Postgame Notes

It's Good!

Washington kicker Grady Gross connected on all three of his field goal attempts and was 4-for-4 on extra points to tie the most points scored by a kicker in the Playoff Semifinals with 13. He became the eleventh kicker in Sugar Bowl History to make three field goals and achieved the feat for the first time since 2011.

Receiving Core

Washington became the second team in Sugar Bowl history to have a pair of receivers accumulate 122+ yards and the first since 1970. Rome Odunze caught all six of his targets for 125 yards as Ja'Lynn Polk caught all five of his targets for 122 yards.

Offensive Power

Texas totaled 498 yards of total offense, while Washington finished with 532. The two teams combined for 68 points, 48 first downs and 141 total plays. The 430 passing yards from Washington ranks fourth in Sugar Bowl history and second in the Playoff Semifinals.

Down to the Wire

In a tightly contested 37-31 Washington win, the game came down to the final play. It marked the first time since 2019 the Sugar Bowl was a one possession game and the eighth since 1995. The six-point margin of victory is tied for the second smallest in the Playoff Semifinals and was the fourth occurrence.

Even at the Break

Texas and Washington ended the first half tied at 21. This marked the third time in Sugar Bowl history the game was tied at the break. In the 14th edition of the Sugar Bowl on January 1, 1948, #5 Texas and #6 Alabama were tied 7-7 at the half. On January 1, 1959, #1 LSU and #12 Clemson were tied 0-0.

Lifetime Performance

For the fourth time this season, Michael Penix Jr. recorded 400+ passing yards as the Miller-Digby Award MVP finished the game 29-for-38, which is the fifth best completion percentage in Sugar Bowl history and the highest since Tim Tebow in 2010. Penix Jr. launched the first 75+ yard passing play at the Sugar Bowl since 2010 with the fifth most completions in the history of the game. The 77 yard pass play was the longest in Sugar Bowl history to not be a

touchdown and the fourth longest from scrimmage. His 430 yard passing performance ranks third in the history of the Sugar Bowl and second among Playoff Semifinals. Before the half and into the third quarter, Penix Jr. rifled 12 consecutive completions which set a new Playoff Semifinals record and ranked second all-time in the Sugar Bowl.

Sweet Appearances

Texas made its fifth Sugar Bowl appearance and now has a record of 2-3. Meanwhile, Washington made its Sugar Bowl debut, the 52nd different school to play in the Classic. The Huskies also became the first Pac-12 team to play in the Sugar Bowl (Utah played in the 2009 Sugar Bowl as a member of the Mountain West). With its victory, Washington became the 37th different school to win a Sugar Bowl and the 22nd to win its Sugar Bowl debut.

Pacific Time

Washington became the third school from the Pacific Time Zone to play in the Sugar Bowl and the first since St. Mary's in 1946. St. Mary's lost to Oklahoma A&M in the 1946 game; while the other Pacific coast team to reach the Sugar Bowl was Santa Clara, which beat LSU in back-to-back years (1937 and 1938). The most Western team to play in the Sugar Bowl was Hawai'i in 2008.

Top Ten

This year's game marked the 62nd time that a pair of top 10 teams (based on AP Poll) have matched up in the Sugar Bowl. The first time was in the 1936 contest when No. 4 TCU topped No. 1 LSU, 3-2.

Champions

Washington and Texas became the 94th and 95th conference champions to play in the Sugar Bowl in its 90-year history.

Big Crowds

The 90th annual Sugar Bowl Classic was sold-out with an official attendance of 68,791, the 67th time in its history surpassing 68,000 fans.

The Coaches

This year's Sugar Bowl head coaches became the 103rd and 104th coaches to lead teams into the Sugar Bowl.

Random Stat History

After 90 editions of the Sugar Bowl, the higher-ranked team now has posted a 53-36-1 record – however, over the past four decades (since 1980), the lower-ranked teams have kept things nearly even at 21-23-1. This year's game was the 22nd Sugar Bowl to be played on a Monday. For what it's worth, the higher-ranked team has now posted an all-time mark of 15-7 on Mondays.

Hall of Fame

The Allstate Sugar Bowl introduced four legends as the sixth class of the Sugar Bowl Hall of Fame during the pregame of this year's Classic. The inaugural Hall of Fame class, introduced in 2017, was composed of 16 stars of the annual New Orleans football classic. This year's class of Hall of Famers includes two College Football Hall of Fame players, a legendary coach, and a longtime award-winning director of athletics.

