• **Defensive At The Start.** Both teams went three-and-out on their first possessions, combining for minus-11 net yards ... and:

• **Three & Outs (Or Worse):** As expected, defenses shined for the most part: Michigan forced five three and outs, now not allowing a first down this season on **71** of **153** possessions (not including kneel-downs); Alabama forced four, and it ended the year not allowing a first down on **61** of **160** opponent drives.

• **Third CFP Overtime.** This was the third overtime game in CFP history, the second at the Rose Bowl (2018, Georgia defeated Oklahoma, 54-48, in two overtimes). This was the second for 'Bama, which beat Georgia in overtime that same year for the title.

• **Ninth of 160.** The scoreless third quarter was just the **ninth** this bowl season (out of 160, with the Sugar and CFP title games to go).

## **Postgame Notes: Michigan vs. Alabama**

### **January 1, 2024**

- With 14 victories this season, U-M has set a single-season program record and became the 12th team since 2000 to reach at least 14 wins without a loss, joining: 2002 Ohio State, 2009 Alabama, 2010 Auburn, 2013 Florida State, 2015 Clemson, 2016 Alabama, 2018 Alabama, 2018 Clemson, 2019 Clemson, 2019 LSU, 2022 Georgia.
- In the sixth all-time meeting between U-M and Alabama, the Wolverines improved to 3-3 all-time. It was the first-ever meeting between the two programs in the Rose Bowl and the fifth postseason meeting.
- The Wolverines played today in the program's 21st Rose Bowl and improved to 9-12 all-time.
- In a matchup of the two winningest programs in college football history, U-M earned program win No. 1,003. Alabama has 965 victories.
- The Rose Bowl was Michigan's first overtime game of the year and the program's first since 2020, when the Wolverines defeated the Rutgers Scarlet Knights 48-42. All-time, U-M has won 14 of its 17 total overtime games. It also marked the first CFP game to go to overtime under the new rules, which force teams to go for two after the first set of scores.
- The Rose Bowl was U-M's third bowl game to go to overtime in program history. In those three games, the Wolverines are a perfect 3-0, previously defeating the Crimson Tide in the 2000 Orange Bowl and the Virginia Tech Hokies in the 2012 Sugar Bowl.
- In quarterback J.J. McCarthy's 27 career starts, U-M is 26-1 for a winning percentage of 96.3, the best mark by any starting quarterback in at least the last 20 years. That win rate ranks above those of Trevor Lawrence (34-2; 94.4), Tua Tagovailoa (22-2; 91.7), and others.
- McCarthy (2,851) eclipsed his 2022 season passing total (2,719) and passed both his coach Jim Harbaugh (2,729, 1986) and Chad Henne (2,743, 2004) to advance to sixth all-time for passing yards in a season.
- With three touchdown passes in the Rose Bowl, McCarthy (49) passed Rick Leach (48) and tied Denard Robinson (49) for fourth in career passing touchdowns at Michigan.
- With his 17-yard rush in overtime, running back Blake Corum (25 this season, 56 in his career) added to his program single-season rushing touchdown record and passed Anthony Thomas (55) to own the outright career rushing touchdowns record at Michigan.
- Corum's first-quarter receiving touchdown was the third of his career and put him at 150 points scored during the 2023 season, setting a new single-season record for most points scored (previous: Jake Moody, 147 in 2022).
- Wide receiver Tyler Morris scored his first career touchdown on his longest career reception, a 38-yard receiving score in the second quarter.

- With his fumble recovery in the fourth quarter, defensive back Josh Wallace has contributed to a turnover in two consecutive games, having forced a fumble against Iowa in the Big Ten Championship Game.
- The Wolverines registered five sacks in the first half alone, matching their previous single-game season best in just 30 minutes and setting an all-time College Football Playoff record for sacks in a half per AP Sports (four by Clemson in the 2016 National Championship game). It was just the fourth time in Nick Saban's tenure at Alabama that the Tide have suffered five sacks in a half, per ESPN Stats and Info (previous games in 2021, 2013, 2010). U-M finished the game with seven sacks.
- Alabama's 288 total offensive yards marked a season low (previous: 306). U-M has allowed only two teams over 300 total offensive yards this season (Nebraska, 305; Ohio State, 395).

NICK SABAN: Well, obviously we're very disappointed about the outcome of the game. I don't think we played great in the first half, but I was really, really proud of the way our players played in the second half.

We just didn't finish the last four minutes of the game like we would like to, and we're all very disappointed, and the players are disappointed, as well.

But one thing that I told them in the locker room after the game, this is one of the most amazing seasons in Alabama football history in terms of where this team came from, what they were able to accomplish and what they were able to do, winning the SEC Championship, and really, really proud of this group.

