle (6'0" 205 So, PS#114). After a couple of years of subpar RB production, I look for improved numbers.

RECEIVERS - In '11 Kevin Dorsey (PS#24) led w/573 (12.7) and while he ret'd in '12, I expected big things out of Stefon Diggs (PS#2). Diggs lived up to that VHT billing w/848 (15.7) among his 1,896 all-purp yds (172 ypg, missed 1). Despite missing the last 5 (toe inj) soph Marcus Leak was the #2 rec (PS#103, 393, 17.1). LY they added in Deon Long (PS#17JC) who played for OC Mike Locksley at NM (#1 there w/809, 17.2 '11). I expected Diggs and Long to be one of the top WR combos in the country should have their best finish in my PDR s/10.

but they were BOTH OFY after gm 7. Despite missing the final 6, Diggs was #1 until the bowl (587, 17.3) and Long #3 (489, 15.3). Soph Levern Jacobs had just 9 rec in the first 6 but had 158 vs Clem and 100 in the bowl and led with 640 (13.6). RFr Amba Etta-Tawo added 500 (16.1) while Nigel King (PŚ#62) posted 450 (13.6). TY they only lose TE Dave Stinebaugh (10 st, 204, 13.6) but return Leak (not with tm '13). Not in the PSL are Malcolm Culmer (5'11" 185'So, PS#174) and DeAndre Lane (5'7" 175 So, PS#264). If Long and Diggs stay healthy, this is one of the nation's top receiving corps.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '12 UM had an inexp'd O-line that

was inj-plagued and the numbers fell from 169 ypg rush (4.8) to 103 (2.6) while the sks rose from 17 to 39. At one point they had 2 true and 1 rFr playing. LY they had to replace 3 OL (comb 24 sts) but had 6 back (39 car sts). The unit suffered a shake up when Mike Madaras (PS#51, 8 st true) guit after 8 sts. UM still improved to 148 ypg rush (4.1, 27 sk). TY they lose LG De'Onte Arnett (13 st, 2Y st'r) and Madaras. Four OL are back who st'd at least 4 LY (61 car sts), add 2 VHT Frosh (PS#2, 17) and I look for improved numbers again.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '11 the Terps had just 1 st'r back and Keith Bowers (11 st) became the first true frosh DL to start here s/05. He along with rFr Andre Monroe made Frosh AA tms. Injuries hurt the Terps and the rush D plummeted to 220 (4.7, 26 sk). In '12 they lost 2 DL (comb 11 sts) but had 2nd Tm AA Joe Vellano back. They lost Monroe (ACL) prior to the yr but improved to 129 ypg (3.5, 28 sk). LY they had to replace both DE's incl 1st Tm ACC DE Vellano. They got Monroe back so I said they would be close. The rush D slipped a little to 149 (3.7) but they increased the sks to 37. Monroe had 9.5 sk (7.5 tfl) despite being a bkp & he enters 2014 first nationally among active players with 0.66 sks per gm (14.5 in 22 car gms). The only losses are Zeke Riser (7 tkl) and Alex Walker (2 tkl). This figures to be a very underrated D-line.

NEBACKERS - The Terps have produced their share of All-ACC LB's. LY they had to replace a 3rd Tm ACC LB (7 st, #10 tkl'r), a 2nd Tm ACC LB (9 st til ACL, #1 tkl'r) and their #5 tkl'r (11 st). They had 1 ret st'r LY (#2 tkl'r) in Cole Farrand, their #7 tkl'r LA Goree and moved in S Matt Robinson (5 st '12' who bulked up to 240 lbs. Robinson missed 2 with injury and Yannik Cudjoe-Virgil, a native of Trinidad and a former walk-on, had 3 sks as a bkp but was OFY after 6 gms. Another bkp, Alex Twine missed 2 and Goree also they missed 2 gms. Farrand had 23 tkls vs Clem, the most by a UM ply'r s/90 (tied most in a single gm in FBS all yr) but then suffered a conc and only st'd 1 of the final 5. Even though the unit was banged up, UM yielded 25.3 ppg (best s/10). TY they lose Marcus Whitfield (12 st, #8 tkl'r, 9 sk. 6.5 tfl). Shawn Petty (2 st. 24 tkl. 2 sk) and Bradley Johnson (2 tkl). Abner Logan (6'1" 235 So, PS#51) had 4 st, 37 tkl and 2 tfl LY but was susp in April and is OFY. LY due to