TEAM NOTES

SERIES HISTORY VS. WASHINGTON

- Texas and Washington faced off for the sixth time in series history. The teams met in last season's Valero Alamo in San Antonio. The Longhorns and Huskies met in back-to-back seasons for the first time since a home-and-home series in 1974-75.
- Texas now holds a 3-3 record all-time against Washington after a 37-31 loss in the 2024 Sugar Bowl, including a 1-3 record in neutral-site meetings. UT fell to Washington in the 2022 Alamo Bowl, (27-20) after previously besting the Huskies at the 2001 Holiday Bowl (47-43) and Washington claiming the win at the 1979 Sun Bowl (14-7). Texas won a home-and-home series against Washington in the early 70's winning in Austin by a score of 35-21 in 1974, then topping the Huskies in Seattle in 1975, 28-10.

SUGAR BOWL GAME

- Texas made its 59th all-time bowl appearance this season, the third-most in the country behind only Alabama and Georgia.
- The Longhorns have an all-time record of 31-26-2 (.525) in bowl games.
- This year's Sugar Bowl was UT's fifth all-time appearance in the game. The Longhorns are now 2-3 in the Sugar Bowl, with their last appearance being a 28-21 victory over Georgia in 2019. Prior to that, the Horns won the 1948 Sugar Bowl, 27-7 over Alabama, lost the 1958 Sugar Bowl, 39-7 to Ole Miss, and fell in the 1995 Sugar Bowl to Virginia Tech, 28-10.
- The Cotton Bowl (22 appearances), Alamo Bowl and Bluebonnet Bowl (six appearances) are the only bowl games that the Longhorns have appeared in more frequently than the Sugar Bowl, while this year's fifth appearance matches the number of times Texas has played in the Holiday Bowl.
- Texas made its 18th trip overall to Louisiana. The Longhorns have a 10-7-1 record in the Pelican State with a 7-0-1 record in New Orleans against Tulane, a 1-4 mark against LSU in Baton Rouge and a 2-3 Sugar Bowl record. The Horns are now 2-2 all-time in the Superdome (a win over Georgia and a loss to Virginia Tech in the Sugar Bowl and a 2002 win over Tulane).
- Texas now holds an 8-6 record against Pac-12 teams.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

- The Longhorns made their first appearance in the College Football Playoff since the CFP's inception in 2014.

DRAWING A CROWD

- Texas played in front of 68,791 fans at the Caesars Superdome.
- It marked the 13th consecutive game in which the Longhorns have played in front of a capacity crowd.

THE RUN GAME

- CJ Baxter surpassed 600 yards on the season, giving Texas a 1,000-yard rusher (Jonathon Brooks) and a 600-yard rusher for the first time since 1996.
- It marks the fifth time Texas has had a 1,000-yard rusher and 600-yard rusher in program history.
- Texas rushed for at least 100 yards in every game this season.

THE CAPTAINS

- Texas' captains are named on a weekly basis.
- The captains for today's game against Washington were QB Quinn Ewers, LB Jaylan Ford, DL T'Vondre Sweat and WR Jordan Whittington.

BREAKING BIG PLAYS

- Texas had six plays for 20 or more yards, including four in the fourth quarter.
- 1Q: RB CJ Baxter 31-yard reception for a first down.
- 2Q: QB Quinn Ewers 21-yard rush for a first down.
- 4Q: TE Ja'Tavion Sanders 21-yard reception for a first down.
- 4Q: WR Xavier Worthy 38-yard reception for a first down.

- Earned the first rushing touchdown by a defensive lineman in a bowl game in program history.

JAYLAN FORD, LB

QUESTIONS FOR HEAD COACH STEVE SARKISIAN, QUINN EWERS, AND JAYLAN FORD

COACH SARKISIAN: Okay. I think, first of all, I'll go backwards. But the resiliency our team showed in that fourth quarter to find a way to have an opportunity to win the game, I think, is indicative of the character that we have on this team and the men that we have in that locker room.

Those guys are fighters. These fought together. As bleak as it looked there, they never gave up hope and they believed. And I think that's how you give yourself a chance at the end.

