MICHIGAN NOTES

- With today's win, Michigan claims its 45th Big Ten Championship and second in a row.
- Michigan improves to 13-0, establishing a program record for wins in a single season.
- Running back Donovan Edwards was selected the Grange-Griffin Most Valuable Player, according to a media vote. Edwards rushed 25 times for 185 yards and one touchdown in Saturday's victory. Edwards is the fourth running back to earn the Grange-Griffin MVP award in Big Ten Football Championship Game history, joining Wisconsin's Montee Ball (2012), Ohio State's J.K. Dobbins (2017) and Ohio State's Trey Sermon (2020).
- Quarterback JJ McCarthy is now 12-0 as a starter, extending his program record for starts without a loss. The previous record-holder was Dennis Franklin (1972), who won his first 10 starts before suffering a loss.
- The Wolverines have scored points on their opening possession in 11 of 13 games this season (eight touchdowns, three field goals).
- Michigan is the third school to win consecutive Big Ten Conference Football Championship Games (Michigan 2021-22, Ohio State 2017-18-19-20 and Wisconsin 2011-12).
- Head coach Jim Harbaugh is the third coach to go 2-0 at the Big Ten Football Championship Game, joining both Bret Bielema (currently at Illinois; went 2-0 while at Wisconsin) and Ryan Day (2-0 at Ohio State).
- Harbaugh is one of five coaches to win multiple Big Ten Football Championship Game titles, along with Ohio State's Urban Meyer (3), as well as Bielema, Day and Michigan State's Mark Dantonio (2).
- Michigan has won more games (25) during the past two seasons than any two-year stretch in school history.
- McCarthy's second-quarter touchdown completion to Luke Schoonmaker was his 10th TD pass away from home this season (road & neutral site). Among Big Ten quarterbacks, only Purdue's Aidan O'Connell (11) has posted more.
- McCarthy's two-point conversion pass to Schoonmaker in the fourth quarter was only the fourth two-point conversion in Big Ten Football Championship Game history and the first since 2017 (Wisconsin's Alex Hornibook completed a pass to Troy Fumagalli).

PURDUE NOTES

- With 162 receiving yards, Charlie Jones became Purdue's single-season leader in reception yardage with 1,361, passing John Standeford's 1,307 yards in 2002.
- With 71 rushing yards, Devin Mockobee now has 920 yards this season, passing Markell Jones (875) for the most yards by a Boilermaker freshman in a single season.
- Mockobee's first quarter rushing touchdown was just the third first-quarter rushing TD allowed by Michigan since the start of the 2021 season.
- Mockobee becomes just the fourth Purdue player since 2000 to score a rushing TD against an opponent ranked in the top two of the Associated Press poll and the third player to do it away from West Lafayette.
- Mitchell Fineran set Big Ten Football Championship Game records by kicking five field goals and scoring 16 points (5 FG, 1 PAT) via kicking. The previous record for field goals in a game was three, done twice before (Michael Geiger, IOWA vs. MSU, 12/5/2015; Blake Haubeil, OSU vs. NU, 12/19/2020). The previous record for kicking points in a game was 11 by Sean Nuernberger (1 FG, 8 PAT) of Ohio State vs. Wisconsin on Dec. 6, 2014.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- For the second time in Big Ten Football Championship Game, the score was tied after one quarter (7-7). The only other tie after one quarter came in 2015, when Michigan State and Iowa were deadlocked, 3-3, with MSU going on to win, 16-13.
- Michigan's 14-13 halftime lead was the narrowest halftime margin in Big Ten Football Championship Game history. The previous closest halftime spread had also been in 2015, when Iowa led Michigan State, 6-3.
- Saturday night's attendance of 67,107 was the second-largest crowd in Big Ten Football Championship Game history. The record of 67,183 fans was set in 2021.

