POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

QUARTERBACKS - In '10 Ryan Katz (PS#33) started 12 (2401, 60%, 18-11). He missed most of Aug in '11 and lost his job in Wk 1 to rFr Sean Mannion. Mannion threw for 3,328 (3rd best sch hist) hitting 65% (16-18 ratio). In '12 Katz transferred and st'd for SDSU. Mannion was having a fine season but was inj (knee, miss 3) and his bkp Cody Vaz (PS#68, 6-17-48 '10, DNP '11) was forced to start vs BYU. Vaz led the upset win and st'd vs Utah (win). HC Mike Riley then opted to go back to Mannion when he was healthy but he threw 4 int vs Wash and lost his job for 2 gms. Mannion st'd the final 3 when Vaz was banged up but had 4 int vs Oregon. Vaz (not 100%) played nearly the entire bowl (Mannion 1 series). Mannion threw for 2,446 (65%, 15-13) while Vaz had 1,480 (59%) but with an 11-3 ratio. LY is that Mannion who retook the job as Vaz ply'd in just 5 gms (176 yds). Mannion in the first 7 was leading the NCAA in passing (427 ypg) and had a 29-3 ratio (68.5%). Over the last 6 games, he had an 8-12 ratio finishing w/4,662 (66.3%, 37-15). Vaz departs and the bkp looks to be Luke Del Rio (PS#62, Jack's son, former Bama W/O), Soph Brent VanderVeen (PS#44) or rFr Kyle Kempt (PS#79). Mannion should have his best season yet as a senior and is just 813 yds away from the school career passing mark and just 1,891 away from Matt Barkley's P12 record (12,327).

RUNNING BACKS - From '98-'10 Ost had 4 RB's in Ken Simonton, Steven Jackson, Yvenson Bernard and Jacquizz Rodgers who comb'd for 16,408 yds with a P12 best eleven 1,000 yd ssns. In '11 true frosh Malcolm Agnew (PS#68) ply'd in just 6 but still led w/423 (4.8). In '12 rFr Storm Woods (PS#134) won the job but was banged up (ankle) most of the year. He still led w/940 (4.9). Terron Ward had the best ypc of the RB's (415, 6.1). LY Agnew transferred. Woods who is more of a power back and workhorse, left the Utah game on a stretcher (head inj, miss 2). Woods had 180 (5.8) the L/2 and finished with 477 (3.8) almost matching that total in rec (440, 9.4). Ward is more of a shifty, speedier back and he exploded for 145 on 17 carries vs Oregon to finish #1 (521, 4.6) and added 280 (8.2) rec. RFr Chris Brown (PS#36) had 144 yd (7.6). Damien Haskins (5'8" 224, PS#92) RS. TY the unit returns intact and should have much more production than '13 when the top 3 RB's comb for just 1,142 (4.4).

RECEIVERS - Ost has had their top 6 career leading WR's under Riley. In '09 James Rodgers led with 1,034 (11.4, 303 rush on fly sweeps). In '10 Rodgers was lost (ACL) after 4 sts (215, 13.4, RS) and Markus Wheaton led with 675 (12.3). In '11 Rodgers missed 3 but was #2 (514, 11.4). A bigger, stronger,

