



Today's game was the 19th Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championship, and the sixth held at AT&T Stadium dating back to the 2009 season. Oklahoma won 27-21 en route to its 14th Big 12 postseason title.

Table toppers...With lower-seeded Oklahoma's win, the highest ranked team is now 5-1 in Big 12 Championship Games played at AT&T Stadium since 2009.

Unfamiliar territory...This was the 86th meeting between Oklahoma and Iowa State, and the first contest played on neutral territory.

Sooner standard...Oklahoma (8-2, 7-2) has won its sixth consecutive Big 12 title and 14th in the 25-year history of the league. The 14 Big 12 championships by the Sooners are a league record.

First-appearance jitters...Teams who are participating in their first Big 12 Championship game are 3-7 dating back to the 1996 season.

Never looked back...Oklahoma took an early 7-0 lead in the first quarter, the ninth time that the Sooners have held their opponent scoreless in the first quarter at the Big 12 Football Championship. Teams are now 11-5 overall when holding their opponent scoreless in the first quarter, and 14-3 when leading at the half.

Rattler not rattled in first Big 12 Championship...Oklahoma QB Spencer Rattler was named the Most Outstanding Player. Rattler finished 22-34 passing for 272 yards and one TD while also rushing for 17 yards and another score. His 0.0 interception percentage tied 12 others for a Big 12 Championship record.

Series dominance...Oklahoma now owns a 77-7-2 all-time record against Iowa State and is 16-2 in the series in the Big 12 era.

Two-loss winners...The 2020 Oklahoma squad is the fifth in program history to win a conference title with two league losses. The four occasions it happened before were in 1976 (5-2 in Big Eight; shared with Colorado and Oklahoma State) and 2002, 2007 and 2010 (6-2 in Big 12; won Big 12 Championship games).

Dirty dozen...Oklahoma made its 12th appearance (11-1) in the Big 12 Championship game, all since 2000, and has advanced to each of the four since the contest was reinstated in 2017. OU has more Big 12 Championship game wins (11) than any other program has appearances. It has qualified for 12 of the league's 19 title games.

Sooner legacy...This was OU's sixth-straight conference title. The last time the Sooners won at least six consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches Chuck Fairbanks (1972) and Barry Switzer.

Chasing a legend... This marks head coach Lincoln Riley's fourth Big 12 title, putting him in second place behind fellow Oklahoma coach Bob Stoops (10) for the most all-time. He is the first Power 5 coach to win four-consecutive conference championships.

Blanked...Oklahoma led the Cyclones 7-0 at the end of the first quarter, which was the ninth time the Sooner defense has held their opponents scoreless in the opening quarter in the title game. The Sooners have gone on to win the game eight times when leading after the first.

Pulled away early...The Sooners led Iowa State 24-7 at halftime, and they are now 7-0 in the Big 12 Championship when leading at the half.

Slowed late...The Sooners' three points in the second half are the fewest by a team to ever win the Big 12 Championship.

Dallas bred...Oklahoma's first touchdown of the game was scored by Oklahoma reserve quarterback Chandler Morris. Morris is from Highland Park, Texas, and led his team to a state title on the same field in 2018 at AT&T Stadium.

Mims the word...Marvin Mims' 45-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter set the Oklahoma freshman record for receiving touchdowns in a season (8). Mims finished as OU's leading receiver in the game with seven receptions for 101 yards and a TD.

BrKICK...Gabe Brkic's 54-yard FG is tied for the fourth longest FG in school history and the longest since R.D. Lashar's 54-yard field goal vs. Missouri in 1990.

- Oklahoma's Big 12 title marked its sixth straight and 14th in the 25-year history of the league. The Sooners now have 50 conference championships, the most among FBS programs (Nebraska ranks second with 46).
- This year's Oklahoma squad is the fifth in program history to win a conference title with two league losses. The previous four occasions it happened were in 1976 (5-2 in Big Eight; shared with Colorado and Oklahoma State) and 2002, 2007 and 2010 (6-2 in Big 12; won Big 12 Championship games). Before this season, no OU team had ever won a conference title after a 0-2 league start.
- Oklahoma's current streak of six straight outright league championships is the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75 (Clemson, which plays later today, is also riding a five-game outright streak [ACC]). The last current Power Five program to win six straight outright conference titles is OU (12 in a row from 1948 to '59)'
- OU is now 11-1 in Big 12 Championship games, and has more Big 12 Championship game wins than any other program has appearances. It has played in 12 of the league's 19 title games.
- Lincoln Riley set a record for most wins in the first four seasons of an OU heading coaching career. He is now 44-8 (.846), one more than the number of wins by Bob Stoops (43-9) in his first four seasons at OU (1999-2002).
- Oklahoma is now 3-1 all-time in games against a team it lost to earlier in the same campaign. It also occurred in 2018 vs. Texas 1978 vs. Nebraska and 1901 vs. Texas.
- Oklahoma owns a 77-7-2 all-time record against Iowa State and is 16-2 in the series in the Big 12 era. The Sooners' .907 series winning percentage against ISU is the best by one Power Five program against another (minimum of 50 games played).
- This was the first game this season in which the OU defense has recorded three interceptions and the fifth in which has had two INTs (also vs. Texas, Texas Tech, Kansas and Baylor). The last time the Sooners registered three interceptions in a game was 2015 vs. TCU.
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Kansas). Before this season, the last time two OU QBs scored a rushing touchdown in the same game was 1990 (Cale Gundy and Steve Collins vs. Oklahoma State), a span of 390 games.

- The Sooners tallied three sacks and five tackles for loss in the game (with six more QB hurries). Over its last seven games, the OU defense has totaled 30 sacks and 59 tackles for loss (averages of 4.3 sacks and 8.4 TFLs per game).
- OU held an opposing rusher to fewer than 100 yards for the sixth straight game, keeping ISU running back Breece Hall to 79 yards on 23 carries (he gained 139 rushing yards in the first meeting on Oct. 3). The last player to gain 100 rushing yards vs. Oklahoma was Texas' Sam Ehlinger, who had 112 yards on Oct. 10 (69 rushing yards through the fourth quarter of the four-overtime contest.
- Oklahoma led 7-0 after the first quarter and has outscored opponents 134-17 in the opening period this season. The Sooners have limited the 10 opponents to 610 total yards on 152 plays (4.0 average) in the opening 15 minutes.
- OU has scored at least 27 points in a school-record 62 consecutive contests. The next longest streak nationally since at least 1980 is 31 by UCF (2017-19). The next longest active streak is 23 games by Alabama (entering today).
- Oklahoma finished with a time of possession of 27:47, just the second game this season in which OU has not held the ball for at least 30:00 of game time (27:12 vs. Kansas). OU has won the time of possession battles in eight of its 10 games this season.