I feel for them because I know how much they poured into this entire season. But like I told them in the locker room, we came into this season to be champions and they are. They're Big 12 champions, and they should be very proud of that. They were a second away from playing for a national championship. And so there's a lot to be proud of on this football team.

Unfortunately, in the game, we dug ourselves a hole with some self-inflicted wounds. And give credit to Washington, they played a very good game. [Michael] Penix got hot. They made some big plays down the field. And when they extended the lead, we got a little bit out of game plan to try to fight our way back into it. But we found a way to get a couple stops and force some field goals that gave us a chance to get back into the game.

But in the end, came up short. But there's nothing to hang our heads about. These guys fought. And I'm very, very proud of the effort that they put into it.

Q. Steve, can you go through the last four play calls inside the 12 and starting with the swing pass to Jaydon [Blue]?

COACH SARKISIAN: He was more of a check-down on the play. We were looking for an opportunity for JT (Ja'Tavion Sanders) or J. Whit (Jordan Whittington) trying to create a one-on-one matchup for those guys to go high-point it. Naturally, they did a good job defending it. And Quinn [Ewers] did a good job of just getting the ball out to Blue with a chance in space, but had to get out of bounds.

It's a tricky situation in that you're out of timeouts. So we have to be very careful that we don't complete a ball short of the goal line or pretty much the game is going to end at that point.

So when you're forced to throw it into the end zone each time, it makes it difficult, especially when they're defending the end zone. So we were just trying to create some matchups with some different route combinations to create some one-on-ones and to give our playmakers a chance to make a play.

And we just weren't quite able to do it. So that's the way it goes sometimes.

Q. Quinn, can you kind of take us through those final three plays and just kind of, I guess, the pressure Washington got on those last two?

QUINN EWERS: Yeah, like Coach Sark (Steve Sarkisian) was saying, we were just trying to take a shot at the end zone. Obviously, because if you fall short, like he said, the game is going to be over. So just was looking to give my guys an opportunity to go make a play. At the end of the day, that's all you can really do.

Q. Steve, I was wondering if you could just talk about the challenge to get pressure on Michael Penix and just kind of the challenge that that placed on your secondary to defend against guys.

COACH SARKISIAN: Yeah. No, I think there were times we did create some pressure. We just couldn't get him on the ground. And that was probably the most frustrating part. He was elusive in the pocket. And he did a good job of avoiding the rush and then keeping his eyes. And then I thought they did a good job of taking advantage of some one-on-one matchups when they got them.

And it just kind of felt like every time they threw it, and we were in pretty good coverage, they made the play. And that's a credit to them. They're a good offense and a good passing offense especially. It showed. We just couldn't get him on the ground. We couldn't generate enough pressure.

I thought our guys were fighting with the pass rush. We couldn't put enough pressure on the tackles, quite frankly, to get a holding call to even get them off schedule. They really played on schedule all night, and that makes it difficult.

The times we did get him into some third-and-longs, we had the ability to get off the field. But we just couldn't get him on the ground. I thought there were some decent pressures in there. We just didn't get him on the ground.

Q. Steve, I don't know if you feel like the 30 days off maybe affected y'all's offensive rhythm more. It just didn't seem like y'all were quite in sync like you were all year.

COACH SARKISIAN: Yeah, to your point, I think, for whatever reason, we had some uncharacteristic kind of anxiousness at the line of scrimmage, where we had different people kind of with false-start penalties. And those things are difficult because sometimes we're trying to play, let's get to second and 5 and now we can operate. And then you get a false start and it goes back at second and 10. Or you do something on first and 10, it's incomplete. That's okay. And then you false start and it's second and 15.

So those were some things that were a little disappointing. And I don't know if that's because of the lay-off or just sometimes being in the environment and you're a little excited to go play. But I thought we rebounded from those things.

And we ran the ball really well early in the game. But like I said, when you fall behind, it kind of stressed us where we had to kind of not lean on the run like we wanted to. And I thought that really changed as much of the game as anything to where we really couldn't lean into the run and then complement it with the passing game. We had to really start throwing it and then mix runs when we could.

Q. Jaylan, what did you say to your guys after the game?

JAYLAN FORD: After the game? I just told them I was proud of them. Kind of like what Coach is saying, this whole year we sacrificed a lot in order to build this team into the way we wanted it. And I think, like he said, at the end of that, like, we went all the way up until the last play.