I just wish that I could have done more as a coach to help them be successful and help them finish, and all we can do now is learn from the lessons that sometimes failings bring to us.

**Q. Coach Saban, what does this mean to have the opportunity, first of all, to play in the Rose Bowl Game, the granddaddy of them all to you, as a coach?**

NICK SABAN: Yeah, I grew up in the Big Ten, coached in the Big Ten for 12 years, and it was win the Big 12 Championship and go to the Rose Bowl. That was always special.

We've had several opportunities to do it, but this is a great atmosphere here today. It was a great football game. Congratulations to Michigan. They played a really good game.



I just wish that we could have finished a little better, but it was a great experience mere for our players, and we really appreciate all the Rose Bowl folks who did a wonderful job of creating some really, really fine hospitality for us all week long.

**Q. I was wondering if you could elaborate on why you said this was one of the best seasons for Alabama football given obviously you guys have won National Championships like you have?**

NICK SABAN: Well, I just think that I don't look at it necessarily from winning and losing, you won the championship, you can't win the championship. As a coach, you're always trying to get your team to improve and be the best that they can be, and I think this team probably improved from the South Florida game and the Texas game early in the season as much as any team I've ever coached.

That takes a lot of hard work. A lot of people being very committed to doing things that they need to do to self-assess and improve their game, and all these players bought in on this team and did it in first-class fashion.

That's why I think for me as a coach, maybe not for everybody else, it's one of the teams that I'll always remember the most and always be the most proud of.

**Q. Jalen, Coach said he wished you could have done more, but people were saying this was one of his best years coaching. What does Coach Saban mean to you and this team mean to you in general this year?**

JALEN MILROE: 100 percent. Coach means a lot to us. We play even harder knowing that Coach has the belief system in us. Just listening to him talk, he talks about how proud he is of this team.

We have a lot of things we can be proud of from this season. Could have easily lingered and past mistakes could have easily went in the tank when things weren't good, but the biggest thing was we continued to improve, continue to have singular focus in our approach when it





came to preparation and when it take to attacking the task at hand.

There's a lot of things to be proud of, but one thing I am proud of is how much Coach Saban harped on his belief system on us.

**Q. Coach Saban, in the first half they were sending blitzes and pressures, and I think they got to you four or five times in the first half. From a communication standpoint what was breaking down in the first half?**

NICK SABAN: Well, not one particular thing. There was a couple times where we could have redirected the protection, which we kind of put on the O-line to a large degree, and we didn't do it.

A couple times the shot clock was running down and we didn't get a chance to do it, and a couple times we didn't fan and miss-executed up front in terms of getting the right guys blocked when we were in the right protection.

It was a combination of several things. I thought we did a better job in the second half, but we didn't give Jalen an opportunity to make some plays, nor our receivers to make some plays down the field, which was a big part of this game.

**Q. Could you talk about the last play and made that one the best one that you wanted to go with?**

NICK SABAN: We called three plays. One they called time-out, one we called time-out, and the last one that didn't work. The fact that it didn't work made it a really bad call. You know what I mean?

But we called time-out because we had a bad look. We had a good look on the first one. They must have known it.

But Tommy just felt like the best thing that we could do was have a quarterback run, which was kind of our two-point play, one of our two-point plays for this game.

The ball was on the 3-yard line, which is just like a two-point play, but we didn't get it blocked so it didn't work. We didn't execute it very well and it didn't work.

They pressured and we thought they would pressure, but we thought we could gap them and block them and make it work, and it didn't.

**Q. How did you see that last play unfold, and why didn't it work from your perspective?**

JALEN MILROE: First thing, I'm appreciative of my

coaching staff for believing in me to have the ball in my hands on that last play. You win some, you lose some. That's all part of the game.

With anything, all it came down was fall back to your level of training, and we just failed on that play. That's all it was.

At the end of the day I just trusted the guys up front for believing in me on the last play to have the ball, and unfortunately we just missed and we just didn't get in the end zone.

**Q. Jalen, how much have you and Seth worked on that quarterback center exchange this year, and why in your mind was it still an issue at this point in the year?**

JALEN MILROE: With anything it takes preparation, whether it's pass protection, whether it's the running game, the passing game. The quarterback and the center have to have a great relationship and that's something that we tried to build throughout the whole season.

There's a multitude of things that me and Seth talk about in that regard. That's something that we do talk about.

**Q. Coach Saban, special teams was an area where you seemed to have a pretty big advantage tonight. It was a big reason I think you were only down three at halftime. Can you speak to special teams tonight?**

NICK SABAN: I think special teams did a good job tonight. We did a good job of controlling field position. I think both specialists did a really, really good job. James did a great job of punting.

