Tonight's game is the 2025 CFP Semifinal at the 89th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic and the 16th played at AT&T Stadium in Arlington.

Ohio State won the coin toss and elected to defer its choice to the second half. Texas elected to receive to start the 88th Classic.

The 89th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic kicked off at 6:45 p.m. Central time.

FIRST QUARTER

Ohio State (7:24): Quinshon Judkins 9-yard rush (Jayden Fielding kick). The Buckeyes drive was 10 plays, 64 yards and took 4:18 after Texas turned the ball over on downs at the Ohio State 39. Ohio State rushed 4 times for 20 yards and was 4-6 passing for 44 yards. The Buckeyes had 4 first downs on the drive. **KEY PLAYS:** On 3rd and 6 from the Texas 44, **Will Howard** threw down the middle, where **Emeka Egbuka** caught the ball between defenders for an 11-yard gain to the Texas 23. Three plays later, Judkins went up the middle on 2nd and goal to score. **Ohio State 7, Texas 0.**

Ohio State had no big plays during the drive.

END OF THE FIRST QUARTER: Ohio State 7, Texas 0

SECOND QUARTER

Texas (0:29): Quinn Ewers 18-yard pass to Jaydon Blue (Will Stone kick). The Longhorns drive was 7 plays, 59 yards and took 1:22 after Ohio State punted to the Texas 41. Texas rushed 3 times for 17 yards and was 2-4 passing for 42 yards. The Longhorns had 3 first downs on the drive. **KEY PLAYS:** On 1st and 10 at the Ohio State 42, Ewers threw a pass to the left to **Silas Bolden**, who broke a tackle and scampered 24 yards to the Bucks 18. Two plays later, Ewers threw a pass to the left sideline of the end zone to Blue for the TD. **Ohio State 7, Texas 7.**

Texas had 2 big plays (2 passes for 15+ yards) during the drive.

Quinn Ewers has thrown for 30 touchdowns this season, and he has thrown a TD pass in 27 straight games, the longest active streak in FBS.

Ohio State (0:13): Will Howard 75-yard pass to **TreVeyon Henderson** (Jayden Fielding kick).

The Buckeyes drive was 1 play, 75 yards and took 0:16 after Texas kicked off after its touchdown. Texas was 1-1 passing for 75 yards. The Longhorns had 1 first down on the drive.

KEY PLAY: On 1st and 10 at the Ohio State 25, Howard threw a screen pass to the right behind the line of scrimmage, where Henderson caught the ball at the Ohio State 19 and sped through the Texas defense to score. **Ohio State 14, Texas 7.**

Ohio State had 1 big play (1 pass for 15+ yards) during the drive.

*Henderson's 75-yard TD reception was the second-longest in Ohio State bowl history and the longest receiving TD by a running back in the Classic since **Ernie Davis** in 1960 vs. Texas (87 yards).*

HALFTIME: Ohio State 14, Texas 7

FIRST HALF NOTES

There were a combined 4 sacks in the first half (Ohio State 3 for -18 yards; Texas 1 for -7 yards). Ohio State's TJ Tuimoloau was credited with 1.5 sacks in the half.

There were a combined 8 punts in the first half (Ohio State 4, Ohio State 4).

Ohio State averaged 7.9 yards per play in the first half (236 yards/30 plays), while Texas averaged 4.9 yards per play (177 yards/36 plays).

Ohio State averaged 9.6 yards per play on first down, while Texas averaged 5.9 yards per first down play.

Ohio State had 3 big plays in the first half (2 passes for 15+ yards – 90 yards gained, and 1 rush for 10+ yards – 22 yards gained). Texas had 6 big plays in the first half (5 passes of 15+ yards – 103 yards gained, and 1 rush for 10+ yards – 13 yards gained).

Ohio State was called for 5 penalties for 50 yards, while Texas was whistled for 2 penalties for 19 yards.

THIRD QUARTER

Ohio State chose to receive to begin the second half.

