### **Conference Notes Attendance: 55,889**

- Arizona State won its first Big 12 Football Championship in its inaugural year in the conference. This was also their first ever win in the postseason title game in school history in any conference.
- ASU's 35-0 run starting in the second quarter tied for the second-most unanswered points in a Big 12 Championship all-time.
- The Big 12 Most Outstanding Player Cam Skattebo tallied 18 points and three touchdowns, tying the record for the most in both categories at the Big 12 Championship. Last was in 2008 by both Chris Brown and Mossis Madu of Oklahoma vs. Missouri, both with 18 points off of three touchdowns. He also tied for third with many players in AT&T Stadium records for total TDs with three.
  - Skattebo rushed for 140 yards in the first half, the most in any half of a Big 12 Football Championship since 2003 (Last by Darren Sproles, Kansas State, 172 on Dec. 6, 2003, vs. Oklahoma in the second half). The last player with 100+ rushing yards in the first half was Oklahoma's Adrian Peterson with 100 yards against Colorado.
  - Skattebo is the fifth player with 150+ yards and two or more rushing touchdowns in the Big 12 Championship.
- ASU quarterback Sam Leavitt is the second player with three or more passing touchdowns and at least one rushing touchdown in a Big 12 Championship joining Texas' Vince Young in 2005.
  - Leavitt is the first FBS freshman with three or more passing touchdowns and one or more rushing touchdowns in a conference championship game since 2013 (Jameis Winston, Florida State).
  - Leavitt's three touchdown passes also tied for fourth-most passing touchdowns in the title game (last by Kyler Murray, Oklahoma, 2018)
- ASU wide receiver Xavier Guillory tied the record for most touchdown receptions in the Big 12 Championship, last achieved by Rashod Owens of Oklahoma State in 2023.

### Arizona State Notes

### **Team**

- Arizona State has won 10 straight games when leading at the half, second-longest active streak among current Big 12 teams (West Virginia, 11).
- ASU's 45 points through the first three quarters is the most points in a game for the Sun Devils outside Tempe since having 40 on Dec. 19, 2020, at Oregon State.
- ASU is 20-2 since 2020 when scoring 30+ points in a game.
- ASU has scored a touchdown on 66.7% of its opening drives this season, tied for the second-best mark in the FBS (Army 83.3%). The Sun Devils have scored on 75% of their opening drives this season, which is tied for third-most in FBS entering today (Army, 91.7% and Miami, 83.3%).
- ASU had 170 rushing yards in the first half, the most for the Sun Devils in any half since 2018. The ASU record is held by Eno Benjamin vs. Oregon State, 185 rushing yards in the first half).
- The Sun Devil defense had one inception and two fumble recoveries in the third quarter. The most recent game in which ASU had three or more takeaways in the same quarter was on Sept. 2, 2021, versus Southern Utah in the first quarter.
- This was the eighth-straight game with a takeaway for Arizona State, tallying 55 takeaway points this season. This is the second-longest active streak among current Big 12 teams (BYU currently leads with 13), and longest such streak for ASU since an 18-gamer between 2021 and 2022.
- ASU is 7-1 since 2020 when scoring 10+ points in the first quarter. ASU 6-0 this season when leading after the first quarter, tied for the eighth-best record in FBS.
- The Sun Devil's 21 takeaway points are its most in any game since Dec. 11, 2020, at Arizona (35).
- Arizona State is one of seven FBS teams that have had three different players make a field goal this season (Auburn, Cincinnati, FIU, James Madison, Syracuse, Tulane).
- ASU also tied (to date) Indiana with the largest FBS win improvement in victories from 2023 when ASU and IU both finished 3-9.

### **Individual**

- Redshirt freshman Sam Leavitt threw his eighth pass for 50+ yards this season the most in Big 12. He is the only other ASU player in the last 15 years to have more than eight in one season. Last was Jayden Daniels in 2019.
- Leavitt's 16 touchdown passes since the start of November are the most in the FBS. He also tied for fifth place in AT&T Stadium history with points responsibility of 24 and touchdown responsibility with four.
- Senior running back Cam Skattebo tabbed 170 rushing and 38 passing yards in the game. He is the first Big 12 player ever to have at least 1,500 rushing yards and 500 receiving yards in the same season, and the first power conference player to do it since Christian McCaffrey of Stanford in 2015.
  - In the first quarter, Skattebo tallied his eighth rush of 25+ yards this season. This was his fifth game this season with 75+ rush yards in the first half, third in a row.
  - Skattebo is the second Big 12 player to record 100+ rush yards and three or more from scrimmage touchdowns in three straight games (last by Kansas' June

Henley, 1996). This was also Skattebo's 10th career game with 100+ rushing yards (he had 140 in the first half alone), seventh this season. The only other ASU player with more in a single season this century was Eno Benjamin with nine in 2018.

- Skattebo is the second Arizona State player to have 75+ rush yards and 1+ rush TDs in three consecutive first halves since at least 2007 (Eno Benjamin, 2018).
   He is the second Big 12 player to do that this season (UCF's RJ Harvey October 19 November 2).
- Skattebo is the first FBS player with 75+ rush yards and 2+ rush TDs in three consecutive first halves since Toledo's Bryant Koback (November 2021).
- Entering this week, Skattebo gained 640 rushing yards after contact fourth most in the FBS.
- Skattebo's four games with 200+ scrimmage yards this season tied with UNC's Omario Hampton for second-most in FBS behind Jeanty's 7. He also tied for most of any Big 12 player in the last 20 seasons (Chuba Hubbard, 4, Oklahoma State, 2019).
- Skattebo's 20 touchdowns from scrimmage this season are the most by an ASU player in a single season since Marion Grice's 20 in 2013.
- Skattebo also is now sixth in AT&T Stadium college tandem yards in a game with 208 (170 rushing, 38 receiving on 18 rushes and receptions).
- Wide receiver Melquan Stovall's 63-yard catch in the first quarter was the most yards gained on a 4th-and-1 play for Arizona State in the last 15 years. It was the sixth-most yards gained on a 4th-and-1 in the FBS this season.
- Redshirt senior Xavier Guillory recorded his second career multi receiving touchdown game. He has had a touchdown catch in three-straight games, after having just two in his first 15 games as a Sun Devil.
- Sophomore Keith Abney II's interception tied the Big 12 Championship record (last in 2023 by two players).
- Redshirt freshman Carston Kieffer had a 32-yard field goal in the first quarter. Kieffer is the second FBS player in the last 25 years to have his first career FGM (at the FBS level) come in a conference championship game (Tulsa's Chadd Evans in 2005 in the Conference USA title game).