And I'm just proud of my guys for never giving up. Not once did I ever believe that until that clock is zero that we didn't have a chance.

Q. Coach Sarkisian, you talked about the resilience of the team, the fight to the last second. Is this something that you guys practice, or is this just the culture and character of the team?

COACH SARKISIAN: It's a belief. We push our guys hard. Like I told them in the locker room, this has been a 12-month journey. We started winter conditioning last January. And those workouts aren't always fun, all right? But we're building character in those workouts. It's cold. We go in the morning. We practice really hard. Our practices are demanding.

Our summer workouts, when we run in DKR (Darrell K. Royal Texas Memorial Stadium) in the afternoon and it's 120 degrees, that's for a reason. It's to build character, and it's to develop the mental toughness and the resiliency.

And then we get to training camp, and we practice hard. And there's a belief in our style and what we do.

And I think it showed this season. There was a lot of games that came down to the wire for us this year. We found a way to win. And we put ourselves in position again tonight to have a chance to win the game. It just didn't happen.

But I think that that just speaks to the mental toughness that these guys have, the resiliency and, also, the connection that they have for one another. Just like Jaylan [Ford] said, these guys never lost faith. They believed that we were going to win that game. And it was just how. That was the biggest thing, was well, how are we going to do it? We know we're going to, it's just how. And unfortunately, we came up short tonight.

But that's the life of sport. When you get into sport, all you can do is put forth maximum effort in your preparation, get yourself in the right frame of mind, and then play as hard as you can. And in the end, somebody's going to win and somebody's going to lose.

And either way, that should build character and that should help these guys in whatever they end up going doing in life, that how to go about your business on a daily basis and put yourself in position to be successful, you got a chance in this life. And hopefully, they can walk out of this season knowing that.

Q. Coach Sark, obviously, you've been building over the last couple of years to get to this point. How do you then, going forward, maintain this level of success and then kind of building forward to get to the ultimate goal where you want to be?

COACH SARKISIAN: Well, I think that we have to make sure that -- This doesn't just happen, right? It took 12 months of hard work. We have to make sure that complacency doesn't set in. We have got to be mindful of that. And then we go right back to the foundation of building the team, like I said, in those things I discussed, whether it is winter conditioning, spring ball, summer workouts, training camp, Culture Wednesdays, all the things that we do.

Make sure that we still handle our business in the classroom. Make sure that we still handle our business in our community, because I think that, ultimately, you have to rebuild the character each year of your team.

And we have to be mindful that it doesn't just happen. It takes hard work. And I think that there's a lot of lessons to be learned that the value of that hard work that we put in is the reason that we're in this position.

So we're going to have to get right back to it again.

Q. Quinn, it looked like you hit your head on the turf in the first half. I don't know if you were treated for a concussion or examined for a concussion. And second part is: Why do you feel like it was so hard to get Xavier [Worthy] and AD (Adonai Mitchell) involved in the offense more?

QUINN EWERS: Yeah, I mean, I hit the back of my head a little bit, got examined, but was cleared, obviously. I mean, you just go out there and try to execute plays and put the ball where you think it's going to go. And it's hard to say why I didn't do certain things. And I don't like to play the what-if game at all. But we just go out there and try to execute each play to the best of our abilities.

Q. In the second half, it looked like a lot of the receptions were more in the flat. Whereas, in the first half, a lot of the plays that Washington had, offensively, were more down the field. Was that more of a scheme adjustment? Was that just something that they were doing offensively that was putting you guys in some difficult situations? Can you just explain the difference in their first-half attack versus the second-half attack?

COACH SARKISIAN: Probably a better question for Coach [Kalen] DeBoer, quite frankly. We try to, obviously, protect ourselves a little bit more against the deep ball, and maybe that's the reason the ball was going out to the flat. But I don't know if that was their intent or not. Like I said, that's probably a better question for him.

Q. Yeah, Quinn, I'm not sure if you're aware of not, but a year from now, the winner of the SEC will be here playing host in the Quarterfinals. Can you envision Texas being in this position? Or does it hurt too much right now to think that far ahead?