Texas (3:12): Quinn Ewers 26-yard pass to **Jaydon Blue** (**Will Stone** kick). The Longhorns drive was 12 plays, 67 yards and took 5:18 after a Ohio State punt to the Texas 33. Texas rushed 6 times for 19 yards, was 4-6 passing for 53 yards and Texas was called for 1 accepted penalty for 5 yards. The Longhorns had 4 first downs on the drive. **KEY PLAYS:** On 3rd and 10 at the Texas 33, Ewers under pressure, flipped the ball forward to Quintrevion Wisner before Ewers' knee touched the turf. Wisner made his way 14 yards to the Texas 47. Texas tied the game when Ewers threw down the left side to Blue, who caught the ball at the Ohio State 13 and ran in for his second TD catch of the game. **Ohio State 14, Texas 14.**

Texas had 1 big play (1 pass of 15+ yards) on the drive.

END OF THE THIRD QUARTER: Ohio State 14, Texas 14

FOURTH QUARTER

Ohio State (7:02): Quinshon Judkins 1-yard rush (**Jayden Fielding** kick). The Buckeyes drive was 13 plays, 88 yards and took 7:45 after an Texas punt to the Ohio State 12. Ohio State rushed 4 times for 26 yards and was 7-9 passing for 52 yards. There was 1 offensive penalty accepted for 5 yards and 1 defensive penalty accepted for 15 yards. The Buckeyes had 5 first downs on the drive. **KEY PLAYS:** On 4th and 2 at the Texas 34, Will Howard rushed up the middle for 18 yards to the Texas 16. Four plays later, Judkins went 1 yard off to the left for his second rushing TD to give the Buckeyes the lead. **Ohio State 21, Texas 14.**

Ohio State had 2 big plays (1 rush for 10+ yards and 1 pass for 15+ yards) during the drive.

Ohio State (2:13): Jack Sawyer 83-yard fumble return after Sawyer forced a fumble on a sack of Texas QB **Quinn Ewers** (**Jayden Fielding** kick). **KEY PLAY:** On 4th and goal at the Ohio State 8, Ewers, under pressure, had the ball stripped by Sawyer for a 9-yard loss. Sawyer picked up the ball at the Buckeyes 17 and rambled 83 yards down the sideline for the touchdown. Texas drove to the Ohio State 1 during a 10-play, 58 yard drive, before a rush for no gain by **Jerrick Gibson**, a 7-yard loss on a rush by **Quintrevion Wisner** and an incomplete pass (broken up by Sawyer at the goal line) preceded the sack/fumble return. **Ohio State 28, Texas 14.**

The 83-yard fumble return touchdown was the longest in the history of the Cotton Bowl Classic and the longest in the history of the College Football Playoff.

The Big Ten is 2-1 vs. the SEC in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. Alabama defeated Michigan State 38-0 in the 2015/80th Classic, and Missouri beat Ohio State 14-3 in the 2023/88th Classic.

The all-time series between Ohio State and Texas is tied at 2-2. Each school beat the other on the road (Texas won in Columbus in 2005, and Ohio State won in Austin in 2006), and the two schools have split a pair of bowl meetings (Texas beat Ohio State 24-21 in the 2009 Fiesta Bowl).

Texas is now 11-11-1 in Classic appearances (the 23 appearances and 11 victories are both Classic records). This was the Longhorns' first appearance in the Classic since 2003.

Texas is 32-27-2 in 61 all-time bowl appearances.

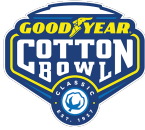
The SEC is 25-17-1 overall in 43 appearances in the Cotton Bowl Classic.