### **Team**

- Iowa State's 15th touchdown drive on 10+ plays ties for second most in the Big 12 this season (Kansas, 17).
- Iowa State's last comeback win after trailing by 14 or more points at the half was on Nov. 30, 2013, when they trailed West Virginia, 31-14. The Cyclones went on to win 52-44 in three overtimes.
- ISU is now tied for second-fewest penalties in a college game at AT&T Stadium and has the second-fewest penalty yards with two penalties for 10 yards.
- Iowa State had allowed 156.9 pass yards per game this season prior to Saturday third best in the FBS. Arizona State passed for 147 yards in the first half.
- ISU has allowed a touchdown on 41.7% of its opponents' opening drives.
- With two fumbles lost, Iowa State tied for fourth in team fumbles in the title game.

### **Individual**

- Sophomore Carson Hansen recorded his first career touchdown catch of the season in the first quarter, which tied his career high of three catches.
- Quarterback Rocco Becht's 44 career touchdown passes since the start of last season is the most by any current Big 12 player to date. Becht has a touchdown pass in 17-straight games, fourth longest active streak in the FBS.
- Becht has had multiple touchdown passes in eight games for the second straight season.
   The only other season in which a Cyclone quarterback accomplished this was Brock Purdy with eight in 2019.
- Senior Jayden Higgins now has 16 straight games with 50+ receiving yards, the longest streak by a Big 12 player since 2018 (last by Tylan Wallace, Oklahoma State, 28 straight, 2018-20).
- Higgins and senior Jaylin Noel have had 30 or more receiving yards in the team's last 19 games, the longest streak by any FBS duo since Tavon Austin & Stedman Bailey with 27-straight for West Virginia (2010 to 2012).
- Higgins has had 11 games with five or more catches this season and is tied for most in the FBS.

- Skattebo also broke ASU's school record for most scrimmage yards (Eno Benjamin, 1,905). He has 2,074 all-purpose yards this season.
- Currently at 19, Skattebo needs one rushing touchdowns to set ASU's school record in the category (Woody Green, 19, 1972).

### **Starting Strong**

- The Sun Devils have not punted on an opening drive this season and have scored on the first drive in nine of 12 games. They have touchdowns in eight of those (field goal against lowa State today and Wyoming in the first game of the year), threw interceptions on the opening drives against Utah and Texas Tech and turned the ball over on downs against UCF.
- ASU has scored on the opening drive of 76.9 percent of its opening drives this season, good for third in the FBS (Army, 91.7/Miami (FL) 83.3)
- ASU has outscored opponents 101-13 in the first half of the last four games

MATT CAMPBELL: First and foremost, let me just give credit to Arizona State. I thought their kids, obviously they executed with high precision today. Hat's off to them. Obviously they've got some great players and really well coached. So you give credit to them.

Unfortunately, we didn't play our best football game today, and that's what it was going to take for us to be successful, but I couldn't be prouder of our kids, who they are, what they withstood through the season, some of the challenges we've gone through and our ability to not flinch.

We kept playing today, but obviously you can't make some of the mistakes we made against a team of this caliber. With that said, I'll open up to any questions you have.

Q. Three possessions, three turnovers to start the second half. You probably felt like, we go down and score, it goes the other way today. How deflating was that?

MATT CAMPBELL: It doesn't get much more deflating than that. I think the thing we prided ourselves on is our ability to take care of the football and our ability to create takeaways. We felt like that, especially that margin for both teams, they were plus 11, we were plus 9 coming into



the game, I felt that was going to be the key to this football team, the ability to take care of the football. And our inability to do that in the third quarter was just paralyzing.

You can't give an offense who was really in a great rhythm, you can't give them a short field, especially to start the second half. Those are tough things because those are fundamentals and details we've done -- especially in terms of ball security, we've really done a great job prior to, but yeah, tough for sure.

Q. As you walked out, it looked like you had your arm around Beau's waist. What can you say about him, and what can you say about the message you had to them?

MATT CAMPBELL: I think the message from me is pretty simple. What Beau and this senior class has done for Iowa State football has been nothing short of exceptional. It's been player led and player driven. When you're a warrior like that, man, these moments you don't have the success that you want, obviously there's temporary pain.

The great thing is we get another football game, and the great thing is that, man, what this group has already done is historic here at lowa State. Nobody can ever take that away from them. The reality of it is we still get one more chance to send this senior class out the way we need to.

I appreciate and love them, and that's what I told them after the game. Just because we had a result we didn't like doesn't mean I have any less appreciation and love for what this group is all about.

Q. Sorry it didn't go the way you guys wanted, and I know the turnovers didn't help. What were your thoughts on the missed tackles today and just execution on defense?

MATT CAMPBELL: Obviously again, I thought the second half of the season we've really started to shore some of those things up. Unfortunately today, that didn't show up in some of our biggest moments. We'll have to figure out exactly why.



Part of that obviously is an elite tailback, but I think the other part of it is, man, we just weren't fundamentally where we needed to be when we needed to be there a couple of times. I think that part of it, I'll take as the head football coach. It's my responsibility to make sure where we need to be when we need to be there, and we just weren't.

I'll have to look back on, man, how do I be better in that moment to help our kids be at their best? Like I said, we'll get another shot to prove we can get that done.

