POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

QUARTERBACKS - With the QB's banged up in '10, UM took the RS off of true frosh Stephen Morris (PS#98) in gm 8. He st'd the final 4 throwing for 1,240 (54%, 7-9) but 3Y st'r Jacory Harris ret'd to start the bowl. Harris threw for 2,486 (65%, 20-9) in '11 while Morris got 1 start (283, 70%, 0-2). In '12 they had to replace their #2 career passer and Morris missed most of the spring (inj) so 6'6" 225 Ryan Williams (10 st Memphis true, 2075, 57%, 13-10) got a lot of reps. Morris threw for a schl and ACC record 566 vs NCSt. He was banged up but still had an 11-0 ratio over the final 4 (3345, 58%, 21-7). Williams hit 15-20-237. Golden RS true frosh Gray Crow (PS#48). Morris' 3,415 tll yds of offense topped Bernie Kosar's schl rec (by 3 yds). LY Morris was the star of the Manning passing camp shooting him up the early draft boards as he possesses an elite arm. Morris did not have the type of year expected (3028, 57.6%, 21-12) as he suffered an ankle inj vs Savannah St (bothered him 6 wks). Williams ply'd in 3 of the first 4 but just 1 (1 att) after that (369, 68.8%, 3-1). Crow ply'd in 2 (8 att). They did RS Kevin Olsen (PS#4). TY they lose their #3 career pass leader in Morris (undrafted) and Williams suffered an ACL in April but the position could still produce similar numbers.

RUNNING BACKS - It surprises me that "The U" has had just seven 1,000 yd rushers in their history. In '11, they had the smash-and-dash combo of Mike James (power) and Lamar Miller (4.3 spd). Miller rushed for 1,272 (5.6) while James had 275 (3.8). Miller left early for the NFL (#4DC). True frosh Duke Johnson (PS#7) lived up to his hyped offseason billing rushing for 947 (6.8, 2060 all purp). He had 402 in the final 4 and topped Clinton Portis' frosh rushing record. James was #2 with 621 (4.2, 344, 11.5 rec). LY they lost James but Johnson was on to his way to a record breaking season (920, 6.3, F/8) when he was OFY (ankle vs Fla St). In the final 6, UM produced just one 100 yd rusher. Dallas Crawford was #2 w/558 (4.1) and true frosh Gus Edwards (PS#48) was #3 (338, 5.1). TY they lose Eduardo Clements (PS#19, 194, 6.5) but get the big return of Johnson and add in low transfer De'Andre Johnson (5'8" 196 Sr, PS#198, 79 yds, 4 gm '11) and PS#10 true frosh Joseph Yearby. Crawford moved to DB in spring. As long as Duke stays healthy, I look for improved production.

RECEIVERS - In '12 UM had to replace #4 & #6 DC WR's and the leading returnee was 6'3" Allen Hurns (415, 13.4 in '11) who had an inj filled ssn and finished #6 (314, 11.2). TE Clive Walford had 234 yds the last 2 to finish #3 (451, 18.0). True frosh Malcolm Lewis (PS#51) made a sensational catch vs GT but dislocated his ankle (OFY). Rashawn Scott was #2 (512, 14.6) despite being susp the final 3. Phillip Dorsett (4.35

spd) had 147 (10.5) as a true but led with 842 (14.5, 3rd Tm ACC). True frosh Herb Waters (PS#49) added 227 (22.7!). LY almost everyone was back (lost #4WR). A surprising stat to me is that prior to LY, only 3 UM WR's had 1,000 yds rec in a ssn. Lightly heralded Sr Allen Hurns surprisingly set the schl record w/1,162 (18.7!). True frosh Stacy Coley (PS#11) was the star of Aug and finished #2 (591, 17.9). TY they lose Hurns (11 st) and TE Asante Cleveland (8 st, 3 rec). Dorsett, the team's fastest ply'r, missed 5 full gms and only finished #5 w/272 (tm high 20.9). Even with the loss of their top guy, they should at least match LY's productivity.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '12 UM had 2.5 st's back (36 car sts) and rushed for 145 ypg (4.7, 18 sk). LY they only had to replace 2 bkps (93 car sts ret). One st'r, LT Malcolm Bunche lost his spot. They improved to 160 ypg (4.8, 17 sk). TY they lose RG Brandon Linder (13 st, 3Y st'r, #3DC JAX), RT Seantriel Henderson (8 st, 3Y st'r, #7DC BUF), Bunche (1 st, trans to UCLA) and C/OG Jared Wheeler (6 st). When I spoke to coach Al Golden last summer, he felt UM's O-line was one of the nation's best but only LT Erick Flowers st'd all 13 at the same position. TY with 3 st's back (73 car st) and 2 VHT's IFS, they make my list of top OL's again.

