Big 12 Football Championship Notes

Kansas State won its second Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championship title by upending undefeated TCU 31-28 with a 31-yard field goal by Ty Zentner in overtime. K-State is now 2-2 in the championship, with its first win against Oklahoma in 2003 (35-7). The Wildcats have won four Big 12 titles overall.

There have been six games decided by three points or less, with the last being in 2010 when Oklahoma beat Nebraska 23-20.

This was just the third overtime game in Championship history, with the first in 1998 (Texas A&M 36, Kansas State 33) and the second in 2019 (Oklahoma 30, Baylor 23). There have been six overtime games in 79 college contests played since September 2009 at AT&T Stadium. The last prior to today was the Oklahoma win over Baylor in 2019.

TCU's two-point conversion made with 1:51 in the fourth was just the second-made two-point conversion in a Championship game. The first made was in 1998 by Texas A&M also against Kansas State.

Today's attendance was the fourth-highest turnout among the eight Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championships played in AT&T Stadium and the highest since 2018.

This was a record sixth-consecutive Big 12 Championship game played at AT&T Stadium in Arlington. Previous sites have been Kansas City (5), San Antonio (3), St. Louis (2), Houston (2), and Irving (1).

This was the second-straight year that the Championship game was decided by the last play of the game. Last year, Baylor stopped Oklahoma State on fourth down in regulation to win, 21-16.

Today's game also is the 15th Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championship played in a domed or retractable roof facility. The other six were contested in outdoor venues at Arrowhead Stadium and Texas Stadium in Irving.

RECORDS

Saturday was the 17th all-time meeting between Kansas State and TCU with the Wildcats taking a 9-8 lead in the series... It was the ninth time in school history the Wildcats faced an opponent twice in the same season and the first since 2000 when they lost to Oklahoma in the regular season and the Big 12 Championship... The Wildcats improved to 2-2 in Big 12 Championship games.

CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP NO. 4

Kansas State earned its fourth conference championship in school history and the third in the Big 12 era... K-State is now tied for second in conference history with three Big 12 titles, joining Baylor and Texas... The Wildcats' first conference championship was in 1934 when they went 5-0 in Big 6 play... K-State won its first Big 12 title in 2003 with a 35-7 victory over No. 1 Oklahoma, while the Wildcats went 8-1 in Big 12 play in 2012 to claim the title as there was no Big 12 Championship Game conducted that season.

DOUBLE DIGITS

Saturday's victory gave the Wildcats their 11th season with 10 or more wins and the first since an 11-win campaign in 2012, which was also the last time K-State won a conference championship... All but one of those campaigns had the Wildcats with 10 victories prior to a bowl appearance.

DOWN GOES ANOTHER TOP 10

K-State took down its third top-10 opponent of the season, the other two being a win at then-No. 6 Oklahoma and a home victory against then-No. 9 Oklahoma State... It is the first time in school history the Wildcats defeated multiple top-10 teams in a season... The Wildcats are now 6-3 in their last nine games against top-10 teams taking back to Nov. 18, 2017, a span that began with a 45-40 victory at No. 10 Oklahoma State... In the previous 16 meetings with top-10 opponents, the Wildcats were 1-15... Head coach **Chris Klieman** is now 7-6 all-time against AP Top-10 teams, including a 5-2 record at K-State.

OVERTIME VICTORY

Kansas State earned its fourth all-time overtime victory and first since a 42-35 victory at Texas Tech in 2017... The Wildcats avenged an overtime loss in the 1998 Big 12 Championship against Texas A&M.

HOWARD KNOWS HOW

Sophomore quarterback **Will Howard** made his 14th career start and fourth this season, throwing for 199 yards and two touchdowns on 18-of-32 aim, while has one rushing touchdown... He now has 34 career touchdown responsible for, which ranks 10th in school history.

VAUGHN GOES VROOM

Junior running back **Deuce Vaughn** carded 130 rushing yards and a touchdown on 26 carries, while he had 30 receiving yards two catches... He moved into fourth place in school history in single-season rushing yards with 1,425 yards... He now has 252 career points scored to tie for sixth in school history.

FIRST ONE FOR GARCIA

Redshirt freshman wide receiver **RJ Garcia II** hauled in two receptions for 27 yards... He carded his first-career touchdown early in the third quarter, a 25-yard reception.

Team Notes

- TCU made its second appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game, having also played in the 2017 contest.
- The Horned Frogs are 1-1 in overtime games this season and 10-10 since the NCAA adopted overtime play in 1996.
- TCU is 8-2 all-time when ESPN's College GameDay has been on site, including 2-1 this season.
- TCU scored for the 380th consecutive game, the second-longest streak in NCAA history. No. 1 is Florida at 435 games (1988-present). The Horned Frogs haven't been blanked since Nov. 16, 1991, at Texas (32-0).
- TCU closed a stretch of five straight games over November and December in which it did not leave the state of Texas. In addition to today's contest, the Horned Frogs had November home contests against Texas Tech (Nov. 5) and Iowa State (Nov. 26) sandwiched around bus trips to Texas (Nov. 12) and Baylor (Nov. 19).
- TCU season captains Steve Avila, Dylan Horton, Quentin Johnston and Dee Winters took part in the coin toss.
- TCU wore a black helmet, black jersey and purple pants.