Q. You mentioned the bowl game. What's the challenge of regrouping here after a loss like this, and just in this day and age too? With the transfer portal opening on Monday, it's a lot thrown at these guys.

MATT CAMPBELL: That's the great thing about our program. We're not transactional, we're transformational. Whatever it is, it is. We'll be ready to play wherever that may be. Whatever the opportunity, this senior class, we're about finishing. We're not about everything else.

#### Q. Do you think you have any chance of getting an atlarge bid tomorrow?

MATT CAMPBELL: Yeah, I don't. That's the reality of that situation. But I don't know enough about it, and the reality from our end is we had some opportunities late in the season to put ourselves in the best situation. Again, those are great lessons learned, and we'll grow with it.

We have a young football team that's got the ability to go forward for sure.

Q. Earlier this week, you talked about falling short in this game a few years ago. How much does it sting to kind of get back and still not be able to reach that pinnacle that you're striving every day to get to?

MATT CAMPBELL: I think those things sting for sure. You remember the losses way more than you remember the wins, especially when you don't play to what you're capable of playing. So those things, they'll haunt you, and the reality is still what drives you. It wakes you up every day to come in and be your absolute best.

The great thing about myself, our staff, and the young people that we have, they've got great humility, and they've got great character. We'll show up, and we'll be better for it someday.

Q. What's the importance of being able to have some young guys come back and potentially get back here

## in future years? When you think of Rocco or Brahmer or the young running backs you have.

MATT CAMPBELL: If you're a young football player in our program, you got to witness leadership for the ages. What this group has led through, the injuries, the challenges that we went through, and never, never was there an excuse, never was there a flinch. Even today, as not as great as we wanted to play, you didn't see our kids fold their tent.

These are unbelievable experiences, and if you're willing to learn from them and grow from them, then you've got this great ability to come back better for it. I think you've seen our football program do that over the last nine years. Again, you're talking about what we've been able to accomplish is nothing short of exceptional and all the credit to our kids.

#### Q. How impressed were you by what Cam Skattebo was able to do out there?

MATT CAMPBELL: He's a really good football player, a lot of respect for him. Any time you witness a great football player like that, you just have to have great appreciation for it. He's an A player, and he played an A game today. In those moments, you need your A players to play football, and he certainly did it. Hat's off to him for sure.

## Q. Rocco took a pretty brutal hit. What's he feeling? How's he doing? What do you know?

MATT CAMPBELL: Obviously he was cleared to come back into the football game and did a nice job putting a drive together at the end of the game.

Rocco is a tough customer. That was a tough shot, and as you know, you guys who have covered us, how tough he truly is. We quadruple checked to make sure whether we were going to put him back in the game. Obviously you know Rocco, he was demanding to get back in the game as soon as he was cleared. I'm proud of him. But I think Rocco will be just fine moving forward.

Q. At the end of the second quarter, you chose to not call timeout after Leavitt got down to the 2 or 3 yard line, and you went into halftime after Abu's run. Can you walk me through your time management decisions at the end of the second quarter before halftime?

MATT CAMPBELL: Yeah, we were in a flurry of chaos there, and I wanted to settle the ship. The last thing I wanted to do is turn the ball back over to obviously them. It felt like we were getting the ball at the start of the second half, and you're talking about -- I mean, there was three seconds on the clock. What are you going to do?



So the reality of it is, man, let's get ourselves in, let's get regrouped, let's put ourselves in a great situation to come back out. We're getting the ball, we go put a score, and we're right back in the football game. That was my thought.

Again, hindsight 20/20, we'll look at it and evaluate it. I'm not saying that was the perfect decision, but at that time and the momentum where it was, I just felt we needed to regather ourselves, regroup. You always evaluate those things and see if it was the best decision. That was my thinking on that part.

Q. Earlier this week, Coach Heacock was talking about the running quarterback, a guy who can extend plays giving the defense a bit of trouble. What did you think of Sam Leavitt's play today and his ability to do kind of what Coach Heacock was talking about?

MATT CAMPBELL: What you said, I think those were timely. There were maybe four in the first half that were third down, fourth down conversions. We had them fourth and four, fourth and three, obviously we had him fourth and one, and he made the play.

Again, hat's off to Sam. What you saw on the videotape is a really talented competitor, and he was certainly that today. Some of the plays in the first half, you're talking a totally different football game if you win those moments. They were able to do it and really grab the momentum.

Yeah, obviously great point and certainly give a lot of credit to him.

Q. You certainly touched on it, but just can you elaborate on what it means to you -- presumably they're all playing to get another chance to coach Beau one more game, Jayden, Jaylin, J.R., all those guys down the line.

MATT CAMPBELL: To me it means the world to me. We've talked about this, my loyalty to this senior class and pulling us by the bootstraps out of really hard two years ago when the deck was falling against us and easily it could have imploded. These guys refused to allow it to happen.

The courage and toughness that they have shown over the course of the last two years is like nothing I've ever seen. When you lose some of the guys that we've left and what happened to us at times this year and never flinch, demand to show up every single day, and how those young men have led, it's been nothing short of exceptional.

To me, it's an honor to be able to coach them. To me, it's an honor that we get more time with these guys. We're going to do everything in our power to send these guys out the right way, and we look forward to the challenge and opportunity ahead.

## Q. It looked like Malik got all armored up to try to give it a go tonight. Just not able to for a long stretch there?

MATT CAMPBELL: I think we were right on the edge of him being ready to go and just physically not there yet. I appreciate his willingness, and I think it tells you everything that guy has tried to do for the betterment of our team over the course of the last month and a half. He's a warrior.

He's tried to help and tried to put himself in position to help us, but unfortunately tonight wasn't truly ready to rock and roll.

Q. We saw on that fourth and one, what's the challenge when a running back like Skattebo presents such a threat to cover all your bases, the deep passes and the play action on top of that?