QUINN EWERS: I guess, I'm a human being and I understand what's ahead. But at the same time, there's a long ways in between here and a year from now. A lot can happen in 365 days.

But I know that we're going to work as hard as we can to try to be back. And that's all we can really do, is attack the offseason the right way and just continue to build this team to what it's capable of being.

Q. Quinn, we can see the emotion on your face. I don't want to guess how you're feeling, so I was hoping you could take us through your emotions now as you're sitting here thinking about how this game ended.

QUINN EWERS: Yeah, it's tough, especially losing a close game like this. But even though when you take a step back and you look back at the entire season, I'm proud of the way that we attacked each week. And for us to have the opportunity to even play here is just -- I know the whole team is beyond grateful for this opportunity that we had today.

And I think we all played our hearts out. And I don't question anybody's effort in that room -- in that locker room at all. But I couldn't be more proud of the way that we attacked this year because I know most of y'all didn't believe that we would be here right now.

And we're going to continue to focus on the opinions inside our four walls and continue to build.

Q. Quinn, when you guys got down 13, just kind of walk through your mindset, what you were saying to guys to kind of make that comeback. And then for Sark (Steve Sarkisian), just evaluate Quinn's performance tonight.

QUINN EWERS: I mean, going down 13, I think the biggest thing we were talking about was just one play at a time. You can't get all 13 points back in one single play. So the small wins turn into big wins, so just trying to get back on track. And I think we did a good job of that.

COACH SARKISIAN: Yeah, I thought Quinn [Ewers] had a really gutsy performance tonight. Thought he utilized his legs extremely well. They were really trying to deploy and match routes and cover people. And when that happened, he found some running lanes to use his legs to extend plays.

I thought he had made some big-time throws at critical moments, especially late in the ballgame. Gave us a chance to win. Down 13 in the fourth quarter with not a lot of time left. And we had the ball on the 12 with whatever it is, with a chance to win the ball game. That doesn't happen unless he's played his heart out and making some really big-time throws for us.

QUESTIONS FOR HEAD COACH KALEN DeBOER, MICHAEL PENIX, JR. AND BRALEN TRICE

COACH DeBOER: Yeah, I mean, you saw it. You saw what happened out there.

Obviously, I'm proud. I'm proud of the way our guys every single week bring everything they've got. And it doesn't just happen on game days. I think that's the thing I told them in the locker room just now, is a lot of people make choices to do something special. But the work doesn't always support the goals that they have.

And these guys don't just do it on game day. They do it each and every day going back to the time a year ago when they decided to come back and make this vision happen a reality.

So, thought we played a really sharp game in a lot of ways. A couple of opportunities that were missed. Unfortunate situation with the clock. And thought we'd end up with just maybe 10, 15 seconds to have to work with and then go the whole length of the field. But the defense had to stay out there and play every down until the very end.

And so proud of the resiliency and finding another way to win a football game.

Q. Michael, was there a time in your life where you felt like a night like this wasn't possible with all the injuries that you went through? And what is it like to get here and get to a national championship game?

MICHAEL PENIX JR: I wouldn't say I ever felt like this wasn't possible, because all things are possible when you believe in God. So for me, it was a tough time. I was going through some tough things throughout my career.

But I always say, man, I feel like everything I've been through built me for this moment. Built me into the man and the person and the player I am today. So I wouldn't change it for anything. I'm super blessed to be in this position, and I'm super blessed to be able to do it with the dawgs.

Q. What was the nature of Dillon Johnson's injury? And then for Michael, what was it like watching that last drive from the sidelines?

COACH DeBOER: Again, I haven't even talked to the training staff. I caught Dillon just a second. And it's related, I think, to what he's been going through the last couple months. So, obviously, he was down and in some pain. But he's been in pain the last couple months, so just working through it.

He's a tough, tough guy, tough kid. Not a kid anymore. But tough player for us. He's been just so strong and keeps pushing forward. It goes back to two or three weeks left to go in the season when really this injury happened, I think, based on what I understand.

MICHAEL PENIX JR: Yeah, for sure. Prayers out to DJ. He's been amazing for us all year. And he's definitely -- I saw a video whenever I was getting interviewed. He was going off the cart, pumping his fist, just super excited, screaming at the crowd. Man, that's just the person he is. He's just full of

excitement. And he wants to see everybody else be great. But obviously, seeing him go down was hard for us.

