GOODYEAR COTTON BOWL CLASSIC GAME NOTES

88th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic Friday, December 29 • AT&T Stadium

Tonight's game is the 88th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic and the 15th played at AT&T Stadium in Arlington.

Missouri won the coin toss and elected to defer its choice to the second half. Ohio State elected to receive to start the 88th Classic.

The 88th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic kicked off at 7:10 p.m. Central time.

FIRST QUARTER

Ohio State (3:12): Jayden Fielding 44-yard field goal. The Buckeyes drive was 5 plays, 27 yards and took 2:35 after a Missouri punt. OSU rushed 3 times for 23 yards and was 1-1 passing for 4 yards. OSU had 1 first down on the drive. **KEY PLAY:** On 1st and 10 from the Ohio State 47, **TreVeyon Henderson** took the handoff on the first play from scrimmage after the punt and went right for a 20-yard gain and a first down at the Missouri 33. **Ohio State 3**, **Missouri 0**.

Ohio State had 1 big play (1 pass of 15+ yards) during the drive.

END OF THE FIRST QUARTER: Ohio State 3, Missouri 0

The 3 combined points in the first quarter was the lowest in the opening period since Michigan State and Alabama were 0-0 after the first quarter in the College Football Playoff at the 80th Classic (12/31/2015).

SECOND QUARTER

No scoring

HALFTIME: Ohio State 3, Missouri 0

FIRST HALF NOTES

This is the lowest scoring first half (3 points) since SMU and Pittsburgh were tied 0-0 at halftime in the 1983 Classic (SMU beat Pitt 7-3).

There were a combined 12 punts in the first half (Missouri 6, Ohio State 6).

There were a combined 12 tackles for loss in the first half (Missouri 8 TFL for -23 yards, Ohio State 4 TFL for -14 yards).

There were a combined 6 sacks in the first half (Missouri 3 for -12 yards; Ohio State 3 for -13 yards).

Neither team reached the red zone in the first half.

Missouri averaged 3.5 yards per play in the first half (112 yards/32 plays), while Ohio State averaged 2.5 yards per play (76 yards/30 plays).

Missouri had 4 big plays in the first half (1 pass for 15+ yards and 3 rushes for 10+ yards). Ohio State had 3 big plays in the first half (3 rushes of 10+ yards), 1 of which went for 20 yards or longer.

Missouri held the ball for 14:46 in the first half (32 plays), while Ohio State had the ball for 15:14 (30 plays).

The teams combined for 10 first downs (Missouri 5, Ohio State 5) and were a combined 1-16 on third downs (Missouri 1-8, Ohio State 0-8).

THIRD QUARTER

Missouri chose to receive to begin the second half.

The 3 combined points marks the fourth that a Cotton Bowl Classic had 3 or fewer points scored through three quarters: 1947 Arkansas-LSU 0-0; 1959 TCU-Air Force 0-0; 1983 Pittsburgh 3, SMU 0 and 2023/88th Ohio State 3, Missouri 0

FOURTH QUARTER

Missouri (14:55): Cody Schrader 8-yard rush (**Harrison Mevis** kick). The Tigers drive was 8 plays, 95 yards and took 4:30 after an Ohio State punt. Missouri rushed 6 times for 43 yards and was 2-2 passing for 57 yards. There were 2 offensive penalties accepted for 10 yards and 1 defensive penalty accepted for 5 yards. The Tigers had 5 first downs on the drive. **KEY PLAYS:** On 1st and 10 at the Missouri 35, **Brady Cook** threw deep down the left sideline to Marquis Johnson for 50 yards to the Ohio State 15. Missouri scored when Schrader ran up the middle on 2nd and 2, and he ran 8 yards for the TD. <u>Missouri 7, Ohio State 3</u>.

Missouri had 3 big plays (2 rushes for 10+ yards and 1 pass for 15+ yards) during the drive.

Missouri (5:12): Cook 7-yard pass to **Luther Burden** (**Mevis** kick). The Tigers drive was 13 plays, 91 yards and took 6:10 after a Ohio State punt. Missouri rushed 9 times for 36 yards, was 2-2 passing for 38 yards and Ohio State was called for 1 accepted penalty for 15 yards. Missouri had 6 first downs on the drive. **KEY PLAYS:** On 2nd and 16 at the Missouri 14, Cook threw down the left sideline, where **Theo Wease Jr.** caught it for 31-yard gain to the Mizzou 45. Later in the drive, on 4th and 1 at the Ohio State 23, **Cook** faked a pitch and ran up the middle for 2 yards and a first down at the Ohio State 21. Missouri scored when **Cook** threw over the middle to **Burden** in the end zone on 2nd and goal from the Ohio State 7. <u>**Missouri 14, Ohio State 3**</u>.

Missouri had 2 big plays (1 rush for 10+ yards and 1 pass for 15+ yards) during the drive.

FINAL SCORE: Missouri 14, Ohio State 3

Missouri had 12 big plays in the game (9 rushes of 10+ yards and 3 passes of 15+ yards), 3 of which went for 20 yards or longer. Ohio State had 8 big plays (5 rushes of 10+ and 3 passes of 15+), 3 of which went for 20 yards or longer.

There were a combined 10 sacks (Ohio State 6, Missouri 4) and a combined 18 tackles for loss (Missouri 10, Ohio State 8).

There were a combined 16 punts in the Classic (Missouri 8, Ohio State 8). A total of 12 of those came in the first half (at one point, there were 8 combined drives that ended in a punt).

Missouri is 3-1 in Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic appearances, and the Tigers have won three straight Classics (2008, 2014, 2023/88th). In previous appearances, the Tigers lost to Texas 40-27 in 1946, beat Arkansas 38-7 in 2008 and defeated Oklahoma State 41-31 in 2014.

The Tigers are 16-20 (.444) all-time in bowl games.