They had time to maybe go two-minute at the end of the game, and the fact that Christian bobbled the 2-yard line or 1-yard line or whatever was really, really good.

Will made some huge kicks, what, two around 50-yard field goals. They missed a field goal, which put us in great position to have a chance to be successful at the end of the game.

But us not finishing a couple drives, and if you really analyze the game, one of the biggest things is we didn't play well enough on defense when we needed to, and the second thing is we had too many drive-stopping plays on offense. I mean, we shot ourselves in the foot. A sack is a drive-stopping play. Getting a penalty usually is a drive-stopping play.

Some of those things we self-inflicted. I told the players after the game, I told them before the game it's going to be about what we do, and when you look back at it, it's kind of



about what we did and what we didn't do.

Not taking anything away from Michigan. They played a great game. They've got a good team. They're really well-coached and wish them the best of luck in the future, but we could have done things a little better, as well. That's on me, on the coaches. It's not anybody else.

Appreciate what the media has done all year long. It's great you create a lot of interest in our sport. Thank you for that.

JIM HARBAUGH: Happy new year. Great way to start the new year off. Glorious. That was glorious. It was a tremendous football game. Congratulate Alabama on a terrific game and their great players and coaching staff and their fans. It was an epic game. Glorious is how I feel. That was a tremendous win.

**Q. Wanted to ask you, you talk a lot about getting to the apex, and you're as close as you've ever been on a collegiate level. I wonder what this moment means for you and what it would mean for you if you were to take that final step and win the National Championship?**

JIM HARBAUGH: Yeah. It's what it means to these guys, to our players the most, to them, to be champions, for their parents to have their son be a champion, their brothers and sisters, their grandparents, for our coaches, for my kids to have a dad be a champion, my parents, just those people to get to feel what that's like.

That's kind of long gone for me. My joy, my ecstatic joy is for our players and our coaches and our fans and our families, that they get to experience that joy of being a champion.

**Q. You guys gained 41 yards of offense in the second half until that last drive when your backs were totally to the wall. What enabled you guys to have the drive you had, tie it up? And talk about what Blake did on the game-winning touchdown.**

JJ MCCARTHY: I would just say credit to a great defense. They played tremendous. They had a great game plan for us. It's just all about focusing on the next play, one play at



a time, and just staying in the present moment and worrying about the assignment that you have to go out and execute.

We weren't really getting things going, but that never bothered us because it is all in the past and we are focusing on staying in the present and controlling the future.

To answer your second question, everything that I see out of Blake on a day-to-day basis and everything that Blake is, when everyone is tired, when it's overtime, he's going to be the guy that shows out just like he does in sprints when we run them in the off-season.

It was nothing new for me. It was just amazing the world got to see it.

JIM HARBAUGH: I would just say that it's just the way this team depth is built and how connected they are as players and we are as a team. It's unanimous support for each and every guy.

It's almost been an unfair advantage, all the things that the team has gone through. We don't care anymore. Don't care what people say. Don't care about anything that comes up.

We just know we're going to overcome it because it's unanimous support from every single guy on the team.

Blake, the best. There's nobody we love more than Blake. Let's get Blake up here.

Yeah, and the guys up front, the front seven and the defense, the coverage on the back end, our offensive line, our tight ends, our running backs, just the physicality.

That was two teams that were really physical, really tough teams up front. I really felt this game was -- if ever a game was going to be won up front, it was going to be won with toughness and physicality, and our guys were just there in rhythm and got it done. Epic game. Epic game.

The stick-togetherness -- I guess what people don't know,



how could they know what the togetherness is like. There's just nothing that can separate these guys.

But Blake is the huge -- he's -- in so many ways JJ is the glue, Junior is the glue, Blake is the glue. I could name you 50 other guys that are the glue, but it is so tight.

**Q. JJ, you told me at Media Day that you've been staying up late preparing for these games. Did you prepare for a fourth quarter in overtime like this, and junior, how much did the defense manifest those stops to win this game?**

JJ McCARTHY: Yeah, you know, just having the month that we had to prepare, I just wanted to leave no stone unturned. Going back to 2017, 2018, 2019, all the way up until the present moment, just making sure that I was locked in on all cylinders in every situation, fourth quarter, overtime, 4th down, and that big completion to Blake.

Just everything about it was just making sure I was the most prepared guy on the field so I could go out there and help my teammates as best I can.

JUNIOR COLSON: First off, all glory to God but you just got to see the way our defense practices. It's all 11 on 1, never 1 on 11. That's the way we went out there and played, made those stops.

We're all playing with guys that we trust the guy next to us because we're brothers. Like Coach said, it's a big glue. We trust each other, and just got to go out there and make our plays.