- For the second straight year, the Wolverines earned a win in the Big Ten Championship game at Lucas Oil Stadium. The Wolverines now have a league-leading 44 Big Ten titles.
- U-M reached 13 wins for the first time in program history.
- It is the fifth season of 10-plus wins in eight years under head coach Jim Harbaugh. Michigan's 25 wins over the last two seasons (2021-22) represent the highest combined total over any two-year stretch in program history.
- The Wolverines are Big Ten Champions in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2003-04. The last consecutive conference titles came in 1991-92.
- In 60 all-time meetings with Purdue, U-M has improved to 46-14 overall after today's win. U-M has won five straight games in the series and both games under Harbaugh (2017).
- The game was attended by 67,107, marking a sellout at Lucas Oil Stadium. Only last year's Big Ten Championship game was better attended (67,183).
- The Boilermakers have a penchant for knocking off top-ranked opponents, but U-M is 11-2 in 13 meetings with Purdue when U-M is a top-10 ranked team.
- U-M's 15-game conference win streak is the program's longest since a 16-game conference win streak spanning 1996-98.
- Quarterback J.J. McCarthy has begun his career as a starter with a 12-0 record, setting a new standard for most wins to begin a starting quarterback's career before his first loss. The previous record-holder was Dennis Franklin (1972), who won his first 10 starts before suffering a loss.
- McCarthy matched a career-best mark with three touchdown passes. He also threw a successful two-point conversion.
- The Wolverines averaged nearly six yards per carry and out-rushed the Boilermakers, 225-90.
- For the fourth time this season, the Michigan offensive line did not permit a sack.
- U-M's first points of the day came from a 25-yard passing connection between McCarthy and tight end Colston Loveland. It was Loveland's second career touchdown after he caught one at Ohio State last weekend.
- Tight end Luke Schoonmaker added a score of his own, and a career-long 40-yard catch later in the game. He later caught a two-point conversion.

- Running back Donovan Edwards recorded a 60-yard carry to begin the second half. It marked Edwards' fifth career run of 50-plus yards and the first that was not a touchdown.
- Edwards went over 100 yards rushing for the fourth time this season and the second week in a row (216 yards at Ohio State).
- Edwards also set a new career-high in carries (25). His previous career-high was 22.
- Swiss-army-knife linebacker/running back Kalel Mullings' second-quarter touchdown run was the first score of his career and he added a second rushing touchdown with 1:22 to play in the fourth quarter.
- McCarthy was intercepted late in the third quarter, snapping a streak of 148 straight attempts without an interception. It was the longest active streak in the Big Ten.
- Two Wolverine defenders set new career-highs in tackles: Junior Colson (15), Rod Moore (14, 9 of which were solo).
- Four different players combined for four sacks and seven total players combined for seven tackles for a loss on defense.
- Defensive back Will Johnson made a key interception with the Boilermakers in the red zone with less than 10 minutes left in the third quarter. He then added another with under 10 minutes in the fourth quarter while Purdue was backed up against its own end zone. Johnson has three interceptions since joining the starting lineup at Rutgers last month.
- Edge rusher Jaylen Harrell recorded his first career multi-sack game with 2.0 in the first half.
- U-M has scored points on its opening possession in 11 of 13 games this season (eight touchdowns, three field goals).
- Kicker Jake Moody recorded five PATs today, giving him 58 for the season to break his program record set last season (56).
- No team has reached 150 yards on the ground against Michigan this season.
- Moody's 132 points this year are just six points shy of Desmond Howard (1991, 138 points) for the single-season record for points scored.

So last week was tough. Going into the IU game, my head wasn't really there, if I'm honest. The coaching staff was gracious enough to let me go home for a few days and spend some time with my family. I think that was much needed.

I felt a lot better this week than I did last week, but it's been a little crazy. It's going to be good to get some time to relax and spend some more time with my family hopefully.

Q. Jeff, just talk about the missed opportunities tonight, settling for too many field goals and not being able to get in the end zone. What were some of the issues in the red zone and the inability of the offense to turn those field goals into touchdowns?