The SEC is 25-16-1 overall in 42 appearances in the Cotton Bowl Classic.

Missouri finishes the season 8-2 vs. Autonomous 5 opponents, 5-2 vs. opponents with a winning record, 4-2 vs. teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 poll at the time of the game.

Missouri won for the second time in the series vs. Ohio State and the first time since 1976. The Tigers broke a 2-game losing streak to the Buckeyes. Ohio State holds a 10-2-1 record vs. Missouri all time.

The 14 points scored by Missouri tied for the fewest in a Tigers bowl victory (1962 Bluebonnet Bowl; 14-10 vs. Georgia Tech).

Missouri RB **Cody Schrader's** 128 yards tonight gave him the Missouri single-season record with 1,627 yards.

Ohio State is now 2-1 in Classic appearances (won 28-12 over Texas A&M in 1987; won 24-7 over Southern California in the 2017/83rd Classic).

Ohio State is 26-29 (.473) in 55 all-time bowl appearances.

The Big Ten is 5-2 (.714) overall in seven Classic appearances.

Ohio State defensive end **Jack Sawyer** had 3 sacks, which tied for 2nd in Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic history. His three sacks also tied an Ohio State bowl game record. He had 3.5 sacks for the season coming into the Classic.

For the second time in as many Classics, a team trailing at halftime went on to win the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic (2023/87th Tulane, 2023/88th Missouri).

- Missouri earned its second-ever win over Ohio State, pushing the all-time series to 2-10-1.
- Eli Drinkwitz wins his first bowl game at the helm of the program. The victory puts him at 28 in four years, the third-most in program history.
- The Tigers clinch their first 11-win season since 2014 and fourth in program history.
- Mizzou moves to 11-6 all-time in domes, and the 2023 season (Memphis, Ohio State) joins the 2008 season (Illinois, Northwestern) as the only tenures where MU won multiple games indoors.
- Missouri became 3-1 all-time in the Cotton Bowl Classic and 16-20 overall in bowl games. It's the programs first bowl win since Jan. 1, 2015, when they beat Minnesota in the Citrus Bowl to cap off its last 11-win season.

- Cody Schrader's 128-yard performance allowed him to become the single-season rushing leader in program history with 1,627, beating Tyler Badie's 2021 mark of 1,604.
- Playing just 25 games for the black-and-gold, Schrader's 2,243 yards on the ground these past two seasons ranks 15th in program history.
- By trailing Ohio State 3-0 entering the break, Missouri trailed for the first time this season heading into halftime.
- First time Missouri has been held scoreless in the first half in Drinkwitz' four years at Mizzou.
- Brady Cook ends his season with 3,317 passing yards and 21 touchdowns, each mark being inside the programs top ten lists (eighth and tied-ninth).

• Cook upped his career passing yardage total to 6,478, which ranks seventh on the Tigers' career list.

• Luther Burden III finished his sophomore campaign with 1,212 yards, the third most by a MU receiver (Jeremy Maclin in 2008, Danario Alexander in 2009). His 86 catches this season is the fourth-most by a Mizzou wideout, and a touchdown reception in the fourth quarter brought his season total to nine.

• The score was Burden III's 15th receiving touchdown of his career, tying L'Damian Washington (2010-13) for tenth all-time.

• Mizzou scored on in both of its trips to the red zone, extending its streak of red zone scoring conversions to 52 in a row. For the season, the Tigers have converted an FBS-best 56-of-57 scoring opportunities inside the opposition's 20-yard line.

DEFENSE

• The Tigers limited Ohio State to just 203 total yards, the Buckeyes' lowest game total since Nov. 21, 2015, versus Michigan State.

• OSU's three points is its lowest output on offense since Dec. 31, 2016, a Fiesta Bowl defeat to Clemson, 31-0.

• MU infiltrated the backfield all night long, garnering 10 tackles-for-loss, eight QB hurries, four sacks and two forced fumbles.

• Mizzou's defense pitched a shutout on third down in the first half, as the Buckeyes went 0-for-8 on third downs.

• The Missouri defense forced a three-and-out on Ohio State's first drive, marking the second game in a row the Buckeyes have had to punt after three plays on their opening possession.

• JC Carlies led the team with 11 total tackles, including a TFL and a sack.

• Triston Newson followed suit with 10 tackles of his own, and racked up 2.5 tackles-forloss.

SPECIAL TEAMS

• Harrison Mevis went 2-for-2 in PAT's today, pushing his career point total to 405, ranking

eighth in SEC history.

• Riley Williams booted eight punts for an average of 40.8 yards, landing five inside the 20 yard-line.

- Ohio State is now 26-29 in post-season bowl games. The 55 appearances are the most of any Big Ten team.
- The 203 total offensive yards and the three points by Ohio State represent the fewest in a game for a Ryan Day-coached team. The previous lows were 283 offensive yards vs. Northwestern in 2022 and 17 points vs. Notre Dame earlier this year.
- The 17 points ties the lowest scoring Ohio State bowl game, tying the 1985 Citrus Bowl (10-7 vs. BYU) and the 1958 Rose Bowl (10-7 vs. Oregon).
- Second-year QB Devin Brown started and thus became the first Ohio State QB to make his first-ever start in a bowl game.
- Brown came up limping late in the first quarter and was replaced at QB by true freshman Lincoln Kienholz, who had taken a total of 21 snaps this season (13 vs. Rutgers; eight vs. Michigan State). He entered the game 4-of-5 passing for 25 yards.
- Ohio State deviated from its 12-game regular season offensive line starting rotation by moving RG Matt Jones to C and replacing him at RG with Enokk Vimahi. This is Vimahi's second start; his first was vs. Michigan in 2022.
- Freshman TE Jelani Thurman made his first collegiate start, joining Gee Scott in a two-tight end set to start the game.
- This is the first time Ohio State has led at halftime by the score of 3-0 twice in the season. Ohio State also lead Notre Dame, 3-0, at Notre Dame Stadium on Sept. 23.
- Three quarterback sacks by Jack Sawyer were a career high.
- LB Cody Simon made a career-high and team-high 12 tackles.
- DT Ty Hamilton matched his career-high with six tackles, including a career-high two tackles for loss. His also collected a sack, giving him 4.5 on the season.
- The six receptions for wide receiver Emeka Egbuka are the most since he hauled in seven passes in the win over Notre Dame on Sept. 23.
- The Ohio State defense allowed more than 17 points just one time this season. The defense surrendered just 15 total touchdowns this season.

