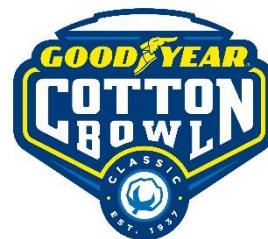

Oklahoma had 19 big plays in the game (12 rushes of 10+ yards and 7 passes of 15+ yards), 11 of which went for 20 yards or longer. Florida had 13 big plays (4 rushes of 10+ and 9 passes of 15+), 6 of which went for 20 yards or longer.

Oklahoma set a Cotton Bowl Classic record with 684 total yards. The 684 yards is also the eighth-highest total in any bowl game. The 1,205 combined total yards (684 by Oklahoma and 521 by Florida) is the eighth-most ever in a bowl game for two teams.

Oklahoma ran for 435 yards, setting a Cotton Bowl Classic record. The Sooners 10.9 yards per carry (40 rushes for 435) is a new Cotton Bowl record and is the third-highest average ever in a bowl game.

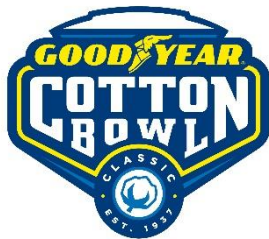
Oklahoma tied a Cotton Bowl Classic record with 55 points. (USC 55, Texas Tech 14 in 1994). The 55 points scored by Oklahoma were the most by the Sooners in their 54-game bowl history.

Oklahoma's victory means that 12 different programs have won the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in the 12 games played at AT&T Stadium.

Oklahoma moves to 2-1 in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic all-time, while Florida is 0-1 in the Classic.

The SEC leads the Big 12 in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, 10-7. Tonight's win by Oklahoma snapped a six-game winning streak by the SEC.

Since the Cotton Bowl Classic moved to AT&T Stadium in 2009, SEC teams are now 6-1 in the game, while Big 12 teams are 1-6. Oklahoma is 1-1 in the stadium.

POSTGAME NOTES – 2

Oklahoma is now 6-2 all-time at AT&T Stadium, including five wins in a row. This was Florida's second appearance in the stadium for football and the Gators are 0-2 (lost to Michigan in the 2017 season-opening AdvoCare Classic).

Oklahoma becomes the first Power 5 school to win its conference championship game and its bowl game in the same stadium in the conference championship game era (since 1992). The Sooners defeated Iowa State 27-21 in the Big 12 Championship Game on Dec. 19 at AT&T Stadium.

Since 1999, 18 of the last 19 teams to lead at halftime have gone on to win the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic (2015 Baylor the lone exception).

The Oklahoma victory was its 30th bowl win, tying the Sooners with Penn State for fifth place among all FBS schools.

Florida had a total of two turnovers in the 1st quarter this season in 11 games. The Gators threw three interceptions in the first quarter tonight. The last time any team had 3 interceptions in the first quarter of a bowl game was Utah in the 2015 Las Vegas Bowl vs BYU.

- Trask finishes his fifth collegiate season with 7,386 career passing yards, which ranks eighth on Florida's career records list.
- With his third completion of the game, a 13-yarder to Keon Zipperer on Florida's second drive, Trask broke Rex Grossman's single-season school record for completions (287 in 2002).
- Trask finished the game with 158 passing yards, snapping his school-record streak of 200-yard passing games at 19.
- The Gators finished the season with an average of 378.6 passing yards per game, which ranks fourth in SEC history and second in school history behind the 2001 Gators (405.2).
- Anthony Richardson's** first career touchdown pass – a 27-yarder to **Jordan Pouncey** for his first collegiate touchdown reception – was Florida's 46th of the season, adding to the second-highest season total in school history.

- Florida finishes the season with a 67.9 completion percentage, tying the 2019 Gators for the third-highest percentage in school history.
- The Gators finished 2020 with 509.8 yards per game, the third-highest average in school history. Only the 1995 Gators (534.4 per game) and 2001 Gators (527.5) had higher averages.
- Florida's season average of 7.28 yards per play this season ranks third in school history, only behind the 1995 Gators (7.40 yards per play) and the 2001 Gators (7.36).
- Florida posted its 14th game of 500-plus total yards in **Dan Mullen's** 38 games as head coach, equaling its combined total from the 115 games comprising the 2009-17 seasons.