JEFF BROHM: I think probably the main one is that's a really, really good football team. Once you get inside the 20, it's tough to run the ball in the first place on them; and then, secondly, they tighten up the coverage.

And they did a good job. We couldn't score touchdowns, and we tried. So they stopped us, and, unfortunately, it for sure hurt us. Field goals aren't going to be good enough to win in those type of games.

Those are things that you have to look at and figure out what maybe we could have done different, but I'm going to have to give them a lot of credit. That's a good football team. We found a way to move the ball up and down the field a little bit, but they stiffened up once we got inside the 20, and they did a good job. I give them a lot of credit.

Q. Coach Brohm, could you sort of explain what it is that Michigan has or does that makes them a difficult team to play against?

JEFF BROHM: I think when you look at Michigan, they're very talented, so they have the players at all the positions, the size you'll want, the speed, the athleticism. You combine that with really good coaching, where they're going to win with their running game and great defense and try to force you into making turnovers.

JEFF BROHM: Really proud of our football team. They've done a great job this year. They've battled through a lot, like other teams do, but some ups and downs, and they continue to play hard and work hard. They found a way to get in a championship-level game, like we did today, which is tremendous. We had a great atmosphere. Our fans really turned out, as well as Michigan's.

We hung in there. We had our chances. I thought we played hard. I thought we competed. Unfortunately, the other team came out in the second half and exposed their will on us a little bit and got after us. We couldn't answer the bell.

So credit to Michigan. A really good football team. They're well-coached, but I'm thankful for the effort our players gave.

Once again, I'm really thankful for our fans. It was tremendous to see them out there. It really motivates our players to work hard, and even the ones that watch on TV. Our fans have been great all year.

Q. Aidan, first, my deepest condolences to you and your family. If you don't mind, what has the last week and a half been like for you leading up to this game?

THE MODERATOR: Question for Aidan.

AIDAN O'CONNELL: It's been very difficult, as you would imagine. You know, when you first hear of news like that, it's shock and denial and just a lot of emotions.



They didn't panic when the game was close in the third quarter. They came out and established their will and ran the ball right at us and created some big plays and extended the lead.

So they're just a really talented football team. They played a lot of good football all year long. It's hard to go 13-0, and they did, so you have to give them a lot of credit. Of course, now they have a chance to do something even more special.

Q. Charlie, you've known Aidan virtually your entire life. You know his family. What have you seen from him the way he has handled all of this, played well against Indiana, played well today? What have you learned about him through a very difficult process?

CHARLIE JONES: Yeah, I just think it proves how tough he is. Obviously it's super tough to get news like that, and with such a great family and to see him come out last week and want to be there with the team and help the team do something special is just amazing.

And then on top of that, to play the way that he did, it just really shows the leader that he is and how much he means to this team.

Q. Charlie, the monster numbers for you, I wonder if you could speak to having kind of a fearlessness when you are going up against a big opponent like that and the determination you showed kind of embodying the Purdue engine, if you will?

CHARLIE JONES: Yeah, I mean, I feel like that just comes with preparation and believing in the things that we do here and believing in the training that I've put in this, this team has put in just to be able to go out there in games like that and be able to perform.

Q. Jeff, now that you've been through this experience of this week with this championship game, how much should this and can this fuel future potential success for this program?

JEFF BROHM: Well, it's great for our program to reach this point, the championship level game. Our fans to experience it. Doesn't mean it's going to happen again. Every year is new, and you've got to continue to find ways to improve the next team and go out and compete.

Now hopefully some of your guys get the feeling of what it was like to play in this type of game because it was awesome. It was awesome for our guys. They love competing. They love practicing this week. They wanted to come out here and try to put on a good show.

So sometimes that motivates guys to want to work harder, and you hope that happens. So, you know, we'll see what the future holds. I know our team is built on hard work and grinding to get better, and we're not scared to take on anybody, and we're able to take some hits in the chin and punches in the gut and get back up and keep competing. So I hope that our team -- that's what it takes to win.

