POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2016

QUARTERBACKS - In '14 David Ash beat out soph Tyrone Swoopes (PS#10) and true frosh Jerrod Heard (PS#5). Ash was OFY in the opener. Thrown into the fire, Swoopes had his ups and downs. He topped 300 yds passing 3 times and nearly upset then #12 UCLA & #11 Oklahoma. The bad was 106 yds in the loss to K-St, 4 int vs TCU & just 13-25-57 in the bowl. Swoopes threw for 2,409 (58%, 13-11, #3 rush w/262). Heard was the bkp but RS, LY Swoopes won the job but mustered just 3 points vs ND. Heard st'd vs Rice and while he hit just 4-7, he connected on 69 & 32 yd td passes (96 yds rush). Heard had a UT record 527 total yds vs Cal but just 71 total yds vs TCU. 6'4" 254 Swoopes was used as a short ydg QB (18 wheeler package) and had 3 TD's vs K-St. Heard was in'd 2Q vs TT and Swoopes took most of the snaps after that. Heard threw for 1,214 (57.9%, 5-5, 556 rush) while Swoopes threw for 537 (50.5%, 4-1, 451 rush, 12 td). True frosh Shane Buechele (PS#12) is the best fit for the offense and had a great spring game while Kai Locksley (6'4" 200 rFr, PS#20) and Matthew Merrick (6'3" 200 rFr, PS#83) provide depth to a very deep unit. I look for much better passing numbers in '16.

RUNNING BACKS - After a streak of 11 straight 1,000 yd rushers from '96-'05, the Longhorns have now gone 8 consecutive yrs without one (last in '07). In '14 after new HC Charlie Strong's offseason purge, they had just 2 schlp RB's in the spring (added 2 true in fall). The O-line was inexp'd and banged up. Texas did not have a 100 yd RB until gm 9. Malcolm Brown (PS#1) led w/708 (3.9) while Johnathan Gray (PS#15) was #2 w/637 (4.3). True frosh D'Onta Foreman had 73 (4.9). LY they lost their top guy but were deeper. Gray st'd 10 but had just 103 over the first 3. Foreman had 99 in the first 4 and QB Heard was their top rusher. Then the running game got going as Foreman had 112 vs TCU, 117 vs Oklahoma, 157 vs KU (93 yd td run) and 147 vs WV. He finished #1 (681, 7.2). Gray had 103 vs K-St (#3, 489, 40). With the top two out vs TT, true frosh Chris Warren (PS#15) had an amazing 25-276! Gray departs but Foreman, Warren and Kirk Johnson (6'0" 191 So, PS#43, 44 yds wear) are all back. The Foreman (238 lbs) & Warren (250 lb) duo will wear opp's down in the 2H and be one of the best in the country.

RECEIVERS - LY Texas had to replace their top 2 WR's (1628, 12.8) and a #7DC TE. They returned #3 rec Marcus Johnson (313, 11.6, PS#82) and #4 Armani Foreman (188, 18.8, PS#25). LY 6'3" true frosh John Burt (PS#20) only had 28 rec's but led with 457 (16.3, lowest yds leading rec s/74). Daje Johnson (PS#29, 374 F/3Y) led in rec's (37, 45, 11.2). Foreman was #3 with just 182 (16.5). They lost 2 of their top TE's in August & so moved in DL Caleb Bluiett (167, 20.9). TY they

lose Marcus Johnson (7 st, 130, 10.8) and Daje Johnson (8 st) who comb'd for just 545 yds. They do add in 6'6" Collin Johnson (PS#31, IFS) & I look for much improved numbers

OFFENSIVE LINE - The Longhorns has not had an OL drafted s/'08! After their 2 ret str's were OFY by Wk 2 in '14, they basically had 0 ret str's (2 car sts ret) and slipped to just 137 rush ypg (3.8, 29 sk) using 6 different lineups. LY they had 4 ret str's but RT Kent Perkins was better suited at G and LT Marcus Hutchins lost his job. Two true frosh were their best OL in 3rd Tm B12 RG Patrick Vahe (PS#26) and 2nd Tm B12 LT Connor Williams. Texas improved to 225 (5.1) but did allow 32 sks. TY they lose C Taylor Doyle (12/23), LG Sedrick Flowers (11/25), Hutchins (2/15) and bkp C Jake Raulerson. They have 49 car sts ret and should continue to improve.

DEFENSIVE LINE - LY Texas lost a 1st Tm AA DT (#1DC) and 2nd Tm B12 DE but ret'd 6 of the top 8 along with Desmond Jackson (PS#9, RS '14). It was surprising that Texas had their worst rush D s/'97 (219 ypg, 4.5, 37 sk). TY they lose DE Shiro Davis (4 st, 29 tkl, 2 sk), NT Desmond Jackson (5 st, 31 tkl, 1.5 sk) and DT Hassan Ridgeway (8 st, 36 tkl, 3.5 sk, #4DC IND). While those 3 (comb 7 sk) all began as str's, 7 different DL st'd and the returnees had 17 of the DL's 24 sacks. They add in a pair of 320 lb frosh and should be improved up front.