MATT CAMPBELL: I don't know if it's just him. I think it's the reality -- and certainly he's talented, but I just think the holistic view model is, man, you have to be elite. Fourth and one, they're in a run formation, and you're going to have to be disciplined.

There's times we've been unbelievable with it. Against Kansas State same thing happened, and we were able to cover and did a great job. And there's been times in our past where we just haven't made the play.

Hard situation and a situation where the detail was a hair off, and that's a situation where obviously they made some great plays. You tip your hat to them, and that's something we'll continue to work forward on.

Q. Rocco, just walk us through a little bit that third quarter where everything seemed to go wrong for you guys.

ROCCO BECHT: We're a second half team, and today just wasn't clicking on all cylinders for us. That's no fault to anybody. That's just fault to -- just our leaders on our team just trying to prepare this team and get ready for that second half.

We had everything in our hands still. We just needed to execute. At the end of the day, we just didn't.

Q. Jaylin, it felt like offensively you guys were kind of



doing what you wanted early on to get the one stop then it snowballed. How confident were you you'd get that groove back and get back into it?

JAYLIN NOEL: We're always confident. Obviously like you said, we weren't moving the ball how we wanted to, but it came down to the small details. The small details weren't there when we needed them. That's what prevented us from going forward and scoring more points.

Q. Jaylin, I saw how emotional you were coming off the field. Could you just describe a little bit more about why this means so much and hurts so much because this opportunity was here?

JAYLIN NOEL: I love this team. I love this university, love my brothers, and just everybody that's believed in me.

For us to -- obviously not end of season, we've got one more game. But for us to lose this game the way we did, everybody kept fighting, though. I couldn't be more proud of this team to get to this point. I'll be appreciative forever for what this team has done for me and what my brothers have done to me, yeah.

Q. Myles, one of the phrases we've heard a lot is the attention and the detail. Did you feel like defensively you guys were as detail oriented and firm on that kind of thing in terms of the missed tackles today?

MYLES PURCHASE: Yeah, like we said earlier, I feel like in a lot of ways we just weren't clicking on all cylinders. Defense is a team effort, and if one thing goes wrong, it can make a snowball effect as well. Just not clicking on all cylinders, and obviously that's the result.

Q. Rocco, you took a pretty big hit there. How are you feeling? What was your mindset after it happened?

ROCCO BECHT: I was feeling good. I just wanted to get back in the game and keep playing with my guys and put points up on the board. So I'm good.

Q. Rocco, I noticed in the tunnel you didn't run back. You kind of stood there and made sure you kind of talked to everybody. Is that something you always do, or is that something you had to do today?

ROCCO BECHT: These guys put in a lot of work to get to where we did today, and it just didn't fall out the way we wanted it to. We've got to be better. We're a team that I feel like can handle adversity really well. Today at some points we couldn't, and we have to fix that.

At the end of the day, I told everybody coming out of that

tunnel, the ones that are coming back, remember this feeling. We will be back in this game next year, I promise you that.

Q. J.R., everyone talks about Skattebo. (Indiscernible). They added a playmaker. How difficult was it to slow them down offensively?

J.R. SINGLETON: Yeah, credit to them. That's why I feel like Skattebo is an All Conference player. We're practicing tackling all week, and we had to get population to the ball, and we failed a lot of times today.

The offense needs us, and we just didn't accomplish what we needed to today.

- Q. J.R., how do you summarize what happened in the third quarter as things just started to unravel on both sides of the ball?
- J.R. SINGLETON: We had a couple turnovers, and then when the turnovers happen, we're a brotherhood, and the defense, we were out there. It was on us to get a stop, and we didn't.

I mean, there's no fingers to point. It's a team effort. Team is what got us here, and we lost as a team today. That's point blank, period, what it is.

- Q. J.R. and Myles too if you want to chime in, after you played against Skattebo for a game, what is it that makes him kind of unique or different than other backs that you faced? Against a guy like that, do you have to try and tackle or wrap him up like in other ways?
- J.R. SINGLETON: He's just got a low center of gravity. I feel like, when he gets his engine going, it's hard to stop him. That's why Coach emphasized getting vertical this week so we could stop him in the backfield and not get him going.

When he does get going, you've got to get population to the ball. It's really hard to tackle him one-on-one. That's the biggest thing about him.

MYLES PURCHASE: Like J.R. said, I would say he's got really good contact balance. Like he said, getting population to the ball is big for us, and that's just the thing we we're doing today. I have to take accountability for that as well.

Q. For the three seniors, assuming everyone decides to play in the ballgame, what would it mean to have one more opportunity to play as a group and obviously with the entire team?



JAYLIN NOEL: Yeah, it means everything. The seniors are going to play in the bowl game. I'm going to play in the bowl game. Just to be able to have that last moment, it will be a defining moment for this program, to win 11 games and finish better than we did last year.

I know we went in last year to Memphis and obviously didn't win that game, but this year it will be different. We've got to prepare, keep the standards the standards, keep holding guys accountable, and anybody that doesn't want to hold that standard doesn't need to go for the ride on the last game. But we'll be ready for it.

J.R. SINGLETON: I think I'll just piggy-back on what Jaylin is saying. Really anything you put your hands on in life, you want to leave it better than you got it. Really all us seniors, we take a lot of pride in being the Cyclone and leaving this place better than how we found it.

Really putting the exclamation point on it, going out there and getting the win against whoever we play wherever we play, it means the world here. We're still on pace to make history, right? Iowa State's never won 11 games, so that's still in the grasp for us.

You're going to get our all. We're going to go back to the drawing board, and we're going to win that game.

MYLES PURCHASE: I guess you can't say too much other than that. J.R. really summed it up. We have a bowl game, but we're going to prepare for that game like it's the playoffs. I'm going to give my best, and I know the seniors are going to give our best in that game.

THE MODERATOR: Coach, congratulations on winning the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Thank you.

THE MODERATOR: Opening comments.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: It was a great game. Players played really well. Our players are good, and they're good people. It's a good combination.