On a side note, these two guys next to me, Aidan and Charlie, in my opinion exemplify what college football is all about. Both those guys started at the bottom, and they worked their way up, and look where they're at now. You have Aidan O'Connell who put on a tremendous passing performance, and he has since he has gotten here and just continues to work and get better. He is a great teammate and hangs in there and makes throws and competes to the end.

Of course, Charlie was fearless. Not only how he plays, but also taking chances, going from one school to the other just to go out and prove what exactly what he can do. He came here, and he has been a great teammate. Our players love him. He competes every day. He has been injured quite a bit of the year and not able to practice as much as you like, but he comes out here and works.

Just really great people that exemplify what a Boilermaker is, and we couldn't be prouder of these young men.

Q. Jeff, basically the same question I asked Charlie. What you have learned about Aidan through the past two weeks or so.

JEFF BROHM: Well, with myself I knew what Aidan was all about. He has always had strong faith. He has always been a hard worker. He has always been able to figure out what was right and how to handle it.

Of course, when something like that happens, we just want to be there for him. There's not a whole lot we can do other than just try to support him because it's tough. It's tough. No one wants to see that happen to anybody, but we knew what Aidan was all about, and I'm glad the whole country does now. Because he is a terrific young man. He does everything right off the field. I can't think of anything bad to say whatsoever.

He competes on the field. He is a great teammate, and I know he has a bright future.

Q. Coach, you mentioned that you felt like field goals alone weren't going to be able to take care of it today. Any of those five opportunities in or around the red zone did you ever think of going for fourth down to try



to either convert or get a touchdown to light some fire and get some more points on the board?

JEFF BROHM: Yeah, we did. I think a lot of them were third or fourth and longs. Unfortunately, from, like, the 10 or the 12 or even farther. So those chances aren't very good.

Then we looked at kind of the points and trying to measure how many touchdowns or points we needed since. So, yeah, we could take a lot of things back. I just think we do not convert down in there.

They got up on us. They guarded us. They got pressure. You couldn't hold it too long. We weren't really being real efficient running the ball in that area either, so it's just they did a good job.

So, unfortunately, I knew at some point it was going to cost us, and, of course, in the second half it cost us because they turned it on offense and really picked up the intensity on defense as well.

Q. Aidan, I'm wondering your thoughts on how tough it was facing Michigan and what your thoughts will be when you walk out of here as far as the game goes?

AIDAN O'CONNELL: Yeah, obviously a very good team, as Coach said. Not only good scheme and coaching but great athletes, and they recruit well. Obviously, a storied program.

You know, they were tough to beat. We were going to have to play a near perfect game to win, and, you know, just touchdowns and turnovers is what football is about, and we turned the ball over and didn't score touchdowns, so it's hard to beat a team like that.

But I'm proud of our guys. We did a great job of battling. Guys playing hurt, guys playing backs against the wall, and just finding a way to make plays. Obviously it wasn't enough, but super proud of our team.

Q. Aidan, just wondering how you felt at halftime and whether you felt that you guys had maybe outplayed them or even how did you feel going into that second half after the first half?

AIDAN O'CONNELL: Yeah, we were confident. We felt we played a good half, and obviously down one, but we needed a fake punt to put points.

But we felt like we were moving the ball and playing pretty good defense. Obviously J.J. made some good plays scrambling, but, you know, we were moving the ball. We

just needed some touchdowns. I think if we scored a couple of touchdowns early on instead of field goals, I think it feels a lot different.

I remember in 2017 my freshman year we played Michigan, and we were up 10-7 at half, and it felt the same way. Like we could hang with them. Obviously didn't win the game.

Yeah, we had confidence going into the half.

Q. Charlie, Coach mentioned kind of the long journey that you've been on to get to this point. Do you feel like you had something to prove coming to Purdue, and why do you feel like you've been able to fit so well with this system?