GENERAL NOTES

- Oklahoma set bowl game program records with 55 points and 684 total yards. Previous records were 48 points (reached four times – in the 1958 Orange Bowl vs. Duke, 1991 Gator Bowl vs. Virginia, 2011 Fiesta Bowl vs. UConn and 2018 Rose Bowl vs. Georgia) and 618 total yards (set in the 1991 Gator Bowl).
- The 35-point margin of victory matched a bowl game program record. OU defeated LSU 35-0 in the 1950 Sugar Bowl (1949 season).
- OU's 435 rushing yards were its second-most in a bowl game. The bowl game program record is 439 rushing yards in the 1972 Sugar Bowl vs. Auburn (1971 season).
- The Sooners set a Cotton Bowl record by averaging 10.9 yards per rush (435 yards on 40 carries).
- The Sooners improved to 30-23-1 (.565) in bowl games. Their 30 bowl wins are tied for the fifth most nationally.
- OU improved to 110-49-8 (.683) all-time against programs currently in the SEC.
- Oklahoma is 59-35-2 (.625) in AP top-10 matchups, and 20-10 (.667) since the start of the 2000 season. It is 39-20 (.661) as the higher ranked team in such games.
- The Sooners held their last five opponents (Kansas [9], Oklahoma State [13], Baylor [14], Iowa State [21] and Florida [21]) to a combined 78 points.
- OU gained 409 yards in the second half, including 307 rushing yards. The Sooners had 275 total yards and 128 rushing yards in the first half.
- OU's 435 rushing yards tonight were its most since rushing for 510 yards vs. Kansas in 2014 (also had 510 rushing yards against Iowa State that season).
- Oklahoma's 10.5 yards per play was its highest average this season, and highest since the second game of the 2019 season (averaged 10.6 yards per play vs. South Dakota on Sept. 7). The Sooners had only averaged more than 8.0 yards per play twice this season (8.6 vs. Missouri State and 8.1 vs. Kansas).
- The Sooners produced their first 100-yard rushing duo (186 yards by Rhamondre Stevenson and 110 yards by Marcus Major) since last season when Jalen Hurts rushed for 173 yards and Kennedy Brooks ran for 149 yards against TCU (Nov. 23).

- Oklahoma's two longest rushing plays of the season (a 73-yard run by McGowan and a 50-yard run by Stevenson) came on back-to-back drives. Entering tonight, OU's longest rush was 30 yards (Stevenson vs. Oklahoma State on Nov. 21).
- This is the second straight game in which the OU defense recorded three interceptions (also had three in the Big 12 Championship vs. Iowa State). It is also the sixth time this year that OU recorded at least two INTs (also vs. Texas, Texas Tech, Kansas and Baylor). Prior to this season, the last time OU registered three INTs in a game in 2015 vs. TCU.
- From the second quarter of the Baylor game (Dec. 5) through the first quarter tonight, the OU defense registered eight interceptions in eight quarters. The Sooners totaled seven interceptions in each of the 2018 and 2019 seasons.
- In 79 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 54 times (next most is 44), including in 44 of the last 62 outings and topped the 600-yard mark on 26 occasions. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 69 of 79 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 50 times and at least 50 points 29 times.
- Oklahoma led 17-3 after the first quarter and has outscored opponents 151-20 in the opening period this season. The Sooners have limited the 11 opponents to 781 total yards on 177 plays (4.4 average) in the opening 15 minutes.
- During its eight-game winning streak to end the season, OU outscored opponents 58-14 in the third quarter and allowed just 435 total yards (average of 54.4) in the period. Texas (-9), TCU (-2), Texas Tech (8), Kansas (44), Oklahoma State (17), Baylor (-2), Iowa State (34) and Florida (74) combined for 164 rushing yards on 61 carries (2.7 yards per rush) in the third quarter. UF's 97 total yards in the third period were the most during that stretch.
- OU has scored at least 27 points in a school-record 63 consecutive contests. The next longest streak nationally since at least 1980 is 31 by UCF (2017-19). The next longest active streak is 23 games by Alabama.
- Oklahoma's 97-yard scoring drive in the fourth quarter that resulted in a 20-yard TD reception by Charleston Rambo tied a Cotton Bowl record for the longest scoring drive (tied with five other occurrences). It also tied for the second-longest scoring drive in OU bowl history, tying a 97-yard drive in the 1965 Gator Bowl vs. Florida State (1964 season). The longest OU drive in a bowl game is 99 yards, set in the 1980 Orange Bowl vs. Florida State (1979 season).
- OU held an opposing rusher to fewer than 100 yards for the seventh straight game, keeping Florida's two leading rushers in the game to 60 yards each.

- Registered his first career interception in the second quarter, picking off a pass by Florida QB Kyle Trask at the OU 16-yard line.
- Finished with six tackles (all solo), the interception and a pass breakup.

- Registered three total tackles (all solo), one sack and a QB hurry. He has been credited with at least a half-sack in each of his last five games (missed the Baylor games) and in seven of his last eight contests.

