POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2016

QUARTERBACKS - In '14, Cyler Miles (PS#5, bkp '13, 418 yd) threw for 2,397 (66.6%, 17-4, 307 rush). Jeff Lindquist st'd vs Hawai'i (10-26-162) but had just 4 more att's. True frosh Jake Browning set a nat'l record w/229 td passes in 3Y in HS (91-7 ratio). LY it was a 3 man battle. Miles departed and Browning became the first true frosh here to start an opener. He set the UW frosh pass record with 368 yds vs Utah St, and threw for 405 vs Ariz St. Lindquist saw time at FB (0 pass att). Browning was inj'd at the end vs Oregon and RFr KJ Carta-Samuels st'd vs Stanford (9-21-118-0-0). Browning had 4 td passes in his return vs AZ and then set a sch'l rec with 90% comp's (18-20) vs Oregon St. He threw for 2,955 (63.3%, 16-10, 35 yds rush) and will be one of the nation's top QB's as a true soph.

RUNNING BACKS - UW has had seven 1,000 yd rushers in the LY. In '13 Bishop Sankey topped Corey Dillon's UW ssn record (1695 '96) with 1,870 (5.7, 304 rec) while RFr Dwayne Washington was a distant #2 w/332 (7.1). In '14 Sankey was a #2DC. Washington was inj'd (25 yds, 4 gm) and led with just 697 (5.3). RFr Lavon Coleman (PS#47) was the #1 when he was inj'd Wk 7 (#2, 565, 4.1) while LB Shaq Thompson was #3 (456, 7.5). LY they added in HC Chris Petersen recruits Jomon Dotson (PS#82) and true frosh Myles Gaskin (PS#47). I called for another 1,000 yd back. Gaskin had 5 yds on 5 att in the opener, added 146 vs Sac St, 155 more vs Oregon and set the UW single gm frosh record w/181 in the bowl (Joe Steele 157 '76). He topped 100 eight times and set a UW Frosh record with 1,302 (5.7), Chris Polk 1,113 '09). Coleman was #3 (176 (5.3). TY they only lose Washington (#7DC DET, #2, 282, 6.0, #4 rec 315, 12.6) and Deontae Cooper (98, 6.1) but add speed with true frosh Sean McGrew (PS#13).

RECEIVERS - In '14 the leading returnee was Jaydon Mickens (PS#35, 688, 10.6), who finished #1 again (617, 10.3). John Ross was #1 (371, 21.8), before moving to the depleted secondary in Nov while PR Dante Pettis (1 catch F/6) was #4 (259, 15.2). LY they had 3 of the top 4 back (Ross OFY only loss). With an inexp'd offense, no WR topped 80 yds in a game until Mickens had 100 vs Ast & 81 in the Apple Cup. He led with 692 (11.9). Pettis was #3 (414, 13.8) and soph Brayden Lenius was the #4 receptions (307, 11.8). TY they lose Mickens (11 st, UFA OAK), TE Joshua Perkins (7 st, 539, 15.0), Isaiah Renfro (178, 13.7) and Marvin Hall (2 st, 206, 22.9). They lose their top 2 but add back in explosive Ross who is at WR full-time. This group will be more productive with a more exp'd QB.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '14 the career starts returning jumped to 124 as they had five 5th year seniors. Expectations were high, but they surprisingly slipped to 189 (4.3, 28 sk). Last year after their LG retired in August, UW had to replace the most OL car sts (179) in the country. They had just 15 car sts back but had underperformed in '14 and were in the 2nd year of the new offense. At points they had 3 frosh starters (9 diff OL st's) but only slipped to 164 ypg rush (4.5, 33 sk). TY they lose C Siosifa Tufunga (13/18) but have 9 of the top 10 back and the career starts climb to 62. This unit is much more exp'd.

DEFENSIVE LINE - LY the Huskies had the most depleted D-line in the FBS losing 4 multi-year starters (141 car sts, #1 and #2 DC's, 43 sks in '14). With those 4 veteran seniors in '14 UW all'd just 124 rush ypg (3.3, 52 sk). Petersen did a fine job as the rush D was just as good (125, 3.3) while the sks only dropped to 34. NT Elijah Qualls had 4.5 sks despite missing 3 gms. TY they lose 2nd Tm P12 DT Taniela Tupou (37 tkl, 5.5 fl) but 8 of the top 9 return. Jaylen Johnson was a terror in the SG and new DL coach Ikaika Malloe inherits one of the Pac-12's top D-lines.