CHARLIE JONES: Yeah, I feel like that was the purpose of making the transition to Purdue to come in and prove that I'm a receiver, and I'm capable of doing that as well as special teams.

Just thankful for that opportunity in coming here and being able to do it with people like these guys.

THE MODERATOR: Thanks, fellows. Jeff, I think we're going to ask you to take a couple more. Anything else for Coach Brohm?

Q. Michigan second halves have been kind of magical for them. The running game really gets going in the second half. Talk about what goes into that and what you saw of them turning the corner in the second half?

JEFF BROHM: Well, they do a great job of playing smash-mouth football, running the football, running it at you, wearing you out, playing really good defense with it. They came out in the second half, and they just ran a simple play right off the edge. We had a corner right there. He missed the tackle and went a long ways, but they put a lot of tight ends in, and they make your secondary tackle. You know, we didn't tackle a couple of times.

I thought in the first half we did a pretty good job keeping them in check for the most part. They also got a quarterback who can run around and make some plays, which he did.

So I just think they have a really good combination on offense of big, physical linemen, great running backs, a lot of really good tight ends. Now a dynamic quarterback. They can score points when they want to. They're going to wear out and pound the running game and let their defense help them win as well.

I just think it's good complementary football and a good recipe for a lot of wins, and they're 13-0 now.

JIM HARBAUGH: First, I would like to thank the parents of the Michigan Wolverine players for raising such tremendous young men. Not just these two super sophs right here, but all of them.

They just help us win in every way on the field, off the field, through perseverance, character, and mostly love. It's been that kind of a team. It's beyond culture. It's a brotherhood. Just truly.

I've talked about it being a happy mission, not a grim mission. It's been a mission of God. I want to thank our parents for how they've raised these youngsters. I mean, they are amazing. Parents, what they've poured into these young men from such an early age. Esteeming them when they're young and all the practices and everything they drove them to and took them to. Just the support and love that they give them.

It's an amazing group of players, and I just want the parents to take a deep long bow for the kind of young men that they've raised.

Q. Jim, the common thread in your big games is the big rushing yards in the second half. It's kind of off the charts. Talk about everything that goes into your running game in the second half of these big games.

JIM HARBAUGH: It's a really good game plan. It's a really good offensive line, and it's been -- I mean, this guy has 401 yards in the last two games. You want to talk about big games? This guy comes alive in the big games.



And Blake Corum has been a warrior too that same way. But, I mean, those are two supreme backs, Blake Corum and Donovan Edwards.

This guy, when it's a big game, I mean, his whole career, whether it was high school, college now, I mean, he just hits another gear. He takes off to another level.

And J.J., I mean, he does the same thing in the running game. I mean, pretty dynamic two guys right there. And credit to a lot of places, you know? But, yeah, that's what I would say.

And talking about J.J. and Donovan, but talking about the entire squad. I mean, every guy to a man. So, I'll probably step out and let you talk to these guys. Otherwise, I'll get a little emotional (laughing). Is that okay?

J.J. McCARTHY: We love it, Coach.

JIM HARBAUGH: Love you. Thank you.

Q. Jim talked about the parents and how it helped him -- how it helped you guys become a better family overall. What do you guys feel like Jim Harbaugh has done to both of you guys and your fellow student-athletes as a father figure to help you grow in your career and education and football?

DONOVAN EDWARDS: You know, he is a great coach. As he just said, he has never changed. Every single day is just like he comes in the same person. Like since my recruitment I haven't seen him change. Not once.

Like, he just shows us tremendous love. You know? He speaks so highly of us, and it's just, like, it makes you want to play for him. You know? Yeah, it's like you want to play for Coach Harbaugh.

J.J. McCARTHY: I would just say, like, that consistency is something that's really hard to find. That's a guy who has got it.

And everything he does from just a leadership standpoint, a problem-solver standpoint, he is to the T. Like Donovan said, it's just genuine, true love. He really does love us like his own sons, and he means that, and that just means a lot because there's a lot of college football coaches out there that just think of their players as numbers. DONOVAN EDWARDS: I'm going to add one more thing to that. J.J. said he will do anything for us. One of our teammates had a kid, and he said that he would take the kid in, you know, like raise him up.