QUESTIONS FOR COACH ELIAH DRINKWITZ, QB BRADY COOK AND DL JOHNNY WALKER JR

COACH ELIAH DRINKWITZ: First, I just want to tip my hat to Ohio State and Ryan Day, and what a great team he has. So competitive, outstanding defense. They faced a lot of adversity in that game with their quarterback going out. Tip my hat to them.

But the story of the game is how hard our defense played. Refused to give in. Refused to blame or place blame. Stick together, and then our offense just kept chopping wood.

We talk about developing an elite edge, and the G in edge stands for grit, a stubborn refusal to quit. And that's what our team displayed tonight. To score 14 in the fourth quarter when you're down 3-0, just really, really proud of those guys.

You know, last night, our chaplain gave a message about the difference between a blue-blood brotherhood and a wilderness brotherhood. And a wilderness brotherhood, forged through adversity and fight and scratching and clawing for everything you get. And it totally encompassed everything that we're about.

I mean, you know, when you look at our team, we're a bunch of wilderness brotherhood guys who stick together, fight together, found a way to love each other and had each other's back. And I knew at any point -- I mean, at the locker room, these guys will tell you, I was telling them, we are right where we want to be. Let's just go win the game. They believed in us. I thought Kirby [Moore] and Blake [Baker] did an outstanding job just calling defense and offense, and just really proud of them. So, with that, I'll quit rambling.

Q. I've been following your career as I'm a NC State alum, and you were the OC for many of our great years. I just wanted to see if you could share more insights on what this career -- or this big, milestone win means for you personally? And then also for your program, just headed into the season?

COACH DRINKWITZ: Yeah, I'll be honest, it doesn't really have much to do with me. It's really about our players and the team and the legacy of the 2023 brotherhood. You know, there's no me if it's not for them. If it's not for our coaching staff. If it's not for our coordinators, for our GAs, our administration. You know, so for me, it's really just about the legacy that this team leaves. You know, we have a sign in our locker room that goes around that says, "When the weakest choose to run, we stand shoulder to shoulder and move forward together." And that's what our brotherhood did.

And you look at these two young men to my left. They came in the very first year

They went shoulder to shoulder and moved forward together. And I can't think of anything more fitting than for these two guys to win the MVPs of the Cotton Bowl as a signal of a wilderness brotherhood.

So, it's really not ever going to be about me. It's going to be about our team and our coaching staff and our university.

Q. Being around football for such a long time, just where does this moment rank for you? And then also, that fourth quarter and the way your guys performed?

COACH DRINKWITZ: Yeah, that fourth quarter is probably going to go down in -- it's going to be a tough one to beat. Down 3-0, to score 14, to play as well as we did. Yeah, just going to be really proud. It's hard to contextualize all that stuff right now. But to win the 88th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in that kind of game, with these men, in this brotherhood, to cement ourself as a top-ten team in the country, from going from unranked to top 10 in the country, going to be pretty special.

But why stop now?

Q. Your offense, in the fourth quarter, or second half, had two touchdown drives of over 90 yards. I just want to ask about your offensive coordinator Kirby Moore and how he's impacted this team in his first year and helping to get this program where it is now.

COACH DRINKWITZ: I think Kirby came in and did exactly what we needed him to do. Fresh set of eyes. Does an outstanding job with Brady [Cook] getting him dialed in. Always trying to present new ideas to us. But really, when it came down to it in the fourth quarter, I thought he did on excellent job of calling what he knew our guys could execute. We had that play dialed up for Marquis [Johnson] all week. We've actually run it several times. And it was the perfect look, the perfect call, at the right time, and Brady executed it.

And that play-action pass to Luther [Burden III] for the touchdown. You know, another great design.

So, Kirby is -- I can't say just Kirby. Kirby and Blake [Baker] have been just incredible leaders on each side of the ball. And I think it goes back to low ego, high output. And they carry the mission -- or the message of the head coach to each side of the ball. And there's no ego involved.

At halftime, Blake was ripping the defense about why we don't have a takeaway yet. I mean, I'm like, okay, bud, y'all are playing pretty good. Just hold on. But he just -- they're both just tremendous leaders.

Q. Brady, obviously, the first three quarters don't go the way you wanted it to. What kind of weight is that when you go on the field, and the three quarters haven't gone the way you wanted them to? And how do you push through it?

QB BRADY COOK: As he said, we showed grit. The offense showed grit. We just kept chopping. We looked up, it's fourth quarter, and we have zero points. But what are you going to do? We were driving. We were confident. We still believed in the game plan. Still believed in the calls that were being sent in. And we believed in each other. So, when we put up 14 in the fourth, it's no surprise to us.

Q. Eli, you mentioned these guys have been here since the beginning. And you've talked all week about some individual adversity stories with Brady [Cook], with Cody [Schrader], guys like that. What kind of lasting impact do you hope that can have on the program?

COACH DRINKWITZ: I think it goes to the stick-to-itiveness, the toughness, the brotherhood that these men have forged. And this is what it's going to be when you come to the University of Missouri. You're going to be in a wilderness brotherhood. You're going to develop an elite edge that's energy, details, grit, and emotional consistency. We're going to demand you compete every single day to be the very best you can be.

