POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2016

QUARTERBACKS - In 2014 Jeff Driskel (PS#1) and true frosh Treon Harris (PS#9) combined to throw for 2,159 (52%), 18-14, 512 rush). Will Grier (PS#3, RS '14) was my projected starter in '15 as he was a better fit for the new offense. Harris and Grier split snaps the first two games but Grier took command and in 6 games threw for 1,204 (65.8%), 10-3, 116 rush). They avg 32.2 ppg in the first 6 but then Grier was OFY (susp). Harris did throw for 271 vs LSU and 256 vs SCar, but generally struggled. Florida avg 16.5 ppg over the last 8 with Harris throwing for 1,676 (50.6%, 9-6, 238 rush). This year Grier has transferred and Harris moved to WR. Luke Del Rio (PS#62) has been at 2 previous schools (Bama & Oregon St) and 2 true frosh were IFS in Felipe Franks (PS#6) and Kyle Trask (PS#122). Austin Appleby transfers in from Purdue where he had 11 sts (2767 yds, 55%, 19-19 ratio) in 3 years. The numbers can only improve.

RUNNING BACKS - Heading into '15, the Gators had just one 1,000 yard rusher s/2005 (Mike Gillislee, 2012). Kelvin Taylor PS#5 ran for 462 of his 508 (4.6) in the final 7 as a true frosh in '13. In '14 Taylor was #2 (565, 4.9). LY they had to replace their #1 rusher (#3DC, 817, 4.9). Taylor became the feature back and topped 1,000 in the bowl (1035, 4.0). His bkps were a pair of true frosh in Jordan Scarlett (PS#14, 181, 5.3) and Jordan Cronkrite (PS#29, 157, 3.6). Taylor left early for the NFL (#6DC SF). HC Jim McElwain said Mark Thompson (6'2" 242, PS#5JC) is "an SEC back, good size obviously, runs behind his pads, real good speed." The '15 RB's combined for just 4.1 ypc and 1,385 yards working behind a very inexp'd O-line. With a stronger O-line this group should top those numbers despite losing their best guy.

RECEIVERS - Florida has had a good amount of VHT's but very little production from its WR's this decade. In '14 I pegged Demarcus Robinson as my breakout POY in the SEC (ESPN Insider article). Robinson led with 810 (15.3, 7 td), more than twice as many yds as the #2 man (353, 16.8). Ahmad Fulwood (PS#16) was #3 (199, 16.6). LY they had to replace their #2 guy but added in TE Jake McGee (769 yds in 2Y at Virginia). Antonio Callaway set a true frosh school record with three 100 yard games and led with 678 (19.4) and 514 return yds. Robinson was in and out of the doghouse but was #1 in rec's and #2 in yds (522, 10.9). 5'9" soph Brandon Powell was #3 (390, 13.4). TY they lose Robinson (9 st, #4DC KC), 2nd Tm SEC TE McGee (13 st, 381, 9.3, UFA CAR) and Valdez Showers (6 rec, UFA WAS). DeAndre Goolsby (PS#15) was #5 (277, 16.3) and returns at TE so this unit could actually be improved despite losing 2 st's.

OFFENSIVE LINE - LY the Gators had 4 OL drafted by the NFL (#1, #3, #4, #7 DC's). They had just 10 car sts ret (all by Trip Thurman) and only 7 schlp OL in the spring. Martez Ivey (PS#1) is a prototypical OT, but started the last 8 (injury) at LG. Injuries hit the unit hard in the last month (3 trues in rotation). It was easy to predict the numbers would be weaker and they fell to 127 rush ypg (3.5) and 46 sks. TY they lose G/C Thurman (2Y st'r) and RT Mason Halter (13 st). LY's pain will equal this year's gain as the unit is much deeper, a year older (43 car sts ret) and should be one of the nation's most improved.

DEFENSIVE LINE - UF allowed just 116 rush ypg (3.2, 30 sk) in '14. LY they lost a #1DC DE and 3 DT's (12 st, 60 tkl, 2 sk). Five of the top 7 DL tkl'rs ret'd (Jonathan Bullard turn down NFL) so they had 2 ret st's again (8 VHT's). After the regular season they had allowed just 111 ypg rush (3.3) but yielded 229 ypg (4.5) vs Bama and Michigan. They went from 26 reg season sks in '14 to 38 in '15 despite the unit being decimated by inj's at year's end. TY they lose 4th Tm AA Bullard (14 st, 66 tkl, 6.5 sk, 11 tfl, #3DC CHI) and DE Alex McCalister (6 st, 26 tkl, 6.5 sk, miss 5 gm, #7DC PHI). While they lose their top 2 DL's, the unit should stay healthier as they have 8 of the top 10 back including CeCe Jefferson (PS#5), who had 8.5 tfl as a true.