THE MODERATOR: We'll open it up for questions.

Q. Congratulations, Coach. After the performance today, do you think the team is worthy of a first-round bye in the playoffs?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: In the judging last year, they left a team out because of a quarterback, and I think our play, we're 11-1, with our starting quarterback having beat four ranked teams, having won the Big 12 Championship. So I do think because we've made a standard that the quarterback is that valuable, I think there should be a real chance we get a first-round bye. I definitely think we should host a game.

Q. Coach, I just wanted to ask you about Cam Skattebo. What has he meant to the team, especially heading into this match-up, where you don't have [Jordyn] Tyson. You know a lot is going to be on him. How did he prepare?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: He prepared the exact same way he always prepares. So mature. He's grown up so much



this year. You can see the speed there throughout the game, which he didn't have last year, but that's the work that he put in to get to that point.

But preparing like he always prepared. A whole bunch of people stepped up. That's the best part about tonight on offense was not just one person stepped up. X stepped up, Stovall stepped up. The O-line. Sam Leavitt is an unbelievable football player. Chamon Metayer stepped up. I could go on a list of offensive players.

The defense gets three takeaways to start the second half on their side of the field. Like are you kidding me? It's kind of like a scene from a movie.

Q. Kenny, have you seen a team improve as much as this one has from the beginning of the year to the end? You talked about wanting to see your team blow out opponents, which hadn't happened until the last two weeks, and then you did that easily.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: It's been great to see our guys play better in the second half. They took it kind of personal after Week 11 when we let another team come back. They took it personal, and they wanted to start finishing games better. They've been harping on it, they've been talking about it. They've been kind of living it. Not just rah-rah, but real focus in the locker room at halftime that we've got to come out and play a good second half. The growth on this team is remarkable. I've never been part of a team that's grown this much.

Q. Kenny, you came here hoping this was possible. Did you think it could happen this quickly?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: No. To be honest, we just got two really good players. That helps. He's got way more belief than I do. Like I said, these guys are good.

Q. Coach, earlier in the first half, you guys faced a similar situation as you did in your first conference game, fourth and 1 in your own territory. Both plays, you guys decided to do a shot play.

Could you go into the decision-making and the difference



between then and now and the confidence in your guys?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: I had nothing to do with that. That was Coach Arroyo. He called it. I was like oh, crap. All right, bud, let's do it. You watch more film than me when it comes to offense right now. I trust it. I trust our quarterback. I trust our players.

He thought that was the best call for that situation. I almost wanted to say, just hand it to Skat, just hand it to Skat. But I trusted him, I trusted our quarterback. Incredible play call, incredible execution, great pickup up front, great throw by Sam. That's a game-changing play right there.

Q. Coach, congratulations. The competition you faced in the Big 12 this year, what do you think it did to prepare you for the extended competition you'll see in the playoffs?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: This is a really, really deep league. Every week, anybody can beat anybody. That's why it's difficult to get through unscathed. You go to real college environments. All of the environments you play on the road are real environments. Our Texas Tech loss on the road was a real environment. First away Big 12 game.

Then we go on the road at Cincinnati's homecoming without our starting quarterback, which is a real environment.

Then you go to Kansas State after they have a bye. That's a real environment.

So I just think the difficulty is not just the teams, but it's the environments you go into as well, which is why the Big 12 consistently, you know, people lose one or two games in the league because it's just so competitive.

Q. Coach, in all your years of being in this profession, and obviously it's still a really young team, the seniors kind of left things where they left it. How do you see the future of this program just based on how fast the young guys caught on to your message, and has it surprised you that they caught on this fast?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: I think we've shown great leadership. You think our leadership council, our players, the guys up here next to me are unbelievable competitors, unbelievable leaders.

When your players run your program, you're good. You can force coach-led leadership, which is needed at times. At the same time, if your players aren't feeding the rest of the team the same vision, the same message, you're only going to be capped at how good you can be.

I think these guys have an unbelievable maturity about themselves to lead their team. What other team has their players giving pregame and halftime speeches? And that's not fake. That's just what our team is.

Q. Coach, two weeks ago, Javan made a big play for you against BYU. He sparked you guys in the second half with the turnover. Seemed like that was a snowball effect after that turnover. What did that turnover mean to you guys that early in the third quarter?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: It was huge to get the takeaway and for the offense to score. The exciting thing was the response in the second half to come out fast. It was a few adjustments we made defensively to combat their check-with-me stuff. And the fact that our guys could go out there, take what we took at halftime, apply it, it worked, and then capitalize on it. Our offense going and capitalizing, that's just a really good team football. That's what good teams do. They play off each other.

Q. Kenny, when you go back and reflect on your time when you first got here in November of 2022, guys like Trenton Bourguet, Caleb McCullough, guys like that who trusted you and stayed through the process, what does it say about those guys believing in you and believing in what you were building to get to this point now?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: It's pretty cool to watch those guys celebrate today. Trenton went on the field and took the knee at the end, which is cool. Talk about a full circle career for him. And then Caleb, to just continue to make plays. He could be one of the most improved players on our football team from where he was 24 months ago to where he is now. It's just incredible.

Those guys believed in the vision, though it's hard to believe when you're not very good and you're 3-9. Not many people believed with that. But we had a sense of belief because, like I said, the guys next to me, the leaders on our football team create a sense of belief with the work they put in.

Q. Kenny, if you could have a last-minute message to the playoff committee, what would it be?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: I would say these guys have worked so hard. These guys have accomplished things that I don't know if any team's ever accomplished, being picked 16th out of 16 and winning a championship.

We're 11-1 with this kid to my left. We're Big 12 champs



when he's on the field, and I think if you were to look at our résumé with Sam Leavitt as our starting quarterback, I think you can look deep and hard to see where we stand with champions, where we stand with conference champions because we've already made the decision that quarterbacks are very, very important to the college football committee. I think it's time to double down on how important the quarterback is and look back on our season as our quarterback played.