- As a result of David Gbenda's interception of Ohio State quarterback Will Howard on the Buckeyes' opening offensive series of the second half, the Texas defense has now recorded at least one interception in the last 10 consecutive games and 14 of 16 games played this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QUINN EWERS, QB

- With his 18-yard touchdown pass for Jaydon Blue with 29 seconds left before halftime, Ewers has now tossed at least one touchdown in 27 consecutive games, two shy of tying the program's record (29) set by Colt McCoy from 2007 to 2009.
- As a result of his third quarter passing touchdown to Blue, Ewers now has 10 games throughout the 2024 season with multiple touchdown passes.
- Additionally, Ewers' second quarter passing touchdown to Blue was the 30th passing touchdown for the Southlake, Texas native this season, becoming just third Texas quarterback (Colt McCoy, 34 - 2008; Sam Ehlinger, 32 - 2019) to throw for 30-or-more passing touchdowns in a single season.
- Ewers now has 10 200-yard passing games this season, which is tied for the fifth most by a Texas quarterback in a single season, and 24 career 200-yard passing games, the fourth most in program history.
- Ewers completed the season with 293 completions, the fourth most in the program's single-season history and most since Sam Ehlinger had 296 in 2019.

JAYDON BLUE, RB

- On a four-yard completion early in the second quarter, Blue now has 37 receptions this season, which is tied for the fifth most by a Texas running back in a single season.
- Blue became the first Texas running back to have a multiple receiving touchdown performance in a single game since Bijan Robinson had two against Colorado on Dec. 29, 2020.

QUINTREVION WISNER, RB

- By finishing with six receptions, Wisner concluded the season with 44 receptions, which were the second most by a Texas running back in a single season and most since Chris Ogbonnaya hauled in 46 throughout the 2008 season.

GUNNAR HELM, TE

- With a 34-yard reception midway through the fourth quarter, Helm became just the fifth tight end in program history to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards and first since Ja'Tavion Sanders (2021-23).

DAVID GBENDA, WLB

- With his third quarter interception of Ohio State quarterback Will Howard, Gbenda's two career interceptions have come off of Howard.

ETHAN BURKE, JACK

- With his tackle for loss on the second to last defensive play of the first quarter, Burke now has at least one tackle for loss over Texas' last five straight games, which include all three College Football Playoff games (Clemson, Arizona State, Ohio State).

QUESTIONS FOR HEAD COACH RYAN DAY, DE JACK SAWYER, AND QB WILL HOWARD

CHARLIE FISS: We are now joined by Ohio State Head Coach Ryan Day, his student-athletes Will Howard and Jack Sawyer.

Coach, we will call on you first for an opening statement about tonight's victory.

OHIO STATE HEAD COACH RYAN DAY: I, first, want to give Coach Sark (Steve Sarkisian) and his staff and team a lot of credit. It's a very good team. A lot of respect for the way he goes about his business, and he's got an unbelievable reputation in the coaching community. And his team played very, very hard today. It was a very well-fought battle, and they're a very good team. Had a great season.

It came down to the fourth quarter. And I believe that the resilience that we've had to show throughout the entire season and through some of these guys' career has led us to this opportunity to win this game and go play for a national championship.

We talked before the game about how you leave a legacy is to become your own legend. There's some guys on this team today that, I believe, will become legends in Ohio State history.

We also talked about how we want to keep this team together. It's a great team. They've been through a lot. They're resilient, and they're great people. They do everything the right way. And so now they get 10 more days together. And an opportunity to tell their story, if they go win one more. And so that's really exciting.

But going back on the game, just gritty, tough. We knew it was going to be that way. Very good opponent. And just the way that we were able to change the momentum of the game in the fourth quarter. And then the ball is all the way down to the one-yard line. We get a stop there. Get our pads down. Knock it back. And then they go to the perimeter with it and really great play for a TFL. And then the third-down stop.

And then, obviously, what happened on fourth down by Jack [Sawyer] just symbolizes not only his career but our team, in general, and who they are and the toughness. And just the clutch play right there was something that I'm sure the whole city of Columbus exploded and all of Buckeye Nation during that play.

Q. For both student-athletes. Will, just to get into that fourth down when you decided to keep it and help to establish a first down that led to the touchdown.