- Set the outright OU freshman record with his eighth receiving touchdown of the season on a 45-yard pass from Spencer Rattler on the first play of the second quarter (broke a tie with CeeDee Lamb [2017] and Mark Andrews [2015]).
- Four of his touchdown receptions this season have gone for at least 45 yards (three others have been for 50, 58 and 61 yards).

GENERAL NOTES

- Oklahoma's Big 12 title marked its sixth straight and 14th in the 25-year history of the league. The Sooners now have 50 conference championships, the most among FBS programs (Nebraska ranks second with 46).
- This year's Oklahoma squad is the fifth in program history to win a conference title with two league losses. The previous four occasions it happened were in 1976 (5-2 in Big Eight; shared with Colorado and Oklahoma State) and 2002, 2007 and 2010 (6-2 in Big 12; won Big 12 Championship games). Before this season, no OU team had ever won a conference title after a 0-2 league start.
- Oklahoma's current streak of six straight outright league championships is the longest among current Power Five programs since Oklahoma won 12 in a row from 1948 to '59 under Bud Wilkinson. Clemson, which plays later today, is also riding a five-game outright streak [ACC]). The Sooners also won or shared nine consecutive conference titles from 1972 to '80.
- OU is now 11-1 in Big 12 Championship games, and has more Big 12 Championship game wins than any other program has appearances. It has played in 12 of the league's 19 title games. Nebraska and Texas rank second with six appearances each.
- Lincoln Riley set the record for most wins in the first four seasons of an OU heading coaching career. He is now 44-8 (.846), one more than the number of wins by Bob Stoops (43-9) in his first four seasons (1999-2002).
- Oklahoma is now 3-1 all-time in games against a team it lost to earlier in the same campaign. It also occurred in 2018 vs. Texas (OU won rematch), 1978 vs. Nebraska (OU won rematch) and 1901 vs. Texas (OU lost rematch).
- Oklahoma improved to 77-7-2 all-time against Iowa State and is 16-2 in the series in the Big 12 era. The Sooners' .907 series winning percentage against ISU is the best by one Power Five program against another (minimum of 50 games played).
- This was the first game this season in which the OU defense recorded three interceptions and the fifth in which it had at least two INTs (also vs. Texas, Texas Tech, Kansas and Baylor). The last time the Sooners registered three interceptions in a game was 2015 vs. TCU.
- This was the second game this season in which two OU quarterbacks scored rushing touchdowns (Spencer Rattler and Chandler Morris did it today and on Nov. 7 vs. Kansas). Before this season, the last time two OU QBs scored a rushing touchdown in the same game was 1990 (Cale Gundy and Steve Collins vs. Oklahoma State), a span of 390 games.
- The Sooners tallied three sacks and five tackles for loss in the game (with six more QB hurries). Over its last seven games, the OU defense has totaled 30 sacks and 59 tackles for loss (averages of 4.3 sacks and 8.4 TFLs per game).
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- Oklahoma led 7-0 after the first quarter and has outscored opponents 134-17 in the opening period this season. The Sooners have limited the 10 opponents to 610 total yards on 152 plays (4.0 average) in the opening 15 minutes.
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- Every Oklahoma freshman class from 1999 to 2019 has won at least two Big 12 championships.

LB NIK BONITTO

• Registered five total tackles (three solo), one sack and a QB hurry. He has been credited with at least a half-sack in each of his last four games (missed the Baylor games) and in six of his last seven contests. The hurry came on OU's last defensive play, which was a game-seasling interception by cornerback Tre Brown.

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Q. Matt, what was the difference in halves, in your estimation?

MATT CAMPBELL: Gosh, I don't even know. I just felt like, man, we were really close most of the game, and I think just -- I think the biggest thing is, in terms of going up against a really good team like that, man, it's hard to win.

I feel like, you know, we just kind of had to settle in a little bit. That's kind of happened against that team now twice. Once we settled in, I thought we found our rhythm pretty well.

Q. Was that nerves, do you think, at the beginning of the game, having not been this far?

MATT CAMPBELL: No, I don't think so. I think, if you go back to the first time we played them, it was very similar. So, I don't think that has much to do with it.

Q. Matt, how big was losing Isheem Young there in the second play of the game?

MATT CAMPBELL: You know, a challenge, but I feel like that's kind of where we live. The obstacles in the way, and you know what, you have to overcome it, and we did. Those guys that came in played outstanding. Quite honestly, I'm really proud of some of those guys. You hate to lose a good player like that, but that is what it is, and you take it and move on from it. Boy, it gave some other guys a great opportunity to get in and really kind of show their growth, so I was really proud of some of those guys.

Q. The confusion on that last play, was there any thought on calling a time-out there before the snap got off?

MATT CAMPBELL: No, I think we felt like we had a good play, and I think there was a little bit of pressure. Brock [Purdy] did a great job of kind of giving us an opportunity to create down the field, but, no, I don't think there was -- it wasn't so much the confusion as it was the clock coming down, but we had everybody set where we needed to have them set.



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Q. Coach, I feel like we've asked this question a few times this year, but what can you say about the fight and resolve of this team? You were obviously down pretty big at the half, but then you come clawing back.

MATT CAMPBELL: Really all I asked our kids in this game is just be who you are. So, I guess the reality is exactly we are who we are, and I think that's what makes this program really special. I think it's what makes this team really special.

You know, you hate it that you're a couple of points short in this game, but, boy, oh, boy, you leave pretty damn proud that the culture, the character, and really the leadership that this program and this team has and the resolve it shows pretty much has showed up each and every day and each and every week from the start of the season till the end of the season.

So I guess mission accomplished. We were who we were.

Q. Just speaking about you are who you are, I mean, I thought about this when I asked the question. Like I said, you've talked about playing all four quarters, but you played all four quarters the entire season, if you know what I mean. You kept fighting the entire season, more than just all four quarters.

MATT CAMPBELL: Well, I think from our deal -- and I've said this a lot in our program -- is this is not a results-oriented football program. I think we're result aware, outcome aware, but I also really believe that the investment of our leadership team from our coaches to our players is process and really culture driven.

And when you live like that, then you don't reside in the highs and the lows of what the scoreboard tell you or what, you know -- and I get it, it's your job to write articles, and what the press tells you or what mom and dad tell you, what you become is you become the best version of yourself you can be.

And I think there's no question, at the end of the day, this football team has become the best version of itself it can be, and that's really hard to do in our



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sport. It's really hard when you've got 18- to 22-year-olds, really hard in a year like this.

But, boy, oh, boy, I don't know if I could be prouder of what these young men have done and what they've accomplished.

Q. Coach, going off that last point, obviously, like you mentioned, they showed the fight there in the second half. Just how tough is it knowing they probably left some plays out there in the first half to not -- so they wouldn't have to claw back in the second half there?

MATT CAMPBELL: I don't know. To me, like I said, I don't know if that's tough for me. It's a football game, and it's four quarters, and you're playing, as we know, in a very talented, outstanding football program.