Individual Notes

Offense

- Max Duggan made his 41st career start and became the first player with 250 yards passing and 100 rushing in a conference championship game since Deshaun Watson in the 2015 ACC title game.
- Duggan completed 18-of-36 passes for 251 yards and a touchdown while rushing for a team-best 110 yards on 15 carries.
- Duggan's touchdown pass gave him 30 on the season, third-most at TCU behind only Trevone Boykin (33, 2014; 31, 2015).
- Kendre Miller ran for 82 yards on 17 carries.
- Miller's touchdown run of 6 yards gave him a rushing score in all 13 games this year, breaking the TCU record for the longest streak to begin a season. Pro Football Hall of Famer and TCU Board of Trustees member LaDainian Tomlinson ran for a touchdown in all 12 games in 2000.
- Miller's 14 consecutive games with a rushing touchdown is the longest active streak in the nation and ranks second all-time at TCU, behind only Tomlinson (15, 1999-00).
- Miller has a team-best 17 rushing touchdowns, fourth-most in a season at TCU.
- Miller's 26 career rushing touchdowns rank eighth in TCU history.
- Quentin Johnston had four receptions for 139 yards, his third 100-yard game of the season and eighth of his career. He had catches of 53 and 51 yards.

THE MODERATOR: We have with us head coach of the Big 12 champion, Kansas State. Coach, an opening statement.

COACH KLIEMAN: Big 12 champions has a nice ring to it. And what a great football game, two great teams. TCU should be in the CFP. They're one of the best four teams. And we went toe to toe with them. I thought we could go toe to toe with them and found a way to win.

It was an exceptional football game. A lot of ups and downs, between both teams, and great resolve by our guys. And the overtime stop, it's incredible. We get a third-and-1 and fourth-and-1, as good as they are up front and good run game as they have -- and our defensive line stood up and stuffed them back-to-back plays.

I thought it was important for to us get a first down and not make it a 40-some yard field goal but get it a little closer. And we were able to do that. And then executed to perfection, what we call our Wisconsin, getting the ball to the middle of the field for Ty.

And then I would say over the last five to six weeks, there may not be a more valuable kid on the football team than Ty Zentner. And Ty was huge again today. And what was just so poetic for me was the ball was on his foot in the last game in Big 12 play for him. And there was no doubt in my mind he was making that. No doubt in my mind.

So credit to our seniors. Credit to our leaders. Credit to the culture that they've created. Credit to player



ownership, the power of belief, all those things, because we've had a lot of tough times. A lot of people doubted that team after we lost to Tulane and said must not be very good.

And they took it to heart. And we lost to a good TCU team. Lost to a really good TCU team. And end up getting a win, and then we lost to a good Texas team.

We had to go 3-0, get some help, got some help. And those kids went 3-0 in tough circumstances at Baylor, at West Virginia, home on senior day against KU -- to have an opportunity to come here.

And we talked about it in the locker room. You can ask Daniel Green about this. We talked about it in the locker room after we beat KU. We weren't coming here for a participation trophy; we were coming here to win the thing.

And that was our mindset all week. And we found a way with great resolve by a bunch of great seniors.

Q. Daniel, that last stand, what were you seeing out there? And what do you think of what happened?

DANIEL GREEN: I just think that was great execution, just overall by just the defense. We talked about situations like that. Just happened to bow up. And that's what championship games come down to, just somebody making an extra play, especially on defense.

I'm so proud of those guys. That's a statement right there. We always say the mob, mob mentality. It don't get no more better than that, on the goal line for the game, almost.

Q. Coach, you had a lot of young guys out there today on defense. What does that say about not only them but just the culture that you talked about a little bit earlier?

COACH KLIEMAN: Well, you've got to rise up. When your opportunity comes, you've got to rise up. And I look at Jacob Parrish, didn't practice most of the week and found a way to gut it out and play.

I look at Keenan Garber, that was a wide receiver the entire year, and came to me five weeks ago and said I'd like to be a defensive back, I want to help the team.

And so he was on scout team up until Thursday of this week. On Thursday, we moved him from scout team and said, you've got to be the emergency guy in case Jacob Parrish can't go.

And that's the sign of a culture. That's the sign of not wanting to let guys like Daniel Green and Eli Huggins down.

And I thought Keenan Garber played his tail off. And VJ Payne is a true freshman playing. And Jacob Parrish is a true freshman playing, to go with the veterans like Josh and Drake and Julius. And phenomenal resolve by those guys.

Q. I've got one for Daniel and the coach, but Daniel first. On the fourth-down play, what were you anticipating and did you think Max Duggan might end up with the ball?

DANIEL GREEN: No, we did anticipate Max having the ball because usually when it comes down to short yardage or the game on the line he's the guy that usually carries the ball.

But when they got into their personnel we came out with a call that was fit for the personnel. And it just came down to executing, this good on good, everyone up front penetration.

And it was just a really big stop for our team. And I'm so proud of those guys, man, because we really worked hard for this moment and we really embraced it.

Q. Coach, I know we're in the moment here, but is there any way to put kind of the enormity of this in perspective? This is a program that's -- you've won the fourth conference championship in program history.

COACH KLIEMAN: I'll let that sink in at some point. I'm fortunate to be here. Gene Taylor took a chance on an FCS coach when not a lot of people would. But he believed in me and us.

And coming here I look at these guys that believed in us as a coaching staff when there was a coaching change and stuck with us.

And the last couple of years starting in January of 2021,

these guys will tell you, our locker room became so close and so tight. And I'm telling you that this is about the power of belief and the power of player ownership. When you have those two things, I don't think anything will stop you.

Q. Deuce and Daniel, after Ty hit that field goal, the first thing he says in the camera is, I would die for this team. When it's a special team like this, everyone talks about, we're a close group or this or that. How much different does this feel? It's not just a cliché, it's an actual thing?