LINEBACKERS - In '14 Texas had an exp'd LB corps and improved the ppg allowed to 23.8 which would have been lower if not for opponents Def scores and 79 pts allowed in the last 2. Last year they lost a 2nd Tm AA LB (#1 tkl'r, #3DC) and their #2 & #7 tkl'rs. They returned #14 tkl'r Peter Jenkins (PS#12). The entire 3-deep consisted of VHT's incl PS#1 LB Malik Jefferson (IFS, B12 FrOpp). After losing all 3 starters they slipped to allowing 30.3 ppg. This year they lose 1st Tm B12 Jinks (11 st, #1 tkl'r, 6.5 sk) and Dalton Santos (9 car st, 112 tkl). They have 5 of the top 6 back including Jefferson (better suited to OLB) making them much more experienced.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Texas was #15 in my PDR in '13 and #5 in '14 (58.9%, 13-15) despite starting true frosh Jason Hall and former walk-on Dylan Haines at S for the final 7. LY they lost a 2nd Tm B12 CB (#5 tkl'r, #6DC) but ret'd 5 of the top 6 while adding in 5 VHT frosh. They started to play more frosh mid year (for future) but I was surprised they slipped to #39 (59.9%, 24-13). TY they lose CB Duke Thomas (PS#26, 12 st, #3 tkl'r, 5 pbu) but return 11 of the top 12 (add PS#4 true frosh Brandon Jones) and should be one of the Big 12's best.

SPECIAL TEAMS - With Texas' recruiting success, most of the bkps are VHT's that contribute on ST's. Since '0UT has had 8 Top 20 finishes. K Nick Rose hit 14-21 fg (L51) in '14 (44 TB 61 KO). The problem (finish #103) was that they were -10.5 on KR's and -2.2 on PR. LY new true frosh P Michael Dickson avg 41.3 (39.3 net) but did fumble a snap vs Okla St. Rose who booted an 80 yd FG in a video posted online missed the tying xp vs Cal but hit 13-17 fg's (long 53, 38-39 xp). They avg 12.1 on PR's and moved up to #28. TY they lose Daje Johnson (10.7 PR, 24.0 KR) as well as K Rose and might drop back a little, especially with Strong saying he needed to find a K after spring.

COACHES - HC Charlie Strong has opened just 11-14. Following legendary coach Mack Brown (158 wins, 15 bowls, 3 BCS bowl wins, a National Title, 16 yrs) makes the task more daunting. Strong went 37-15 at Louisville incl a BCS bowl win & was previously the DC at Florida ('03-'09) & South Carolina ('99-'02). While the first 2Y were disappointing, his tough approach in reshaping the Horns roster should bring winning dividends going forward. The 1st yr OC/QB ch is Sterling Gilbert. His Tulsa offense avg 502.8 ypg LY. He was the OC at BG '14, & tutored Jimmy Garoppolo (FCS Coor of Yr, EIU '12-'13). Vance Bedford begins his 3Y as DC. He held same position at both UL ('10-'13)

& Okla St ('05-'06). 2nd yr ST cch Jeff Traylor was HC at Gilmer High (TX) for 15Y ('00-'14).

THIS DECADE 41-35 (53.9) #63 - Texas had DD wins for 9 consecutive years (avg 11.2 wins peryr) from '01-'09 incl a National Champ in '05 and playing in the National Title gm in '09. They have not had DD wins this decade. In fact, they've had 3 losing seasons and an overall record of 41-35. In 2014 Charlie Strong inherited an 8-5 team and had a my-way-or-the-highway approach with many players leaving the program from spring through August. That method worked very well when he was at Louisville going 7-6 in his 2nd season, then an impressive 11-2 and 12-1 his final 2 yrs there. UT went 6-6 but lost 31-7 in the Texas Bowl and finished 6-7. LY it was B2B losing years without a bowl this time.

2015 ANALYSIS 5-7 - In 2015 UT rated a -56 in all-conf pts (pg 33) and ret'd just 11 str's. If I would have told Texas fans prior to the year that '15 would include wins over Oklahoma (which would make the playoffs) and a win at Baylor, they probably would have taken it. Texas opened up with an embarrassing road loss at ND 38-3. They were outgained by Rice 462-277 but won 42-28. They trailed Cal 45-24 4Q but UT appeared to tie it with 1:25 until an improbable missed xp. After a narrow 3 pt loss to Oklahoma St and a 50-7 rout by TCU, UT fans were not happy. Texas then upset #10 Oklahoma and had a 373-242 yd edge at Kansas St and were back to 3-4. They had a stunning 24-0 shutout loss to a 3-9 Iowa St team. After beating Kansas 59-20, they outgained WV on the road 439-379 but lost by 18 thanks to 4 TO's. They lost by 3 on Thanksgiving vs TT despite RB Warren's 276 rush yards. Baylor was down to their #3 QB and Texas pulled the 23-17 upset in Waco to finish 5-7.

