## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2016

**QUARTERBACKS** - In '14 Miami had to replace a 2 yr starter. True frosh Brad Kaaya (PS#15) did not come in until August but won the job. His first start was on a Monday night vs L'ville (17-29-174-1-2). Kaaya showed steady progress as in his first home gm & his F/3 road gms he had a 7-8 ratio but had a 19-4 ratio in his others. He topped 300 yds passing 3 times (3198, 58.5%, 26-12). Backing up Kaaya LY was Fr Malik Rosier (PS#62). Kaaya had a good but not great year (3238, 61.2%, 16-5) struggling on 3rd downs and in the red zone. He did have 379 vs Neb and 405 vs Florida St. He missed the 2H vs Clemson. Rosier played the whole game vs Duke (20-29-272-2-1) but did not attempt a pass after that. TY Vincent Testaverde (6'1" 195 So, Vinny's son), Evan Shirreffs (6'5" 210 rFr, PS#247) & true frosh Jack Allison (PS#11, IFS, likely RS) provide depth. I look for Kaaya to be one of the top QB's in the country.

**RUNNING BACKS** - Duke Johnson left as UM's career rushing leader in just 3Y ('12-'14). Bursting on the scene in '14, true frosh Joseph Yearby (PS#10) rushed for 509 (5.9, pair 100 yd gm). Gus "The Bus" Edwards added 349 (5.7). LY Edwards at 235 lbs was at the top of the depth chart but was OFY in August. Yearby had three 100+ yard gms in the first 4 but zero after that and just got past the 1,000 mark in the bowl (1002, 4.9). True frosh Mark Walton (PS#12) was #2 with 461 but just 3.5 ypc. Soph Trayone Gray (6'2" 216, PS#60) had 145 (6.3). It looks like a three headed monster at RB with Edwards, Yearby and Walton (5'10" 195 So) all capable of being the feature back.

**RECEIVERS** - LY the unit lost their top WR (#1DC, 871, 24.2 ypc) and TE (#3DC, 676, 15.4, Mackey Award finalist). The leading returnee was Herb Waters (277, 13.9) as a banged up Stacy Coley had just 184 (8.0) in '14 after 591 (17.9) as a true. LY Coley missed 2 gms early but was #2 with 689 (14.7). Rashawn Scott who had 512 (14.6) in '12 but missed most of '13-14 led with 695 (13.4). Waters was #3 (624, 15.2) while 240 lb rFr H-back David Njoku was #4 (362, 17.2). This year they lose Scott (10 st, UFA MIA) and Waters (11 st, UGA GB) but with Coley turning down the NFL, they are more exp'd and have 8 VHT's in the unit. HC Mark Richt said they had a lack of top end speed at WR so expect his true frosh signees to play.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In '14 the Hurricanes had 3 st's back (73 car sts ret) and 2 VHT's IFS. UM improved again (180, 5.3, 21 sk). LY they lost a 2nd Tm ACC 3Y C, 2nd Tm ACC 3Y LT (#1DC) and 4Y LG (#4DC). They lost 116 sts (only 22 car sts ret) so this unit was a ? in '15. After 20 yards rush vs Florida St they started shuffling the line to find the right combo. The numbers dropped dramatically to 120 (3.7) but they did allow just 19 sacks. This year they only lose RG Joe Brown (2/2). They have 85 car sts returning and should have much improved rush numbers.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - From '87-'07, UM was very physical in the middle and that is backed up by the fact that they had 10 DT's taken in the NFL draft (8 #1 DC's). That has not been the case recently. LY they allowed their highest ypc in over 20 yrs giving up 5.3 ypc (201 ypg rush, 26 sk). TY they lose NT Calvin Hurtlelou (11 st, 27 tkl, 3 tfl) and DT UFomba Kamalu (10 st, 47 tkl, 4 tfl, UFA HOU). They not only have 7 of the top 9 back including their top guy DE Al-Quadin Muhammad (#3 tkl'r, 5 sk) but add in Florida transfer Gerald Willis (PS#7) who was dominant on the scout team in '15. I expect them to return to their old form now that Coach Kool (ex-Missouri DL cch Craig Kuligowski, 4 #1 DC DL's/'09) has taken command. Miami could have the most improved run defense in the country.

