Team Notes

- No. 23 Liberty took a 6-3 lead over No. 8 Oregon into the second quarter of the Vrbo Fiesta Bowl. However, Heisman Trophy finalist Bo Nix led the Ducks on seven straight touchdown drives as Oregon scored 45 unanswered points to defeat the Flames 45-6.
- Liberty made its fifth straight bowl appearance, in its fifth season of full FBS bowl eligibility. Liberty (2019-present), Appalachian State (2015-present) and Marshall (1997-2002) are the only three teams to appear in bowl games in each of their first five years after transitioning from FCS to FBS.
- Liberty is now 3-2 all-time in bowl games, including 2-2 in bowl games featured on ESPN.
- Liberty is the first Conference USA team to ever appear in a New Year's Six bowl game.
- The Group of 5 is now 4-6 all-time in New Year's Six bowl games, including 1-2 in the Fiesta Bowl since the College Football Playoff began in the 2014 season.
- Since the beginning of the Pac-12 Championship Game in 2012, the loser of the Pac-12 Championship Game had been 0-12 in its subsequent bowl game prior to Oregon's win today.
- The Flames have tied Conference USA single-season records for victories (13; tied 2011 Houston and 2014 Marshall) and winning streak (13) while also setting program record in both categories. Liberty's 13-game winning streak was the longest in a single season in Conference USA history.
- Oregon is the highest-ranked opponent which Liberty has played in football. The previous high was when Liberty beat Jamey-Chadwell-coached No. 9/11 Coastal Carolina in the 2020 Cure Bowl. The Flames are now 1-5 all-time against FBS Top 25 teams.
- Liberty now holds a 2-5-1 all-time record in dome stadiums. Jamey Chadwell is 0-2 indoors, with his only other game played inside being a 24-14 overtime loss for Charleston Southern at North Dakota State on Aug. 27, 2016.
- Jamey Chadwell is 2-2 all-time against FBS Top 25 teams, with his only other loss to a nationally-ranked FBS team coming to then No. 23 Liberty in the 2020 Cure Bowl.
- Jamey Chadwell has posted a 44-7 record since the start of the 2020 season, a stretch which includes two unbeaten regular seasons.
- The Flames were facing their first Pac-12 opponent in program history. The Pac-12 was the last conference which Liberty hadn't faced before in football.
- Arizona is the 32nd different state in which Liberty has played a football game, while also competing in the District of Columbia.
- Liberty scored on its first drive for the 10th time in 14 games this season.
- Conference USA went 2-2 this bowl season, getting wins from Liberty Jacksonville State (New Orleans Bowl) and Western Kentucky (Famous Toastery Bowl). New Mexico State fell to Fresno State in the New Mexico Bowl.
- Liberty broke the single-season Conference USA rushing record with 4,106 yards. The previous record was 3,994 set by FAU in 2017.
- The Flames set new single-season program team records for rushing yards (4,106), rushing yards per game (293.3), rushing touchdowns (39), passing touchdowns (32), offensive yards (6,988), yards per game (499.1), total touchdowns (73), points scored (536) and first downs (348).
- Liberty finished the season leading the nation in rushing yards per game (293.3) and interceptions (21).
- The Flames were held to season lows for points (6), rushing yards (168) and total offense (294). Liberty also turned the ball over twice. The team gave up opponent season highs in points (45), passing yards (401), total yards (584), touchdown passes (5) and total touchdowns (6).
- Liberty entered bowl season as the only FBS team with two players with 1,000 or more rushing yards (Quinton Cooley, Kaidon Salter), also the first time in program history Liberty had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season.

Liberty Player Notes

QB Kaidon Salter

- Passed for 126 yards on 15-of-24 passing, with one touchdown pass and one interception. Also rushed for 25 yards on 10 carries.
- Finished the season with program-record totals in touchdown passes (32), touchdowns responsible for (44) and total offense (3,965). Also set a program record for most rushing yards by a quarterback (1,089), also scoring 12 rushing touchdowns.
- Holds a 15-3 record as the Flames' starting quarterback. He started for Liberty against Toledo in the 2022 Boca Raton Bowl.

RB Quinton Cooley

- Rushed eight times for 79 yards, including the longest rushing play by a Liberty player in a bowl game (41 yards).
- Finished the season with 1,401 rushing yards, which is the second most rushing yards in a single season in program history. His 16 rushing touchdowns tied for second in the program's single-season annals.