DEUCE VAUGHN: Yeah, it is. Whenever I got recruited to come here, Coach Klieman said we're going to build a culture that's going to win championships. It's going to be built on team, player first, a player-led team.

And we built that. And for what Ty said, that's exactly how I feel. That's exactly how everybody feels inside that locker room right now.

It's just been battling through adversity. The good, the bad and everything that we've been through together has brought us so close together. That's my family.

Q. Coach, you guys ran out there, when you needed at the end there, Damian Ilalio, a redshirt freshman from Manhattan, Kansas. What does it mean to see him do that -- he doesn't get a ton of snaps? When you needed him on the biggest play of the game he got it.

COACH KLIEMAN: Everybody is counted on in those times. And Damian came in, did his job, as well as everybody else up front and the linebackers.

This was a pure team win. I mean, offense, defense, special teams, guys that you expect to make big-time plays like these two guys, to guys that maybe a little bit under the radar.

But that's what championship teams do. And championships teams have resolve, and they count on each other when it's crunch time.

Q. Daniel and then for Deuce, just to the team's perseverance this season and today throughout the game?

DANIEL GREEN: Like Coach said, it started in January, this team coming together and believing in each other. And belief is what won us this game.

We came into this game knowing it was going to be a dogfight and we was going to have to earn it. But not one

second of that game we didn't believe that we wasn't going to come out with the victory.

It just shows the character of the team, the culture we got and the brotherhood we got that we can fall on each other and believe in each other. Even through all the adversity that hit us, we kept believing and fighting.

DEUCE VAUGHN: When it comes to that perseverance you talked about, I feel it's the team motto to go back to work, whether it be after a loss getting back into the coaches' office, the recovery on Sunday and getting back to work on Monday and understanding that the preparation we do Monday through Friday is how we win football games.

Today, whenever adversity strikes, the perseverance to say we're going to go back to work as an offense and defense and take it play-by-play. That's how you win football games.

Q. Deuce, you didn't have a lot of opportunities for explosive plays today, but the one time you did you made it count. Could you walk me through the 44-yard touchdown?

DEUCE VAUGHN: Yes, we ran a man scheme, like our no-pull power play. And the D ends slanted in. Great job by I believe it was KT to mash them down and it opened up a seam.

Once we planed through Kade, it brought the corner out and a little bit of space and after that it's one-on-one with the safety. But I'm not doing that, I'm not doing anything without those guys up front and everybody on the perimeter.

Q. This was a game of momentum swings. Every time one team tried to pull away, couldn't happen. Winds up in overtime. How did you manage it?

COACH KLIEMAN: Just stay in the fight. We talk about it all the time, that you're going to have adversity and you've got to stay in the fight. We talked this morning that field goals aren't going to beat you. I thought the defense did a phenomenal job a couple times on them moving the ball and holding them to field goals. And then we were able to hit a few explosive plays.

And just I can't say enough about these guys and the leadership of this crew, because once we got it to overtime, and went on defense first, we knew we were going to get a stop. I'm telling you, if we didn't get a stop we were going to score a touchdown and go for two. We were going to end this thing. Will knew it. The offense knew it. Once we

got that stop, we were going to position ourselves and let Ty win the game.

Q. Daniel, Deuce, what does it mean to be part of this team that's just captured the program's first Big 12 Conference championship since 2012, from a player's perspective?

DANIEL GREEN: It means everything. You know, when we come here, and like Deuce said earlier, Coach came here to build a culture that wants to win championships, like if you're playing Power Five football you're playing at this level, Big 12 football, it's what you came here to do.

And to be able to do it with the group of guys that's on this team, great group of men, great group of coaches and coaching staff. And it's really amazing feeling to see the journey we was on just since January, after the last bowl game, and just come in here and do everything that we had set out to do and come out with a victory like that in overtime. That's really amazing.

DEUCE VAUGHN: I feel like he hit it on the head. Everybody contributed in some way or fashion throughout this year, and in the building, on the team and on the coaching staff. And everybody just went to work in January, understood that this is what we wanted to accomplish this year.

And so it's big time. So a big "thank you" to everybody that's poured into us as players from our perspective to go out there and play as hard as we can to go out and do things like this.

Q. Coach, you knew this TCU team would come back. They've done that. Most of our games this year, watching that last drive where Duggan breaks off a couple runs, ties it up, what's going through your mind there as you're potentially going into overtime?

COACH KLIEMAN: To try to get our offense ready to go, to try to get a field goal. We were close. We had a good drive, Will threw a strike to Deuce on a slant, on a third down, that got us past midfield. And then they did a nice job stopping us. We were trying to win that thing in regulation, and weren't able to do it.

Once again, Ty pins them down inside the 10 so they can't mount a drive, so that they can win it in regulation.

And I want to say on behalf of the three of us up here, K-State nation came today. That crowd was electric and it was an unbelievable atmosphere.

When we were on defense, that crowd was phenomenal

and can't thank our fan base enough for coming down here in droves and cheering on these guys because we were playing for them as much as we were for each other.

Q. I remember Coach Klieman talking to you, Big 12 media days when you stated about Will Howard and him to stay at K-State and not transferring. How do you think he's taken it as Adrian Martinez has gotten injured and he's now the starting quarterback?

COACH KLIEMAN: These guys will tell you, everybody in that locker room has so much confidence in Will Howard. And Will Howard's a flat winner. He's a competitor. He wanted to play.