Q. For both players, you've won the Big Ten twice in a row. Going back to the playoff. I assume that experience will help. What do you think about your chances going forward?

J.J. McCARTHY: I love our chances. Last year it was kind of the bright lights, everything was new, Big Ten Championship, College Football Playoff. Going into the offseason it gave us so much momentum, and we knew that we could get there, and we could get back. Ultimately, this whole offseason it was about winning it.

So at the end of the day everything is great that happened today, but job is not finished. We've got a lot bigger plans in mind.

DONOVAN EDWARDS: Everything he just said.

Q. J.J., for you I have a nice picture of you here with Aidan O'Connell. He has had a tough week with losing his brother. Can you speak from a quarterback's perspective about his toughness that he demonstrated on the field today?

J.J. McCARTHY: Yeah, I shot him a DM earlier last week, just sending my love and prayers to him and his family. He is from Illinois, and that means a lot just seeing him and what he has done this year and what he has done through his whole career. That kid is a fighter. He is a fighter, from the get-go he stepped on campus.



I was just so proud to see him go out there and do his thing and play the sport that he loves, and he didn't shake one bit.

I mean, that quarterback fraternity, especially like us Illinois QBs, we stick together. We're tight-knit. I love that guy. I truly do. I'm right beside him with everything he stands for, and I'm just really excited to see what he does with the rest of his career.

DONOVAN EDWARDS: I'm sorry. If I could add, I didn't know that his brother that died, and I want to send my wishes and my prayers to his family and to him as well.

Q. Donovan, in the first half I think you had 37 rushing yards. You finished with 185 tonight. Big second half. Big second half at Ohio State. What is it about crunch time that really gets you going in games?

DONOVAN EDWARDS: Like Coach Harbaugh said, I believe, you know, I rise to those occasions. I thrive for that. Excuse me. You know, it's just easy too when I have tremendous teammates that I call my brothers around me. You know, they show me love. They believe in me.

Also, too, I believe, like, I'm made for the big moments, you know?

Q. J.J., I know you were there last year in Miami on the field at the end of the game. Donovan, I believe you may have been as well.

DONOVAN EDWARDS: Yeah, I was.

Q. When Georgia was celebrating, you guys stood there and really took it in. How much did that drive you, and how much does that continue to motivate you as you now find yourselves on the verge of being able to compete in that same game again this year?

They have trust in me. They have trust in J.J. and everybody else on the team. So, I mean, it's just easy running behind those boys.

J.J. McCARTHY: It's something we just expect every week because they put it out every week. I mean, I'll say it and keep saying it. Best offensive line in the country, hands down.

We're able to pass and run as efficiently as we've been doing all year, and it's all because of them.

DONOVAN EDWARDS: That's right. Hey, please give them the Joe Moore Award, again, please.

J.J. McCARTHY: They deserve it.

DONOVAN EDWARDS: Come on now, quit playing with them.

Q. For both of you guys, Purdue is only an hour away, and yet this game almost felt like a home game. For you guys, what was that experience like in that atmosphere, kind of in a home-away-from-home kind of a setting?

DONOVAN EDWARDS: You know, it's kind of -- this is basically -- I would say this is our home too, you know? We've been here last year, this year, and when we did our walk-through yesterday, it was just like, yeah, this is -- like, this is our home right here.

So, you know, we were, like, completely comfortable because a bunch of us, like, have already played here last year, so it was just another day in the office.

J.J. McCARTHY: I think it speaks testament to our fan base. Now it's the greatest fan base in the country. They travel. We're out Northeast playing at Rutgers, and it feels like a home game.

DONOVAN EDWARDS: That's true.

J.J. McCARTHY: They do such an amazing job supporting us, and we can't thank them enough. Appreciate y'all.