**LINEBACKERS** - LY the unit lost Denzel Perryman (#2DC SD, 110 tkl - 50 more than #2) and their #3 tkl'r but did return their #2 & #5 tkl'r's and moved in DE Tyriq McCord. In 1970 UM all'd 28.2 ppg but in the next 42 yrs they didn't allow over 26 ppg. They have now done so in 3 of the last 4 yrs (incl 28.2 LY). This past year would have been better but the LB corps was hit hard by injuries. Juwon Young missed the first 2 but still was the #2 tkl'r. Raphael Kirby was OFY after 6 sts (still #9 tkl'r) and Darriion Owens (PS#44) was OFY after 2 gm. TY they lose Kirby and Tyriq McCord (8 st, #13 tkl'r, 7.5 tfl, UFA PIT) but return the top 2 tkl'r's (incl speedy Jermaine Grace) and add PS#20 Shaq Quarterman (IFS). I look for a much improved defense.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - In '14 UM had 2 ret st's and moved up to #27 in my PDR (57.7%, 14-10). LY they lost a CB (13 st, 28 tkl) and S (9 st, 55 tkl) but ret'd 6 of the top 8 and also got back Rayshawn Jenkins (12 st '13, inj '14). From '94-'10, UM had 8 Top 10 finishes in my PDR and only once all'd over 56.8% comp. It wasn't quite a return to the old days, but they finished #24 (59.9%, 16-15). TY they lose CB 2nd Tm ACC Artie Burns (12 st, #11 tkl'r, 6 int, #1DC PIT), S Deon Bush (12 st, #5 tkl'r, 1 int, #4DC CHI), S Dallas Crawford (8 st, #12 tkl'r) and Tracy Howard (7 st, #14 tkl'r, UFA CLE). They do return their #4, #7 and #10 tkl'r's (3 of their top 4 tkl'r's) so despite having just 16 sts from '15 back, the unit could be just as good.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - In '14 true frosh K "Jersey Mike" Badgley hit 14-18 FG (L48). P Justin Vogel avg 42.8 (40.5 net, Ray Guy award semi-finalist). The return game was slightly below avg and Miami slipped to #41. LY I expected a move back up and they finished #29. Badgley tied a UM record with 5 FG vs Nebraska (25-30 long 57, 2 miss 50+). He has the leg and confidence to hit from 60+ and his 57 yd FG tied Danny Miller (1981 vs Florida St) for the UM record. Soph Jon Semerene had 26 TB on 64 KO. Vogel avg 42.5 (37.4 net). Corn Elder had 1 PR TD in the opener (one called back due to penalty in that gm and another TD called back vs Cincy) but only had 152 PR yds (13.8). The KP's were below avg. Semerene departs but the rest of the unit returns and they will contend for Top 25 honors.

**COACHES** - Following 15 distinguished seasons as HC at Georgia (9Y 10+ wins, 2 SEC Titles, 145-51), Mark Richt returns to his alma mater (QB for Howard Schnellenberger). OCH Thomas Brown played for Richt at UGA ('04-'07, SEC FPOY). He coached RB's at UGA in '15 and was RB cch at Wisconsin in '14 (Melvin Gordon). Richt however, will call the plays. DC Manny Diaz (son of legendary Miami mayor Manny Diaz) was DC at Miss St in '15 and Louisiana Tech in '14 (FBS best 40 TO's gained). Diaz previously worked on defensive staffs with Mack Brown at Texas ('11-'13), NC State and Middle Tenn, in addition to his first stint at Miss St ('10). The new ST coor is Todd Hartley, who was the Director of Player Personnel at Georgia LY.

**THIS DECADE 43-33 (56.6%) #55** - Miami is trying to get back to the glory days. They have 5 National Titles but their last one came in '01. UM almost repeated in '02 (OT loss

Ohio St). They finished #5 in '03 and #11 in '04 but in the last 11Y, have only finished ranked twice (#17 '05, #19 '09). UM did get as high as #7 in '13 but (7-0) but finished NR. They finished 9-4 in '13 but a lot of factors were pointing down for 2014 (see '14 mag). Miami was still voted 1st in the ACC Coastal media poll. They were not ranked the entire season for the 3rd time in 4Y. They ended up suffering just their 3rd losing season in 35 yrs (2007, 1997) at 6-7 (bowl loss to South Carolina). LY Miami went 8-4 but lost their bowl to Wash St and are just 43-33 for the decade.