But I credit both Adrian and Will for how this has gone this year as far as both kids helped us win a Big 12 Championship for sure. And both kids rallied around each other when the other one wasn't playing.

And that's a culture. That's a sign of a group of guys that love each other. When it ended up being Will's job when Adrian got hurt, Adrian was his biggest fan and helped him a bunch.

And Will Howard deserves everything he got today. And these guys will tell you, the kid works his tail off and is a great, great leader for a young player.

Q. Daniel Green, this time last year, you immediately said you were coming back because this is what you were playing for. How rewarding is this experience when you reflect back on that moment?

DANIEL GREEN: It's a great feeling to do it with a group of guys that came a long way. Like this journey has been so long, and it's been a ride that I wouldn't trade for anything. A lot of adversity, a lot of ups and downs.

But we believed in each other. We believed that we could do this. We is it out from the first time we got back from the bowl game in the wintertime. And we said we were going to do this. And just to come out and do it today how we did it today is just an amazing feeling.

Q. Coach, you mentioned at the start of this, the losses that this team had to kind of respond to. How did you see this group of guys go back to work after Tulane, after the first TCU game, after Texas?

COACH KLIEMAN: Just the fact that they were more upset about it, that they let an opportunity slip, whatever it may be. We lost to a Tulane team that might be a New Year's Six bowl team. Maybe they're actually a pretty good football team.

But you can't trip on something that's behind you; you've got to focus on the next game. I thought we played a phenomenal game the next week against an Oklahoma team that's ranked fifth in the country and fought after that.

That's the thing we kept talking about is, guys, don't have an edge after a loss, have an edge after a win. And these last four weeks, I think our preparation and the final 48 hours prior to us finishing practice on Thursday, to teeing it up on Saturday, has been as good as anything I've ever been involved with, of guys owning it, locking into the final details and playing with unbelievable focus and unbelievable resolve for each other. And these last four weeks our guys have been so locked in and razor sharp.

Q. Coach, Julius (Brents) battled with Quentin Johnston throughout the whole game. How big was that pick today?

COACH KLIEMAN: It was huge. And Quentin Johnston's a great football player. He's a first-round draft pick. And we gave Julius a tough task. You know our defense, there's a lot of one-on-one situations and you're going to lose some. That's part of being a defensive back. You're going to lose some of those situations.

But you've got to make sure and stay in the fight. And we called a great blitz on a third and goal from the 8, and Julius got flipped on it and makes a huge, huge pick to keep him out of the end zone. But that's Julius. Julius wants to be on that stage and that's why he's the player he is.

Q. And RJ Garcia got pushed into duty for Malik (Knowles) after he got hurt.

COACH KLIEMAN: I'm going to let Deuce answer that question. I'm so happy for RJ.

DEUCE VAUGHN: RJ Garcia, ever since he got on campus, he's somebody I've taken under my wing and called a friend. For him to get in there after all year he's behind three seniors, three great football players for us. And, man, he just went to work every single day, frustrated a little bit, being the younger guy that feels he can play on this football team. That's the competitor he is, but understanding and just going to work every single day. You see it in practice and going to work, going to work.

And I told him yesterday, I said, man, why not score your first touchdown in a big-time football game like this. And it's actually -- I saw him run down the football, see the ball get thrown. And when he caught it, I screamed to the top of my lungs and I chased him down. For him, big

confidence, big confidence for the football team. Shows you the type of football player he is.

SONNY DYKES: Well, that didn't end the way that we wanted it to obviously. It was a hell of a football game. Got to give Kansas State a ton of credit. Did a great job, really played clean football, as you would expect Kansas State to do. It's kind of the way they play.

Love our team for battling back. Got down eight, didn't look real good. Excuse me. Got down 11. Didn't look real good. Like we've done all year, we made a bunch of plays to get ourselves back in the game.

Griffin Kell did a nice job kicking a field goal. Defense got a stop, just like they've done all year. Offense went down and scored, just like they've done all year. Got the two-point conversion.

Was disappointed obviously the way the game ended. We felt like Max scored on the scramble. I was trying to get him to replay it. I don't know. I don't know what the issue was. Thought the spot wasn't right, but it is what it is.

Then we've got to do a better job of getting the ball in the end zone. We had two cracks from inside the 1 yard line, and we didn't get it done. We were obviously in that situation there. You got fourth and less than a yard, you've got to figure out a way to get the ball in the end zone. We didn't do it. Again, you've got to give Kansas State credit for getting us stopped.

Q. On that third and goal, Kendre [Miller], it looked like on the replay he might have broken the plane.

SONNY DYKES: That's what we said too. That's what our people told us when they saw the replay upstairs.

Q. So they didn't review it?

SONNY DYKES: I don't know. I'd love for somebody to come give somebody some answers. I was told they did, but I don't know.

Q. What was the thought process in kind of maybe going with Kendre as opposed to Max on those last two plays?

SONNY DYKES: We just felt that Kendre has done it for us all year. He's been really, really good at converting those short yardage situations. He's done it consistently. We've just got a lot of confidence in him. Obviously if we had to do it over again, we'd do it different.

Q. Sonny, I know it's just coming off the loss and it's not in your hands, but do you think this team belongs in the College Football Playoff?

SONNY DYKES: For sure I do. We went through the Big 12, 12-0. We've been figuring out ways to win games like this all year, and today we weren't able to do it. I think we're certainly deserving.

I think the league is one of the best leagues in the country, to go through undefeated in the league, certainly we ought to get in. I don't think we should be punished for coming to the Big 12 Championship game. I don't think the way this stuff is designed to -- you know, the conference championship games, I don't think are designed to punish teams and prevent them from getting in the playoffs.