WR CJ Daniels

- Caught eight passes for 79 yards. His eight catches were the most by a Liberty player in a bowl game. Tied his career high for receptions, also catching eight passes against Army on Nov. 27, 2021.
- Eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark for the season, finishing with 1,067 yards on 55 receptions. His 1,067 receiving yards are the fifth most in a single season by a Liberty player.
- Also surpassed the 100-catch mark for his career, finishing with 106 receptions to date.

TE Bentley Hanshaw

- His lone reception of the contest went for 17 yards and a touchdown on the opening drive of the game. It was his sixth touchdown catch of the season, ranking second on the team.
- The touchdown marked the second year in a row in which Hanshaw caught a touchdown pass in a bowl game. His 67-yard touchdown catch in the 2022 Boca Raton Bowl was the longest pass play in Liberty's bowl history to date.

LB Tyren Dupree

- Had a team-high eight tackles in the contest.
- Finished the year with 124 tackles, the most by a Liberty player since Jessee Riley recorded 133 tackles in 1998.

P Max Morgan

- Punted five times for 235 yards, averaging 47 yards per punt, including a career-long 65 which was also a Liberty bowl game record.

- » UO has scored a touchdown on 32 of its last 40 red-zone drives.

QUESTIONS FOR HEAD COACH JAMEY CHADWELL, KAIDON SLATER AND TYREN DUPREE

COACH CHADWELL: First of all, obviously a lot of credit goes to Oregon. They have a fine team, and they obviously laid it on us today. We knew we would have to play really well to compete and have a chance to win the game, and they did a lot of things that made it challenging on us. So hats off to them.

I'm proud of our team. We kept fighting. We had some opportunities there, especially in the first half and some things going our way, to maybe keep it closer and have a chance. But we kept playing through four quarters. That's hard to do when you're getting beat like the way we were.

But I'm not going to let today, and our team is not going to let today, diminish what they were able to accomplish over 13 weeks. We wish we would have played better today, no doubt. I think the biggest lesson that we as a team and a program have to learn is when you play in these big stages, big moments, what do you have to do consistently, what do you have to give up to make sure that you can play your best.

Because our chance was to play our best game. We didn't play our best game. A couple of turnovers and dropped passes and penalties. We didn't play our best game. We needed to, to have a chance today.

So that's my takeaway, is what do we need to do as a coach to make sure our guys play their best game leading up to it from a preparation standpoint.

Q. I was wondering if you could talk about what it was like to play in this game. Obviously not the result you wanted. But what was it like playing in the Fiesta Bowl?

COACH CHADWELL: It was a great opportunity. It was a special moment. It was a fantastic -- however many days we were here -- five, six days. The hosts were tremendous. Our players had a wonderful experience, from helping with the Girl Scouts to just the practice and the different things we were able to do here.

I think also from a standpoint, just the extra bonding that you get with your team and doing something special like. This is hard to come by at our level, so we didn't take that for granted. It was a wonderful week, except for the last 60 minutes.

Q. Tyren, you said before that there were times when you felt like maybe throwing in the towel, but you've come back year after year. You're one of the older guys here. What was it like for you, especially going on to the field?

And then, Kaidon, given your background and getting that starting job kind of late compared to some guys, what was it like for you today to cap this kind of crazy season for you here?

TYREN DUPREE: We don't usually base things on results. The process is what I can be grateful for and blessed to be able to say that I was able to persevere with the help of my parents and God.

It was amazing to be able to close off your senior year in the Fiesta Bowl where nobody thought you should be there. Of course, it didn't turn out how we wanted to. But we had our opportunity, and that's all we can thank God for, is that we had our chance.

KAIDON SALTER: Yeah, when I got this spot, I just knew that the team was going to be on my back and I had to do everything that I could do to put us in the best positions on the field. I knew that the team would move how I move. If I go out and execute and keep my head up, the whole team keep their head up and just keep fighting.

That was the plan today, just keep on fighting, win or lose. We just wanted to fight. We came out, and it didn't end how we wanted it to, but nobody gave up. That's what made me so happy. I'm proud of our team for not giving up. That's just what made me happy. Nobody gave up and that showed that me being a leader, and me keep bringing the juice showed that everybody was feeding off of me and nobody gave up.

Q. Jamey, you guys had that point late first quarter where it's 4th-and-2 right in your midfield, and you elected to punt the ball. Is that something you wanted to have? Is that something that made sense formationally in the moment? Take us through that decision.