DEFENSIVE LINE - From '87-'07, UM was very physical in the middle and that is backed up by the fact they had 10 DT's taken in the NFL draft incl 8 #1 DC's. That has not been the case recently. In '12 they only had 1 ret st'r and had to replace a #3DC DE. They all'd 218 ypg (5.0) with a paltry 13 sks (lowest in 30Y). It surprised me that they had just 1 VHT st'r. LY they had 7 of the top 8 back. Things looked great early with 16 sks in the first 4, (topping '12's total) but they had just 13 sks in the last 9. Their rush D improved, but only to 177 ypg (4.4). TY they lose DE Shayon Green (13 st, #3 tkl'r, 3 sk, 7.5 tfl), DT Curtis Porter (8 st, 25 tkl, 3 tfl), Virg transfer Justin Renfrow (5 st, 36 tkl), Wisc trans David Gilbert (10 tkl, 1.5 tfl) and DT Luther Robinson (1 st, 24 tkl, 1 sk). While not as exp'd as LY (lose 5 of top 8) with 2 st's back, they should continue to show improvement and add in 6 VHT newcomers incl 2 JUCO's.

LINEBACKERS - In '11 Denzel Perryman earned 2nd Tm Frosh AA and UM all'd just 20.1 ppg. In '12 they had to replace a 1st Tm ACC LB (#1 tkl'r, #3DC) and a bkp (20 tkl). It was the 5th str yr they had to replace their #1 tkl'r. The unit was banged up all year with the most sts logged by any LB being 8. UM all'd 30.5 ppg, their worst ever! Due to those inj's, they didn't have to replace their #1 tkl'r LY (lost #3 & #4 tkl'r's). They did return their #2 tkl'r in Perryman as well as their #5, #9 and #12. I've got to hand it to Thurston Armbrister who is 6'3" 235 but was only PS#1373 (not listed by any recruiting service). He st'd 4 gms in '12 with 40 tkl's and I figured he would fall by the wayside with UM's talent infusion but he st'd 7 LY (#10 tkl'r, 2 sk, 3 tfl). James Gaines (PS#303) had the last 6 sts in '12 (57 tkl) and st'd all 13 at MLB LY. Perryman led by a good margin with 108 tkl's (1st Tm ACC). TY they lose Gaines (#2 tkl'r) and Tyrone Cornileus (4 st, 40 tkl) but the unit is more exp'd and can only improve.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - From 1994-'10 UM had 8 Top 10 finishes in my PDR and only once all'd over 56.8% comp, that being back in '97. Golden's secondaries have not matched that lofty level. In '11 with 1 st'r back they finished #110 (66%, 16-6). They had just 1 ret st'r in '12 yet improved to 57 (61%, 15-11). LY they had to replace a #5DC CB and 2 bkps (comb 8 st, 50 tkl). I thought they would improve but the unit lacked blazing speed (only 2 in 2-deep topped 4.53). UM had an outstanding ratio of 16-18 (60.2%) vs my 78th ranked opp QB's and finished #61. TY they lose S AJ Highsmith (4 st, 23 tkl, 4 pd) and S Kacy Rodgers (7 st, 18 tkl, 1 int) but return everyone else and add in the last 2Y's recruiting classes (speed). It's the most exp'd

secondary in 3Y and I'll call for them to easily have their best finish in my PDR under Golden.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Miami has produced some excellent ST players incl Devin Hester and finished #1 in my ST rankings in '00. Since then they've been in the upper half every ssn (except '07). Golden inherited the #42 unit and they improved to #17 in his first year with KR Duke Johnson (892, 33.0, 2 td). LY they had to replace their P (36.5 net), K (19-25, L39), then lost Johnson (396, 28.3) and top PR Phillip Dorsett (85, 5.7'12) midseason. Miami still climbed to #10 in my ST rankings. New P Pat O'Donnell, was a 3Y punter at Cincy with his best net being 38.8 in '11. O'Donnell had a fantastic year with a 47.1 avg (39.3 net). He had 37 TB on 77 KO. Matt Goudis (PS#5) hit 13-17 fg's (L49). UM was +5.1 on KR and -0.9 on PR with true frosh Stacy Coley (PS#11) leading in both. TY they lose O'Donnell (#6DC CHI, only P drafted) and unless Golden uncovers another transfer, I see them slipping some. This remains a premiere unit, however.