LINEBACKERS - After having an exp'd LB corps in '14, last year they had to replace a 3rd Tm P12 MLB (#1 tkl'r, 10 pbu) and 1st Tm AA Shaq Thompson (#3 tkl'r, 1DC). They ret'd their #9, #10 & #11 tkl'rs. UW actually improved from allowing 24.8 ppg down to 18.8! The unit produced 4 of the top 5 tkl'rs and 2 of them depart. Gone are 3rd Tm P12 Travis Feeney (12 st, #5 tkl'r, 8 sk, 9.5 fl, #6DC PIT), Cory Littleton (13 st, #3 tkl'r, 6 sk, 5 fl) and Scott Lawyer (4 st, 22 tkl). They return their #1 and #2 tkl'rs and are clearly more exp'd than 2015.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - UW finished #4 in my PDR in '13 (55%, 15-16). In '14 they had to replace 3 starters and their best DB was true Fr Budda Baker (PS#14, 14 st). The inexp'd secondary dropped to #78 (64%, 26-13). Last year they had to replace a CB (7 st, #1DC) but had 3 starters back. They made a significant climb to #8 (58%, 11-15). Baker was 1st Tm P12 despite missing most of 2 games, while CB Sidney Jones (4 int, 10 pbu, 42.2% comp allow) was 1st Tm P12 and Kevin King earned HM P12 (40% comp allowed best P12). Seven of the top 8 are back with the only loss being Brian Clay (#3 tkl'r, 12 st). This could be the P12's top secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In 2014 Dante Pettis got UW's first PR td s/O3 (288, 10.3). John Ross was the top KR in '13 (720, 23.2) and '14 (938, 24.7) and ret'd a KO for a td in a 2nd straight bowl before RS in '15. Soph Cameron Van Winkle (PS#8) hit 20-24 fg's (L51), true frosh Tristan Vizcaino (PS#19) had 17 TB on 70 KO and P Corey Durkee (PS#12) avg 42.1 (38.2 net!). With almost everyone back they surprisingly slipped to #26 (#17 in '15). Van Winkle hit 16-20 FG's (L49), Durkee avg 43.6 (37.4 tm net) and Pettis added 2 PR td's (271, 16.9). True frosh Chico McClatcher, meanwhile, did well on KR's (582, 23.3). They do lose P Durkee but get back Ross and could improve given Petersen's ST history (5 Top 12 finishes in 8Y with Boise).

COACHES - Chris Petersen has 15 wins his first 2 years and has steadi the course. Petersen was at Boise for 13 years (5Y OC, 8Y HC). Of all current FBS HC's, he earned 100 wins the fastest and is the only HC to win the Bear Bryant COY Award twice. Third year OC Jonathan Smith was Boise's QB cch in '12-'13 and OC at Montana ('10-'11). Smith set multiple school records at Oregon St as a walk-on. DC Pete Kwiatkowski has been with Petersen s/O6 (DL cch 1st 4, DC after that). They add a co-DC in Jimmy Lake, who also is the DB cch. Former ST/DL Cch Jeff Choate is the new Montana St HC. New ST coor Bob Gregory (also asst HC/LB) has been w/Petersen during 4 different stints as an asst coach.

THIS DECADE 45-41-15-0-3-54 - The Huskies have a proud winning tradition. They had a streak of 27 non-losing seasons

snapped in '04 due in part to NCAA probation (low schips), which started a streak of 6 straight losing yrs incl Steve Sarkisian's 1st yr ('09). I mentioned in my '09 mag that coming off an 0-12 '08 season, UW was probably the FBS's most improved team but faced my #16 skid. They did not make my MIP list but they got to 5-7 (upset #3 USC and #19 Cal). They were 4-5 in P12 play and in Sark's final 4Y ('10-'13), they were 5-4 in conf play each year (7, 7, 7 & 9 wins overall). UW improved all 4Y in P12 play (-30.1, -20.9, +1.9, +60 ypg). That '13 squad dealt Chris Petersen (Boise HC at time) his worst ever loss (38-6) and finished #25. In '14 Petersen inherited 14 ret st's, though they lost their QB, AA RB, top WR and Mackey Awd TE, (UW most yds 124 yrs, 6,491 '13). UW was 8-6 in '14 with 1 win vs a team with a winning record (lost bowl). LY Wash won their bowl and finished 7-6 and are 45-34 this decade after being 49-71 the previous one.

