Q. Avery, 15 plays on that last drive to score a touchdown. What's the mindset going into that drive and finishing it off with the touchdown?

EVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, we knew we needed to finish the drive strong and put the game away, and just credit to those guys up front. Fifteen plays is not easy, and they dominated. We pushed the ball down the field and ultimately got in the end zone, so credit to my teammates.

Q. As a true freshman, how did your confidence progress in that game passing and running the ball?

EVERY JOHNSON: I just try to carry myself with confidence throughout everything that I do, and credit to my dad always for just making sure I am confident in myself. When you have teammates and coaches and players, like you know players around you that are confident in your ability, it just ultimately makes my job easier.

So credit to them once again just making my job easy today.

Q. This time last year, you were a high school kid and now you're 19 years old and our a Bowl game MVP. What's this last year been like?

EVERY JOHNSON: It has been a lot of ups and downs and a lot of learning. When you come into college, you do not really know what to expect. I am so happy I chose Kansas State. I am so happy I got to be around these players and these coaches because they truly do care about you, and it really is a brotherhood and it really is a family. It is not like that at other places, and I am a hundred percent sure of that.

Q. You really impressed on the scramble drill plays, particularly that touchdown near the end of the first half. On those specific plays, what are you looking for and do you sort of have a clock in your head of when it's time to throw the ball away or when it's time to try and make a play?

EVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, really just kind of goes -- kind of weird. Pre-snap when you get the coverage and I go through my read and I do not like necessarily what we have, then I kind of get flushed out of the pocket and, ultimately, I just try to keep my eyes down the field and see if maybe somebody pops open. If somebody does, great hit them. If not, tuck it down and run.

At the end of the day, if there is nothing available, you have to throw the ball away. I just tried to be smart with the football today and tried not to turn it over. At the same time, just cut it loose and play a little bit, because you can not play conservative with the football.

Q. I don't think you touched a back.

EVERY JOHNSON: I mean, those guys have been doing it together for a long time. All the credit goes to them tonight for keeping me off the ground and allowing me to sit in a clean pocket and deliver footballs. Some of that stuff is really underrated, just being able to have a clean pocket makes my job a hundred times easier.

Being able to send some of those guys off tonight with a victory and propel ourselves into the 2024 season was just a great way to finish out our season.

Q. On the final drive, you went for it on fourth down instead of kicking the field goal. How much confidence does that show from the coaching staff?

EVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, Coach Klieman came out and grabbed me and the offensive line and said, we are finishing the game on offense. Credit to Coach Riley, credit



to all those guys for believing in me and giving me the ball to go convert on that fourth.

At the end of the day, the offensive line opened up the hole and that is just for me to go get the first down at that point.

Q. What was it like playing today with Conor Riley call plays instead of the guy you had more experience with?

AVERY JOHNSON: It was a lot of fun. For it to be my first start and his first game as an OC [offensive coordinator], we both had ups and downs. I am looking forward to growing with him and building with him and just you see he really cares about this team. He had fire to himself throughout practice, throughout this whole Bowl week, throughout the whole time we were down in Orlando.

He is really thankful to be in this position. I am really just happy to be able to throughout this whole week just build a deeper relationship with him because he really does care about his players and at the end of the day he want to win just as badly as the rest of us, so credit to him.

Q. Can you take us through that final touchdown to Jason? Obviously we know that you're super close with him, and just how cool was it to be able to have that moment with him on this kind of stage?

AVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, we are roommates back home, came in together. Roommates down here in Orlando. Shows the chemistry and the connection that we have, so just being able to trust him. Putting the ball in a place for him to go up and make a play. Just being able to trust that he is going to come down with it and make a play.

That is just him coming to grab me after practice, me grabbing him after practice and getting in a few extra throws.

He is a big-time play maker and he is going to be somebody to watch in the near future. Shout-out, Jas.

CHRIS KLIEMAN: Great win for our program. Great win for our seniors. Finished the legacy of 2023 with this group and start a new journey and legacy of the 2024 guys. That's what Bowl games are becoming a little bit. We honored the seniors, and then we got a little glimpse into 2024.

We beat a really good football team. I have tons of represent for Coach Doeren. He's a great football coach. They play physical and they play hard. Those are two mirrored programs and the game was really physical on both sides. That's what we knew it would be. Their quarterback is an exceptional player. We finally found a way to slow him down a little bit the second half and we struggled in the third quarter moving the ball offensively,.