COACH CHADWELL: It was more about 4th-and-3 -- and-2 is normally our window to decide to go for it. They said it was 4th-and-3. I think it was 6-3 at that time, if I'm not mistaken.

Looking back, maybe you wish you had went for it there, the way the game went. I thought at the time, you pin them back and maybe you get a chance to get a stop and get the ball back there.

But hindsight, for sure, I probably would have went for it, even if it was 4th-and-3 or plus. That's something we've done quite a bit of.

And yeah, I would have done it again and we would have went for it.

Q. Coach Chadwell, and also for the players, as you look back on the season, obviously you guys accomplished a lot this year, 13-1 and making it to the Fiesta Bowl. What will be kind of your main takeaway that you will remember from this season?

TYREN DUPREE: Just the bond and the growth it took for us to be able to stay together through everything that we've been through. It's not easy to get a new coach in January and then flip the whole roster before fall camp.

So just congrats -- or hats off to these coaches, hats off to the teammates that bought in. It doesn't go without everyone buying in and trusting us. So congrats to them guys, too.

KAIDON SALTER: Yeah, basically like he said, just the bond we were able to build so quickly. Coaches came in, in January. Half our roster transferred. We were bringing in players that were coming from all over the world. Just being able to bond with them and getting to know a lot of our players.

That was very important for us. I feel like that's what got us here today.

Q. Coach, for you, it seems like a lot of plays were going to [Aaron] Bedgood early in the game, those first two drives. Did you see something that you liked in preparation that you thought you could exploit there?

COACH CHADWELL: I think we actually had a good plan, and he was part of that, and just some different formations and things that they had shown. The first drive, obviously, worked well. We had some things there. We had some other ones there, especially in the first half.

You look at it there, we had a great drive. And then we went three-and-out. We had a dropped pass on the third down that could have extended the drive.

Right before halftime, it's 24-6 and we're down there inside the 30-something yard line, and we tip a pass up and they pick it off. Who knows, you score right there, you're down -- you're in the ball game.

So I thought we had a good plan early on. But then when they got up so much, now you're just trying to make sure you can stay in it. You might have to come away from it a little bit and put us in some situations that we didn't want to be in.

But again, that was what I was more disappointed in, some of the things that we did ourselves that we hadn't done all year, really.

Again, would that have made the difference in the whole scheme? I don't know that. But you don't drop that pass, who knows what happens. We had the momentum early. We had some momentum. It was 6-3 in the second quarter and then they scored 28, and we didn't do much.

Q. Kaidon, when you're coming off the field, there was a lot of support and cheering and praise for you from the Liberty fans. Take us through what you noticed and what that meant for you.

KAIDON SALTER: That just showed us how much love that our fans mean to us. I mean, they love us, win or lose. And that just showed right there, just walking off the field and hearing my name and all the screams, knowing that we just lost, that brought more cheer to me.

I mean, I never had my head down after the game. I knew that our team did everything we could do to go out there and try to win this game. So I had no reason to walk off the field with my head down. Walking off the field, just hearing the crowd yelling my name and giving me the cheers and the praise, that felt amazing.

But still, I just wish we could have finished the season better and that's that, yes, sir.

Q. Question for both Tyren and Kaidon. You're both in different spots right now. Tyren, you're a senior. This was your last game. Kaidon, this was your first year as a starter. How excited are you to look forward to the future? Tyren, even just watching this team as an outsider, just knowing all the turnovers that happened Tyren, you've seen this program develop over the last couple years to get to this point. How excited are you to look towards the future and build off of this?

TYREN DUPREE: I'm more than excited. I just told them in the locker room, I was like, 'Do not have your heads down.' This is not the last time you guys are going to be here. We've done this in a short amount of time that we've been an FBS program.

I'm so excited to see what God and Coach [Chadwell] has to bring to this university. We're not done.

Q. Coach, what made life difficult running the football today? I think it was your lowest total of the season.

COACH CHADWELL: Yeah, well, the challenge was they're big in the box and sometimes we can hand it off and get some big yards. We weren't able to do that.

Secondly, when you get behind, you get away from it, right? So you're not really able to grind on people and some of those things. So there's a combination of that.

They're the best defense we played. You have to really scheme them up to make some things happen. When you get behind the chains, get behind the sticks, you're not able to maybe do things that you would like to do to keep the clock running and get the yardage that you need.