And these guys, both coming back, can tell you what the results are going to be. Not only for them personally. I mean, these guys are ultra-talented. But they weren't recruited by very many people. I mean, my man's got a GED. Johnny Walker, we flipped him late from Washington State, and he didn't play. Didn't play a whole lot. Last year before the bowl game, came in and talked to me about, Coach, should I transfer? Do you believe in me? What did I tell you, Johnny?

DL JOHNNY WALKER JR.: Yes, sir.

COACH DRINKWITZ: I told him, I believe in you, man. Come back. Earn it. And all he's done is developed into the Most Valuable Player of the 88th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic.

Q. I think you mentioned on the field, can you talk about the idea of can't necessarily win a game in the first, second, third quarter, but you can win a game in the fourth quarter?

COACH DRINKWITZ: What an awesome thing we saw Coach [Pete] Carroll say the other day, and I actually talked to the team about it. You can't win it in the first. You can't win it in the second. Can't win it in the third. But you can sure win it in the fourth quarter. And this team, they did that. They displayed that.

And I'm appreciative to Coach Carroll for demonstrating that and Drew Lock giving us the inspiration to go out there. We didn't have to quite do it on the last drive, but it was sure a lot of fun.

Q. For Brady, can you describe the trajectory of this Mizzou football program and the idea of a lot of people coming back next year and the excitement there?

QB BRADY COOK: I think I said this last week, this game was big for the 2023 Tigers. To cap off an incredible season for the people who chose to come back for their last year and chose to

come back instead of going to the NFL. It's special for them and that group, but it's also special for our team next year. The guys who are coming back for one more. The coaches. The brotherhood.

So, this is just going to give us more momentum. It's going to send us off on a little two-week break with some good energy. We'll be back, ready to work in a couple of weeks.

COACH DRINKWITZ: Can I just add that I'm so proud of Darius Robinson who battled a groin injury on Wednesday. Didn't come out. Played every snap. KD (Kris Abrams-Draine) went in the tent with a separated shoulder. I said, "Hey, man, you're done." He said, "The hell I am." Put his stuff on and ran back out there and played unbelievably tough. JC [Carlies] bloodied his nose. Could have easily sat out the rest of the game. Those guys have NFL futures, and said, No, we're playing for each other, and we're not giving in to that mindset. And that's a legacy that's going to be passed on. And I can't tell you how incredibly proud I am of those guys and what Javon Foster, Xavier Delgado, Cody Schrader, those guys put it on the line for our football team tonight.

Q. Johnny, an absolutely master class on the defensive side of the ball.

DL JOHNNY WALKER JR.: Thank you.

Q. Against one of the best teams in the nation in Ohio State. How does it feel to hold a team like them down to 3 points all game long?

DL JOHNNY WALKER JR.: Got to give credit to my teammates. We all just did our job, stayed in our gaps, and shut them down.

Q. And Brady, I mean, an underdog story from finishing last year 6-7 overall to coming in this year and just absolutely being a dog all season long. And then even coming into the game after a great season, having a 31% chance by ESPN to win the game. How does it feel to beat a team like Ohio State, being the underdog?

QB BRADY COOK: It feels like we've been at the bottom, to be honest with you. We've had some tough years, some tough games, tough experiences together. An opportunity like this comes up, there's nothing but excitement. Let me tell you. We've been at the bottom. We were going to fight all four quarters for this one.

COACH DRINKWITZ: We don't really care what ESPN says or what the procrastinators say. It's what mirror you choose to look in. You can look across the field and see those guys, and man, that wide receiver room they had looks unbelievable. And you can be intimidated by that or figure out, look in the mirror and say what made me. And what made us is an elite edge that we work hard every single day to develop. It's about what's inside of us, not what we're facing on the outside of us. It's just about us. And that's what this team's all about.

I mean, we didn't care about the flip-flopping of lines or who was playing, who wasn't playing. All that crap didn't matter. The only thing that mattered to us was who was playing for our team. And we saw those guys in warm-ups and said, don't worry about what they look like. It's what we have inside of us that we're going to display tonight.

Q. Brady, how fitting of a way was this to send off Cody Schrader?

QB BRADY COOK: Oh, man, I couldn't have drawn it up any more perfect. He deserves it. He embodies what our team is and what our values are and how we operate. And man, he did it. He did it. He deserves this. He deserves the credit. I mean, I can't say enough about him. I mean, I'm just so proud of that guy. I hope he's got a smile on his face right now.

Q. Eli, the touchdown run from Cody [Schrader], how much does that embody in the wilderness brotherhood that you were talking about a little earlier?

COACH DRINKWITZ: On the headset Kirby [Moore] was going to call a quarterback run. I said, No, let's give the ball to Cody [Schrader] right here. You just knew he wasn't going to be denied. Kirby dialed up that inside zone, hit perfectly. It was his moment. It was his game. You could argue that him or -- Cody or Luther [Burden III], all three had a huge impact on it.

The coolest thing about all three, they don't really care who gets the credit. Brady [Cook] will probably make them MVP trophies and give it to them because he just wants to win. I think you would do that, right, Brady?

QB BRADY COOK: Yeah, I'd do that.

Q. Eli and Johnny, can you speak on the impact of Daylan Carnell tonight, and also, just the depth of the defense that stepped up with three starters missing?

DL JOHNNY WALKER JR.: Daylan, he's a baller. He comes in, works hard. Leaves, comes back, works hard. There's nothing I don't think he can't do. Sacks, interceptions, force fumbles.

COACH DRINKWITZ: If there was anybody that didn't think Daylan Carnell was going to come ball out tonight, being from Indianapolis, didn't have an Ohio State offer, was overlooked, undervalued, and was exactly what we're talking about, a brotherhood that's forged in the wilderness. I mean, there was zero doubt in my mind that he was going to play his best game.