But watching the last drive from the sideline, it was just believing. Coach [Kalen] DeBoer, he always preaches to us, we're built for this moment and we believed it. And no matter the circumstances, the adversity that we went through during that drive, I know everybody on the sideline continues to believe. Continue to believe in the defense, that they were going to get that stop, because they've done it all year.

You've seen it so many times, each and every week throughout the season, them coming up with big-time stops and big-time moments. So we were just waiting for the play, and it was bound to happen.

But just super blessed, and we were all believing on the sidelines, though.

Q. What do you feel like a performance that Michael [Penix Jr.] had tonight does for his legacy at Washington?

COACH DeBOER: Yeah, I mean, he set the tone pretty quickly. And, I mean, just made all the throws. And obviously, there's other people that have to make the plays as well.

But I thought he just was just so good with his feet in the pocket and resetting and making throws, things that we know he's capable of doing. And with a good defense like we were facing in Texas today, he had to kind of resort to all the tools that he has and all the skill sets that make him special and make him, in my mind, the best player in college football.

This guy really all month was on another level as far as his mission to make sure that this happened. And I think you saw it all week in practice. There was just nothing he was going to let slide by where we would leave a doubt that we were going to find a way to win.

Even last night, I don't know what the meeting was about, but he asked to get the guys together. I think just sharing his mind, sharing his heart. Certainly, as a leader of this football team, those guys respond and you saw that today. Those guys play with passion, and it starts with No. 9 right here.

MICHAEL PENIX JR: Yeah, I'm just blessed. I couldn't do it without the man above and obviously without my offensive line and everybody that's been protecting me all season. They've been doing an amazing job, just keeping me clean. And obviously, I got the best playmakers on the outside. So it's like they make it easy.

You got the best players on the outside. You got Joe Moore winners. Man, it makes my job so easy. I'm just super blessed to be in this position.

But, man, the job's not finished. I feel like it's definitely going to take more. I'm going to push myself to get this team more next week. And, man, we're just super excited for the opportunity for sure.

Q. Kalen, on a night with big pass plays one after the other, [Ja'Lynn] Polk had the first one on the catch-and-run. How important was that for kind of setting the tone for what you were going to do? And then, Michael, Polk's touchdown catch where he tipped it to himself, what was your view on that play? And what did you think of that one?

COACH DeBOER: Yeah, I think that first drive and just coming out and Michael [Penix Jr.] putting the ball in a perfect position for JP (Ja'Lynn Polk) to catch it. And then JP making a couple of guys miss and getting a quick score, kind of just with a month off, you don't know how you're going to come out and what type of rhythm you're going to have. And I think that got Mike into a rhythm very quickly and gave us a lot of confidence that we can move the ball up and down the field.

MICHAEL PENIX JR: Yeah, man. That's a play we've been running all season. Just got the right look. And me and JP was on the same page. And just having to avoid pressure and make the throw. It was just like a routine play, man. It's just something that we've been repping all year.

And man, JP, he's a guy that's been making plays all season. You see him show up each and every week. So he's somebody that I trust. I mean, I trust all my guys, but he's somebody that I can trust to make those big-time plays. And I knew once I threw the ball, it was going to be a touchdown. Tipped or not, I knew he was going to find a way to get it because that's what he's been doing all year.

My voice is going out (laughter.)

Q. For Kalen and Michael. Kalen, you have not been afraid to go downfield all season. Even tonight, there were times toward the end, four or five minutes left, and you're not afraid to take shots downfield. Could you talk to me about just that philosophy of not just worried about the clock and getting the ball downfield?

And, Michael, a few weeks ago, y'all win an emotional game in the Apple Cup and you have to turn around and go play Oregon, and you're underdogs there. And now you win this emotional game tonight. And here you are a week from now going to Houston to play Michigan. How does this team get itself back up and get emotionally ready to go for this game?

COACH DeBOER: Yeah, I think the aggressiveness is just who we are. And I think time and time again, even look at the drives where we kind of stalled, I know a lot of the times we just look back on it and we were like, man, we just need to give Michael [Penix Jr.] a chance to have the ball in his hands because he was feeling it and his guys were making plays. And he was putting the ball where it needed to be and making good reads, and the O-line was protecting for him. And so not losing that aggressiveness.