faster Wheaton led with 986 (13.5). True frosh Brandin Cooks was #3 (391, 12.6). In '12 they had to replace Rodgers (9 st). They had 2 NFL caliber WR's in Wheaton and Cooks. LY they had to replace Wheaton (1244, 13.7, #3DC) and their TE (136, 17.6). Cooks (1151, tm high 17.2 ypc '12) set the schl & P12 single ssn mark with 128 rec and 1,730 yds (13.5, 217 rush) and took home the Biletnikoff Award. Richard Mullaney (PS#70) had 156 (12.0) as a rFr but 788 (15.2) LY. TE Connor Hamlett (PS#63) had 403 (12.6) in '12 and 364 (9.1) in '13 and bkp Caleb Smith (PS#24) had 343 (13.7). TY they lose Kevin Cummings (2 st, 299, 12.0), Micah Hatfield (130, 16.2) and Cooks who left for the NFL (#1DC NO). This unit which struggled to find a #2 rec LY will really struggle to find a #1 TY.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Since '01 Oregon St's high mark for rushing was 175 ypg in '07. The total dropped each of the next 4 ssns (87 ypg in '11). In '12 they added in VHT true frosh Isaac Seumalo (PS#15) and he st'd all 13 (1st Tm Fr AA) becoming just the 3rd true OL to start for Riley and the 1st to start at C s/78 (Roger Levasa). Ost improved to 124 ypg rush (3.7, 33 sk). LY they had to replace a 2Y st'g RT but had 8 of their top 10 back. The '12 unit had just 2 sts lost to injury but LY they had 7. Roman Sapulu won the RG spot but was OFY after 2 gms. Another true frosh Sean Harlow (PS#77) st'd the L9 at RT and Ost slipped to 94 ypg (3.5, 25 sk). TY they lose LT Michael Philipp (48 car st), LG Joshua Andrews (13 st, 32 car st) and 3rd Tm P12 RG Grant Enger (10 st, 3Y st'r). The car sts drop from 88 to 42 but they could improve upon LY's numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '11 Ost had to replace all 4 s'trs (#5DC) incl the P10 DPOY, DT Stephen Paea (#2DC). They then lost 2 DL's after 5 sts. The inexp'd unit all'd 197 ypg (4.8), their highest ypcs/96. In '12 they had to replace 1 st'r. Their outstanding DE combo of Scott Crichton and Dylan Wynn who had both st'd as frosh, added weight. Ost allowed just 129 ypg (4.0, 28 sk). LY they had to replace both starting DT's and 2 bkp DE's. Riley brought in 5 VHT JUCO's but they had very little impact and Ost got 25 sks but also all'd 190 ypg rush and their 5.1 ypc were their worst since '81 (5.3). A horrendous game vs Wash (530, 9.1) impacted the stats (162, 4.6 without UW). DT Josh Braun was OFY after 8 sts. TY they lose their star in 2nd Tm P12 Crichton (13 st, 47 tkl, 7.5 sk, 11.5 tfl, #3DC MIN), DT Mana Rosa (13 st, 49 tkl, 3.5 tfl), Braun (20 tkl, 2 tfl) and DE Devon Kell (2 st, 20 tkl, 3 sk). They do add in Miami, FL transfer Jalen Grimbale (PS#33). Even though they have equal returning starters to LY (2) and lose their star, I would think Riley will have them playing closer to what you would expect from a Beaver D-line.

LINEBACKERS - Ost has had 6 LB's drafted s/'02. Riley takes a lot of pride in this group calling it the West Coast version of "Linebacker U" and saying his LB's all have the ability to rush the passer and drop into coverage. The MLB is supposed to make the bulk of the tkls in Ost's gap cancellation D however their 3 MLB's were all inj'd in '11 (all'd 30.8 ppg) and a S led in tkls. In '12 they had to replace a SLB (#8 tkl'r) and a bkp (11 tkl). DJ Alexander and Michael Doctor were two of the fastest OLB's in the FBS (comb 18 tfl) and Ost improved to all'g 20.6 ppg. LY they lost their MLB (#6 tkl'r) and his bkp (27 tkl). Joel Skotte st'd the first 4 at MLB but lost his job to rFr Rommel Mageo. Alexander missed 4 gms while Doctor inj'd his foot and RS after 2 sts. Jabral Johnson st'd 9 at WLB (4 at SLB) while Caleb Saulo st'd 2. With Doctor's return the unit remains intact and should stay healthier and show solid improvement from their worst numbers in 8Y (all'd 31.4). Riley and DC Mark Banker know how to coach LB's.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Beaver CB's are generally left out on an island (blitz heavy). After finishes of #7, #10 and #12 from '06-'08, they had to replace all 4 s'trs in '09 and dropped to #68.

Even with 3 st's back, they fell to #88 in '10 and were #88 again in '11. In '12 they had to replace 1 st'r and Jordan Poyer led w/7 int. Ost moved up to #15 (59%, 14-20). LY they had to replace 2nd Tm AA Poyer (#7DC) but had 3 st's back and added in PS#58JC Steven Nelson. They slipped a little to #24 (246, 60.4%, 20-19). Their worst 2 games were the opener vs EW (448 pass) and the bowl vs Boise (382 pass) as they were #1 in the Pac-12 in pass D (208 ypg). TY they lose 2x 2nd Tm P12 CB Rashad Reynolds (13 st, #7 tkl'r, 6 int, 4 pbu) and CB Sean Martin who st'd the first 4 (8 st, #8 tkl'r, 2 int, 2 pbu), but lost his job to 1st Tm Pac-12 Nelson and bkp Steven Christian (12 tkl). Just like LY, 3 st's return and this remains a top-notch secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In '12 OSU had to replace their P (39.1 net) and dropped to #70, their lowest ST finish in 5Y. K Trevor Romaine (PS#11, 16-18 '12) was on the Lou Groza Preseason Watch List and LY hit 14-20 (L50) with 28TB on 82KO. Keith Kostol (41.9 avg, 38.5 net '12) was on the Ray Guy Preseason Watch List and LY avg 40.5 (net 36.7) while true frosh Victor Bolden had 1,198 (20.7) on KR. Ost dropped even lower to #91. TY they only lose PR Cooks (6.0 on PR) and should easily move up.