And then we got into a little bit of rhythm in the fourth quarter, which allowed us a couple big drivers. One obviously with the touchdown, and then get the interception and be able to basically run the clock out. And that's something that's really important to me, really important to Coach Riley and our offense is to finish the game, finish the game on the field offensively.

We have been going for it on fourth down all year and we were four for four tonight and that was a huge deal.

North Carolina State has got really good players on defense, and they had a hard time catching him because he just understands angles and how to beat people and then when he couldn't get the edge, okay, he'd throw it away, did some big-time things but some of the scrambles he had against really good football players.

For a young player to do what he did, we're really excited about the future.

Q. That did not happen. We were 4-of-15 on third down, and I think all four conversions came in that drive. Maybe, it was five, because we had a pass interference call against us there, too.

Bottom line is, we did not finish and they did and that is really what it came down to, that last drive. We missed a field goal, too. Obviously, that had something to do with it.

But, it was a heck of a football game. You got to watch a game with two teams that played really hard and probably a fun game to watch with two fake punts. Kids played hard on both sidelines, and a well-coached game. There was only one turnover. There was not a lot of penalties.

It was a good football game. Unfortunately, we just did not make enough plays to win it at the end.

Some of those times, a young player may force a throw when he is scrambling and does not see anybody open. He just said, you know what, I will throw it away.

The No. 1 stat that he looks for is: Did you win the game? I know he was 14-of-31, but he threw the ball away and avoided a number of sacks or lost yards and, you know what, he is 1-0 as a starting quarterback. That is the No. 1 stat that we look at.

He helped us win. He made big-time play after big-time play. He made the check on the last touchdown throwing it to Jas. He saw the look. How many young kids are going to say, no, I am not going to change it right now and throw a great dime to him.

Q. For the offense to not score over a quarter, and then Avery to lead a drive with two third-and-long conversions with a touchdown throw, what does that just say about him?

CHRIS KLIEMAN: Well for starters, it says a heck of a lot about our defense, because we did a great job in that second half against a defense – against a quarterback --

he's a fifth-year guy. Not many fifth-year seniors play in Bowl games, so my hat is off to him for playing in the game. For a fifth-year guy to play in the game and lead his team, he got after it in the first half.

We did some different things. Changed our stunts up to allow us to make them kick field goals, which allowed that one opportunity for us to get a big-time drive. Convert some third downs. Convert some fourth downs. Guys, we had two touchdowns called back, too.

We did some good things. We had a punt return called back. We had a long touchdown pass called back, and for us to finish that game with a couple big drives says a ton about our total team.

Q. Two things. Fourth-and-one, you run behind Cooper Beebe and KT Leveston; get the first touchdown. Score a touchdown after that. To end the game, run behind Cooper Beebe and KT Leveston to ice the game.

CHRIS KLIEMAN: Pretty smart. Those guys are really good players. Again, give it to DJ.

The other team we spread everybody out, and we had not done that out of that personnel grouping. Great call by Conor Riley to spread everybody out. We have been given the ball out of our two tight end set. Two tight end set, spread everybody out, give the ball to Avery. We were really smart with Avery. He was the only guy we felt comfortable and confident with to step up and play tonight.

We were not just going to just run the guy 20 times. We wanted to showcase his arm, showcase his ability. The play he made making the check on the first drive, throwing that touchdown pass to DJ, we had worked that, and we had not done that all year.

To make that play and to see everybody coming at you, and DJ kind of sidestepped the last blitz, that is Football 101 done by a true freshman.

Q. You talked about the O-Line all week and they certainly went out tonight and made you proud, I'm sure. I don't think Avery was touched in the backfield.

CHRIS KLIEMAN: No, he was not. I know he was not. Those guys are the heart and soul of our offense. I had to give Gilly crap. He was not feeling well, so he missed yesterday. He came back fresh. He just maybe needed a day to rest and sleep. He had had the flu and bounced back, gave him an IV today, and he played his tail off.

We rotated. We played seven guys in there with TP and

Carver Willis. We are excited, because three of those guys are returning, too. It is not like -- I know we lose a lot of really good players in the o-line, but we have three studs coming back there and a lot of good youth that has learned from Coach Riley.

We are going to go as far as our O-line ask D-Line take us and both groups are really good tonight.