We had some big plays that happened, but they're few and far between. There were a couple of times on drives early, 2nd-and-4, 2nd-and-5, you get a good first down and then you don't get nothing on second, now you're at third and medium. That's a challenge with the way they can cover. That was one of the things.

It wasn't the scheme they were doing. Our guys will tell you, we knew where they were at. There wasn't anything they didn't show us that we weren't prepared for. But you have to be able to buckle in, and we weren't able to do that consistently.

Q. Coach and Kaidon, CJ Daniels hit his 1,000-yard benchmark today. Could you just kind of speak to the difference he made today. He had some big catches out there and the hard work he's been in throughout the entire season.

KAIDON SALTER: Yeah, CJ, that's my roommate. Our bond is a little bit stronger than me and the other guys. Just with CJ, I mean, he's like my man in the back pocket. When I know I'm in trouble and things like that, I can go to CJ and I can trust that he can make the plays that need to be made.

I feel like our coaching staff understands that. They understand that he's in the game plan a lot, running routes and things like that. But I knew it was his goal to be a 1,000-yard receiver, and we made that happen today.

I mean, I didn't even realize until you just said it. But kudos to him. I'm very proud of him and everything he's done this year for us.

Q. Coach Chadwell, you complete your first season here at Liberty 13-1. How much can you use this year to build off of and moving forward as you continue to build this program?

COACH CHADWELL: Well, I think from a recruiting standpoint, obviously, you have a chance to be on a national stage. You have the success. You have a chance to hoist a conference trophy. So more people know about us.

I think the challenge for us is -- and this program will be back on this stage. Mark that down. Conference USA will be back on this stage. We will be back in this. The reason why is because today, we saw how far we're away. The guys that are returning and the guys we're bringing in, this will be our benchmark.

We're shooting for the College Football Playoff and today is a great motivator, because it tells us how far we are. And we're far away right now. But we will be back on that, and I hope future recruits and people know that we're heading in a great direction.

Q. After four weeks of really unprecedented exposure for the university and the institution of Liberty, if you had one lasting impression, one last thing to tell maybe America who doesn't follow Conference USA as much as they ought to, what would be the one impression you would want to leave them from an institution and university level?

TYREN DUPREE: I would just hope that Conference USA had notable wins, even outside of us, other teams in the conference had this year, or the competition that they showed. I just ask that they might get a little more respect.

Conference USA is only going to get better. This team is only going to grow and get better. I'm excited to see how the conference does and how we do in the future.

KAIDON SALTER: Yeah, kind of like Tyren said, just pray that Conference USA gets more respect. Like, there's a lot of guys that are bounce-backs that come from the P5 schools to the G5 level and things like that.

I feel like we deserve more respect. We just have to keep on bringing in the players that we need in this conference to be better and be able to compete against these P5 schools.

Q. Coach, yesterday, Rob Griffin III said that Kaidon Salter has the potential to come back next year to win the Heisman. What does that say about what he's already been able to accomplish this year and all his untapped potential?

COACH CHADWELL: Obviously RGIII would know. He's a winner of that. He watched a lot of video preparing to announce this game. So everybody that's followed us knows the ability and the talent that Kaidon has and what he was able to display this year from week one all the way through tonight.

As he continues to develop, continues to buy into being a complete quarterback, buying into being the leader of this football program -- and he's the face of the football program.

What we have returning, with him continuing to improve and working on the things he needs to do, I have no doubt that he comes and has a fantastic spring and summer, that he'll be right up there. He's one of the best quarterbacks in this country. We believe that. There's no difference from a talent standpoint. There was no difference from a talent standpoint from the guy on the other sideline, if you were watching today.

So that's the talent he has, and he knows what he has to do to continue to maximize what God's given him. I'm excited about it because I know he's hungry to go get even better. I'm looking forward to seeing how good he gets.

Q. Can you tell us a little bit about how this changes things for your future athletics. What's your greatest lesson playing in a game of this caliber?

KAIDON SALTER: It really wouldn't change anything because we wouldn't be playing a team this big unless -- with us being in Conference USA, we wouldn't be playing a team this big unless we are in a big bowl game like this every year. Although we do wish to make this big game every year, the competition that we're playing is -- I don't know. I just forgot the question. I'm tired.

TYREN DUPREE: Just to piggyback off what he said.