Q. Coach, it really felt at the end of the first half you guys got going in the defense. In the second half, you got three consecutive turnovers. Earlier, you talked about attack, attack, attack. What change going from halftime to the second half to allow to gain the momentum and swing the game in a different direction?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: To be honest, I thought they had a good plan early. A lot of check-with-me, getting themselves into good plays, good numbers. I think Coach Ward did a nice job combatting it. Then our players got comfortable.

Early, you're in the best if not the best stadium in the country that they're playing in. A lot of our kids are from Texas. They dreamt of the playing in the Big 12 title game. To say there's not going a little nerves is delusional. There's going to be a little bit of nerves. It's what they dreamt of.

I think they calmed down, I think we made adjustments as a staff and they went out and executed the rest of the game. It started in the first half and continued through the third quarter.

Q. Kenny, what can you say about the way Cam played today and the end of the season. Do you think he should be in New York for the Heisman ceremony?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: I do think he should be. Want to turn on the tape? I mean, he's really good. Like he's good enough to be there. I don't know. What did he finish up today? Oh, he was 0 for 1 passing.

(Laughter.)

KENNY DILLINGHAM: He had two catches for 38 yards, one touchdown. He basically had 200 yards of total offense and three touchdowns. That's incredible. I think that's his third time in a row he's gone for over 100 yards and multiple touchdowns in the first half, potentially.

I don't know what else you can do to put your name in the race. Obviously, there's two other guys that are really,

really high on that list, and I don't know if he should ever surpass those guys. Should he be on that list? Should he have the opportunity to go there? Yes.

Q. You've always been so much about process, focusing on one week to the next. Can you please just describe when you guys got the ball back with two minutes left and you started making your way around the sideline hugging people and congratulating people, what that feeling was like?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah, it was pretty cool. I mean, it was pretty cool. The process was over. We got the job done. It's just a pretty cool moment to see those guys.

Q. Kenny, can you take me there a little bit about that Skattebo pass, what was going through your head? Sam, if you want to chime in too, what were your thoughts on that?

CAM SKATTEBO: I'll take it.

Don't do it. That was going through my head. That what makes Skat Skat. He does incredible things. You know what? To his credit, like, they pan out. I don't know how. Last year, we called a punt with him as our quarterback, because it was an absolute amazing situation we were in last year, and he checks a throw to Elijhah Badger, and it's complete. I'm like what's just happened? Like is this real life?

But that's Skat. It defines Skat. He's just one of those guys that he works so hard, he finds a way to be successful. What was going through my head was oh, my gosh, this is not good. This is not good. Oh, it's getting worse, it's getting worse. Then it was incomplete. I was like holy cow.

Q. First of all, congratulations. What does this moment mean for long-time Sun Devil fans? What does it mean to people who have been with the program from the first year up to now. Knowing the job isn't finished, what does this mean?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: It just shows what we can be. With the right direction, with the right players who are committed to the program and committed to work, I think you can achieve anything here.

I've always thought that. People have always said this place is a sleeping giant, sleeping giant. Well, you're not a sleeping giant, right, if you never wake up. You're a dead giant, right?

It just hasn't woken up for so long. Finally, I think these



guys have bought into not just Arizona State, to the city, to the community, the weather. They're over here talking about the weather the other guy. It's like they've bought into everything that the Valley, Tempe, Arizona State has to offer. That's what's special is these guys are members of the people. Like they love it there, and I think that's special.

THE MODERATOR: We'll start with questions for the players.

Q. Xavier, this had to be like a whole redemption tour for you after being denied by the NCAA eligibility last year. Talk about what are your feelings right now. You definitely put in the work and the sacrifices to be where you're at right now.

XAVIER GUILLORY: It's surreal. I can't put words on it. I'm blessed to be in this room next to these three guys, being on this team.

When I made the switch, I want to credit Coach Dillingham and the staff and the university. They took a chance on me off the portal knowing I could be ineligible. When the news came back, the only thing that changed was I couldn't play.

These guys stuck by me the whole year, motivated me, kept me going. Each and every day, I showed up in the building even though I knew I couldn't play. It's a blessing because we all talked about winning the championship, and we knew we could do it. We put the belief in each other.

So whenever I was granted eligibility and the next year came, it was a clean slate. I could sit and pout about it, or I could be ready for this moment.



It's just a blessing to be here. I just can't put any words on it, really. Can't put any words on it.

Q. Xavion, you've played state championships in this stadium. To do it in front of your friends and family, doing it at the collegiate level, what does it meant to you, being a kid from Texas?

XAVION ALFORD: It means a lot. You see this game a lot growing up and dream of playing in it. You see this stadium a lot and dream of playing in it. I got to play here before now at the high school level. I got to do it again. Third time.

The last time I was in here, confetti was raining. I took it as a sign this time the same thing would happen. Especially with these guys and the belief we had in the team.

Coming into the game, the whole week, we knew we could win this game, and I told them that. Everything we've been doing the whole year, our culture has been a championship culture. Even though we don't say that. Even though we don't say, oh, championship culture, we've been building a championship team the whole year.

To come out and finish it off like that, to continue pressing and twisting, not be done, it shows we're here to work, and we'll be here regardless of who believes in us, each and every week, each and every day. We love being the underdog. We love when we see that on the media. We feel like we're in our place. Coming in here, it's a blessing to be on this team with these guys.

Q. Sam, I'm curious, can you tell me a little bit about how Cam is on the sidelines, especially when you guys aren't in the game? What's he kind of like?

SAM LEAVITT: He's a little bit of a spaz, you know, but he's just talking over scheme and telling me what he sees on the field and exactly what he's thinking. Talk about a super cerebral player. He's one of the best that I've played with, if not the best.

I think back to his little run around and throw. Shouldn't



have done that, probably, but he knew where I was at so it wasn't going to be intentional grounding so it was a super smart play. Yeah, the kid's just unreal.