2015 ANALYSIS 7-6 - Washington only had 9 ret st's (-41 all-conf pts) and were also +12 in TO in '14 (all factors pointing down) but it was Petersen's 2nd year (familiarity). Boise had their biggest HG ever for the return of the coach that left them and led 16-0 at half (UW outgained 254-66) but only beat UW by 3. UW shutout Sac St then had a 442-254 yd edge vs Utah St in a 14 pt win. UW trailed Cal 27-7 and lost by 6 (outgained 481-259 yd). UW got the key win in their bowl season upsetting #17 USC on the road on a Thursday. UW lost at home to Oregon, and on the road to Stanford (outgained 478-231yd). UW crushed Arizona at home 49-3, yet fell behind 21-6 to Utah and lost by 11 at home. They led Ast 17-3 at half (341-133 yd edge) but Ast dominated the 2H and won by 10. UW needed to win its last 2 and did so convincingly (comb 97-17) with #20 Wash St being without QB Luke Falk. UW beat SMiss in the bowl 44-31 for a winning year.

PHIL'S FORECAST

OFFENSE - UW's offense finished '15 on a roll with 52, 45 & 44 pts over the L3 gms. They have 8 ret st's and go from a true frosh QB to a veteran soph who is one of the best. After 30.2 & 30.6 ppg in Petersen's first two offenses, this is clearly his best one yet and will get close to 37.0 ppg this year.

DEFENSE - UW allowed 24.8 ppg in '14 and had to replace most of their stars (only 4 ret st's). I was very surprised they improved to yielding just 18.8 ppg (from 41.1 to 35.2 ypg). They lose a few stars TY but have 7 st's back and have my #1 rated P12 D.

2016 - I thought Petersen underachieved in his first year and LY with an inexp'd team they were 4-6 but won their last 3 to accomplish a winning year. They were #107 on my experience chart in '15 but are #43 this year with a now veteran QB, 1,000 yd RB and the best D in the Pac-12. They face Rutgers, Idaho and Portland St in non-conf play. They do, however, draw 5 Pac-12 road games vs teams that were all in bowls in '15 but only 1 of them is vs one of the Pac-12's Top 5 teams (Oregon). Petersen enters his 3rd year and now the majority of the team are his players that he recruited for his systems. Most of their key All-Conf players return and they go from 9 ret st's to 15. My #1 Surprise Teams do very well (Florida St Nat'l Title '13, Stanford #3 AP '15) and Washington gets the call as my top non top 10 team that I think can win the National Title. I will call for their first season of double digit wins since 1991 (25 years!)

First mtg. The Huskies are 25-5 in home openers (last one against a P5 school was in '10, beat Syracuse 41-20). Washington has won 11 str hosting non-conf foes (L/loss vs #8 Nebraska in '10). UW has won 18 str w/the last series loss in 1905. Huskies won the L/mtg ('09) 42-23. UW just came off a home loss vs #11 LSU & led 35-9 late 3Q. Petersen went 5-0 vs the Vandals while HC at Boise St.

UW won 52-13 (led 45-0 at HT) in '12 (only prior mtg). UW is 21-2-1 vs FCS tms, both losses in 1920. Vikings went 9-3 LY (playoffs, ranked #10) incl wins at Washington St (24-17) & North Texas (66-7).

UW is 2-9 incl 3 str losses (2 by 7 pts or less). LY UW trailed 17-0 at HT punting on all five 1H poss (53 ttd yds). UW did cut to 10 early 3Q but trailed 31-7 after 3Q. 39% of UW's yds (90) came in the 4Q.

UW has lost 10 str. LY UW led 17-3 at HT but was held scoreless in 2H. UW was SOD, missed a fg & had 4 TO's the L/4 drives. The Huskies are on a 6-1 run in home finales (loss in '11 vs #6 Oregon).

109th Apple Cup. LTH was the coldest meeting on record with tms'p of 19°. The Huskies led 31-0 w/12:30 left as the Cougars gained 36% (134) of their yds & 35% (7) of their FD's in their last 2 poss's w/the game well decided.