KAIDON SALTER: I was on the right track. (Laughter)

**QUESTIONS FOR HEAD COACH DAN LANNING, BO NIX, JEFFREY BASSA, AND
TEZ JOHNSON**

COACH LANNING: First, I just want to say to Fiesta Bowl, Vrbo. This has been an unbelievable experience. You talk about the things that are benefits of the bowl game, for us it's connection. It's the time that we get to spend with each other one last time. This guy [Bo Nix] on the stage with me, some of these other guys, their last opportunity to get to spend some time with us. And for us to have a great opportunity to spend time together and then go out there on the field and finish it the way we wanted to.

We said this season, and really this game, was about unfinished business. We said we're writing the last chapter to our book, and we had the pen. I thought our guys wrote a phenomenal chapter. Started off a little hairy, but they finished it off the way Oregon is supposed to play.

So, really proud of these guys. And thankful, again, to the Fiesta Bowl and the job they did.

Q. 12 wins only happened five other times in this program's history. What does this win mean? What does 12 wins mean for this team and this program?

COACH LANNING: I think it just speaks to the direction, the base that these guys have created for where we're headed and what we're about to do. They believed in what we wanted to accomplish. Really, this is all about our players. Our players had a buy-in. They knew what the goal was and what to accomplish. We're going to build off that in the future, and they really set the stage for that.

Q. Bo, you end your career as one of the most experienced, productive college quarterbacks ever. Do you feel 35 years old in quarterback years? Or what does it feel like now that this kind of odyssey is finally done?

BO NIX: I feel like I have played a lot of football. But every time I went out there, it slowed down more and more. And by the end of it, I just had a really comfortable feel. I think this year with what we were doing offensively, schematically, I think we were very efficient.

And part of that is because of what we did offensively, and then the players we have on our side of the ball.

It's been a great career. It's been a lot of ups and downs. And there's been some great adversity too that I've been able to learn from.

I wouldn't be here without every year. Every step has been another journey, and I wouldn't have traded anything.

COACH LANNING: To piggyback off that for Bo, hopefully everybody out here in the crowd realizes that this guy has the single-season record for passing touchdowns, passing yards, and most

touchdowns in an Oregon bowl game right here at quarterback; not to mention set the NCAA passing record for completion percentage. So, he's done a lot for this program. He's played a lot of elite ball, and we're really proud of him.

Q. Bo, just your thoughts on those accomplishments. And will you finally say that you played good football this season?

BO NIX: Yeah, I played good football this year because of the opportunity and the situation that I was in. It wasn't difficult to go out there and play with the guys that I was around.

Coach [Dan] Lanning can say what he wants, but a lot of it is because of him that we were in the situation we were in. He coaches us extremely hard, and he gets the best out of us. That's what you want out of a head coach.

And his humility is going to give it to the players, but we wouldn't be here without him and his leadership. I've learned so much from him over my time, over two years.

Like I said, I wouldn't be here without him and the coaches that he's put around us as players. As a team, I felt like we set the bar really high. We had a standard, and we just wanted to go out there and match it every Saturday.

Q. Obviously, your last game in the Pac-12. Just wonder what your thoughts are, leading the league, entering a new league, and also the legacy that Oregon leaves.

COACH LANNING: I think Oregon has cemented itself as a premier program in college football. I'll say, more than anything, certainly grateful for some of the great games that exist in the Pac. But probably just as excited about what's happening in the future for us, where we're headed, the direction we're headed. The clarity, what that brings.

That's really a credit to our administration, Rob Mullens and the people around us that have put us in that position.

Q. Bo, looked like you had a little conversation with Will [Stein] and Dan [Lanning] before going out for that curtain call. You guys were smiling. What was said there in that conversation, and what emotions were you feeling when you were walking off that field for that final time getting that curtain call?

BO NIX: Well, we were just going through the little memories we had. Both coaches were just super excited, and I was grateful to be in that position with them. They've done so much for me and my development.

They've allowed me to have one of the best years of my life and I attribute it to those guys. To be able to have that situation, you see it a lot and you always wonder, you think maybe one day that could be me, and then today it just happened.

I feel nothing but joy. I feel nothing but happiness and gratitude for the entire university. I think I could list on and on about what the university has meant to me and each person that's done so much for me.

Q. Jeffrey, what conversations did the defense have after that first drive and being able to shut them out for the rest of the game?

JEFFREY BASSA: Yeah, little things just like keeping our poise. That's something that we preach every day at practice and all the time in the facility. I think Coach [Dan] Lanning and Coach [Tosh] Lupoi do a great job of instilling that in our minds.