## Q. Cam, you were having a lot of your teammates sign your belt after you got that. Why did you want to do that?

CAM SKATTEBO: My O-line because we wouldn't be in this position if we didn't have them. Me and this guy scoring touchdowns, those guys have put in the effort to get better every day. You see week in and week out, they get better and better and better.

I don't know how many yards I have this season, but they're the reason for it. Even being in the Heisman talk is awesome, and those are the reason -- that's the reason. Those guys up front. And I just want to keep spreading love to those guys because they deserve it.

## Q. Cam, playing at a non-Power 4 conference or a smaller school, something like that, what did that do for you to make that transition to a Power 4 conference and become a better player?

CAM SKATTEBO: I had coaches at that level who were better than that level and developed me to become to the level I'm playing at now. Coming to ASU and having Coach Aguano and Coach Dillingham pushing me and making me better because they know what it takes to be successful at this level, I've been set up for success because of the level of coaches I've had and the teammates I have that trust and believe in me. The reason I'm here is because of them.

# Q. Sam and Xavion, obviously, you know, DB, quarterback. When that targeting play kind of happened, what were both your initial reactions, and what was your reaction as to the explanation of why it was targeting and why you got ejected?

XAVION ALFORD: Honestly, with the different types of targeting, I thought it was a clean hit. His head was up. It's football, you know. It happens. Obviously, you know, we can't really -- we don't really have the outcome on that, can't control it.

Obviously, in good spirits and next man up. Keep the next man up mentality throughout the team. Even offensively, everybody talked about we had JT go down, but the offense was the offense. We believe they do what they do. They score points. Skat, Sam, X, all the receivers, everybody stepped up. We're one team, and that's the thing about this team. We're just together. Until that 60 minutes is erased off the clock, we'll play our hardest, play

as hard as we can and compete. That's all.

# Q. Sam, on the fourth and 1 in the first half, you were deep in your own territory, what did you see in the buildup of the play that led you to gamble out there? That's a tough decision to make. What was the discussion? Ultimately the play turned into a big gain. What was the reaction?

SAM LEAVITT: We know on fourth and one they were going to play cover one or cover zero, essentially, whether it was all out or zero route. So we knew we would have a stutter and go. If we gave big action, we've got Number 4 in the backfield. Everybody has to account for him.

So I just gave good action, pulled the safety down, and then Melquan was able to give a bluff and go and just take off down the field. Great call by Arroyo. I was pretty shocked that he called it that early in the game. We practiced all week, were successful 100 percent throughout the week. Big-time players make big-time plays in those kind of moments. Essentially, I'd call Arroyo a player for that.

## Q. Cam, you broke out the Heisman celebration today for the first time this season. You got do it three times. Can you go into your reasoning why you decided to hit the pose today?

CAM SKATTEBO: Because I've been disrespected my whole life. I've always been the underdog. Nobody respects the fact that I'm the best running back in the country. I'm going to stand on that. If people want to disrespect that, I'm going to keep going and proving people wrong.

Whatever NFL team takes me is going to get a gem. I'll give everything I've got for them. Whether winning or losing the Heisman, I should still be in that situation.

# Q. Cam, 2,000 yards from scrimmage never happened in ASU history, and Kenny Dillingham has coached two of those players, one in 2018. What is it about the scheme that helps enable your position to be so successful?

CAM SKATTEBO: There's so many options you can do with me. The receivers don't get the option to run the ball. They have to catch the ball for the most part. I get the option to catch the ball in the backfield, run the ball, throw the ball possibly, kick the ball possibly. I have the option because I'm there with the quarterback. I'm blessed to be in this position. He understands what he has. Coach Arroyo uses me to the max position. That's why I'm here and why I stayed. I knew I would be in a position to be



successful. I love playing for this football team.

## Q. Xavier, we all talked about Jordyn Tyson going down and what a blow that was. Can you talk about getting your chance at really stepping up and helping?

XAVIER GUILLORY: Yeah. We knew last game when he went down, that's our brother. It hurt to see the work he put in, he wasn't going to play. When one man goes down, somebody steps up. We all collectively as a group chipped in, top to bottom. We had Malik out in Week 4, came in and made a great play down the field.

It's trust. We play with Sam every day. We have trust. One man goes down, we feel confident the next guy will step up. Melquan had some great plays today. From top to bottom, I was proud of how everybody reacted to the pressure situation. Big 12 Championship, nobody tucked their tail. We all stepped up to the challenge. I'm proud of how everybody reacted.

## Q. Sam and X Guillory, can you just speak to the connection that you've continued to develop here these past couple weeks where X has been able to find the end zone four times in three games?

SAM LEAVITT: It dates back all the practices, just getting on the same page. We talked about exactly how I want the route ran. So last week, we caught Arizona in a cover zero look. I told him if you're ready for the ball, it's going to be cover zero. I'm going to put it up there. Stutter step and go. Massive play.

And then come out here and catch two in some big-time moments, so nothing but props to him and the work we put in and so I'm just super happy and proud of him.

XAVIER GUILLORY: Sam makes it easy. He works hard, one of the hardest workers on the team. When he stepped on campus, we were by ourselves on the field, getting our timing down, and that's with everybody from top to bottom. Doesn't matter. Sam can throw to anybody. He makes it really easy for me.

I was glad I was able to run my route. We practice that every single day. That ball's in the air, it's like we already repped that thousands of times before the season started. So that was just 1,001.

SAM LEAVITT: I did not make it easy. I don't know if you all saw that catch.

Q. Xavion, the defensive back room was incredible today, holding two 1,000-yard receivers to minimal yardage. What do you make of the performance of

## your group as a whole and your game plan and how you were able to execute?

XAVION ALFORD: Them guys step up for the challenge each and every week. The DBs, when we got together this summer, we wanted to be one of the best secondaries in the country. We felt we put in the work to do that. We needed to show it throughout the season. We've gotten better and better each week.