Only thing I was upset with him about, he was taking forever celebrating in order to try to get the offense on the field to finish the game. I absolutely knew he was going to play lights out tonight. And extremely proud of him and cannot wait to continue to see his growth as a player and as a leader on our team.

Q. Brady, Cody [Schrader] just said you were spending 12 hours a day looking at film preparing for Ohio State. How much of that did you learn from him? And how much of that did you kind of use to propel you and this offense this whole year?

QB BRADY COOK: Yeah, I mean, we pushed each other all year long. The way we went about our business and our operation day-to-day and the way we prepared together, I mean, constant back and forth pushing each other. Who's going to do this? Who's going to do that? Who's going to go here? Who's going to watch extra tape? Who's going to go to sleep first? I mean, we pushed

each other all year long.

And the bowl prep wasn't any different. The month of December, I mean, we looked at each other when this game got scheduled on that Sunday, and we said, we're going to win this thing. There's no other way. We're going to send you out the right way. We're going to send these guys that came back for their last year out the right way. And we looked at each other and said, we're going to do anything it takes to get this one done.

COACH DRINKWITZ: There's a clip in the Tom Brady "Man in the Arena" where Coach [Mike] Vrabel talks about edgers, and we're not going to let you get the edge on me. And it was a culture that Tom Brady had and Coach Vrabel and the rest of those guys. We showed it to the team, and those guys are embodying that.

Q. How special is it for you, obviously you, Kirby [Moore], the Boise State connection, you get this win, it's a huge milestone for you as a coach and career and the program. How great does this feel for you?

COACH DRINKWITZ: Yeah, I don't know. Maybe on the ride home I'll think about it. I'm more proud of our team and our staff and what they've been through and fought through in order to achieve this. It's not really about me at all. It's about our team and our players and our staff and what they've earned the right to enjoy tonight.

Q. Coach, you told your team earlier this year, they can't kill you because you've been at the bottom. Now that you have climbed the mountain quite a bit, how does the mentality change? Or does it going forward?

COACH DRINKWITZ: Yeah, it's, why stop now. I mean, that's the mentality is, why stop now. We've worked really hard to get this opportunity, and we're not going to sit here and change. So why stop now.

Q. Brady, you know there was a lot of 12 jerseys out there in the crowd. That's been you. Does that feel like a full-circle moment for you? Starting your first game at the Armed Forces Bowl two years ago, to this, and to know that's been you in the crowd, watching this team? And to get to this level, the feelings of that?

QB BRADY COOK: This is a really special night. Obviously, it was special for me. But this is about our team. We keep saying it. We mean it. This is about Mizzou. This is about our team. This is about our fanbase and the university. I mean, they deserve this. It's been a decade since we've been at a bowl game like this. I hope they enjoy it. I know our team is going to enjoy it. But this is about the team. I've got one more year left. So, this isn't the end of the story for me.

COACH DRINKWITZ: So, you're coming back?

QB BRADY COOK: I am coming back. I am coming back. So, this isn't -- this isn't the full-circle moment I've been waiting on. I've still got one more year. This is about the guys who played their last game tonight. This is about the whole Mizzou team.

Q. Coach, I just wanted to follow up with another question about Blake Baker. I mean, what else can you share with us about this guy, this special thinker of football who's kind of got a fun personality too?

COACH DRINKWITZ: He just means a lot to me personally. When we talk about a brotherhood that was forged in the wilderness, me and him worked together at Arkansas State. We went to Boise State. Blake was hired as director of personnel. We lived together for about six weeks. They only gave us seven nights to stay in a hotel. So, Blake and I were sharing our nights, getting double beds so we could make it 14 nights. When he took the job at LA Tech, I had to get up and drive his butt to the airport and drop him off at the airport and say goodbye. I didn't know if our paths would ever crossover again.

Then when the opportunity to hire him -- I tried to hire him at App State, and he went to Temple instead.

When I had a chance to hire him, I knew it was going to be impactful because I knew the type of energy and the type of culture he would bring to our staff. And I knew he would always have my back. And he's just a special person. And he's a great leader. He has the right type of fun with the players but seriousness. He does an unbelievable job game planning, and he'll tell you it's the entire defensive staff. But he's got the right snap in, snap out, right, Johnny?

DL JOHNNY WALKER JR.: Yeah.

COACH DRINKWITZ: But he's a great leader. But he's a really good husband. He's a really good dad. Most of you don't know that he won the Superbowl with his son's 8-year-old team -- 6-year-old team this past year as the head coach. So, he has a lot of head coaching experience, and he's going to get his head coaching job pretty soon.

But we're very grateful for him to be here. He turned down a lot of defensive coordinator job offers in the last four weeks. And I'm appreciative to Desiree [Reed-Francois] and our administration for stepping up and compensating him and securing his future here as a defensive coordinator.

But he's a special, special person and a guy I rely on. And I was glad that they poured Gatorade on him, too, because he's certainly responsible for this as much as anybody else.

Q. We just talked to Cody [Schrader], and he said the difference in a lot of games that were won in the fourth quarter was you. Can you talk about your relationship with him this season and what it was like to be a captain along with him and just kind of help rally your team this entire year?

QB BRADY COOK: I think I spoke on it a little bit earlier. But we just pushed the crap out of each other. Every week we were battling, and we did it together. We prepared together. And every week we just felt like the most prepared players on the field. That gave us a lot of confidence. I know it helped him out. It helped me out. But yeah, I'm just super proud of him and grateful that he was along for the ride.

COACH DRINKWITZ: He was the ride.

QB BRADY COOK: Yeah, he was the ride, actually. I was along for the ride.

Q. Eli, what does it mean to finish as a top 10 team with the way you guys are recruiting and all the momentum? Just kind of where do you feel the trajectory of this program is going right now?