I thought we did a good job even coming out of the half. And you never know how it's going to go. You would like to run some time off the clock. But it's what we've done the last two years here, is just stay aggressive.

Give Michael and the guys a chance to make a play. And, again, pushing the ball down the field, even to Rome [Odunze], getting the PI and things like that. We are just trying to put the game away. Don't want to be reckless, but that's our style, that's for sure.

MICHAEL PENIX JR: Yeah, man, just keeping a 1-0 mindset. That's what it's always been about all year. Yeah, we're going to celebrate this win. But we're going to have a quick turnaround. You got to be ready for the national championship. We're going to be playing a good team.

But, man, it's been amazing. Everybody just collectively just continues to believe and continues to trust the process.

That's the thing about us, I feel like each and every player on this team, we fell in love with the process. And I've said it since -- I think it was around fall camp, that our goal was to win the national championship. And some people probably didn't believe us. But we had the opportunity to do that. So we're not going to get distracted and forget about that goal.

Obviously, this was a step towards it. And it's given us the opportunity to be able to play in that game. But we're still motivated. We still got more things we want to accomplish. And the natty is right here in front of us. And our focus is going to be on that, and we're going to be ready for the game.

Q. Question for any of the three of you. This team has talked all season about the belief that it has in prevailing, getting the win. Can you talk about what that belief looked like on the final drive in a stressful situation?

BRALEN TRICE: From a defensive perspective, that belief just stems from all of our preparation throughout the whole season, throughout these past three, four weeks that we've had to get ready, early on before the season in our training periods.

But it's part of our standard. It's a player-led team. We do that every single day, right? We put ourselves in those situations in practice where we're ready when that happens. And I think you can think we were shook out there, obviously, but we weren't. We were ten toes down, ready to go.

Q. Talk about the third quarter, how you guys dominated the third quarter and held Texas to five plays with keeping your offense on the field. You turned the ball over a couple times. Really, the talk about this, going into this game, was the Texas defense may be able to stifle y'all. But y'all used your offense to stifle the Texas offense. Can you talk about that a little bit?

COACH DeBOER: Yeah, the defense did a nice job getting off the field, whether it be take-aways or getting stops. I think we started feeling it there at the end of the second quarter, going into the third. And getting a chance to have the ball to come out of the locker room and marching it right down the field.

And then kind of getting that ten-point lead, that was a big time in the game for us, to be able to be a little bit more in control. So that was good team football we were playing right there.

And I think that's what we've done a good job of, especially the second half of the season, is being there for each other. But getting stops and then going down and getting some sort of points. Every point mattered, obviously, tonight.

So getting field goals, even when you know you would like to get more, but getting some points on the board and special teams coming through with the field goals there, making all their opportunities.

The guys just coming out of the locker room and knowing there's 30 minutes left and leave it all on the field.

Q. Bralen, this last week you heard about that you're an underdog over and over again. And you seem to get a little impatient with that, wanting to come out with a decisive win. You've been the underdog in three of your last four games. Do you feel a little bit better, maybe you've sold more people on who you are and what you do?

BRALEN TRICE: Obviously, yeah, I feel better about that.

Yeah, I just think we prove everybody wrong time and time again. And we'll continue to do that. And this is what we do as dawgs, at UDub up in Seattle. We're bred for this. We prepare for this. And you can overlook us all you want, but we go out there and we prove everybody wrong every time.

Q. Michael, before the game, Coach talked about how he knew you were a Heisman-potential player back in Indiana. Having this kind of a performance on this stage, how much do you think that solidifies and maybe answers questions about how the Heisman voting ended? And also, if any of you guys watched "College Gameday" this morning, was your performance to let naysayers know, if you will?

MICHAEL PENIX JR: Man, I feel like everything happened for a reason. Coming out of high school, I'm going to be honest, like coming out of high school, when I committed to Indiana University, my dad, he didn't really want me to go there. He didn't understand why I was going there. So that was something that was hard for me, just having somebody that I love the most not really -- he didn't see my vision.

But obviously, it led me to here. Going to Indiana helped me meet Coach [Kalen] DeBoer, and our relationship that we built throughout the years has been amazing. And I wouldn't want to play for anybody else. So I'm super blessed.