RB SETH McGOWAN

- His 73-yard rush in the third quarter was OU's longest rushing play of the season. It was also the program's third-longest rush in a bowl game and the longest non-scoring run in a bowl. Leon Heath had an 86-yard touchdown run in the 1950 Sugar Bowl vs. LSU (1949 season) and Spencer Tillman had a 77-yard TD run in the 1987 Orange Bowl vs. Arkansas (1986 season).
- He added 70 yards on three receptions (23.3 average) and was OU's leading receiver in the game.

WR MARVIN MIMS

- Notched his ninth touchdown reception of the season on a 27-yard strike on Oklahoma's opening possession.
- His nine TD receptions are tied for the most by a true freshman in Big 12 history (Jeff Fuller of Texas A&M had nine in 2008), and tied for second-most by any freshman in Big 12 annals (Texas Tech's Michael Crabtree holds the record with 22 as a redshirt freshman in 2007; Iowa State's Todd Blythe also had nine as a redshirt freshman in 2004 and Missouri's Jeremy Maclin had nine as a redshirt freshman in 2007).

- Named Defensive Most Outstanding Player of the 2020 Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic.
- Recorded his team-leading fifth interception of the season (all in the last six games) and returned it 45 yards for a touchdown to give the Sooners a 14-0 lead. It was OU's first INT returned for a TD since Brendan Radley-Hiles had a pick-six last season against South Dakota (Sept. 7).
- His five interceptions are the most in a season by an OU player since Zack Sanchez had seven in 2015.

WR CHARLESTON RAMBO

- Scored his third receiving touchdown of the season and the ninth of his career on a 20-yard play in the fourth quarter. It was his first receiving TD since the season opener.
- Finished with 45 yards on two receptions, and average of 22.5 yards per catch.

- He also rushed seven times for 40 yards, including and a 1-yard score in the second quarter.
- His six rushing TDs are the most by an OU freshman QB since Blake Bell had 13 in 2011.

RB RHAMONDRE STEVENSON

- Named Offensive Most Outstanding Player of the 2020 Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic.
- Rushed for a career-high 186 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries, averaging 10.3 yards per rush. His 15-yard score in the third quarter was his team-leading seventh rushing touchdown of the season. His 186 rushing yards were the third-most in program bowl history.
- His 186 rushing yards were the most by a Sooners since Trey Sermon recorded 206 yards against Texas Tech in 2018.
- His 50-yard run in the third quarter was OU's second-longest of the season and the third-longest of his career (had a 75-yard run vs. South Dakota and a 61-yard run

CB WOODI WASHINGTON

COACH MULLEN: Yeah, tough game for us. Appreciate we had a lot of young guys. A lot of opportunities for guys to go out there and play in the course of the game. Give Oklahoma credit, did a great job, made a bunch of explosive plays, ran the ball well, made some plays in the pass game, played disciplined football. They really weren't penalized; we had a lot more penalties than they did as well. We turned the ball over a couple too many times, which you can't do playing good teams. But a lot of guys got some really good experience for us out there tonight.

Q. What's a fair takeaway for people from this game, I mean, for your team, Kyle Trask, the future of the program after a performance like this?

COACH MULLEN: Yeah, I think the future's really bright. You look, we had a guys get an opportunity to get experience on the field tonight, go play. We were down a -- Kyle Trask, you know, I couldn't be prouder of him and the season that he had with our team this year. A special, special year for him. Coming out of what he was able to accomplish during the course of this year, I thought was special.

I'm really happy for him. I mean, you're talking about a young guy that is -- came in, I think only played a couple plays in his career before he even graduated college. Didn't play much in high school. And now he's a Heisman Trophy finalist, and he's going to be an NFL draft pick. So that says a lot about him.

For the program, I'm excited. You look at the experience we were able to get out there on the field tonight, all the different young guys. A lot of the guys that were out there playing tonight were on the scout team most of the year for us, so very few guys that were playing had even really -- we kept things simple. Some simple things for them, because they just haven't really had the chance to even to play with the -- within the normal game plan week. Some really good experience for those guys, and a lot that we can teach off of with that group.

Q. Just building off of that, you knew coming into this game it was going to be young guys and a lot of young guys. Can you see now maybe where there are some depth issues in certain positions and where other -- you might have to recruit a little bit differently this next cycle?

COACH MULLEN: Well, I think, yeah. It's hard to say. That really -- with the number of people that were out for the game, we were under numbers, actually. To be honest, we could have said -- I give our guys credit. We had the numbers to not play the game. You see a lot of games have been canceled and not played.