COACH DRINKWITZ: When we took this job four years ago, there was a belief in doing something that had never been done before. And it started with recruiting locally, developing our players, and then putting it all together. And we're -- you know, we're still in the infancy stage of doing all that. But I think the future is extremely bright because of the plans we have and the vision that we're carrying out. And it's not just me. It's our administration, the support they have and what they've done, building the indoor and renovation of Memorial Stadium, investing in our staff. It's what our players have done, investing in each other. It's what our recruiting is doing in continuing to get the right players to come play for us.

So, with the new 12-team playoff system, this would be a game where we're, obviously, continuing to move on and going to have a chance to play at a higher level.

So, everything's coming together now, but we do understand that the wind's twice as hard at the top of the mountain. So, whatever we did to achieve this year, it's going to be twice as hard. We're going to have to battle a whole new set of problems. Starting with the disease of me, the disease of what about me. We're going to have to go in there and rebuild a culture. Because I'm going to enjoy this ride home because I'm not going to get a chance to do it with Cody Schrader again. We're going to have to find new players to step up and lead. We're going to have to find new ways to connect.

So, it will be challenging. But that's what the fun is. You know, the fun is rebuilding it and putting it all together and being able to say, this is what we did in the past. Now this is what our vision is for the future.

There's an old western movie called "Lonesome Dove," it's a mini series. Hell of a vision that we've got going here. And now it's about implementing it and going and doing it.

Q. This is the last Cotton Bowl that won't be a playoff game. In the playoff era, most teams will end their season with a loss. What does it mean to just end this season with a win?

COACH DRINKWITZ: I should have started with how appreciative I am to the 88th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. How phenomenal this week and experience has been for our players, for our families. The way that they treated us all week, it felt so special, that we had earned this opportunity. And then the way they treated us was -- it felt like the Super Bowl. And it felt like everything we did was so important to them.

Anything we asked, hey, we needed a bigger ballroom for a Christmas celebration. Man, they

showed up and made it happen. These people are first class in everything they do. And I'll be honest, I hope we don't lose that in the 12-team playoff because there's something special about being able to have these bowl games and bowl experiences.

But if this is the last one, wow. Mizzou did it right for them, I'll say that.

MISSOURI DEFENSIVE LINEMAN DARIUS ROBINSON

Q. What were some of your emotions playing your last game at Missouri?

DARIUS ROBINSON: It was a lot. Honestly, it still doesn't feel real. You know, I've got my pants on, I've got my jersey on, but it just doesn't feel real yet. I just thank God for the opportunity to allow me to be here and play for the Tigers. I can wear my Mizzou gear so proud now, man. I'm gonna wear my Mizzou gear every day until the draft, honestly. I'm just thankful to be a Tiger.

Q. Can you talk about the mental toughness of this game, and the brotherhood of this year?

DARIUS ROBINSON: It took a lot. When you're playing a good team, you can't be complacent on your end, you can't think you're good enough or you'll get blocked. You have to keep that edge and keep going and keep fighting. We were able to do that--our edge, energy, details and most of all consistency. We were able to display that all four quarters, and that's why we were able to stay locked in.

MISSOURI WIDE RECIEVER LUTHER BURDEN

Q: Was there any doubt (about winning)?

LUTHER BURDEN: No, there was never no doubt man. You know I go to work with these guys every day so you know we've always got belief and it's not over until the fourth quarter.

Q: Can you discuss the mental toughness it took to fight through?

LUTHER BURDEN: We knew they couldn't score so we knew the offense just had to get something going and get a little momentum to get that takeaway. So we just stayed together and pulled it off.

Q: Can you discuss the leadership of Brady Cook?

LUTHER BURDEN: Brady is a dawg man, just let him cook man. You know, nobody believed in that man except everyone in that locker room. So, shoot man, I'm proud of him.

Q. You're familiar with Missouri football, do you think this game meant more to Missouri than it did to Ohio State?

JC CARLIES: Most definitely. We've been doubted for a long time since I've been here. Ohio State has always been at the top of the ranks for a long time throughout the years in college football. Mizzou has always been on the down end of SEC play. This means a lot. It's an improvement of the staff of where we were supposed to be and where we are now.

Q. In a game where defenses are trading possessions, what is your mentality coming back on the field after each punt?

JC CARLIES: Stay focused. It's just a football game. Football games can go back and forth defensively and go back and forth offensively. At the end of the day, you just need to stay focused, and that's what we did.

MISSOURI RUNNING BACK CODY SCHRADER

Q. You got enough yards for the single season rushing record. We talk about team accomplishments, but what does that mean to you personally?

CODY SCHRADER: I didn't really know that I had that, it's good to know. Man, that's something pretty special. I've never chased individual records, but to end my career as Cotton Bowl champs with that, it's extremely special. Shoutout to these guys that have been blocking for me upfront for the last 13 weeks.

Q. Tell me about with QB Brady Cook did tonight to lead you guys to the win?

CODY SCHRADER: He rushed for 102 yards and threw for how many yards? I say all that, that kid is the MVP of the whole season. You only go as far as your quarterback, and Brady is a stone-cold killer. He puts his body on the line every single day. I live with Brady and this kid prepares for 12 hours a day. He's been preparing for a month for Ohio State. He hasn't gone on one vacation, didn't take one break. Man, this kid has been working his butt off. He deserves the MVP. He's the MVP of the Cotton Bowl, and the MVP of this 2023 season.

COACH DAY: We'll go right to questions, please.

Q. I'm sure you came into this game looking for optimism and clarity, particularly at the quarterback position. Where do you go after this game? Obviously, Devin [Brown] only played -- not even a whole half. But didn't look great. Obviously, Lincoln [Kienholz], first time out there. Where do you kind of go with quarterback right now?