PHIL'S FORECAST

OFFENSE - New OC Sterlin Gilbert brings his "Veer and Shoot" offense to Texas. Charlie Strong inherited a group that avg'd 29.3 ppg. They only put up 21.4 ppg his first year but improved to 26.4 in '15. The new offense (7 ret str's) will clearly be the best he has had in his 3 years with the key being vastly improved QB play and the best RB corps in his tenure.

DEFENSE - Strong is known for defense and in 2014 Texas held opp's to 101 ypg below their season avg (#8) as they allowed just 349 ypg (#27 FBS) and 23.8 ppg. LY was a surprise as they gave up 30.3 ppg and 453 ypg although they faced some potent offenses (held opp 26 ypg below ssn avg #45). TY he has 8 str's back including LB Malik Jefferson and a secondary that is over 2 deep in potential starters.

2016 - Charlie Strong is 11-14 and clearly will make my "Coaches on the Hot Seat" article on philsteele.com in August. He should also have one of the most improved teams in the country (#1 on my Most Improved List). They were +11 in my Turnovers=Turnaround (pg 30) which points down but all the other factors point up. They rate a +2.0 on my Stock Market Indicator and coaches usually have a big year in their 3rd season with the majority of the team now made up of their own recruits. Texas has 15 returning starters (2nd most Big 12) and their offense could have a transformation like TCU did in 2014, when they went from 25.1 to 46.5 ppg. They are much improved at QB, RB and WR and defensive-minded Strong has 8 starters back on D making that a unit to his liking. They get TCU and Baylor at home and face Oklahoma in Dallas so they must be considered this year's Big 12 dark horse title contender.

LY (1st mtg in nearly 20 yrs) saw UT down 17-0 at HT, F/5 drives tll'g 32/18pl. More of the same in 2H as 4 of 6 poss ended in 3kouts (-10 tll yds). Longhorns have won 16 str home openers by 37 ppg.

Texas is 4-0 vs UTEP incl a 64-7 win in the L/mtg ('09). That ssn the Longhorns finished 13-1 (#2, only loss in BCS Title gm vs Bama). Into '16, UT is 38-9 hosting non-conf foes s'96 (Big 12 first ssn).

UT is 2-0 in Berkeley incl a 17-0 shutout LTH but that was in 1969. That ssn the legendary HC Darrell Royal was at the helm & UT knocked off ND 21-17 in the Cotton Bowl to finish 11-0 & National Champs.

Bonus: Texas is 12-3 in road openers but has dropped 3 straight.

Bonus: Strong was the first Texas HC since 1937 to have a losing record in his inaugural season.

The visitor has won 7 str by an avg of 16 ppg. LTH Texas led 19-0 at HT, all'g just 51 yds & forcing four 3kouts in the 1H in the 28-7 win. The Longhorns are 48-14 on the Big 12 road (3+ wins 3 of L4Y).

Two of the L3Y UT has come in unranked vs a ranked OU squad & has pulled the upset. LY UT jumped out to a 14-0 lead. Twice in the 2H OU cut it to 7 but UT responded w/great def & a controlling run gm.

LY in the shutout UT had 9 of their 12 poss go 4 plays or less & 18 yds or less. 38% of their tll yds (77) came on a gbg L-drive down 24-0. UT is 17-1 the gm following the RRS (only loss in '11 vs #6 Okla St).

Visitor is 4-12. LTH UT was shutout for the 1st time s'04 (12-0 loss vs OU). Longhorns ran just 3 plays in the RZ (deepest to the KSU14). Since the BCS Title gm in '09, UT is just 7-22 vs ranked foes.

LY UT led 20-0 at HT holding the nation's top offense to its 1st scoreless 1H since 19-20-11. BU did cut the deficit to 3 late 4Q but UT forced a fmbt at the B43 & EOH at UT47 on the Bears 12-0 poss.

LTH the Longhorns went on an 85/2pl td drive to take a 17-13 lead w/2:59 left before HT & never trailed again, holding Texas Tech scoreless and to just 172 yds the rest of the way.

LY UT had 5 TO's costing them 24 pts incl a WV 42 yd FR td.

Texas only trailed 21-17 3Q but WV scored 17 of L20 pts.

UT has won all 13 conf gms. LTH 8 of KU's F/10 drives ended in UT territory only being outgained by 16 yds (FD's even).

LY Texas was completely dominated as TCU led 30-0 after 1Q. UT's only td came after a 93/4pl 4Q drive down 50-0.

Texas is 18-5 in home finales, but has lost 5 of the last 6.

Bonus: UT is 55-18 hosting B12 foes, just 11-13 the L6Y.