Keeping our poise, going to the sideline, not keeping our highs too high and our lows too low. I think that's something that a lot of these guys in the offseason were focusing on, was that mindset of next-play mentality. We've got to flush the next play and we have to look at that next play and reflect on it and grow from it.

I think that first drive, just kind of reflecting on the first drive, like you said, was going to the sideline and keeping our poise, and we were going to execute at a high level from there on.

COACH LANNING: Jeff [Bassa] won't give himself enough credit, but just like Bo [Nix] makes this offense run, Jeff makes this defense tick. We give him an unbelievable amount of defense that he has to process through his mind, getting us in the right call. Obviously, that showed up today, and that's why he was able to play elite.

BO NIX: I get tired of practicing against Jeff because he always calls out our plays because he studies so much. He knows exactly where to tell the guys where the ball is going. I think that's a tribute to him, because he's such a great leader. He took ownership of it, and that's why he had such great success on the field.

Q. It's the last year before the College Football Playoff is coming here to Glendale. What was it like playing in the Fiesta Bowl before that change comes?

BO NIX: Well, for it being my last game and for the season that we had, I grew up watching the Fiesta Bowl. I grew up watching bowl games on New Year's Day and dreaming and going outside after and playing like I was in that position. Even though maybe you could say it didn't go how we wanted it to this year, I think it ended exactly how we could have controlled it.

I think we did everything we could with the opportunity that presented itself. We were in the Fiesta Bowl. We were able to come out here and play.

It wasn't until pregame, I was out there warming up and I thought back to when -- back in 2010 the national championship was here and I was able to come to it. Full-circle moment. I'm back in my fifth year and the last game ever, back in the stadium.

It's little things like that, that you know God orchestrates, and He does things like that, and He's up there kind of smiling.

COACH LANNING: Yeah, certainly a unique experience, getting to be a part of a New Year's Six. I think all of our players realize how special a moment like that, how special this game is. I remember being in college watching the Fiesta Bowl with Oklahoma-Boise State. Getting to experience some of these games and getting to be a part of it is really special, for these guys up on this stage, but also for our team.

Q. Offensively, you guys switched in that third drive. What do you think contributed to the sluggish start as far as points go? And how did the experience and leadership you guys have on the sideline, how do you flip that switch to score all those touchdowns in a row?

COACH LANNING: We just had to settle in. They had some success getting hands up on some batted balls that probably would have been successful plays early. But once we settled in and made sure we weren't beating ourselves -- we talk about how bowl games come down to the team that tackles the best, the team that doesn't penalize themselves. I think we walked out today with two penalties. That's a big credit to our guys operating really well. But as long as we operate within sequence, it's hard to stop the Ducks.

BO NIX: We were a batted ball and a poor, inaccurate throw from having success on the first two drives. Just like we did all year, we've got to settle in and continue to go. We knew that the defense was going to continue to get us the ball back. We just had to go down there and score the first time. Once we did that, once Bucky [Irving] had that long run, that really started things.

Q. Bo, what went into your decision to play this game, when a lot of guys in your position wouldn't have -- or around the country didn't. What message do you have for players in the future about participating at the end of the year, even if there isn't the carrot of a national championship, or not necessarily, the quote, unquote, stakes that would bring a player out? What did you get from this, do you think?

BO NIX: My decision was simple. I wanted to go out and compete one more time. I wanted to go out and play another game. I don't think you're promised many opportunities to play the game of football, and with the year that we had, it would have been a shame if I didn't go out there and finish with the guys who made it all possible.

So, all I can go off is just my feelings and my decision. I didn't think -- I never had a question if I was playing in it. I just kind of thought it was going to be assumed that I was going to play in it, to be honest with you.

It wasn't much of a decision. For some guys, that's different. It's situationally based, but I couldn't wait to get back on the field with these guys after what happened on December 1st. I couldn't wait to get back out there and compete one more time. If I had the opportunity, I was going to go use it.

Q. Dan, before this game, you were very praiseworthy of Liberty. Now that you've played them and won pretty convincingly, does that change your projections and your analysis of whether they were a team worthy of playing this game at all?

COACH LANNING: Not at all. They were an undefeated team. They had an elite season. Coach [Jamey] Chadwell has won everywhere he's been. Yeah, we had the better game today. We played well today.