COACH DAY: Well, I feel like Lincoln got put in a tough spot there, to say the least. I thought he battled his tail off. But clearly, we didn't help him up front. We didn't run the ball well enough. And a freshman quarterback out there for the first time playing, and we're not running the ball well enough up front. So, it's hard to get much of an evaluation coming out of the game when you can't get any balance. I just felt like we could have helped him in certain areas, and we didn't.

Q. Straight to the point there about the offensive line play. What's your take immediately? And No 2, Carson Hinzman didn't play center. Obviously, y'all made the switch, Matt Jones, Enokk Vimahi, right guard. But their speed rushers just kind of had a night tonight. What's your take on it?

COACH DAY: Certainly, there was some zero-pressure that came, and they were aggressive on Linc (Lincoln Kienholz). There were a couple of things that hit. But overall, when you have a young kid in there, you have to be able to run the football and take some pressure off. And we didn't do that well enough in order to win the game. The defense played plenty good enough. I thought they played their tails off and ran out of gas down the stretch.

We gave up 14 points and, what is it, 331 yards? Is that what it was? They played great. Good enough to win, the defense did. We just couldn't put it together on offense. So, that's the story of the game.

Q. Just from your vantage point, sending Lincoln [Kienholz] in for his first real series on the 5-yard line in the ball game, what's going through your mind there? And what were you cautioning him about as he goes in there?

COACH DAY: I mean, when you're a freshman quarterback who comes in during the summer, you don't have the spring, you really don't have much of a preseason, and then you get thrown into it with the scouts a little bit here and there. But when Kyle [McCord] was in there and Devin [Brown] was getting reps in the twos, Lincoln didn't really get many reps.

He did get reps in bowl practice, but that's not like playing in a game. I think his first few drives were inside the 10-yard line. That's a tough place to be. What I didn't want to do is put him in a situation where he's going to the ball over and maybe see something he's not

used to seeing. And then all of a sudden, we're really battling uphill.

What I felt we could do there was get into halftime, get it settled, and try to get the ball towards midfield. If we did, the defense got us a stop, got us at midfield. We stalled and then missed the field goal. I felt like that was our chance to maybe jump on top a little bit. And just couldn't quite get it going.

But I give Lincoln credit. He got put in a tough spot, and he battled out there and did make some good throws. But that was a tough ask right there. And we need to help more.

Q. What was your message to the team afterwards? Obviously, you didn't want this kind of finish to a season. Two straight losses, 14-3 in a bowl game. What's your message?

COACH DAY: I told them I thought a lot of guys played really hard in this game. And nobody wanted to lose this game. You saw guys fighting here and there. We got put in a tough spot, and we didn't respond well enough. We didn't help the young kid at all. And that's why we lost the game.

So it hurts to finish the season like this, with two losses. And that's not good enough at Ohio State, and we all know that.

Q. You talked about wanting to finish on a high note and springboard for next year. But now, that's obviously not the situation. When you look at what happened tonight and what happened at the end of November, where does this need to go? What are you already thinking about to get into 2024 and turn it back around?

COACH DAY: I mean, this game was very different than last game. It was a different situation altogether. And yeah, we wanted to finish this game and build some momentum into next year. It didn't happen.

But yeah, first thing I mentioned in the room was the guys who were deciding whether to come back or not, now they have to rally together. And we've got to put this team together moving forward of guys who are coming back and get finished some unfinished business that's happened here. I know there are some guys who feel that way.

Q. Ryan, what is the status of Devin [Brown]? He left. Can you give us just a general idea?

COACH DAY: He had a high ankle sprain and wasn't able to return.

Q. Like you said, it's circumstantial here with the circumstances with the quarterback. Does this change anything? Looking at transfer portal? Or do you now just reassess a little bit?

COACH DAY: Yeah, we're just fresh off the game, so it's hard for me to process all of it right now. But we've got to figure out what's best for the team moving forward. And that's in a lot of areas. So we've got to take a hard look at that and get that figured out. But everything will be looked at. Q. Coach, I wanted to just ask about some of the miscues on special teams. Some of the, maybe, self-inflicted wounds. Are there common threads that you see with some of the mistakes, perhaps with fair catches inside the 10-yard line, false starts on punts, things to that nature?

COACH DAY: I thought overall, early on, the whole punting operation, other than the delay of game, but there was a funky look there. And we always tell them, hey, if you're not sure, don't snap the ball. And we ended up getting that one off. So that one there, you know, was okay.

But I felt like we were punting with good hang time, and we were covering and flipping the field at times pretty well. So, I thought that was well done.

But you're right, we shouldn't catch the ball on the 4-yard line. Our heel should be on the 8. I think he felt like in that moment, they were right behind him, and they were going to pin it inside the 4. But still, you have to stick to your rules in that situation.

And then we missed the field goal, and that one was big at the time. It was a little momentum swing, and they get the ball back on the 30-yard line. There were some good things there but not good enough.

Q. When Devin [Brown] was playing in the first quarter, there were still struggles. Is that a matter of a new quarterback, new center, new right guard, no Marv (Marvin Harrison Jr), or is there more to it?

COACH DAY: I felt like he was going to have nerves early on. I thought we were going to be able to play through it and figure out what that looked like going on in the second half. He had a little bit of nerves, but you could see the athleticism. See him break the pocket. Just miss the throw down the sideline. He missed a screen early on. But I felt like he was going to kind of have to play through that. This is his first start.

And then we lose him. And we had a lot of things in the game plan designed for his style of play. And we lost them. It was a little bit of a scramble, and we came up short.

Q. Did the game get a chance to slow down for you throughout? Or was there too much pressure at that time?

QB LINCOLN KIENHOLZ: It wasn't really that fast, honestly, because I go against the best defense every day in practice. It was pretty good. I think the Mizzou coaches were trying to speed me up, give me some zero-looks. But other than that, I'm pretty sure it was just like another game. And I think like the big thing for me was just to slow down and just focus on my mechanics and everything and just trust my eyes.