We were 3 last week. My hope is we stay at 3 and go tee it up and see how we do.

Q. Max had over 360 total yards, a couple touchdowns today. What can you say about his performance today?

SONNY DYKES: Typical Max Duggan performance. Gritty, tough, made plays when he had to. Did everything he could do to give us a chance to win. Did exactly what Max does.

Again, I think if you watch this game today, I think it's pretty

clear that he's certainly deserving to, if not win the Heisman Trophy, to certainly be in the conversation. His performance has been gritty week after week after week. He does -- he gives us an opportunity to win, does what he has to do to give us a chance to win.

The guy is one of the best players in college football. I think it's pretty obvious.

Q. Were you guys hesitant at all to not try and get the field goal at the end of the game?

SONNY DYKES: Not really. Look, if it's fourth and three, obviously we kick the field goal. If it's -- but we have to be able to convert inside the 1, two downs, and we just didn't do it.

Again, you've got to give Kansas State credit. And we've got to do a better job. I think that's one thing that I'm disappointed in. We've got to figure out a way to get that ball in the end zone.

Q. Sonny, that pick in the end zone by Max, was that a big turning point in the game?

SONNY DYKES: Yeah, I think if we could get anything there, field goal, anything like that, that was a big, big turning point.

We just had some kind of things -- not talking about that play, but in particular down at the end of the game, go against us. Got a holding penalty and a long scramble for Max and an offensive pass interference penalty on Jordan Hudson as well. Those two penalties really hurt us.

I don't know exactly what happened on that. I don't know, I think there was some miscommunication apparently between Quentin [Johnston] and Max. Obviously it was a bad play.

Q. Obviously 12 times you were in there with a message about winning. What was your message to the kids today? And then the anticipation that they're going to have tomorrow to find out their fate.

SONNY DYKES: Yeah, that's kind of what we talked about. I just said, hey, a couple things. Number one, how proud of them I was and I am for having the fortitude to get back in this game. When you look up and you're down 11 points with seven minutes to go, it doesn't look very good.

To our guys' credit, man, they gave themselves an opportunity to win, and they just battled, and they stuck with it. They stuck with the plan. They believed in each other. They did the things that we've done all year, and we've been able to make enough plays to win.

Today on two downs inside the 1 yard line, we didn't do it. That's the difference between winning and losing. That's what we talked about in there. We'll get better because of that. We'll obviously address that issue for us and make sure, when we get in that situation again, that we're more comfortable and we can go out and execute better than we did in a short yardage situation, particularly when the game is on the line like it was.

I think that -- like I said, I love this team. I love these guys. There's a bunch of hurt players in there, some guys that were really upset. We wanted to win a Big 12 Championship, and we didn't make enough plays to do it. It's disappointing, but my hope is obviously we're going to get another game, and my hope is we're going to get into the tournament and have a chance to go and compete for a National Championship.

Ultimately that's the goal at the beginning of the year is to put yourself in that situation. We wanted to do it ourselves today. We didn't want to let anybody else make that decision. We wanted to go 13-0 where they were forced to put us in, but we're going to be 12-1, and my hope is they do.

Q. Sonny, not just that you lost, but the way you lost today, you think, if you had to lose, is that a good endorsement for the committee? A top ten team, you went overtime, you're down, you come back, all that kind of stuff.

SONNY DYKES: I think so. Look, we were literally an inch away from winning the game or certainly having a chance to and being 13-0. My hope is they see it the same way I saw it and realize, hey, look, this is a team that certainly the resume is good enough and we deserve to be part of it.

Again, our hope is to not have to rely on a beauty contest, you know what I mean? Our hope is to kick the door down and make sure that we were Big 12 champs and there was no discussion about it.

Q. Sonny, what went into the decision to kneel out at the end of regulation instead of going for it there?

SONNY DYKES: There wasn't much time left, and we felt at that stage of the game we would have to go about 60 yards in 26 seconds, I think it was, and just felt it was the most prudent thing to do. Didn't want to take a chance of throwing an interception or fumbling and having a turnover.

Then when they punted it to us, if we get the ball at the 20, it's a whole different line of thinking, as opposed to getting it at the 5 or 6 yard line. A lot of stuff can go wrong. You

can get caught in the backfield and get a safety. There's a whole chain of events that could happen that's negative.

So that was kind of the thinking was let's just get to overtime. We felt like we had all the momentum as well. We felt like that was where we wanted to be.

Q. Sonny, you mentioned earlier this week how this team, every time you guys move on to the next opponent, you're just focused on that and not getting too far ahead of yourselves. You don't know who the next opponent is going to be until tomorrow morning. What do you think this afternoon and evening and even tomorrow morning might be like for you and your guys? What can you say to them?

SONNY DYKES: Probably a little bit of anxiety for all of us. Again, I got a lot of faith in the committee. I know they've got a very difficult thing to do, but I believe that those guys will take a look at what we've been able to accomplish and what this team looks like and what we've done and put us in.

As I said earlier, my hope was to celebrate a Big 12 Championship tonight and not worry too much about it, but it's going to be a different course of action.

Q. You say you have faith in the committee and you also know this can be an unpredictable process. Are you nervous at all about not seeing your team in the final four?

SONNY DYKES: I think, again, to go back to 2014, I think that TCU has been through this. Lost a close game to Baylor in 2014 and didn't have a conference championship game at that time.