If you expect perfection, I think you're a fool. If you expect that you're going to play a game that's going to have highs and lows and your ability to weather the storm and continuing to fight, then I think you have some realism as to what this sport is and what football is.

I think, for me, I've got great realism that what I just witnessed was the character and the heart and really the soul of Iowa State football today.

Q. How would you evaluate Brock [Purdy]'s performance today?

MATT CAMPBELL: Man, I still think Brock was really good. It's like I've said since he took over two and a half years ago, like that guy gave us a chance. You know, I know there's times that the ball got turned over, but there's pressure, and he's got this unbelievable escapability.

To be honest with you, we're nowhere close in that football game if Brock Purdy is not our quarterback, and obviously, we're not even sniffing this football game if Brock Purdy is not our quarterback.

Q. Matt, on that last offensive drive, you guys were moving the ball pretty well, but how much did those false starts kind of get you off schedule from what you were doing?



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MATT CAMPBELL: Yeah, obviously, those penalties hurt, and they've got great edge rushers. I think it pulled a couple of those guys offsides. So, again, I do think our detail at times, in this game -- you know, in all phases, it wasn't as good as we needed it to be, but I still felt like, again, we've given ourselves every opportunity to go win the game. But that certainly -- that hurt us there at the end.

Q. Responding after losses has not been a problem for this team, but what do you expect, or what do you hope to see in the couple weeks before whatever Bowl came comes your way?

MATT CAMPBELL: You've got to grow, right? The season's not over. Obviously, the regular season now is, and the championship game is, but I love the character and the humility of this team. I know what the senior leadership and the elite junior leadership that we have in this program, and I expect us to continue to respond and continue to grow.

Again, this group has never disappointed me once, and I would certainly be shocked if they disappointed me now.

Q. Any thought or hope of where you guys might land?

MATT CAMPBELL: No, I'll be honest with you. I don't even know what Bowl games are being played or what the process is. To be honest with you, we'll worry about that sometime tomorrow. Really could care less. Just hope this team gets another opportunity to play football.

Q. Coach, what did you see from Oklahoma's defense that contained Breece Hall and got pressure on Brock Purdy relatively often tonight or today?

MATT CAMPBELL: Yeah, I thought it was -- give those guys credit. They found some unique ways to get an extra hat in the box. We struggled to create great vertical run seams and consistently doing those things. So I thought they did a really good job. They've played outstanding on defense really for the majority of the year, and hat's off to obviously Coach [Alex] Grinch and certainly Oklahoma.



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Q. Matt, talking about the OU defensive line for a minute, they were outstanding, outstanding today, the OU defensive line. How much did it hurt your offensive line when [Jake] Remsburg got hurt very early in the game?

MATT CAMPBELL: From really the first offensive play, Randy, you know. That was tough losing Jake [Remsburg]. I'll have to go back and watch the video and see how Joey played. I think the positive is you've got a guy like Joey who actually started against Oklahoma last time.

So I don't know if it was that big of a deal other than the fact that Jake has played really good football for this team, and we're really, really proud of what he's done and accomplished as a red-shirt freshman.

Q. Coach, you obviously have a lot of guys who -- I mean, I know you have to play a Bowl game, but you have a lot of guys who will be coming back next year. Do you envision coming up short in this game being a thing that will drive them going into the off-season?

MATT CAMPBELL: I don't know. It just depends what kind of team we have. I think it's going to be really interesting to get to the end of the season. Obviously, continue to evaluate our year and then figure out what kind of team is coming back. To me, it was the senior leadership of this year's team that allowed greatness to occur.

It will be fascinating to me to see what the character, what kind of leadership we will get from next year's group. That's, I think, really early to kind of figure that out and truly understand that.

But I do know there's some great young men that are coming in to be seniors next year for this program. Certainly look forward to evaluating next year's team when it's appropriate to do so.

Q. Matt, what can you say about Xavier Hutchinson's performance today? He showed flashes of Hakeem Butler, Allen Lazard, and even his own personality out there today.



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MATT CAMPBELL: I'd almost tell you guys, I told you so. I think I've been tell you about this guy from before the season started. Like I said, I think my favorite thing about X is from the day that I met Xavier and from the day that he showed up on our campus, he has worked as hard or harder than any of the players in our football program.

When you have great talent and you're willing to have an elite work ethic next to that talent, then in the biggest moments, your God-given ability shines, and for X, he shines.

You know, I think, to me, that's exciting. You're proud to be able to coach a guy like that. You know a guy like that brings out the best, not only in himself, but those around him. So I'm really grateful that he's in our program, and he's certainly made lowa State football a lot better.

Q. Matt, lastly, your defense was stellar today, especially missing Isheem Young early, and especially with the three picks. How proud were you of those guys of rallying and really being that key to the second half comeback and forcing OU to punt and obviously holding them to a field goal on that last drive?

MATT CAMPBELL: Man, what those guys did today on defense -- and they've done it all year. It's not just today. But when you've got a great defense, they give you a chance to win football games, and they give you a chance to play really high-end football. Obviously, you look at that senior leadership on that side of the ball, and the Greg Eisworths and the JaQuan Baileys and Eyioma Uwazurike and Jake Hummel and Lawrence White, we're blessed to have so many amazing humans on that side, and not only amazing humans, but great players.

What I love about them is they never flinch. They never flinched today. They haven't flinched all year, and they've given us an incredible opportunity to have great success and do the things that this team and this program has done this year.



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I can't sing their praises high enough because what they've done is they've established excellence within our program.

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Junior WR Xavier Hutchinson

Q. Xavier, what can you say about the fight that your team showed this game?

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: The fight that our team has inside of them is something great to look at, and I know it's great to watch. To be honest with you, just to be a part of it is great. Our team never gives up. One of our mottos is never die easy. And I think you guys kind of saw that today, and I'm glad that the world got to see that today too; that no matter what predicament we're in, we're never going to die easy in a football game because we can always make a comeback. Today we just fell a little bit short.

Q. Where does that mindset come from? Does it come from the coaches? Does it come from the seniors on this team? Where does it come from?

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: I think it's a mix. I really think it comes from Coach Campbell, from really all the coaching staff, and it trickles down to the senior class instilling it in us every single day. I think it's a perfect mix between both coaching and players.

Q. Xavier, how frustrating was it not being able to cash in as much as maybe you guys would have liked to today?

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: I don't think it was upsetting or anything. Just obviously, after you play such a big game and you come a little bit short, it definitely hurts. I think we all feel that around, but I think we all know that, at the end of the day, this is a game, and obviously we want to win, but at the end of the day, life still moves on. So we have to pick ourselves back up for the next day.

Q. Just out of curiosity, the eye black, who is Q?

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: Yes, sir, that's for my brother.