JIM HARBAUGH: It also things that guys go through. They go through injuries. They go through tough training environments, practices, games. Those are the situations that I'm talking about.

Adversity, that's the adversity. They train so hard, like Junior said, they practice so hard, they play so hard. It's their individual mental toughness that gets them through, but it's also someone. It's also someone else, someone on the team, someone in their family, their teammate or teammates that's just right there by their side, right there that has their back.

And Ben Herbert, who's always there, right by their side. He is an absolute -- what adjective could you --

JJ McCARTHY: Trained assassin.

JIM HARBAUGH: That resonates. He's got their backs, and it's so much credit to Ben Herbert and his staff for putting us in those situations, putting us in those tough

training environment situations.

When it comes to these situations, I was calm that fourth quarter, that overtime. I just felt like there's nothing that we couldn't overcome inside of this stadium today.

**Q. Coach Harbaugh, that last play when Alabama had the ball, it looked like you guys went back and forth with time-outs. What did you see, and then when they finally snapped the ball, what did you see on defense?**

JIM HARBAUGH: Yeah, we just had everybody in there. It was everybody. We call it twister, and everybody there, everybody to the ball. Similar to Alabama, every time you get inside the 5-yard line, they're in zero every down.

Our favorite play, it'll be JJ's favorite play, got us in the end zone there when we really needed it.

Yeah, we were just -- we were just all out, selling out, and playing for that -- let Junior -- go ahead, Junior. Why don't you describe it.

JUNIOR COLSON: We were playing cover zero. Coach was telling us all the time like this is the moment we were built for. This is the moment we come out here to play for.

We knew exactly what was going to happen. When the moment gets tough, you go to your best player, and they went to their best player, and we were right there to stop it. We said it's 4th down, one last play, everybody strained, everybody strained to the ball.

JIM HARBAUGH: So much credit to Jesse Minter and Sherrone, Jay Harbaugh, all of our coaches.

**Q. You obviously represent the Big Ten when you go out there in a game like this, and this is the first time a Big Ten team has beaten an SEC team in the playoffs since the first year in 2014. What does that mean to you guys?**

JJ McCARTHY: It just means everything. Just think about how far we've come, all the hardships that we went through as a team and as a brotherhood. Just being able to do it on this stage. It's been 26 years since Michigan won in this building, and the second most appearance out of any college in the entire country playing in this game.

It's just amazing the way it happened, but ultimately it's everything that Coach said. We can't do it without the unity that we have, everything that we went through this entire year made us unbreakable, and in the biggest moments we were going to show up.



**Q. Coach Harbaugh, playing in the granddaddy of them all, the Rose Bowl, what does it mean to you?**

JIM HARBAUGH: Glorious. It was right where we wanted to be. It's everything that we worked for, everything that we prepared for, everything we hoped for, everything we trained and strained for.

The team was just not going to be denied. JJ said it when he walked off this same podium last year in the semifinal game. He said, we're going to be back. What he told me was not only are we going to be back, we're going to win. And there he did.

And in overtime against Alabama, I think the last quarterback to win in overtime against Alabama was none other than Tom Brady.

I've said it before, but right here, this is the greatest quarterback in University of Michigan -- college football history. Got a long way to go to get to get where Tom Brady eventually got to, which is the GOAT. He lapped the field when it comes to that.

But in a college career there's been nobody at Michigan better than JJ. I know we talk about it an amalgamation of quarterbacks. He is that guy.

My guy Junior Colson, man. Was it all worth it, all the training?

JUNIOR COLSON: Always.

JJ McCARTHY: It was all worth it.

**Q. JJ, the offensive line, when you had to have ball control, talk about that. What made it so special for you to be back there knowing the guys would give you time to make the plays you have to make to win the game?**

JJ McCARTHY: I mean, the offense doesn't go unless those big boys go. That's just been -- Coach Harbaugh mentioned it. This game was going to be won in the trenches, and I feel like they did a tremendous job taking out two great edge rushers, two great interior guys.

I've had people reach out to me like Brad Nessler. Great guy. Love him. He said, watch out for 15 and 41. They're coming for you.

I never really felt them all game just because of the tremendous job LaDarius did and Trente did and Keegs, Nug, Carson stepping up in a big time role. Everything about that unit just meshes so well together through the

adversity with Zach going down and just all the credit goes to them.

That's the heartbeat of our team. Blake would stand up here and say the same thing. Those big boys, we owe it all to them.

**Q. There's a lot of interest in your future; I wonder if you can tell me what the chances are that the championship game might be your last one at Michigan.**

JIM HARBAUGH: My future consists of a happy flight back to Ann Arbor, Michigan. Can't wait.