I really believe that was a different time in college football. I think the Big 12 is in a different place than it was then. I think they're going to see it different, but at the same time, you just don't know.

I'm concerned, obviously, but again I've got faith in the committee, and I believe -- I know that we deserve to be in, so my guess is we'll be in.

Q. Can you kind of take us through that drive Max put together? You saw him almost looking sick. You saw him almost passing out. What was happening during that drive?

SONNY DYKES: He was doing what he does. He was making plays. He was finding -- figuring out things to give us a chance to win. That's what the guy does. I mean, you see that he gives every single thing he's got on the field,

leaves it all out there every single Saturday.

It's like he goes out and he does what he does. We get him back on Sunday, and it's like we tape him together and do what we can to get him to the next game. To his credit, he puts the work in. He puts the work in and grinds through injuries, grinds through discomfort. He's just one of the toughest football players I've ever been around.

He's the consummate winner and a guy that, again, raises the expectations of every single person around him. I think our team sees Max and is challenged to approach the game the same way he approached the game.

I think a big part of our success is because of that, because of that mentality that he has and everybody watching him every single day and watching what he does and how much he cares about his teammates and how much he loves those guys and how he would do anything in the world for them.

So this was a game that I think, again, we made a lot of mistakes. We haven't turned the ball over like we did today very often. We've taken care of the football a lot better than we did today. There's a lot of plays, a lot of things that could happen that would give us a different result. Again, everyone is going to focus on the end and overtime, and I certainly understand why.

I think there's a lot to be learned from this and a lot of ways we can improve as a team and as a program.

Q. Similarly, how is Max?

SONNY DYKES: I haven't gotten a report. I think he's fine. I think he was more just tired than anything, I think.

Q. Also, did that play any role in any decisions on the intensity?

SONNY DYKES: Yeah. We just didn't feel like he was - maybe is - a 100 percent. We would've like him to be, so it felt like Kendre was the guy.

Q. Quentin Johnston had 139 yards and four receptions. Had a pretty big game, but also had a few missed opportunities including the fumble. Can you talk me through his performance today?

SONNY DYKES: Quentin really played well. I think there was probably a little bit of a rust. He just hasn't played that much. He's been banged up. He's been trying to play week in and week out. You know, when you've missed as much time as he has, it doesn't matter who you are. There are going to be a little bit of rust.

He played excellent today. He does what he does. He had a couple of huge plays that resulted in us scoring some touchdowns and scoring points. At the same time, like I said, when you haven't played, there's always a little bit more rust maybe than there is if you've been playing.

I thought he played really well. I thought he played hard. He's been courageous all year battling through the injuries he had and made a ton of big plays today. I think, if you ask him, he'd probably say wish he had made one or two more.

Q. I think you played seven or eight of these kind of games in the Big 12 and won them all, except today. Did you feel like in any part maybe the law of averages caught up with you a little bit?

SONNY DYKES: I think maybe to an extent. It's like anything else. Once you believe you can do something, it's a whole lot easier to us. There wasn't anyone who didn't believe we were going to win this game. That's why you got to give Kansas State credit for making the plays they made down the stretch and doing what they had to do to win.

This is a confident team. We feel like we can play with anybody. Our hope is we'll have an opportunity to play against them in the tournament because that's what we want and that's what we believe we deserve.

Yeah, it's like anything else. I think you get on a run sometimes, and if you do some things that are pretty improbable, then at some point it becomes a little bit more difficult to continue to do the improbable.

Q. Did you all feel like you all were at any kind of disadvantage without Johnny Hodges today, or were you all pretty comfortable with the next man up?

SONNY DYKES: Johnny has been a very, very good player for us, obviously our leading tackler. We've been really fortunate this year to not have a lot of injuries.

The position we've been hit pretty hard at is the linebacker position. We lost some guys in preseason camp. Obviously lost Marcel Brooks. Shad Banks has done a great job of learning to play the position and coming in and filling in. There's been some weeks where all we've had is three linebackers, and Shad's had to be the backup for all three of those guys.

Today Shad was the starter. I thought he played well. He has a lot to learn. He just doesn't have as many snaps as some of those other guys. I think that's what makes Johnny such an effective player. You look at his history, he's played a lot of snaps, first at Navy and now here at TCU.

Not having him out there certainly hurts from an experience standpoint, but Shad Banks has been a hell of a player for us.

Q. Sonny, two things. One, how many times, if you have any idea, have you all been in that sort of goal line situation this year? I'm assuming that was your goal line offense?

SONNY DYKES: Yeah. It's something, again, we spend a lot of time on. Something we obviously need to get better at.

I think that's the one thing if you say -- you know, if you ask me what this football team needs to improve, I would say it needs to improve our short yardage situation. This year we haven't been as good as we want to be. It's been something that we've been working on all year, and I think it's something that obviously needs to continue to get a lot of our attention.

Q. The game tying drive, when Max ran the ball, I think, six times, how much of that were called and how much of that was him?

SONNY DYKES: A couple of them were called. Probably three were called, and probably three were improvised. A couple times you drop back -- they did a nice job of playing some two man, covering those receivers up, having some safeties that could run back there. When they did that, then that gave Max an opportunity to pull the ball down and make some plays.

Again, that run to get down to the 1, that was a heck of a run. What a great play. You guys saw.

Q. Feels like a microcosm of your season is overcoming adversity, whether it's quarterback situation, injuries, being down in games. You lost for the first time today. How much confidence do you have in this team to overcome adversity? Because there's still a lot more to play for here.