COACHES - There are only 5 HC's who have been at the same school longer than Mike Riley has been here. Riley was here for 2Y ('97-'98) before taking an NFL HC job (SD) but ret'd to Corvallis in '03 and of the school's 11 bowl wins 6 have been under him. He must replace his first coordinator in 10Y. Danny Langsdorf left to go to the NYG so the new OC is John Garrett (NFL asst TB '13, Dallas '07-'12, brother of Jason). DC Mark Banker is in his 14th season overall (12th as DC) and was also here during Riley's first stint (DB cch '97-'98).

PHIL'S FORECAST

Ost was just 51-166 (23.5%) in the 80's & 90's including a 28 year streak of losing seasons which was snapped in '99. They have gone 104-71 s/2000 incl 61-25 (71%) in Reser Stadium in that span. Mike Riley returned to Corvallis in '03 and has had 8 of 11 winning yrs. After 2 straight losing seasons, they were picked 6th in '12 in the P12 North, but I had them higher than everyone else. They had 59 sts lost to inj in '11, were -8 in TO's, had poor ypg's and the Stock Market Indicator was bullish at +3.5. They also had 15 ret st's and surpassed everyone's expectations, including mine, finishing 9-4 and #20 AP.LY they were Preseason #25 but this time my indicators were pointing down including the Stock Market Indicator (-5.0). I pointed out LY that Ost could be favored in their first 7 and played their toughest 5 foes over the final 5. Ost was stunningly upset by FCS EWash in the opener yielding 625 yds and would not get into the AP rankings the rest of the year. They quietly would win their next 6 with the toughest 2 being an OT win at Utah and trailing SDSU 27-14 they rallied for a 34-30 win. Ost was 6-1 when they hosted Stanford and had a 1&gl at the 7 but 4 shots at the EZ came up incomplete and they lost by 8. They took on a USC team that was fired up for an interim HC and were blasted 31-14. They did trail Ariz St on the road, 30-10, getting a td w/2:41 left and then had an embarrassing home finale vs Washington, a game I'm still scratching my head over as they trailed 55-6 in the 4Q despite UW having a bkp QB. They showed the quality of their team by nearly upsetting Oregon on the road (Ducks late td). The 5 game losing streak was their longest s/1997. They were impressive in the bowl blasting Boise 38-23. TY the Beavers have 14 ret st's and most indicators are pointed up. They do draw USC and Ariz St out of the South but avoid UCLA. They will top LY's 7 win total and could be a surprise contender in the North.

OSU is 3-0 incl a 34-7 win in the L/gm ('09's opener). LY OSU lost to EW to open the season and are just 1-2 the L3Y vs FCS foes. The Vikings finished 6-6 LY incl a 37-30 loss vs Cal.

OSU is 6-3 (3 str wins). LTH ('06) OSU never trailed (gm tied 3x's) but only led 35-30 w/7:06 left. On UH's final drive, OSU forced a inc pass on 4&14 from their 26 w/2:08 (OSU took SAF w/42).

Bonus: Oregon St is just 4-11 in away games vs non-conference foes since 2003.

OSU has won L/2. LY OSU trailed 30-21 but after a 81/10pl drive was only down 2 w/2:40. After a deep KO OSU got the GW score 2 plays later (16 yd IR td) & Int'd SDSU again to seal the LTH ('09) the Beavers lost 42-36. In fact OSU has not won in L/40 (22 str losing trips). OSU never led and after cutting the deficit to 6, all'd USC to run out the L/5:41 (USC conv 2x's on 3D). The Beavers are 4-2 vs the Buffaloes but prior to LY their last series win was in 1964. LY Seamus Mannion threw for a school record 6 tds. Into '14, the Beavers are 7-11 in Pac-12 road games.

Bonus: Into 2014, OSU has dropped 5 straight vs ranked foes but 3 were by 8 or less.

The HT is 5-1 w/OSU winning on the road LY. Down 1, OSU went 79/8pl (2pt) to lead 45-38. w/2-29 left but all'd a 9 yd run w/21. In OT Utah got a fg while OSU tossed a GW 6 yd to pass.