They're a good team. You can't discredit a team going unscathed throughout the season, undefeated. It speaks to the quality of the team they are and the quality of coaches they had. They had an elite season. Hopefully this doesn't overshadow the season they had. I know how I wanted to come out at the end of this thing, and fortunately our players came out and performed.

Q. Bo, we talked about your brother (Tez Johnson) this week. Tell me what kind of day he had today, in your opinion, and how your feelings on what he did out there. Because he seemed to have a special day.

BO NIX: Tez had a Tez day. If you watch him every day, that dude goes out there, he gets open, he catches the ball, and he continues to do it over and over and over. I mean, I can't explain how awesome it was to get to play with him for a whole season.

To see him do what he did and to see him cap it off with the day that he had today, it was like I told him going in, "I'm going to throw you the ball as much as you're open. You just get open and we'll take care of it." Sure enough, that's what he does.

I mean, it's so fun watching him, because I understand what he's been through to get to this moment. I understand what he's been through to get to this point in his career. He has had to overcome a lot of adversity, a lot that I probably don't even understand.

But I think he's such a great human being, such an awesome person. He's one of the kindest people that you could meet. He's got a great heart, and I think it overflows on the football field.

The energy and the effort you get is how he lives his life, and he just competes, even when he doesn't have to. He goes out there and competes. I think he reaps the rewards of that.

COACH LANNING: Talk about one of the easiest recruiting deals ever is when Bo [Nix] walks into my office and says, "Hey, I think we have this guy who can maybe play for us." It was like, "Okay, what do you think? We're going to have to recruit our tail off? What's it going to take?"

Bo says, "No, no, no, Oregon is his dream school." And today, that guy that walked away with Oregon being his dream school set the single-season record for receptions for an Oregon receiver. Big accomplishment for Tez [Johnson] and nice recruiting job by Bo.

Q. Dan, when you take a look at the evolution through your first two years; last year, 10-3, go to the Holiday Bowl; this year, 12-2, win the Fiesta Bowl. What do you believe are the next steps heading into year three for you with Oregon?

COACH LANNING: The great thing about football is every team has an individual identity in itself. What these guys built, they created a legacy and created a tradition about what we expect and our standard of play.

But the reality is, it has nothing to do with next season. It's going to be about the next group, going back to the fundamentals and starting from scratch. Starting from zero and figuring out exactly what we have. But they certainly put the building blocks down for what it means to be an Oregon football player and an Oregon football team.

Q. Dan and Jeff, lowest rushing total for Liberty all season long. What made you guys so successful at stopping the run?

JEFFREY BASSA: I think it just went down to the preparation. Knowing that they were the number one rushing offense in the country, I think a lot of the guys looked up to the challenge of stopping that run. That's something that we didn't do in the previous game. We didn't do that very well.

Accepting that challenge, I know a lot of the defensive linemen were fired up. Guys like Taki [Taimani] and [Brandon] Dorlus were fired up to go against that offensive line. Then obviously Coach [Dan] Lanning and Coach [Tosh] Lupoi calling the calls that they wanted to call. A simple call sheet. We were ready to strike and fit the gaps.

COACH LANNING: I feel a little bit different because they had 168 rushing yards, so it still bothers me when we talk about our standard.

But I will say this, that our players embrace what it's going to take to win this game. They understood their strength, which is a big strength. They're better at running the ball than anybody else in the nation, for a good reason. So, I'm appreciative that our players stepped up to the challenge.

Q. Bo, can you walk us through that second touchdown pass? It looked like a bit of a broken play when you were able to put six on the board. What went on down there?

BO NIX: Was that with Terrance [Ferguson]? We've been practicing that play a lot. We were expecting it to go to Pat Herbert, to be honest, in the corner. And when we came off the fake, somebody kind of ran with him and there was the dude right there, so I just tried to avoid -- I thought somebody was going to be on the other side and probably hit me pretty good because I kind of lost my balance.

But Ferg just stayed alive. He kind of found his way over the middle. When I looked up, I saw his number and threw it to him. It's exactly how we practiced it.

COACH LANNING: Not at all like we practiced it, but it worked. That's what Bo [Nix] said to me as soon as he came to the sideline. He said, "Just like we practiced." I said, "Right."

Q. Bo, a question for you. A lot of debate with the single-season completion percentage record. A lot of people online throughout the game were kind of doing the math as you updated the completion record. Was that on your mind coming into the game? And then while on the sidelines, was there any awareness of where you were in the league? And how did you deal with the pressure knowing you were close to a record?