Q. Is there a story behind that, or is that just --

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: He's not able to watch right now, so I put it on me so he at least knows that I'm playing for him every single time I go out on the football field.

Q. Xavier, what's just the feeling for how much you guys have accomplished this season and how far you've come? Then just to come up one score short today.

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: The feeling around our whole season is incredible. What happened today, we are going to go down in history as one of the best lowa State [teams] to ever come through here. So just to hold that, that's a great feeling.



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Then just about today, coming short, it's very disappointing. We put in so much effort like you said. So it really hurts, but as I said before, at the end of the day, we've got to sulk right now, but when it comes time tomorrow, we've got to put our head down and grind again.

Q. Xavier, first of all, congratulations on that comeback and your great game. What -- it looked like there was a little bit of confusion the last two plays. Is that -- am I accurate on that? If so, what was the somewhat confusion, it looked like?

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: I don't really know if there was confusion, to be honest with you. The game kind of flew by me a little bit towards the end. I think we were all revved up, so I can't really recall what happened on those two plays.

Obviously, we must have had a little bit of a slip-up mentally when that came. So I can't really speak on it too much because I don't really -- I truly don't remember what happened.

Q. What kind of message did you send to the people who were in charge of your fate for the next month or whenever the bowl game is? What did you guys say to them today? Or at least in the second half.

XAVIER HUTCHINSON: I think we told them that we're a very good team. Like I said, I do think we deserve whatever Bowl game we get. We deserve to be in a Bowl game. But I hope we just put respect on our name, on this university, to everybody who's an outsider from this program, that we're here to stay and we're always going to play our butt off.

Senior DE JaQuan Bailey

Q. JaQuan, sum up your emotions right now.

JaQUAN BAILEY: Man, like -- just -- I definitely am proud, though. I will say that. I am definitely proud of the way our team just kept fighting.

Q. JaQuan, what was the difference between the first half and the second half?

JaQUAN BAILEY: Just simply just executing, just taking one play at a time and just playing Iowa State offense, defense. I don't know.



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Q. You guys hold them to the field goal there late in the fourth quarter. What's the emotion and the tension like for you guys as a defense to watch on the sideline that last drive just come up a little bit short after moving the ball?

JaQUAN BAILEY: Well, to be honest with you, the whole time, we all thought we were going to win it. Then I guess the ball just didn't bounce our way.

Q. What does it say about you and this defense to hold OU to just five punts in that second half and that last second field goal to at least give your team a chance for another comeback victory?

JaQUAN BAILEY: It wasn't good enough. We still lost. Just it wasn't good enough. It was still some great effort, but it still wasn't good enough.

Junior TE Charlie Kolar

Q. I mean, what's it say about the fight you guys showed tonight to get back in that game in the second half?

CHARLIE KOLAR: Yeah, I'm proud of this team, but we lost. I don't believe in moral victories. I don't believe in good losses. We lost. I wouldn't want to play for any other team or any other coaching staff, but we lost.

Q. Charlie, this might kind of go against the emotions you're feeling right now, but we just got done listening to Xavier [Hutchinson] saying the motto behind this team is never die easy. Kind of what's the message -- what's your feeling on that message? Obviously, it's a tough loss, but kind of based off that last question, what's the fight in this team not willing to die an easy death?

CHARLIE KOLAR: Yeah, he's right. We don't die easy. We fight to the last minute. Today it just wasn't quite enough. We lost.

Q. Charlie, when you guys are in a close game like that, I guess what do you focus on, and what might have been the difference today?

CHARLIE KOLAR: We've got to score more points than them. It doesn't matter how we get there. We've got to do it. It's not just the fourth quarter, it's all four quarters. Little things here and there. Got to be better for Brock [Purdy].

Yeah, I mean, we lost. I haven't watched the film yet, so I can't speak on the details, but defense, offense, special teams, we just -- all of us just didn't do quite enough. So we'll come back. Hopefully, we'll get a Bowl game. I don't know how that works this year, but we'll get better and be ready for that game.



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Q. You guys are moving the ball down the field on that last drive. Did it feel like you had wind in your sails that you're going to be able to put in the end zone?

CHARLIE KOLAR: Yeah, we believed in the last second we were going to win. Obviously, we didn't at the end. We had third and 11, and they made a play on the ball. Yeah, I mean, we're moving the ball. We had time left. We had time-out. Obviously, we had that belief. That's why we kept fighting. It just wasn't enough at the end.

Q. What can you say about Brock [Purdy] today? Some may look at the three interceptions, but what can you say about him?

CHARLIE KOLAR: He's a (expletive) warrior. I mean, you can say what you want about three picks, but he keeps fighting to the last second. I'll go to war with him any day of the week, any day of the year. Just like him, like all of us, we've got to get better. Obviously, he didn't play his best game. None of us did. I don't care. I (expletive) love him. I'll keep playing with him any day.



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LINCOLN RILEY: Man, hard to believe. Just not knowing if this team would even, if we would even get to play. I told the team in the locker room after, you remember two specific moments: One moment when we had to send our whole team home after having only one spring practice, not knowing what was next; and then in that locker room in Ames, Iowa, when you were 0-2 in the conference and I told them, you know, a place like OU, man, there's nowhere to hide. It's not like, well, if we just go off and have a bad season, that people aren't going to pay attention. They always pay attention to OU. I mean, this is such a national powerhouse and there's never anywhere to hide in this program, so you got really one choice you got to step up.

And I think that everybody in our locker room believed that this was possible and, at that point, and what a tremendous run it's been. We have had to win games in different ways. Today was no different. We had to have different players step up and had to make key plays and just, yeah, it's a little surreal, again, just all of these are. I mean, just sit back and think six in a row and that just doesn't get done in college football very often. It's so hard.

And we as coaches that have been here through it, all of our players, our staff, our fans, I mean, everybody that is a part of this football program, that cares about this football program, that roots for this football program better appreciate what this is. I mean, this is awesome, awesome stuff by this team individually and our teams over the last several years. It's just a great, great feeling right now. Feels good to be the champ.

Q. Wanted to ask you about Tre Brown. Not only the interception, but the two kickoff returns for him, just, it seems like every time in this game he comes up with some massive play for y'all to help turn the tide.

LINCOLN RILEY: He did. No, he did. The two kickoff returns were huge. We hadn't had many opportunities there this year and, which is a good thing and, as well as we played defensively. Yeah, he just, I thought we fit some of them up really well and he's got such a burst, we were able to get him loose and we ended up scoring after both of those drives. They were big-time plays and both of them came after lowa State had some momentum, like you said. So those were important plays and great job by him and our whole kickoff return team.

And then obviously we had the pick ten but it was a great individual play, very reminiscent of over in the Cotton Bowl just a couple of months ago. So I'm really proud of that kid, all he's had to overcome and he's obviously been a really, really good player for us and I think really taken another step this year.