COACHES - Al Golden took a Temple program that was 0-11 with just 2 winning ssns in 26Y and left them with a 17-8 record his L2Y. The 9 Miami wins LY matched the best here S/O3. The 2nd yr OC is James Coley who was the OC at Fla St for 3Y (LY here was his first ssn calling plays). Longtime Golden asst Mark D'Onofrio is the DC after playing with Golden at Penn St (LB), coaching with him at UVA and being the DC at Temple for 5 yrs.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Miami is trying to get back to the glory days. They have 5 Nat'l Titles but their last came in '01. UM almost repeated the next year in '02 but had a controversial ending losing the Title game vs Ohio St. They finished #5 in '03 and #11 in '04 but in the last 9Y, have only finished ranked twice (#17 '05, #19 '09). That '05 team got as high as #3 but their highest ranking since then has been #8 in Wk 7 of '09. LY UM was not ranked at the start of the year and in Wk 2 were outgained by UF 413-212, outFD'd 22-10 but thanks to a +4 in TO's came away with a 21-16 win and that was against a healthy UF team. After blowing out 2 weak opp's, UM trailed GT 17-7 but won 45-30. On a Thurs night, they trailed NC 23-13 in the 4Q but rallied for a td w/urs left to win 27-23. For the 3rd consec game they trailed by DD as WF led 14-3 and even 21-17 late but UM got a td w/57 left to pull out a 24-21 win. That put UM at 7-0 and #7 AP when they travelled to face #3 Fla St and it was a rare meeting between Top 10 teams, where one was a 21 pt dog. RB Duke Johnson was OFY in the 2Q. It was just 21-14 at half but FSU went on to a 27 pt win. Logan Thomas had the best game of his career hitting 25-31-366 as VT whipped UM 42-24. They lost to Duke for the 1st time s/76, 48-30. In their 3 game skid, they allowed 41, 42 and 48 pts, the most in a 3 gm span in school history. The team went from #7 to unranked but rebounded to beat Virg and Pitt the final 2 wks. The Pitt game impressed me as Miami has not played well in cold weather (30° or lower) in the past but came out in short sleeves (some shirtless) and proved it was not a problem. It was a very disappointing bowl effort, however, as L'ville whipped them with a 554-174 yd edge and they finished 9-4 (NR). I thought LY's team was a year away from really contending. TY there are some factors pointing down as they benefitted from 3 net close wins, go from 18 ret st's to 14, lose their QB, 1,000 yd rec and 4 of their top 8 tkl'r's. They also draw Fla St out of the Atlantic, plus have road games at L'ville, Neb, GT and VT. Still, this appears to be Golden's best team yet.

UM suffered a 31-7 setback the LTH ('06). UM was 9-0-1 vs UL coming in but has dropped 2 str (L's bowl). Miami is 3-6 their L/R road openers but have won B2B. 3rd yr in L/R UM starts a ssn on the road.
Miami is 8-1 (loss in '79) incl a 45-0 win in the L/gm ('10). Miami is 25-3 in home openers. Incl bowls UM is 17-2-s/04 (1st yr in ACC) vs non-conf in-state tms. Rattlers went 3-9 LY (lost 76-0 vs Ohio St).
In '97 the Hurricanes won 42-10, only prior meeting. Into '14, the last time Miami dropped a HG vs a non-conf foe was in '11 (lost 28-24 vs KSU), since they have won 6 str by an avg score of 43-10.
Hurricanes are 0-3 in Lincoln but the LTH was in '76. The L/5 meetings have all come in bowls (UM is 4-1). L/gm took place in '01's ssn Rose Bowl (#1 vs #4). UM finished that yr 12-0 w/a Nat'l Title.
Until LY UM's only loss had been in '76 (1st gm). In 5 of L/8 UM has trailed but battled back for a win. LY UM led 30-28 w/5:04 3Q but on their next 4 poss DN run a play in Duke territory & all'd 20 unanswered.