Q. Ryan, obviously, this was a different type of year at quarterback. You have Kyle [McCord] the whole year. He transfers. You kind of get thrown. You're playing Devin [Brown], and then Lincoln [Kienholz] comes in. How would you assess the quarterback room or quarterback play this year? I know it's fresh off the game. But how would you assess how that went and how it impacted the season?

COACH DAY: I think it's hard to say because we're talking about a year's worth of play of Kyle. He's not here. I don't think it's fair to me to go back and go through all of that right now. And then this game was very unique. So bottom line is, we didn't reach our goals this year. And that's everybody. And so, the quarterback room is one of them. So that's the bottom line. When you look as a whole, we didn't get our job done.

If that's what you're looking for for an answer, that's kind of what it is. I'm not going to go through and kind of evaluate Kyle at this point. I don't think that's fair. And as you saw what happened in this game. And again, we've got to be able to help them out more. Some of those zero-looks that Lincoln's [Kienholz] is talking about, we can do better job with as coaches.

Q. Obviously, you tied Ohio State's sack record in a bowl game. How much more difficult now does it make it to potentially put your name in to hop in the draft or to come back?

DE JACK SAWYER: Honestly, I'm not even really thinking about that now. I'm just upset about the game. I want to send the seniors out the right way. When you put so much work in, it's tough when you don't get the outcome you want. And I want to give Lincoln [Kienholz] a shout-out for stepping in there and playing with confidence. It's not easy, and you went in and did the best you could. So, shout-out to you, man.

QB LINCOLN KIENHOLZ: Appreciate it.

Q. Ryan, I know you guys said when all the dust settles from the game, you'll go make the evaluations and stuff. We thought coming into this, and I think maybe you did too, that tonight was going to be a big piece of that evaluation pot.

How do you move forward without that evaluation? Because as you said, it's been an odd game. And you, obviously, didn't have Devin [Brown].

And second part to that question is, I watched Devin after the injury and the way he carried himself on the sideline. Can you just speak to the way that he handled himself after his second injury in a crucial moment during a battle?

COACH DAY: Yeah, for Devin, I know he wanted to play in this game more than anybody. And even after he hurt himself, he wanted to get back in there and actually did it for a series. It just wasn't fair to him. He couldn't move, and he wasn't supposed to be in the game at that point. But he was fighting to get back in there. And he kept a great attitude the whole time. He's a great young man with a great attitude. He's a great teammate.

Yeah, I don't have a great answer for that because that's not what we were expecting to come out of the game. We didn't have a game to look at and go through and evaluate. We know what we see in practice, but it's certainly different when you play in a game. So disappointed we don't have that.

So we'll go back to work and figure that part of it out. But again, I don't have a great answer on that right now because we didn't have a game from Devin.

Q. Ryan, why did you make the switch on the offensive line to play Matt [Jones] at center and Enokk [Vimahi] at right guard?

COACH DAY: I don't want to get too much into it, but Carson [Hinzman] was having a tough time the last couple of weeks in practice. And we just felt like at the right time -- this was the right thing to do at the time. He was having a few issues there, and so, it's not that Carson will never play here again. But based on the last couple weeks of play, the decision was made that Matt gave us the best chance at center.

Q. (Off mic)

COACH DAY: We felt like Lincoln [Kienholz] had been taking all the backup reps. And moving forward in the future, felt like this was the best thing. And Lincoln also gave us a chance a little bit with the zone-read stuff. Where that's really not Tristan's [Gebbia] game. And the game plan had more of that stuff in it. Even more than what you saw, because that's what Devin [Brown] can do. And we felt Lincoln could at least do those type of things as opposed to Tristan. That's not really his style of game. So we felt like the right thing was to have Lincoln in there.

Q. Your roster was affected by guys leaving, opting out. I need you to look into a crystal ball. Do you anticipate in the next couple of years we'll see things put in place to try to ensure that rosters in the regular season look similar for the postseason, even if they're not playing in games that are affiliated with the playoff bracket?

COACH DAY: I hope so. I hope there's something. You have key pieces missing, and it's just not the same team that you played with a month ago. But not that that's an excuse. It's just the way it is. We have to go win the game. I feel like absolutely. And I think maybe with the playoff that will change things as well.

Q. How do you evaluate your offensive staff moving forward? And do you think there's reason to look at and potentially make changes?

COACH DAY: We're going to look at everything, yeah. Ultimately, like you said, this is an example of a game. It doesn't -- nobody cares that you have a freshman quarterback in there. You've got to go win the game. And it didn't happen.

So, like I said before, everything is going to get looked at. If it's what helps Ohio State go reach our goals and win these games, then we'll make those changes.

So, got to really evaluate it the right way and make sure I'm doing it the right way and do what's appropriate and best for the program.

Q. One for Jack and Lincoln. Jack, is it kind of true that you just kind of wore down as the game went on? And how will this affect, not just your decision, you think, but the other people in your situation in terms of coming back?

And for Lincoln, how much do you think this experience, as tough as it was, will help you down the road, if that's what you feel?

QB LINCOLN KIENHOLZ: I'd say I think it's an awesome experience. Just going out there. Just playing in the Cotton Bowl is crazy fun. I mean, I think being out there was hard at first, but I think just experience of playing a lot and just being out there throwing, running a little bit. I mean, it just helps me build like my -- I want to say like my platform for the next four or five years.

DE JACK SAWYER: You know, I think a lot of us all are on the same page about we don't want to end our Ohio State careers like this. Two tough losses. We all love it here. We love Coach [Ryan] Day. We love the staff. And sometimes, unfortunate things happen, and you don't get the outcome you want. And I think it's going to play a big decision and big factor in our decisions.