LINEBACKERS - Depth was a concern in '14 (just 8 schlp LB) but surprisingly they didn't sign any LB recruits. UF allowed an identical 21.1 ppg. LY they lost 2 st's (#2 & #8 tkl'rs). The only ret'g st'r was #1 tkl'r Antonio Morrison (1st UF ply'r w/100+ tkl s/10) but he was considered a long shot to play in Sept (knee surg). He made a miracle recovery and became just the 3rd UF player s/1983 to have B2B 100 tkl seasons. UF improved to 18.3 ppg allowed. Alex Anzalone (PS#4) who would have st'd if Morrison did not make it back, was OFY (shoulder) after 2 gms (6 tkl). TY they lose 3rd Tm AA Morrison (#4DC IND), NB Brian Poole (6 st, #7 tkl'r, 10 pbu, UFA ATL) and Jeremi Powell (2 st, 11 tkl). They do return #2 tkl'r Jarrad Davis but LY signed just 1 LB (PS#307), so depth is still a problem as is the loss of their top guy (did sign 3 LB's in this year's class).

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Gators have 6 Top 12 finishes in my PDR the last 8 yrs including #1 in '12. Vernon Hargreaves III (PS#1) was the first true frosh to wear #1 s/Keiwan Ratliff in '00. In '14 he was the only ret st'r but the Gators finished #11 (53%, 15-16). LY they had 4 DB's back with 8+ sts in '14 but "only" finished #16. Hargreaves gave up more big plays than expected. This year they lose both 1st Tm AA Hargreaves (#9 tkl'r, 4 int, #1DC TB) and S Keanu Neal (#3 tkl'r, 1 int, #1DC ATL). They do return 3rd Tm AA Jalen Tabor and 2nd Tm SEC Marcus Maye (#4 tkl'r) and will remain near the top.

SPECIAL TEAMS - LY the Gators had to replace their P (44.2, 38.0 net), their KR (519, 24.7) and PR (323, 14.0). They fell all the way to #74. New P soph Johnny Townsend (PS#13, 42.0 as frosh, RS in '14) avg a super 45.4 (42.1 net). FG's were a nightmare with McElwain holding tryouts late in the year (200 tired out). Austin Hardin hit his first 3, but made just 2 of his next 11. Rf'r Jorge Powell then hit 2-3 FG but was inj'd (knee). True frosh Antonio Callaway (1 of tms fastest) had 435 (15.5, 3rd Tm AA) on PR's and Brandon Powell added 510 (21.2) on KR's. They add JUCO K Eddy Pineiro (PS#34JC) who was IFS. He hit the crossbar on a 71 yd FG in a K camp and will be a huge upgrade despite having never kicked a fg in a live game before (only KO's and PAT's in HSI). Everyone is back and I look for a good sized jump in the ST rankings.

COACHES - Jim McElwain seemingly has the tradition rich Gators program back on course. He won 10 games in his 1st season and has familiarity with the SEC, spending 4 ssns as Bama's OC ('08-'11). He led Colo St to new heights the prior

3Y as HC after taking over a 3 win program and getting them to 4, 8 & 10 wins. 2nd year OC Doug Nussmeier had taken over for McElwain as Bama OC ('12-'13). He was OC/QB cch at Mich in '14. DC Geoff Collins was at Miss St ('11-'14) as co-DC the F2Y and full DC the L2Y. The ST cch is Greg Nord (also TE's) who was at WKU in '12 & '14, and '13 as TE/ST cch at Kentucky.

THIS DECADE 47-30-10-12 - Urban Meyer won National Titles in '06 and '08 but in '10 Florida was just 8-5 (NR 1st time 6Y) and he stepped aside. Florida was 100-30 (76.9%) from '00-'09. Will Muschamp took over and in his first year needed a bowl win over an interim head coached team, Ohio St, to finish with a winning record at 7-6. In '12 UF was #23 in the preseason and picked 3rd in the SEC East (media). I had them in my Top 10 and #1 in the East. Florida was within a ND loss of playing for the Nat'l Title as they were 11-1 and #3 in the BCS rankings. They came into '14 ranked #10 AP but I had them ranked lower than everyone else. The Gators went through a devastating spate of injuries as the defense only allowed 230 ypg over the first six, but 380 in the last six incl a loss to then FCS GSthrn. They had their first losing season s/79 and their first non-bowl year s/90 (4-8). In '14 the Gators had 14 ret st's, rated a +5.0 in my Stock Market Indicator, and had -4 net close losses and -4 net upsets in '13. They did draw both LSU & Bama out of the West. Muschamp was let go after a loss to SCar put them at 5-4. DC DJ Durkin was the interim HC for the bowl and they finished 7-5. LY Florida won the East and was 10-1 but lost their last 3. They have already matched last decades loss total of 30.