injury, nine diff LB's st'd and this year 7 are back **DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Maryland was #18 in my PDR in '10 but fell to #94 and #55 the next 2 yrs. LY they appeared in good shape losing a FS (#6 tklr) and Matt Robinson who moved to LB (5 st '12). They then lost BOTH starting CB's in the first 3 gms in Jeremiah Johnson (tm's vocal leader) and Dexter McDougle (ACC DB POW vs Conn). Basically the st'rs were a senior w/2 car sts, a true frosh and 2 soph (7 car st). True frosh William Likely (PS#50) took over and earned 4 votes as the ACC Def Rookie POY. UM slipped a little to #62 (61.8%, 18-11). TY they lose CB Isaac Goins (11 st, #6 tkl'r, 2 int, 4 pbu) and McDougle (3 st, 14 tkl, 3 int, 2 pbu, #3DC NYJ). They return 7 of the top 8 and get back Johnson (12 st, 43 tkl, 8 pbu '12). This is, by far, the most exp'd secondary under Edsall and they

SPECIAL TEAMS - Edsall's ST units at ST RANK LOY Conn were #28 and #17 in his final 2 yrs. Not much went right for the team or this unit in '11 (#107) but they showed some improvement in his 2nd year up to #76. P Nathan Renfro avg 39.7 (tm net 33.1) in '12 and LY improved to 40.8 (net 35.8). Aussie K Brad Craddock hit 10-16 fg's (L52) in '12 and improved to 21-25 (L50) LY with 12 TB on 69 KO. Stefon Diggs had 713 (28.5) with 2 td's on KR in '12 and tallied 281 (23.4) before being OFY. True frosh William Likely got UM's first PR td s/'10 vs VT (205, 12.8) and was the top KR (729, 26.0).

They improved to #21 and TY with all of the key players back, figure to be one of the top ST units in the country.

OACHES - Randy Edsall spent 12 years as Conn's HC and was BE COY in '10. Injuries have plagued his 3 seasons here but UM did make a bowl in their final ACC season. The 3rd year OC is Mike Locksley who was the NM HC from '09 thru gm 4 of '11. He was the Illinois OC from '05-'08 and was also a RB cch here from '97-'02. DC Brian Stewart is also in his 3rd ssn. He spent 7 yrs as an NFL asst before taking over as the Houston Cougars DC in '10-'11.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In the 15 yrs prior to Ralph Friedgen taking over, the Terps were in just 1 bowl (1990 Independence). In Friedgen's 1st yr, UM not only produced its first winning season in 6 yrs, but also its 1st ACC Title s/85. In his first 3 seasons UM finished ranked #11, #13 and #17 but then he had losing seasons in 4 of the next 6 yrs. In '09 I picked them last in the Atlantic. They finished 2-10 and were -91 ypg (2nd worst ACC). In '10 for the 3rd time in 5 yrs, UM was back on my MIT list and for the 3rd time had a winning season (9 wins, #23). Although "The Fridge" had been let go prior to the bowl, he still cch'd it (won 51-20). Randy Edsall has been through 3 injury-plagued seasons here. In his first year, UM was picked as high as 2nd but I had them 5th. Edsall's disciplinary style didn't mix well and by early Dec, 20 players with eligibility had left. The Edsall era got off on a great note with a win on Mon night over Miami, 32-24, but they went just 1-10 after that. In '12 they could have made a bowl but suffered through devastating QB inj's and were starting a true frosh LB there. After opening 4-2, they lost their last 6 incl blowouts by 35 & 27 vs two of the ACC's top tms. After missing out on making my Most Improved List in '12, the Terps made it LY. They appeared on their way to a great season winning their first 4 by an avg of 40-10. Coming off their most lopsided win in the WV series s/51 (37-0 shutout), they were #25 for their showdown with Florida St. They only trailed 14-0 mid-2Q but QB Brown was inj'd and FSU went on to a 63-0 rout. The Terps rebounded to beat Virg but then lost their top 2 rec's (Diggs and Long) and would drop 3 straight incl a 20-3 home loss to Syr. UM beat VT in Blacksburg for the first time s/49 with a 27-24 win. BC's K missed a game-winning fg but Edsall had called time-out and they nailed the 2nd try as UM blew a 24-13 lead and lost 29-26. The Terps pounded NCSt scoring on their first 6 poss to lead 34-7 but then lost the bowl to Marshall in their own backyard. Now UM makes the step up to the Big Ten but does have 17 ret st'rs. On the negative side, they come up -4.0 in my Stock Market Indicator (pg 32) and the B10 schedule gave them little help as they draw Wisc and Iowa out of the West. In fact, their B10 foes TY were a comb 40-24 in their respective conf's in '13. Despite those last 2 factors, all 9 sets of my PR's call for at least 8 wins and, provided they stay healthy, I'm fairly confident that I will have them ranked higher than other publications.