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Q. I know all these are special, but given all the things that you just articulated in your opening statement, the suspensions, the, having a game canceled, having another game postponed, all those things, is this the most satisfying of the Big 12 titles for you?

LINCOLN RILEY: Gosh, it's hard to say. Like you said, they're all so different. I mean, I felt tremendous excitement after each one of them, but this one does feel different in that way. It does. It's maybe the most unlikely, I guess you might say, just with all we had to overcome, both across the country, every team, everybody, and then specific to our group, we had to overcome a lot.

It's just hard to find a way to get it done even in one year, so to think that we could continue to do it has been odd. It is. It's a little surreal right now, just the pride in, not just the players, but just the whole program. It took every single person making a sacrifice for this to even be possible and every single person to get out of their comfort zone and do everything that they could. And it took that. It would not have happened without that.

Q. How unique is this game to you in that you just made decisions based on a lot of confidence in your defense and it ended up paying dividends at certain points?

LINCOLN RILEY: Yeah. No, it's just a little bit the flow of the game. I thought we were playing pretty well defensively the majority of the game. I felt like we -- that's a good offense, obviously a good quarterback, and felt like we were on top of things really the whole day and we had some periods where we played good offensively and some periods where we didn't play good offensively.

And no, there were some, some close decisions there, but certainly how well we were playing was a big factor. And we did a nice job on the punt teams being able to pin them down there and play the field position game a little bit. And again, you got to win in different ways and our defense, special teams, certainly gave us an opportunity to make some of those decisions based on how well they played.

Q. I would like you to go back and reference what you said a bit ago about you hoped that the base, the fan base, gets what this team did. I know it wasn't any work of art this season, of course it hasn't been. This season's been hard on everybody and I don't know where you guys are going to end up in terms of your post-season, but just to persevere like you have, even for a base that's used to the success that your program has produced, the need to see it for what it is, just if you would mind reiterating that.

LINCOLN RILEY: Yeah, I just, I would just encourage everybody to think of their own personal hardships that they have had during this pandemic. This pandemic, obviously it wasn't just bad for us, it's been challenging for each and every one of us.



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Everybody's talked about how negative that 2020 has been and just it's almost kind of become a catchphrase now. And I do think though the adversity also provides an unbelievable opportunity to do something special and that's how we have tried to look at it this entire time through anything that came up was how awesome would it be to come back and everybody will remember. Like you said (background noise.) I think everybody will remember who won it this year. It's the most challenging year any of us have ever had.

Q. I wanted to ask you about third downs. 1-of-11, I think was the final tally on third down. I get you were turning the game over to your defense and special teams and stuff like that, but what do you think was going on wrong-wise for being unable to convert third downs?

LINCOLN RILEY: Well, the biggest problem was most of them were long yardage, so we didn't put ourselves in very many great situations there. A combination of things. We had a couple of times where we had some stuff open and didn't protect good. Had a couple of competitive plays that we thought we had real opportunities to make that we didn't make. Couple of times I had bad calls. I mean, I don't know. I'll answer that one tomorrow. I'm going to enjoy being the champ today.

Q. Last year you guys had to have a stop from the defense on a big fourth-down play against Baylor. This year, as well, the defense had to step up to make another big stop. At what point during the season last year and through this year did you start to feel like you could see the culture of the defense kind of gaining that confidence to where they feel like they can go out there and make those type of big plays in those big moments?

LINCOLN RILEY: Yeah, I mean, I think you just continue to evaluate that each year, and not necessarily just with games, but just in the games within the game and the matchups and just the flow of the game. That's where I've always gotten into people, this and that about analytics, and yeah, analytics are great, but they can't measure all those things all the time and you got to know your team.

So, and I'll say this, though, our team, we have been in now I guess four of these here, our team's had a history of playing pretty darn well defensively in all four of those. We certainly did it again tonight or today. But to win championship football games you got to play pretty good defense and we have been able do it in the past ones and certainly did it again today.



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Q. Offense is so fascinating. You're struggling to get drives going in the second half, but then when you need one at the end of the game you get one. I mean, can you take us through what was going through your mind in the second half?

LINCOLN RILEY: Yeah, I mean, it was kind of battling some frustration on my part because we felt like we were close to so many good things in the second half and just -- and they're a good defense, obviously. We know that. They're a very good defense. And you're going to get some. We made some big plays, but again, we had some opportunities that we were just a tick off and in the second half and when you're a tick off against a good group it's going to make things hard and then you continue to put yourself in long-yardage situations, it's not there. But it's always difficult. I don't care who you're playing. But I think there were still continued belief. We knew we were going to have to go score again to win the game. There was still continued belief and obviously got the boost from the kickoff return and had a really nice drive there. Obviously, I think had a really good chance to catch that last ball and finish it off right there.

But, no, we hung in there. We battled. We got to get better there. There's no question about it. I would have felt like that if we had scored 62. I mean, it's just you always feel like you can get better and, but found a way to do enough to get it done.

Q. It was a little bit of a rough start for the Big 12. Some losses to Sun Belt teams. You got off to the 0-2 conference start. But at the end of the day, America seemed to love Iowa State. They showed up well today. You beat them. Do you think this was a good sort of a good presentation for the Big 12 as a whole?

LINCOLN RILEY: Oh, absolutely. And then I think people need to make sure and educate themselves on why a lot of those things happened early in the season. I mean, you take this team that we played, you take Kansas State, you take us early, we were sitting there playing with depleted rosters when a lot of people either weren't playing or were postponing/canceling games. And honestly, those three teams you mention all right there would have been well within their rights to postpone or cancel some of those early games, and we didn't do it because we were trying to get a season in. So that's part of it. Those are good football teams, but there's no way lowa State loses that first game if they have got the personnel and there's no way that Kansas State loses that first game if they have the personnel, in my opinion. I don't want to say no way. I don't want to have disrespect to Arkansas State and Louisiana. I don't want to say no way, but a lot less likely.

So we were in a hole ourselves obviously early in the season with personnel as well. So, no, that was a good football team, man, that team right there that we played. Quarterback, third year going at it.



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Really, I mean, those are NFL-level tight ends, receivers. Obviously the back's good, the defense really super experienced. I mean, that's probably, that's definitely one of the best teams that we have played in a championship game in all the years. They're easily, easily right up there at the top of the best and most complete teams that we have played.

So, no, I thought for the Big 12 to get the games in that we did, have a great championship game, it was a heck of a finish.

Q. I'm just curious, you guys got to 11 turnovers in the last three games -- or last five games, sorry, which is at your two takeaway average. What, the takeaways equal victories mindset that you guys have had. I know it's really kind of simple, but it seems like it's paid off for you down the stretch? LINCOLN RILEY: Well, it has. I would just say we capitalized on the opportunities and we created more opportunities. And a lot of credit goes to the front and how disruptive that we have been there. We did another good job today with on [Breece] Hall, only 83 yards, 3.4 carry for him was huge. We especially did a good job on him in the second half. Made them a little bit more one dimensional, which we have been able to do with some teams.