SONNY DYKES: I certainly believe in those guys. I told them in there, I've just never been around a group of young people that are as invested in each other as this group is, and I think that's been what's been such a pleasure to coach these guys and to work with them every day and be around them.

It's just been the regard that they hold themselves to and their teammates to. They don't want to let people down, and I think that pressure to work hard and to do the little

things right kind of started with our players and just spread throughout the team.

It's hard when you lose a game like this. It's kind of your first chink in the armor in some ways, but I think at the same time, we'll learn. We'll go back, and we'll look at all those plays, the culmination of a bunch of plays in that game. Again, the focus is going to be on overtime, but there will be a bunch of plays we can improve on and we can get corrected.

Obviously we'll learn things as a coaching staff. There's some things we have to do better obviously down the stretch as well. I thought we got back in the game the right way, kicking the field goal to cut it to one possession, scoring, and having a two-point play and getting the stops and everything we had to defensively to get the game to overtime. But we needed something a little better in overtime.

Q. Max, obviously that was a very hard fought game out there. It's the first time, though, you guys have fallen short. What was the reaction like in the locker room today after this game?

MAX DUGGAN: I think guys are upset. We have a lot of emotion in the locker room.

(Crying.)

Sorry. I think Coach Dykes talked about we still have -- wherever we go, we still have a game to play. So it's going to hurt. Let it feel you. But we've got to get back to work.

Q. That touchdown that you guys tied it on, you had almost 90 rushing yards. Can you run us through that drive, what was going through your head, and specifically the touchdown run? It kind of looked like you only had maybe 50 percent energy, but you made it happen.

MAX DUGGAN: We knew what they were going to be in. We were down by eight at that point, I think. Time's kind of getting low, going down. So we were just trying to make a play, trying to give us a shot to maybe go to overtime, maybe get the ball back, go win it, things of that sort. So just trying to make a play.

Obviously I was a little tired, but I think everybody else was. I wasn't going to come out. I wasn't going to pout. I wasn't going to try to make it impact us because there were guys on our side giving it everything they've got.

Q. Not having a moment to catch your breath going into that two-point conversion, what was that feeling like?

MAX DUGGAN: You just go back to preparation. You don't let any emotion take over. I think the O-line did a tremendous job of getting me right, continuing to talk to me, and just playing that play. It comes down to preparation. We ran it so many times.

Be in the moment. Be where your two feet are.

Q. You guys talked earlier in the week about wanting to win and not have to worry about the what ifs. Now that you have not won, can you take me through your emotions and your thoughts about wanting to get into that College Football Playoff and not having the ability to control your own destiny?

MAX DUGGAN: We got beat today, and now it's out of our hands. That was something that we wanted to do is be in control. Big congrats to Kansas State. They earned it today. They won that game. They deserved it. They played well today.

Yeah, now it's out of our hands. So all we can do is kind of watch.

Q. Max, how are you physically? You got hit a lot, slow to get up a couple times. How are you doing?

MAX DUGGAN: I'm all right. I'll be all right. I'll be fine.

Q. Do you feel like you guys should be in the playoff?

MAX DUGGAN: I don't even know right now. I think, if we got in, we would give one heck of a fight, and I think our competitiveness would take over and things of that sort. I don't know. I wanted that one really bad.

Q. When you think about everything you've been through and this program's been through over the past few years, how much you love this school, what would it mean to get to bring TCU to the playoff?

MAX DUGGAN: A lot of pride, I think for our fan base, for our team if we were able to do that. There's nothing more that I want than to bring this school a championship.

Today we fell short. I didn't make enough plays to help us offensively that kind of put us in that spot. There's nothing more than I want for us than to get to a school championship.

Q. Max, first of all, did you think you had scored on the play down there at the end of the game? And also, did you want to try to score yourself when you all were down there in fourth down?

MAX DUGGAN: They didn't call me in, so I didn't score. At that point, I don't really care. I could be standing on the sideline. I just wanted to make sure we won.

Q. Max, I'm just kind of curious. The emotion that's pouring out with you right now, is it a product of that game, the uncertainty, the anxiety? Can you pinpoint where that's coming from?

MAX DUGGAN: I think since my four years I've been here, there's been a lot of lows in a football career, and to be so close to bringing this school, this university a championship, the guys, the seniors on this team, the guys have been through a lot.

I think that's where it hurts the most is that you've been so down before, so low. To get so close and it falls short, I think that's where it's coming from.

Q. Obviously this is an emotional time, but you still have more to play for. How do you bounce back from this and regroup as an individual and as a team?

MAX DUGGAN: It's going to hurt, but no one's going to feel sorry for us. I wouldn't expect anyone to feel sorry for us. Once we find out where we're going, we're going to erase this. It's going to hurt for a couple days, but we've got to erase it because no one else is going to care. No one cares that we got beat today.

Q. For anyone who hadn't seen this team play until today, what do you think they should have taken away from watching the effort that you and your teammates gave?

MAX DUGGAN: I think the love that we've got for each other, the love that we've got for this university, for this school to be proud of a team that's out there on the field. I know we came up short, but this team competes, they fight. They fight for each other. They fight for this university.

There's nothing more that we wanted for this team and this school, and we fell short. We're sorry for that.

Q. Are you the kind of guy that follows the rankings and sees where you're ranked and who you're battling with and those kinds of things?

MAX DUGGAN: I don't really care, especially at this moment. Wherever they tell us we're playing, that's where we'll go play.

Q. Quentin, in the football game, do you feel like they left a couple of pass interference penalties in their pockets as far as the referees go against you guys tonight?