Q. What does it say about the six-year players, that they came back, and that played in the game tonight?

CHRIS KLIEMAN: They love K-State. They love the culture they have built. They love the fact that they have one more stage to play with their brothers. That is a party going on in there with those six-year guys.

I think it says more that they came back to play for K-State this year, and so many of those guys are O-linemen, and they came back to play for Conor Riley.

Q. DJ, on that pass from Avery in the first quarter, it looked like he went up, said something to the offensive line, and you were just wide open. What happened on that play and how nice was it to get on the board first?

Q. Avery, 15 plays on that last drive to score a touchdown. What's the mindset going into that drive and finishing it off with the touchdown?

EVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, we knew we needed to finish the drive strong and put the game away, and just credit to those guys up front. Fifteen plays is not easy, and they dominated. We pushed the ball down the field and ultimately got in the end zone, so credit to my teammates.

Q. As a true freshman, how did your confidence progress in that game passing and running the ball?

EVERY JOHNSON: I just try to carry myself with confidence throughout everything that I do, and credit to my dad always for just making sure I am confident in myself. When you have teammates and coaches and players, like you know players around you that are confident in your ability, it just ultimately makes my job easier.

So credit to them once again just making my job easy today.

Q. This time last year, you were a high school kid and now you're 19 years old and our a Bowl game MVP. What's this last year been like?

EVERY JOHNSON: It has been a lot of ups and downs and a lot of learning. When you come into college, you do not really know what to expect. I am so happy I chose Kansas State. I am so happy I got to be around these players and these coaches because they truly do care about you, and it really is a brotherhood and it really is a family. It is not like that at other places, and I am a hundred percent sure of that.

Q. You really impressed on the scramble drill plays, particularly that touchdown near the end of the first half. On those specific plays, what are you looking for and do you sort of have a clock in your head of when it's time to throw the ball away or when it's time to try and make a play?

EVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, really just kind of goes -- kind of weird. Pre-snap when you get the coverage and I go through my read and I do not like necessarily what we have, then I kind of get flushed out of the pocket and, ultimately, I just try to keep my eyes down the field and see if maybe somebody pops open. If somebody does, great hit them. If not, tuck it down and run.

At the end of the day, if there is nothing available, you have to throw the ball away. I just tried to be smart with the football today and tried not to turn it over. At the same time, just cut it loose and play a little bit, because you can not play conservative with the football.

Q. I don't think you touched a back.

EVERY JOHNSON: I mean, those guys have been doing it together for a long time. All the credit goes to them tonight for keeping me off the ground and allowing me to sit in a clean pocket and deliver footballs. Some of that stuff is really underrated, just being able to have a clean pocket makes my job a hundred times easier.

Being able to send some of those guys off tonight with a victory and propel ourselves into the 2024 season was just a great way to finish out our season.

Q. On the final drive, you went for it on fourth down instead of kicking the field goal. How much confidence does that show from the coaching staff?

EVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, Coach Klieman came out and grabbed me and the offensive line and said, we are finishing the game on offense. Credit to Coach Riley, credit



to all those guys for believing in me and giving me the ball to go convert on that fourth.

At the end of the day, the offensive line opened up the hole and that is just for me to go get the first down at that point.

Q. What was it like playing today with Conor Riley call plays instead of the guy you had more experience with?

AVERY JOHNSON: It was a lot of fun. For it to be my first start and his first game as an OC [offensive coordinator], we both had ups and downs. I am looking forward to growing with him and building with him and just you see he really cares about this team. He had fire to himself throughout practice, throughout this whole Bowl week, throughout the whole time we were down in Orlando.

He is really thankful to be in this position. I am really just happy to be able to throughout this whole week just build a deeper relationship with him because he really does care about his players and at the end of the day he want to win just as badly as the rest of us, so credit to him.

Q. Can you take us through that final touchdown to Jason? Obviously we know that you're super close with him, and just how cool was it to be able to have that moment with him on this kind of stage?

AVERY JOHNSON: Yeah, we are roommates back home, came in together. Roommates down here in Orlando. Shows the chemistry and the connection that we have, so just being able to trust him. Putting the ball in a place for him to go up and make a play. Just being able to trust that he is going to come down with it and make a play.

That is just him coming to grab me after practice, me grabbing him after practice and getting in a few extra throws.

He is a big-time play maker and he is going to be somebody to watch in the near future. Shout-out, Jas.

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