And then when you can get pressure like we can, you're going to have opportunities. And then our secondaries, our linebackers, we've made some great plays on the ball this year. Just we've created more opportunities and we have taken advantage of them and it's been obviously a difference-maker for our team.

Q. You're 10 games in now. If you were to make a report card for Spencer Rattler through 10 games, how would you grade it and how do you think he did today?

LINCOLN RILEY: I thought he probably played his best game of the year today. I thought he was poised. I thought he did a great job in the scramble situations, threw some elite throws. I thought he made good decisions with the ball, really. I mean, he was in the right place a lot. I mean he, his eyes were where he was supposed to be. He went where he was supposed to go. Really, a big, big portion of the day.

And Iowa State, as we knew they probably would, showed us some different looks and I thought he handled it well. These are big moments. I mean, you go win a four overtimer in the Red River game, you come here and play like he did and win the Big 12 championship here, I mean, these are big moments for a young guy and he's certainly not afraid of them. He's going to, he's got so much room to grow and he's going to get, have a chance to really get better if he'll keep his head down and keep working. But for a redshirt freshman, this is a pretty darn good start.



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Q. The whole league played a lot better defense this year. I wonder if that's a one-year aberration or is that a growing trend? And especially with y'all, y'all seemed to be getting more balanced every year.

LINCOLN RILEY: Yeah, it doesn't surprise me, just with some of the quality of coaches that have come into this league. I think we've got some really good defensive coordinators, some really difficult schemes. I think the quality of defensive linemen in this league has, in my opinion, gone up.

I feel like early in the league there were times where there were a couple really good defensive linemen here and there but not everybody had them. Whereas now, I can't really remember many teams this year where we didn't go in having a really solid if not a whole lot of respect, a solid amount or even more of respect for the opposition's defensive line. So, and this was one of those groups here today.

So I think that's been a big part of it. And no, you're right, it's really, to me, two years in a row that defenses have really, really been strong. You got several of the top defenses in the country in this league right now.

Q. I want to ask you about it because all the fans were talking about it, your players were talking about it. What were your thoughts when you first saw the All-Big 12 team? Was there some disappointment? Was there anger? Did you think maybe there was some gamesmanship involved there?

LINCOLN RILEY: I'm glad they did it. Whoever did it, I need to send them a little gift basket.

Q. Well, it's all the other coaches, right?

LINCOLN RILEY: It was. I appreciate all those guys. No, it was, no, yeah, we were -- it's not why we do it, but we were pissed. Disappointed for our players because we had some guys that no doubt should have been on that. If you looked at an All-Big 12 team it's amazing we won the game.

So that's a -- I know it was a weird year and some guys didn't play some games and this and that, but yeah, you got the best defense in the league here that doesn't have one guy on the first team, that, that, we missed the boat there.

But at the end of the day, you give us a choice between All-Big 12 teams and this trophy, I know what each and every one of us will choose. And I know the kind of players we have in there and there's a lot of first-team, all-league and even more players in that locker room right now.



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Q. Need to ask about Chandler Morris and the touchdown. It looked like a trick play or at least a change of pace. What was that like preparing that play and then getting it executed like that? LINCOLN RILEY: Yeah, just one of those that worked and it was a big moment. You never know if one like that you're even, you never know how the game will go, if you'll even have an opportunity, and then here we go, all of a sudden right there on the first drive we, you know, we get it in a good spot to run it - no, I had a lot of confidence in him. I had confidence in him and in Seth. I mean, here you are in the Big 12 Championship game at AT&T Stadium, first drive and you pop a true freshman quarterback and a true freshman tailback in there and they go in and execute it well. So I'm just trying to take advantage of every skill set on our roster and those guys were ready for the moment.

Q. Trejan Bridges played in the game. Did you get the same kind of emotional boost that you got when Rhamondre and Perkins were allowed to play? Did you get that with Trejan last night or the day before?

LINCOLN RILEY: Yeah. No, they, the guys were thrilled. We found out actually about halfway through our practice yesterday morning, so we didn't -- we weren't able to do a whole lot with him. I guess, I don't know, I guess something magically changed at the NCAA where now all of a sudden he was going to be eligible, so I, who, I had -- I had no rhyme or reason. I was thrilled he was able to play. It was great for us, but man, I was just so excited for that kid, man, just to be able to go out there and play and get all this behind him. And, yeah, it was good to have him in there. He's going to have a chance to be a big part of our offense certainly going forward, but that was, the kid's, the team loves Trejan, we all do, and yeah, great to have him back, just again I know we talked about it, now the great thing is we don't have to talk about it any more. But what those kids have been through it was hard and especially for him. So meant a lot to have him back.



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Q. What was your message to your guys, as the offense was having a little trouble, you guys were on the field a lot. Were they getting tired and what were you saying to them?

ALEX GRINCH: Well, a number of different things. One of the things is, I mentioned to them a couple times was, we got to be excited to go take the field again. Winter workouts are coming. We're going to snap our fingers and it's going to be winter workouts. And we sure wish we could have pads on and play in Cowboy Stadium for the Big 12 Championship.

And so every time we take that field, every opportunity we do, that we had there in the second half to finish off the season, have a respect for that and have an excitement level attached to it.

Also talked to the guys -- and so much of this stuff is pre-loaded -- is don't be fans. We got our own jerseys on. And so not get lost in the, allow yourself to get lost in the ebbs and flow of the game, but think about focusing on your task, because your task is coming.

And ultimately, have an understanding that no matter what happens, we're going to have to make plays to win the football game, and so in any event, amongst other things, but certainly that is some of it.

Q. Lincoln just got a question about the All-Big 12 team and he, frankly, he said, yeah, it motivated us. We were pissed, he said. Zero guys on the first-team defense. Tell us about that and how you guys took motivation from that for this game.

ALEX GRINCH: Yeah, I mean, I think the biggest thing is, and obviously, you love your guys and every coach is that way, but you just want guys to reap the benefits of quality performance because you know they're going to get critiqued for negative performances, and rightfully so. We're in a results business. It's the same thing from a coaching standpoint. So when guys produce at a certain level, and maybe they're the conference leader in sacks, for instance, you know, the conference leader in rushing was a first-team all guy.

So it's, you know, this isn't just we love our guys so much or we think because we're Oklahoma we should have a bunch of guys on the first-team defense, but, and I don't know how we'll end up, but one of the better defenses in the Conference, one of the better defenses in the country, and we don't have any of the better players in our own Conference. So you bet you're, yeah, we're used it. We're used it, and rightfully so. Rightfully so.

So in any event, and then that's no disrespect to anybody else, but it certainly, in some cases, we felt like guys earned it.