But our young guys, I was really excited. They wanted to go play in that game. They wanted to get the experience. They wanted to be on that stage.

So I think you're able to see us, by playing so many players tonight, guys have experienced their stuff now that they know they can go build off of and learn from. They know now, hey, when I step on the field in a big game against a great football team, there are certain things that -- you know, when I was recruited -- when I was playing other high school football, you know, the last time I was really on the field, it wasn't like this, and it's a very different game.

So I think there's a lot of those little things that our guys had the opportunity to learn, and they'll be able to take that experience with them as we get going into spring football.

Q. This season had such high expectations, and you guys really accomplished some great things along the way. Obviously, this is a sour note. And there were some really glaring mistakes in some other games too. So how should this team be remembered?

COACH MULLEN: Well, you know what? I would have loved to have played the season we were supposed to play with the team we were supposed to have this year; but, unfortunately for COVID, we weren't able to do that. I think it's a pretty special team right now -- you know what I mean? -- when you look back at what we do.

I mean, the -- I don't know. I look at the games that we played with the team that we had -- we were supposed to have, which we -- there were a few this year.

SEC championship game, we were close to having our team. The Georgia game, we kind of had our team. There were some games in the season where we had our team playing, and then there were a bunch that we didn't, just for all the extenuating circumstances that happened.

But, to me, during the course of the year, you know, I kind of viewed -- maybe this is wrong. I viewed this game -- that wasn't the 2020 football team that you saw. I mean, there were about 25 guys missing off the 2020 football team out there tonight. That was kind of like a kickstart for us for the future and the opportunity for young guys to go play and, you know, even with me, all the coaches, I wanted to make sure. I think you saw all -- a lot of different guys on the field, us rotate a lot of different players in different situations, and a lot of that was for me to get to evaluate guys and for us to be able to teach those guys moving forward.

That's how I kind of view this game. Not really; I view the last game -- the last team the 2020 team played was 11 days ago.

Q. Do we need to start looking at bowl games differently with all of the opt-outs, and does that take some of the luster of a bowl game from the team itself?

COACH MULLEN: Well, I think that's an interesting question. And I don't have the answer for you to that right now, because I think this is such a unique year. You're talking about a bowl game that we played on 11 days' rest. We didn't really get to have, you know, the full bowl experience, which I think is -- one of the things that make the bowl games so special is the bowl games are a reward for the end of your season, the opportunity for young guys to come to somewhere, big places.

I know there's so many stories about it, but it's simple. One year, we were playing in the Orange Bowl -- not last year, earlier in my career. And the guys -- you have a day they bring you to the beach, they treat you to the beach. And guys are like, "This is the first time I've ever seen the ocean." There's a learning experience in that for college students.

I thank the Goodyear Cotton Bowl people. The very short time we were here, the hospitality was unbelievable. The people took care of us. Everything we needed, they bent over backwards to try to help and make this game happen. And I think it is so special that we're able to make these games happen.

But I think your question is a much bigger question, which is the future of college football and the direction college football is heading. Now, I think you see a lot of opt-outs, but you saw whole teams opt out, whole teams not play this year. It's a very different year. In our past two bowl games that we've played before this year, in those two combined, we had one player opt out and not play.

So I don't know if this year is kind of a unique anomaly for what it is. I don't know if that's going to be the future. But I think college football really needs to do a lot of evaluating.

And I'm a traditionalist. I think everybody that knows me knows I'm a traditionalist. I love college football. I love college football history, I love the game, I love the passion, I love that everybody has the fans, the people. I love bowl games. I love all of the history and tradition involved in college football.

But things are changing, and I think one thing that we have to do is sit there and say, okay, if we can't hold on to the past, how do we forge into the future, reevaluate and rethink the games? And ask me in a couple of weeks, because I have a couple thoughts on that, but this isn't the time or the place to go into that.

And so I think there's a lot of things that we can grow off of. and those guys now, guys that have played very -- played minimum snaps throughout a season, guys that were at best in backup roles, a majority of who were on the scout team for most of the year, so they didn't even get to run our defense, got opportunities to go play in a big-time atmosphere in a big game on the defensive side of the ball. And I think there's a lot of those things that guys can learn from, and we can build off and take that into the future for this team. And I think we have a very young defense that I'm very excited about.

Q. We've been asking you about evaluating your coaching staff. Given your comments about this game and how young you were and the opt-outs, do you evaluate them off of this game and this performance or what you guys have done in the previous 11?

COACH MULLEN: I evaluate everything in our program. This season is now over officially, so I evaluate every aspects of our program as we move forward.

Q. With Emory Jones and even Anthony Richardson entering the game, you mentioned Kyle Trask is going to become a draft pick, so with that, what did you see from them and how you can build upon their performance moving forward?