**2015 ANALYSIS 8-5** - The Hurricanes tied for last in the Coastal in '14 at 3-5 but were +75.3 ypg in conf play (3rd best). Coach Al Golden made my "Coaches on the Hotseat" article at philsteele.com but I put Miami on my Most Improved List and expected them to contend for the Coastal Title. At 2-0 Miami led Nebraska 33-10 w/10:00 left but actually needed OT to win. They lost on the road 34-23 to Cincinnati. Miami led Florida St 24-23 but allowed a TD with 6:44 left and lost by 5 on the road. After beating Virginia Tech by 10 at home, they were set for a showdown with Clemson. Miami fell behind early, then lost QB Kaaya (Rosier 7-22-42-0-2) and it turned into their worst loss in program history at 58-0. Golden was let go and TE cch/run gm coordinator Larry Scott took over as the interim HC. Miami led the entire game vs Duke (14-3, 24-12) until they gave up a TD w/06 left. They got a miracle 8 lateral KR TD that withstood review and won by 3. They beat Virginia by 6 at home to get to 6-3. In another ACC showdown they trailed North Carolina 31-0 at half and lost by 38. Miami beat Georgia Tech by 17 and led Pitt 29-10 late 4Q (won by 5) to go 8-4 but in the bowl had an int in the EZ, a fumble at the 11, had the GW TD called back and then were int'd at the WSU15 and lost by 6 to finish just 8-5 and NR.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

**OFFENSE** - Offensive lines are important. LY they had an inexp'd O-line and despite returning most of their skill players, including QB Kaaya, they slipped from 430 to 397 ypg, their lowest totals s/'11. TY they return 9 starters on offense, QB Kaaya, 3 capable feature RB's and a now veteran O-line. I will call for Miami to have their best ppg since 2002 (40.5), the year they nearly repeated as National Champs.

**DEFENSE** - Manny Diaz's last 4 defenses had a combined 133 sks while Miami has posted just 95 in that span. He has 6 of the top 7 tkl'r's back and I know Coach Kool will mold a dominating D-line. I like the talent that Miami has despite losing 74 sts from LY. This could be the most improved defense in the country after allowing and avg of 412 ypg the L4Y.

**2016** - Last year Miami was #9 in the FBS in fewest amount of seniors (12) which is usually a good sign for the next year. They were +11 in my Turnovers=Turnaround (pg 30) which is a bad sign as are their 2 net close wins (pg 24) LY. Miami was #100 in my Experience Ratings LY and now are #24 (4th best ACC) with 15 returning starters (11 LY). Folks pointed to coaching as a main reason for Miami's struggles LY and while Mark Richt does not have any National Titles, he does have a lot of double digit win seasons in the rugged SEC. Miami has the coaching, veteran QB, improved defense and my #2 rated ACC ST's unit. Plus, Clemson drops off their schedule. Miami has not had a double digit win season since 2003 but 5 of my 9 sets of power ratings call for one this year including my main one. The Hurricanes are my favorite to win the Coastal.

UM is 9-1 (loss in 1979) incl a 41-7 win in the L/mtg ('14). UM is 27-3 in home openers & has won 11 str non-conf HG's by 30 ppg (L/loss in '11 vs K-St). Rattlers went 1-10 LY incl a 51-3 loss at USF.

UM has won both mtg's ('13 & LY). LY was 20-20 w/9:44 3Q but UM scored 24 unanswered (275-48 yd edge). Schools are 51 miles apart. Incl bowls UM is 20-2 s/04 (1st yr in ACC) vs in-state non-conf tms.

First mtg. The Hurricanes are 1-5 in non-conference away gms outside the state of FL, w/the avg loss by 22 ppg (win in '10 at Pitt, then Big East member). Miami is 4-7 in road openers but 3-1 recently.

**Bonus:** Prior to becoming the UGA HC for the L15Y Mark Richt served on the Florida St staff as a GA from 1985-'88. QB cch 1990-'93 & OC/QB cch from 1994-'00. In '89 he was the East Carolina OC.

Miami is 6-1 (prior just 2-8) but the visitor has dropped 3 str. LTH the Hurricanes had two 7 pt 1H leads but it was 14-14 at HT. UM got within 4 w/3:25 left 3Q but was int'd in the EZ (from the GT10) w/1:11.

HT is 3-7. Twelve of L/15 have been decided by a td or less. LY UM trailed 17-3 2Q but took their 1st/only lead 24-23 w/10:02 left. UM all'd a 23 yd td run w/6:44 & their L/2 drives ended in punt/SOD at UM42.

The home tm is 12-4. LY the Hurricanes trailed 45-0 w/10:26 3Q. Miami's first 10 drives covered 161/44pl ending on 6 punts, 3 TD's & a missed fg. Into '16, Hurricanes are 9-4 hosting ACC foes.