Q. You guys averaged 11 turnovers -- or not averaged. You guys had 11 turnovers in the last five games, getting to your two turnovers per game average, but kind of tongue-in-cheek here, but takeaways equal victory? You've been preaching it for two years now and it seemed to really down this stretch worked out for you.



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ALEX GRINCH: Right and only because they do. And I didn't invent it and sometimes if you say things enough it turns into something that's cute or that turns into something that kind of, to your point, is just kind of this clutter or noise, especially when you're not doing it. Right? I mean, and we talked about it before, you kind of feel like a con man a little bit when that's the case.

But no, they do and it's something that we talked about. We have a takeaway board and, well, right now because of distancing in our weight room, which is kind of our defensive meeting room for the time being, but it was very, very blunt to the guys is that that board doesn't change after this weekend, okay? Don't expect to call yourself Big 12 Champions.

And then it's similar to the offense. Well, we're not going to score any touchdowns. We're going to do some good things, but we're not going to score any points. Well, you would never think in a million years you'd have an opportunity to win the game. Well, it's the same thing on our side. Coach, there's got to be another way. There's not. Listen to me now. There's not. We have, we have proven that on our side before and obviously it's across college football and NFL football.

So no, just thrilled that, that that message is hitting home and guys are reaping the benefits of it.

Q. You guys winning to the level you do, it becomes maybe a the natural thing for those who follow the program to take success for granted. Not to use the word spoiled, but you know what I mean.

ALEX GRINCH: Sure.

Q. Given everything that your kids have been through this year and even today in this game, do you stop and say, Make sure you don't take this one for granted because of what's going on, what's gone on here?

ALEX GRINCH: Right. And I think it's a great point and I think about of all the years in athletics, this was the greatest, the COVID and the quarantine and really from March on, and we had this conversation with our players and that it's one of the greatest equalizers that you'll ever have in sports because everything at that moment is equal.

No one can work out, from, in terms of the team. No one can have spring football. No one can have -- and so really what it amounted to was each individual guy, were they going to bet on themselves? And were they going to go get a workout in every single day and do it the right way, at the standard, and as you mentioned, at a very, very high standard being that you're a football player at Oklahoma. And you say, well, they had nothing else to do. It's easy for them to get a workout, but it's just as easy for them not to do it.

So there was a large stretch of time over this calendar year that will never happen again, I pray, that these college football players, again, had to bet on themselves. And we put it very bluntly to them is, if you don't bet on yourselves, don't come back to campus and think we're going to bet on you as we go into this thing.



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So I think with that, I just give these guys a lot of credit. Talked to them last night just about how proud we are of them. We constantly remind them about that text message during spring break saying that you cannot return to campus, and at that moment everything was in kind of the unknown and so much has happened over the course of this year. Some guys in quarantine for 28 days, this and that.

And so, no, it's just, guys battled to the end and like I said, you want them to reap the benefits and they certainly did.

Q. Tre Brown, once again, comes up with a big play in this game. I know you haven't been here for all of them. But what is it about Tre that allows him to make those big plays and take advantage when he has the chance to late in these games do that?

ALEX GRINCH: Sure. And I don't know there's a specific quality in that way, but certainly, the one thing that you always come back to is, if one team knows they have to make a play to win the game and the other team says, Well hopefully they just don't make it. As opposed to, someone on that field, on either side, regardless of the scoreboard whether you're winning or on the other end of it, has to make a play to ultimately win a football game, I think that just speaks to it.

Someone's going to have to -- and you watch the same thing I did -- I was probably a little bit more emotional about it than maybe you were -- but someone was going to have to make a play to win that game. When all was said and done, somebody was going to be on the right side of it and so someone was going to be on the wrong side of it.

And so in any event, defensively, obviously critical and to see Tre [Brown] do that as a senior, obviously thrilled for him and thrilled for us.

O. And then specifically could you just talk about that interception, the play that he made there?

ALEX GRINCH: Yeah, just at that tail end you're sitting there -- and obviously a couple penalties on the drive, specifically the 15-yard penalty -- and all of a sudden you got clock is one thing to bear in mind, obviously field is the other one, and you have to weigh, from an aggressiveness standpoint -- the last thing you want to do is allow these guys to bleed you all the way down the field. You want to put your guys in the best situation possible so they can make a play. If you get too passive with calls and some of those things -- so you got to weigh that.

So just, on that particular one, brought a little bit of pressure, still had the opportunity to spy the quarterback, and then the guys up front created it in so many ways. To flesh him out of the pocket, which he is as good as anybody, just a real knack -- Purdy that is -- to find the escape lanes and find guys down field. And so probably made him, obviously, throw it before he wanted to and in a way that he wouldn't want to otherwise. And when that -- that ball was in the air for an awfully long time and so it was really good that, obviously, one of us came down with it.

Q. Along with Tre Brown, you came in here and inherited Tre Norwood as well, two young guys that had a lot of snaps. As your defense has built to being able to put up this performance, how



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satisfying is it that those two guys really have stepped up here down the stretch and kind of been the big playmakers of your defense -- just the rebuild and building this all back up -- to have those two guys kind of be the core of it?

ALEX GRINCH: Well, no, I think it's huge and I think -- obviously if you want to play defense at a high level you have to have production at every level of your defense. You may lean on a certain position group -- this year for us certainly our front from a production standpoint has played at a pretty high level - but that doesn't give your linebackers a free pass not to have their level of production. And then likewise on the back end.

So probably the biggest thing, my biggest disappointment was yards after catch today, I thought that was something that we made an emphasis on and so that was a frustration. But, no, to see guys at that level make some plays -- two years ago, you talk about 129 -- and we talked about it a lot -- 129 out of 129 in terms of pass defense. To see those guys make some plays and have an impact in a positive way is obviously really good.

Q. You played probably 26, 27 guys in the game. You were on the field it seemed like the whole second half. How much did that help you when you had to take the field again, with 3:12 to go in the game, to send the defense out there to win the game?

ALEX GRINCH: Yeah, that's really interesting and I wouldn't have known that number, but I probably could have gotten close to that number in terms of the guys that have played. That has been something that really, going back to the first time against Iowa State, coming off of that game we said that we need to throw numbers at our defense in terms of playing more guys.

So that's something we have done, we have continued to do over the course of the year. I like to think that that certainly had an impact at the end. I think about the last drive, the last couple drives against Texas, the fatigue and that was -- so in those moments -- and I, like I said, someone's got to make a play and so if you don't have a pass rush, it ain't going to be real good. And same thing on the back end, if guys are exhausted, because a lot of times those plays are extended in those situations because the quarterback's not just going to throw it out of bounds and say, next play, the clock's ticking.

So, no, I think it speaks to -- and I'm just so proud of all those guys that, regardless of starting roles or anything along those lines, just a lot of guys had an impact. And that's when it's most fun and that locker room, there's not 11 guys celebrating, so that's, that's pretty cool.