2015 ANALYSIS 10-4 - Florida drew both LSU and Ole Miss out of the West and had just 11 ret st's for new HC McElwain. They won their first 3 as expected, getting past EC by 7 at home and UK by 5 on the road. They trailed Tenn 27-14 and needed a 4th & 14 conv for a comeback 28-27 win. They upset #3 Ole Miss at home 38-10 (355-328 yd) and beat Mizzou on the road but QB Grier was OFY. They avg 384.6 ypg the first 6 but just 296 ypg over the last 8. At 6-0 they were #8 but LSU won by 7 in Death Valley. The Gators won their next 4 to clinch the SEC East but only beat Vandy by 2 and FAU in OT. They were crushed by Florida St, Bama and Michigan by an avg of 32.3-8 for a 10-4 finish a #25 final ranking.

PHIL'S FORECAST

OFFENSE - UF avg 32.2 ppg with Will Grier at QB but just 16.5 the last 8 without him. They have 2 transfers and a VHT true frosh at QB. With 6 ret st's they may be a notch below the 1H Gators offense but clearly better than the offense of the final 8.

DEFENSE - The last 7 years Florida has allowed just 18.4 ppg and has 6 st's back on defense. They do lose their top DL, top LB and top DB but should be strong again with DT Brantley, LB Davis and CB Tabor (both All-American candidates).

2016 - Jim McElwain took over a Gator team that was 11-13 the previous two years and got them to 10-1 clinching the SEC East after 10 games. When QB Grier was OFY, so was their offense and they struggled down the stretch. Blowout losses to Florida St, Alabama and Michigan closed out the year. They had 4 net close wins LY (pg 24), have a Stock Market Indicator of -4.5 and were only +57.9 ypg in SEC play despite their 7-1 record. They have beaten Tenn 11 straight years and only play 3 true SEC road games (Georgia neutral site). This team will be solid on defense and special teams and if the offense improves like it should, they are a SEC East contender again.

First mtg. The streak now stands at 26 str ssn opening wins, all have been at home (2014's Idaho opener was cancelled). The Gators have won 5 str non-P5, non-conf home gms by 35 ppg.

UF's 29 gm series win streak is now the longest active in the FBS as Penn St had its 31 gm win streak snapped LY by Temple. LY UF led 14-3 into the 4Q & up 5 sealed the win on a int at their 23 w/33 left.

The Gators actually lost the only prior mtg 20-12 but that was back in 1947. TY Florida has 9 of their 12 regular ssn gms in the state & only travel to TN (twice; Knoxville & Nashville) and AR (Fayetteville).

The Gators are 19-4 vs the Vols incl winning L/11 by 13 ppg. LTH QB Harris replaced Driskel late 3Q down 2 scores and led UF on a pair of 4Q scoring drives. UT's LP/oss was a int at UF23 w/51.

The win LTH avenged 2013's humbling loss, Florida had won 22 str. UF trailed 7-0 early but scored 24 unanswered until a Vandy fg w/13:17. UF put the gm away on their next drive w/a Harris 33 yd td run.

LY UF led 7-0 & after trailing 28-14 at HT tied the gm after a 72 yd PR td w/1:04 3Q. LSU got the gm deciding td after a 75/11 pl drive w/10:40 left. UF punted from LSU35 (4th&22) & was SOD twice L/3 poss.

LY Mizzou's 1st drive covered 62/7 pl (fg), down 7-3 mid 1Q. In Mizzou's L/14 drives they ran just 10 of their 60 td plays in UF territory (deepest penetration to UF29). Into '16, UF is 12-5 hosting SEC foes (3-0 LY).

21st str yr in Jacksonville. UF has won 2 str. LY UGA QB Faton Bauta was making his 1st career str (15-33-46%-154-0-4). UF led 20-0 at HT forcing 5 TO's incl a fmbt recovered in the EZ (UGA muffed PR).

UF is 9-1 (only loss was in series 1st mtg in '82). LTH ('08) Florida won 38-7, 3-0 in Fayetteville w/a avg win by 24 ppg. UF has struggled vs SEC West going 4-11 since '10 including losing 5 of the L/6.