All those guys, I want to say I made first team all-conference, but each and every one of them guys I play with should be on that list. There's no way possible that they don't make those lists and there's no way possible I make that list without them. They make my job easy.

The way they communicate, the players they are physically, Javan getting the tackle, Keith with the interception, Shamari coming in for a fumble, coming down and making tackles. We're one of the best secondaries in the country from top to bottom. We challenged each other throughout the summer. I challenged them myself. Sometimes it was uncomfortable.

DBs, you gotta be tight. We're like brothers. It's just us five out there. Each and every ball that's thrown behind the linebackers and D-line, that's on us. We step up to the challenge every week. Two 1,000-yard receivers, we'll step up to the challenge every week. Don't matter who we play, which logo. We've got the best secondary in the country.

## Q. Cam, I'm wondering, was it during camp or was there a point during the season when you knew that you had a special group, that this team had a chance to compete for a Big 12 Championship? When was that moment?

CAM SKATTEBO: When we had guys pushing other guys in a positive way. There was a time where it was very negative from last year to this year, and for some reason there was a switch that flickered, and we hit that switch, and it's been different ever since.

I couldn't tell you the exact date, but there was a time where it wasn't going to go like this, and then a day later it was. And ever since that day, this team has been nothing but on the forward trajectory, and I respect that because everybody's pushing each other and there's no negativity in the room.

That's what makes a team. No matter how much money people are making, no matter how much things are being tossed around or names are being tossed around or who's not getting the ball, who is getting the ball, everybody on



the team is positive.

That's why I respect Coach Dillingham because he's bringing in guys that love and want to play football. Even if they're not in the game, they have a positive attitude towards the guys that are playing.

Q. Sam and X Guillory, can you talk about Cam breaking off those crazy runs? You've seen it all year. He had a couple wild ones where he was winding and weaving, breaking tackles, 50-yarders. What's it like for you when that's happening?

SAM LEAVITT: I've got the best seat in the house. It's wild. I hand him a ball, carry out my fake a little bit, peek back, get ready for a gain of 5. And I see the dude weaving through traffic and randomly busts loose and breaks one and goes for 70. He's the best player in the nation, flat-out. Most dominant player. You want to talk about the Heisman race, talk about the player most dominant in the game, he does it week in, week out against the best competition. All props to him.

XAVIER GUILLORY: As a receiver, blocking for him, it's like every game, I'm blocking for him. Okay, cool. Oh, he's still running. I'll run down. Oh, my gosh, he's still running. So I'm running, like, 100 yards to block for this dude.

I was at Idaho State when he was at Sac State. We were in the same conference so I've seen this since 2021. The dude is crazy. I don't understand it. It's cool not to understand it. Like he said, we got the best seat in the house, watching the dude run through people. I can't compare it. This dude is so fun to watch. I'm able to team up with him and block downfield with him. Like Sam said, he's one of the best if not the best player in the country.

CAM SKATTEBO: Thanks, guys.

XAVION ALFORD: Not very fun to see him in practice either.

Q. Xavion, you've obviously been at places before that have lots of highly recruited kids. How does it impact a program when maybe the biggest name on the field is somebody who started at Sac State?

XAVION ALFORD: Me going to the places I've been, that's what people don't understand about the college football. It's not the logo. It's the people in the building. The people in the building. Like these people, they actually care. They're people. They have feelings. They have emotions. They're not afraid to show that.

Some places, you go somewhere, people try to uphold an

ego or, you know, stuff like that. Everybody in this building love each other, and you can see that in our play. We play like we love each other, and it's not about the logo. They predicted us last. They predicted us to be last in this conference. But I guarantee you, nobody in that building thought we was the worst team in the conference because we believe in each other and we care.

We see the work we put in. Nobody sees the work we put in. Nobody's there on June 1, 2, 3, in July. In fall camp, day 16, 17, me and this guy been going heads up every day. Sam been throwing it. Nobody sees that. Like I said, logos don't mean anything. What makes the team special is the team and the people in the building.

That's why we're sitting here right now because we believed and continue to believe and continue pushing. Through the ups and downs, through the losses, through the injuries, we continue pushing and continued believing. That's why we're sitting up here conference champs.

Q. Xavier, what was impact of getting this for Jordyn? You talked about how you can relate to being in positions of having lower leg injuries that are devastating. In this case, obviously it's a collarbone. But getting this for him and continuing to win, knowing that he'd love to be out there and just was there any type of message either pre or halftime between you and the receiver room or just the offense of, you know, we gotta get this one for him?

XAVIER GUILLORY: Yeah, since last Saturday when we found out. Like I said, beyond teammates, we're brothers. That's one of my best friends. We do a lot together. We go to church together, do Bible study together. I've seen so much of JT off the field, that's my brother.

We all felt that when he went down, you want to go out and win it for him he was the most dominant receiver in the Big 12 this year. I wouldn't have been here without him. We're glad to chip in and glad he was here to see that. That's one of my best friends. I wanted to make sure we got this win for him. Glad to see him out there coaching everybody up. He's feeling as much in the game as if he was playing. That's a testament to who he is as a person and his character.

Q. Xavier, last week against Arizona, after you won Xavion Alford was in the press conference with a Jesus Won t-shirt. After your first touchdown, you pointed to the sky, saying it's not me, it's all God. What does it mean to be able to pronounce your faith on such a big stage?

XAVIER GUILLORY: I'm glad you asked that. I appreciate



you asking that. Our faith, I'm just so glad that -- the Lord had us here for a reason and brought us all here for a reason. We wouldn't be here without him. We're talented, yes. We score, oh, da, da, da. Cam and all this stuff. We know who was there when we didn't have this. The Lord brought me through so much, brought these guys through so much.

It's a testament when we show our faith. It's most important to me. I'm sure it's most important to those guys too is putting the Lord first in our successes, in the down times and the up times. Anytime I get a chance in the end zone, I'm going to give a nod to the Lord. I appreciate you asking that question. It means a lot for me.