Q. You guys last year had to make a stop in the game against Baylor. This year you guys were set up against again to make a stop or had to make a stop. At what point during your time as becoming the defensive coordinator at Oklahoma to now did you start to see the growth and the confidence to where the guys on the defensive side of the ball, I guess, had the confidence to go out there and make those type of plays, because previously there was times where those type of plays weren't being made.



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ALEX GRINCH: Sure. I mean, I think it's tough. I think -- certainly, I go back to the Big 12 game last year, you kind of felt like in that moment -- there was some injuries, obviously Baylor quarterback-wise, I mean, and we were playing at a high level and kind of let them back in the game. And that particular one maybe, maybe didn't speak enough to maybe progress. The fact that we couldn't finish the fourth quarter in the necessary way, but obviously made some plays in overtime, which you don't apologize for it, so you get a chance to call yourself a champion.

But, no, I think it's just, it's progressive over time. I mean obviously people don't see it, but you see it over the course of a game week or in this case fall camp, because we didn't have spring football, but you just see an expectation, as much as anything. You see it on the sideline, between series maybe a little bit more. And like we always talk about, I mean, you're one game away from not doing those things and it's very, very difficult, when emotions run high, to maintain focus along the way.

But I think, again, to circle a particular game, I think obviously just after getting the Texas win and this year I just reminded the guys that -- and I think we talked about it on these calls -- is not -- playing pretty good football, just not getting the outcomes we want because we won't finish.

And so guys really taking an ownership role and saying that it's not okay to not be a four-quarter football team and specifically a four-quarter defense. And somewhere as the year went on I think expectations have gone up and I think it continued to. Did we play our best game tonight? I don't know that we did, but we made the necessary plays which is exciting.

Q. I wonder, as high powered as Oklahoma's offenses are and have been, do your players talk about being the equivalent of that on the defensive side; and a follow-up, on your personal All-Big 12 team, how many Sooner defensive players would be on that?

ALEX GRINCH: Oh, I'll answer that one. 11. No. I'm joking.

Q. I thought you might say that.

ALEX GRINCH: And again, I mean, I would highlight Isaiah Thomas. I mean, you can't convince me that he's undeserving of being first-team all-conference. Go lead the league in passing and you wouldn't, and you're telling me you wouldn't be first-team all-conference? Leading the league in receiving?

So, no, by no means do I suggest that this is some conspiracy or anything along those lines, so.

But, no, and no I think part of it is -- one of the things that we have had to do, it's team football, it's playing complementary football, but understanding defensively you have to have some level of being an independent contractor. You have to. If you get caught up in the ebbs and flows of a football game, including not just when you're on the field, but also when you're off or to somehow suggest that if the scoreboard reads 17-7 that your performance is less important or it's the role of the offense to make up for the deficiencies that you have as a defense. Again, that's irresponsible.



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So that's been, as much as anything, are guys having an understanding that, as an individual, you chew on film, we talked about this several times, they don't time stamp the score when you miss a tackle. That's you. There's no excuse for it. The same thing, they don't put the score next to or the time left in the fourth quarter so somehow it doesn't matter anymore.

So I just think that as much as anything guys having a real appreciation and ownership in their own performance and believe me, we cheer like all get out for the offense and we're they're number one fans, but we have to make sure that doesn't affect our performance. So that's a battle for everybody, but specifically when you're talking about elite football, as you mentioned, on the offensive side of the ball.



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Redshirt Freshman QB Spencer Rattler

On winning the sixth title:

"It feels amazing. Words can't really describe it right now. Where we started and where we are now is just night and day. Who would've known we'd be here winning this sixth title in a row. I'm happy to be here."

On the adversity faced this season:

"It's just a great feeling. Just knowing you had to fight your butt's off to get to this point and that's what we did. We had the most adversity out of any Oklahoma team ever and we ended up on top still. We didn't even know if we were going to play a game. Now we're holding trophies winning big. We're happy about that."

On his maturity over the season:

"I think my growth has been something I've worked on, but I think it just comes with time. Just night and day, I feel like I'm on a new level now. I just have to keep going up"

Senior CB Tre Brown

On his final pick:

"It was crazy. I was saying all game that I felt like I needed to make a big play. I thought to myself the game is not over and I haven't had a play yet. I'm just sitting there helpless. During that whole series I was just praying that if I got put in a position to make that play. Then I made that play. It was surreal."

On what he saw in his final pick:

"I was just seeing the ball. I saw the guy coming to score and he threw it. I jumped and I saw the guy swipe but it was just to throw me off. Then I caught the ball."

On his mom:

"I thought about her a lot. I think about her a lot, everyday, all the time. I pray to her before the game on the 52-yard line. That's when she passed away."

On getting back onto the field:

"I'm just thankful to be healthy. To come back and play this game that I love with my brothers, with this team. Through all the Covid stuff that we went through this whole year, not knowing if we were going to have a season. I'm honestly just grateful for the opportunity and blessed to play a game that I love with a team that I love."

On winning the sixth Big 12 Championship:

"The team overall just showed fight from the first match to the last. That's what we like to see and we came out on top. It's exciting to have six in a row and you can't top that. It's an ecstatic feeling. I'm just happy to be a part of it."



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Senior RB Rhamondre Stevenson

On winning the Championship:

"It means a lot, especially how this year went with Covid, and then my suspension, and then my teammate's suspensions. It's just been like a rough year all around. So to get the sixth win, it means everything. We don't take it for granted at all."

On Spencer Rattler:

"He came in the game with a chip on his shoulder, as we all did. But he just came ready to play and ready to put it all on the line and do nothing less than win this game for us."

"Since the beginning of the season, he's matured a lot. He's getting better and better. I can't wait to see what he does in the future. Next year is going to be scary."

Junior DE Ronnie Perkins

"Every week we gotta go out like we got something to prove...We wanted to go out there and show we're probably the best D line in the conference."

"Back in Ames I had to sit on the sideline and watch my team lose when I knew I could've been a big factor in that game and help us win. Coming out today...I really just wanted to play my best game, get after the quarterback...help my team come out victorious."

On Tre Brown:

"He's always prepared for the moment no matter when it is. He's always the guy we can lean on to make a big play when we need one... Today he helped us big time... Those type of plays are what we expect out of Tre. He's a four year starter so we don't expect nothing else from him."

"We faced way more adversity than any other OU team. The year started off...in February we practically got kicked off campus, we couldn't practice, couldn't work out. We really didn't see each other again until July. Usually during that time we have about 150 workouts... Not being able to develop ourselves with a real off season like we usually would, it just kind of felt off..."

"It was a tough year...from what I had to deal with to Covid, losing guys the day before the game, not knowing if your team is going to play that Saturday...it was a long stressful year... But we can tell the story that we lived through it, we played through it."