BO NIX: Well, it was hard not to think about it because you're so close to something that you worked so hard for and that the season has led up to.

But I would just give credit to the coaches. I think they were aware the entire time, and they did a good job of calling the game, and when they call the game like we do, we go out and execute and it just kind of happens.

I think the completion percentage is important because it speaks to a lot of people. It doesn't just speak to one person. Everybody that the ball is thrown to, they've got to catch it, they've got to do something to it, and then you've got to protect it to throw it. Everybody was included.

I think it's a great team accomplishment. I think it was an awesome way for this year to conclude, and it's an honor to even be recognized as that, because the quarterback setup had those records, that I have had such remarkable years and seasons. I'm just extremely fortunate, extremely blessed, and I wouldn't have traded it for anything.

Q. (Question about game-winning season.)

TEZ JOHNSON: There was only a few in Oregon history to do it. We finished business, and I felt like we finished business today.

Q. Next year you guys would have a chance to play for a title as the playoff expanded. This year you didn't get an opportunity. Is that kind of hard to come to grips with?

TEZ JOHNSON: We just need to stay on course and believe in Coach [Dan] Lanning, which he's the

greatest coach of all time, I feel like. He knows what buttons to push us to get a little bit more out of us to compete every day. We've got to trust the process.

I feel like the playoffs, with them expanding, is going to put some teams in there that's really good and going to really try to get to that next championship game and playoffs. It's going to be really good. You're going to see some teams in there that's going to shock the whole world. That's going to be us next year.

Q. This is Oregon's last game in the Pac-12 Conference. Is there any statements to be made? Want to talk about that.

TEZ JOHNSON: We coming. We coming to the Big Ten. The whole team is coming.

Q. We really saw you in that game as wide receiver one. Without Troy [Franklin] there, you were clearly Bo's [Nix] top option with all the catches you had. Does that make you want to come back? Just kind of seeing the glimpse of the future, that you put on the show that you did today?

TEZ JOHNSON: I was just focused on the game today. The one thing that I can say is Troy was on the sideline. This is how smart Troy is. He sees the coverage from the sideline. He hasn't even been on the field with us not one time and he comes to me and just tells me what they're in. Do this, do that. And I trusted him, and I had a highlight night tonight.

I give very unbelievable thanks to Troy. Troy Franklin is the best receiver in the country. Just being in the same room with him has helped me a lot. Thanks to Troy and Oregon organization.

Q. On the third-quarter touchdown, was that a play you guys kind of had in your back pocket a long time? You know as soon as it's called, you knew you were going to score?

TEZ JOHNSON: It's one of those, like, we had it in our back pocket. We just waited for the coach to call it. When he called it, I knew I was going to score the whole time. Running behind big Steve [Jones]. That's the biggest guy on the field all the time. It was pretty good.

Q. Just with getting to play with Bo [Nix], can you put into context, is this the most fun you've ever had playing football this season? How much fun did you have this year?

TEZ JOHNSON: I had a lot of fun. I got pushed to limits that I didn't even know I had, and that's from the teammates. The teammates pushed me so hard at practice. Even when I'm not feeling the greatest at practice, they were the ones that are going to come out there and build me up every day. Tez, we need you to get a good look right here. We need you to compete today.

Those little words, those simple little words, encouraged me to even do better. I know I'm doing it for the right reason. And thank you to the defense.

Q. What kind of legacy does this program leave?

TEZ JOHNSON: I feel like we left a good legacy. Can't wait for those guys to showcase what they can do this season. It's going to be really good.

Q. You can argue you're the best team in the Pac-12 the last 15 years.

TEZ JOHNSON: Yeah, we was. We was the best. But, yeah, we was the best team in the Pac-12, always, and always will be.

Q. Talk about Troy [Franklin], topping his receptions.

TEZ JOHNSON: I told him today after the game, I was like, Boy, I didn't even know I beat your record. He was like, What do you have? I was like, I don't know, I think it was yours. He said, Because I didn't play, fool.

But, yeah, Troy is a good guy. Troy is a great receiver. Nobody can cover him. When he gets to the next level, he's going to showcase the same thing.

Q. For your brother to have the record, what does that mean to you? What do you think that means to him?

TEZ JOHNSON: It means everything. It was really good. I didn't even know what the record was.

Q. What's going to be the process the next few hours, few days, to determine what you want to do next year?

TEZ JOHNSON: I don't know. A lot of thinking, a lot of thinking. That's all I can say.