And as far as the Heisman thing, that's over, man. It don't matter. Right now, man, we're looking to win the national championship. That's been my goal since day one. You won't find an interview or anything of me saying that I want to win the Heisman. Like, that was never my goal. My goal was to win football games for this team. And we've been doing it. 14-0 here and we got one more to go. So that's my focus.

The Heisman committee, I never like talk down on them at all. They do an amazing job with their votes. And Ja'Lynn Daniels, he's an amazing player. He's made plays all throughout the year as well. So I don't take anything away from him and the decision that they made.

But the only thing I can account for is what I do to help this team win football games, and that's what I'm all about.

Q. For Kalen and for Bralen, I have to know what your thoughts are on Elijah's [Jackson] play. What was going through your mind when he made it there at the end, from both of your perspectives on the sideline and on the field?

BRALEN TRICE: From my perspective, I was just obviously happy that he was able to make that play. I do like E.J. He works really hard every single day. He's a big part of our defense and a big part of our team. And to see him capitalize on an opportunity like that is huge. Especially for me, being a vet and seeing younger guys I've been looking at and watching and playing next to ever since they came in and seeing them get opportunities like that is huge. I mean, it makes me happy. It makes our whole defense happy. It makes these guys happy. It's awesome.

COACH DeBOER: I think, from a coaching standpoint, first things first, you love seeing just the team come through and find a way to win. And then when you look at individual performances and you see a guy who has come so far, even just this year and the confidence he continues to build.

And playing corner is so hard. Guys are going to make plays. You get to this level and this type of game and there's going to be a play that's going to be made and being able to just erase it from your mind and go make the next one, he's just really become someone that we can count on. And he's gotten better. And he's got a mindset. And we got a lot of belief in him across the board, both offensively and defensively. So it's really cool to see him use his skill set and his length to go knock that ball away.

Q. This is for Michael and Bralen. You two have had plenty of adversity through your career. Michael dealing with injuries at Indiana. Bralen being at UDub for now your fifth season. Talk about how this process has shaped you into a player that's prepared to go and compete for a national championship next week.

MICHAEL PENIX JR: Yeah, man, I say it all the time, I wouldn't change my journey for anything. And obviously, that might seem crazy to say because of what I've been through.

Like, if I would say that I had to get hurt four times for me to get to this point, that's not something that I would have thought of. But, man, I feel like it was all worth it. I feel like everything I've been through is definitely worth it and shaped me into the person, the player, and the man I am today.

So I'm just super blessed to be in this position and to be able to be on the other side of everything I've been through and continue to climb. I just continue to trust my faith and trust everything that I believe in. I just let everything just go and just have fun and not really worry about anything that I've been through. BRALEN TRICE: Yeah, as a guy that's been around for a while, since 2019 over at UDub, as a guy that's been around for a while, it's crazy to see the adversity we've been through and the point we're at now. All the guys around us that stayed around, stuck around through the mud to get to where we're at, it's a great feeling to know that we're at this point in our careers now where we can look back and be like, man, we had to go through that to get to where we're at.

I'm just proud of everybody on the team, both sides of the ball. It's a great feeling to be where we're at, but we're not done.

Q. Kalen, what is your game plan for the coming week? I assume y'all are going home tonight, or sometime. Long flight home.

COACH DeBOER: Yeah, the coaching staff is going home tonight. And they'll get rolling. Fortunately, we gain a couple hours going back.

The team will stay here tonight and then leave mid-morning and get back. It's going to be a quick turnaround. We'll get a couple practices in and then head down to Houston and kind of have what we would normally see as a Thursday/Friday down in Houston. Those practices. But Tuesday/Wednesday for us. That will take place up in Seattle.

So give us a chance to be able to kind of be back at home and be around our facilities and get back into the routine. It's going to happen fast and furious. One crazy thing that we got is we actually start our quarter tomorrow.

So we have some newcomers, high school and transfers, coming in. And we have to be around them from a coaching standpoint.

But I can tell you 100% of our dedication will be on getting ready, obviously, to play this game.

I'm not expecting these guys will be too consumed going to school or anything like that. So their time is done.

Q. Can you get in the work that you need? And how does this compare taking those bus rides to the NAIA championship games?

COACH DeBOER: Yeah, these are a little easier. You got a few more people around you, and the plane rides are much shorter. We'll enjoy tonight.