QUENTIN JOHNSTON: You could say that about passing. You could say that about a few plays. But I think at the end of the day, it was a hard fought game. Shout out to them, congratulations, all that type of stuff.

Like I said, it's a lot of plays in that game I feel like should have been our way, and I'm pretty sure they feel like some plays that we did and got away with could have been in their favor. So it kind of goes either way. But at the end of the day, the game's over.

Q. How are you feeling right now? Undefeated season didn't happen, and now you kind of have to wait to find out what happens next.

QUENTIN JOHNSTON: I mean, I'm not the best right now obviously. We've been winning all season, and we just took our first loss of the season. From the beginning of the year, that's not something we're used to, so it's going to take a minute. I'm doing the best I can.

Q. It's really for both of you all. Obviously first loss of the season, both of you all, tenured leaders, captains. How much of it is on y'all to get the team ready because there's even more for you this season after a tough loss.

QUENTIN JOHNSTON: Obviously being a captain is a big responsibility, especially as you said, coming off the first

loss. It's our job to shake that off faster than most other people on the team, and from the time we get back to the time we start practice in the morning, kind of just getting everybody's mind off of having the short term memory about what happened today and continue moving forward with starting in film, practice, nutrition, everything that goes into that.

DEE WINTERS: I think he pretty much hit the nail on the head. We've just got to come back and use it as a stepping stone for us and come out and kind of use it as motivation to just come out and get better and get ready for the next game.

Q. Dee, you guys are obviously down quite a few guys at your position. What does that change for you knowing that you and Jamoi (Hodge) and Shad (Banks) are going to be out there for the majority of the game? How were you feeling near the end there?

DEE WINTERS: It kind of messed us up a little bit, but we all believe in each other as linebackers, whether that be second team, third team, stuff like that. We just got to come out and execute the plays that we practice in practice and just do that. We didn't do a very good job of that today.

Q. Dee, I asked Quentin this before you got here. How are you feeling, and how is the team right now, and what will the next 24 hours be like for you guys while you wait?

DEE WINTERS: It just sucks, to finally get to a championship. That's something that we talked about as soon as the new staff came here, just talking about championships. And the fact that we got here and we weren't able to pull it off, it sucks.

But like I just said, we're going to try to use this as motivation to come out and prepare for the next game.

Q. I've got somebody arguing with me and saying that TCU should not be in the top four. I'm curious what you guys feel about that. Quentin, it looked like after the game you were taking in a moment for a second.

What were you internalizing there?

QUENTIN JOHNSTON: Obviously that's the position we wanted to be in, and I kind of put it in my head at the moment that I wanted to be there to see the confetti fell down, whether we won or lost. Obviously we lost, but I kind of just wanted to take that all in and feel that, kind of the hurt of that and embrace that.

Me being a captain, it's my job to shake off all the hurt. So I kind of want to take that to the chest, shake it off on the field, and then come back in the locker room and try to motivate everybody for future games and stuff like that.

Q. Do you guys think you should be in the final four?

QUENTIN JOHNSTON: Absolutely.

DEE WINTERS: Most definitely.

Q. What is your resume?

DEE WINTERS: We feel like as a defense we didn't play what we're capable of doing. We had a lot of busted coverages, and they executed on that. I believe we should be in the top four, and we're going to prove that next game.

Q. What do you think about Max's toughness and seeing what he lays out there on the line?

QUENTIN JOHNSTON: It really brings the team up every time we get in sort of a dark place, the usual ups and downs throughout a football game, which is expected, but he's always the one to come, especially with the offense, kind of be that spark.

Because sometimes, obviously as you can see, we get a little down. We get several three and outs in a row, and he always finds a way to make a big play first down. Obviously every time he runs, you see him on the ground side. He's dead tired, but he continues to get up and fight each play.

That just kind of motivates everybody to go the extra yard, not only for our teammates but for him. As an offense, it's just very motivational. Obviously he puts a lot on his shoulders, being the quarterback.

Q. For both of you guys, there's been a lot of talk throughout, I'd say, the second half of the season about Max Duggan and the Heisman conversation. He's largely deflected that. I think that's his personality. What are your thoughts on him in that conversation?

DEE WINTERS: I think Max is a great guy. He comes to work every day, and he kind of proved that today as he went out there and pretty much drained his body to fight for a touchdown when we needed it the most and the most adverse time.

It means a lot to have Max as our quarterback, and he proved tonight that he's worthy of the Heisman. I believe that.

Q. Quentin, I know you're down right now, but you and Jared (Wiley) had big plays in the game today. What is it like to represent Temple, Texas on the national stage this year?

QUENTIN JOHNSTON: It means a lot because obviously somebody comes -- not just me, but for everybody else specifically since you asked about being from Temple, that's something like any kid wants to do when they make it to the next level, make it to the next two levels. Kind of just put on for the city. Kind of represent them and kind of give the younger kids with no hope in your city kind of a sense of, okay, I can do it.

Obviously we've been performing on the big stage being from the same area on the same team, which is kind of ironic, but you know a good thing too.

It means a lot. It kind of, along with those things, adds extra motivation to us to keep going. This is a good example. They see us down. We lost. Obviously not the best, but they're going to see how we continue to bounce back for us, so like the team used to feed them and give them good motivation back at home.

Q. If you're not selected for the College Football Playoffs, what will be your message as the leaders in this locker room?

DEE WINTERS: We faced adversity our entire season. We've got to go out and prepare like we are going to the playoffs and handle that situation and take it like a man and come out and practice every day, regardless if we're in the top four or not.