COACH MULLEN: I think this: Emory obviously has gotten a lot of experience. I think Emory has learned an awful lot. Sitting there with Kyle Trask, he has learned to prepare, to develop, to be ready. And I'm really excited to see what he's going to bring to the table here moving forward within the offense.

And the same with Anthony. Anthony is just a young guy. You know, I'm really excited about us getting going in the spring and seeing a lot of these guys out here on the field, especially at the quarterback position. We have a couple of young quarterbacks coming in that will be enrolling in school in a couple weeks. I think today you saw the excitement. Both Emory and Anthony are very different style quarterbacks than Kyle, which I think, as everybody knows, we always play to the strengths of our players.

So we'll run. There will be a lot of similarities and a lot of differences in our offense next year, but we're going to build around the strengths of those guys.

And then you know what? You look at this right now, Anthony Richardson is throwing a touchdown pass in the Cotton Bowl against Oklahoma. Emory Jones has played in a lot of big games and a lot of big moments, so he has the experience and he's really learned how to prepare to get ready to take over that main role.

And, you know, I'm excited. Hopefully -- I hope. I hope we get back -- a little bit back to normal and we're able to have a spring practice and an off-season to go develop.

I was talking to a bunch of the guys, and you look at this. You look at Kaiir Elam is really the leader of our secondary moving forward. He has never had a spring practice, not one spring practice day in his life, and he is our veteran leader in the secondary. He's never had a spring practice, not one, not one.

So I think I am really excited about all of these guys and life hopefully getting a little bit back to normal as these guys continue to grow and develop to see what type of team we're going to have next year.

Q. How many guys, because you said you might have been under, and also do you think this was fair to Kyle Trask, this situation, I mean, that he was put in?

COACH MULLEN: Yeah, I -- fair. Situations are what they are. I don't know that there's anything that's fair or unfair. I don't know that anybody in the world is going to say this past year has been fair to them, to be perfectly honest with you. That's not just football; that's everything in the world. And that's life. There's a lot of people that have gone through a lot tougher things. I'm really proud of all our guys and how they've handled this year, but there's a lot of people that have gone through a lot tougher things than that.

Q. I'm going to ask Trey. Trey, what was practice like this week leading up to the game? I mean, this certainly wasn't what you guys were hoping to do today.

DB TREY DEAN: Well, every day at practice, our players have to go out there, make the plays that we need to make, make the right checks. With COVID and everything, we have good practices, but you've all got to put it all together when you get on the field and players got to make plays no matter what age you are or what classification you are. At the end of the day, the Gators standard, we've got to play the University of Florida football, and we didn't do that today.

Q. And then Mohamoud. What can you take away from this game leading into next season?

LB MOHAMOUD DIABATE: I think this is a great learning experience, especially since a lot of the younger players who didn't get to play this season were able to play in this game. So it really allowed them to have the opportunity to understand where they were and what they needed to improve in the off-season. It really made them realize what college football is like because a lot of these guys came in during the COVID year, things were difficult, and they didn't get many snaps. Q. What were they doing, especially on the ground? And how much did maybe not having Kyree [Campbell] up front make a difference in not being able to stop the run game? And, Mohamoud, start with you since you're closer to the ball up there.

LB MOHAMOUD DIABATE: Obviously, Kyree's a great player and that would be a great help for our defense. But I'm not going to sit here and say we gave up a lot of rushing yards because Kyree wasn't there. Because at the end of the day, Kyree was not there the first couple of games, and we played. Kyree's a great player. We need him. He's a big part of the 2020 team. But at the end of the day, just like Trey Dean said, players have to get out on the field and make plays. LB AMARI BURNEY: Everybody played this game, from the freshman never getting a snap. We were putting everybody out there to see what they can do.

DB TREY DEAN: I say a fair assessment, at the end of the day. If we won by 80, we still got to go back to the drawing board, see the things that you did wrong. Our recipe has been we just got to worry about ourselves. We got a group of guys that were excited and committed to come in and play this game, and I think it showed. I think we probably played our most complete game of the season.

Q. Over 400 yards rushing, big play after big play from all three of your guys. Was that something you thought would be successful? Why was it so successful tonight? Your running game really carried your passing game.

COACH RILEY: Oh, it absolutely did. We were a little sloppy in the passing game early. Had a couple of things that we missed and a couple that we didn't catch, and we were just a little sloppy there. The run really got us going. It was easily the best we've ran the ball all year.

I thought our offensive line played outstanding because that's still a supertalented defensive front that we just played against. And so I thought our Oline was outstanding.
