He threw more passes in the first half (five) than Army did in seven of its games in 2017, and finished with the academy's most yards passing since its 208-yard day against rival Navy three years ago. "The things we wanted to do didn't turn out how we wanted to," Hopkins said. "They were moving fast laterally, couldn't get them reach-blocked and things like that.