Jack, just what you can say about the strip sack and the return.

QB WILL HOWARD: Yeah, that fourth down was huge, man. They came out and gave us a good look for the play. O-line blocked it up well. I fell on purpose. I'm joking; I didn't fall on purpose. I should have been out. It should have been a touchdown. I was trying to keep a couple of seconds on the clock. No, I'm just joking.

It was a great play and a statement drive. We needed that. We'd be beating ourselves all day with penalties and getting behind the sticks. That was a statement drive. The O-line did a heck of a job on that drive. I think guys stepped up and made plays. And obviously, what the defense did on the next drive sealed it.

But they bailed us out all game, and I can't say enough good things about this guy sitting next to me and about our whole defense because they played their tails off today.

DE JACK SAWYER: Coach has put us in great spots all day long. Like Coach Day said, that's a really good football team that we just played. Hats go off to them, coach Sark (Steve Sarkisian) and Quinn [Ewers]. They're a great team, and they'll be back here, I'm sure, for the next couple years.

God is great, and He put me in a great position to make a play. I was fortunate enough to do that. The resiliency of this team, you know, from a month ago, it's been incredible. It's been led by guys like these two men sitting next to me. And the whole team embodies that role because our leader is like that.

I've said it a million times, but we sat up here last year with a sore taste in our mouth. Heard a lot of things. Then come back and heard the same things a month ago. We kept swinging because this guy next to us, he shows up every day to work, and he loves each and every one of us so much. He's the most resilient guy I've ever been around, and that's the reason why you see this team fight so hard each and every week.

Q. Jack, how special was it, especially for you as a local guy, Pickerington guy, can you walk us through what you saw on that play and what you were feeling as you were running down the sideline?

DE JACK SAWYER: I guess just don't fall like Will [Howard] did. I'm kidding.

No, seriously, I hit about the 30, and I looked back, I'm like, I hope I get some blockers. I'm running out of steam here. They were running with me side by side. That speaks volume to who this team is, too, you know. We always have each other's back. It was a special moment.

I love Columbus. I love the state of Ohio. I love Ohio State football. Like I said a million times after the game, God is great and He's put this team in such a great spot. I'm so fortunate to be playing in the national championship my last year here.

Q. Jack, when you watched Texas on film, everything went to the left, primarily with the pass and the run. Did you anticipate? Did you see that coached?

DE JACK SAWYER: I just think that they're a great team, and they've got great scheme. You know, I give Coach [Jim] Knowles and Coach [Ryan] Day a lot of credit for the way they schemed them up. They made a lot of big plays, too. They punched us in the mouth a lot of times throughout the game.

Like I said, they're a great team, and we knew they had a lot of good stuff, and they were going to land some punches as well.

The team who executed the most and prepared the best in the game was going to win. We were able to -- we were fortunate enough to execute.

Q. Will, I'm curious, what do you kind of feel like Texas did well to take away Jeremiah [Smith]? And how important was it for you guys for Emeka [Egbuka] and for Carnell [Tate] to step up in that place?

QB WILL HOWARD: Yeah, we knew they were going to be keying him. Obviously, the first two rounds of the playoffs, he went off. We knew they were going to do something to try and take him away. They clouded him. They doubled him. They were finding different ways to get two guys over top of him. But all that means is that we need to be smart and get the ball to other guys.

I think Carnell stepped up and made some great plays. The running backs did a great job. Tight ends had some great catches.

I think Texas, what they do on defense, likes to keep shell on things, make you work the game, and get the ball down the field methodically. I think they -- you know, credit to them. They've got a great defense, and they've got some dudes.

But when it came down to it in the fourth quarter, man, we did what we had to do, and the defense did a hell of a job.

Q. Jack, Coach Day was talking about leaving a legacy. How does it feel to deliver what figures to be one of the iconic plays in Ohio State history?

DE JACK SAWYER: I'm just so thankful to be able to play for this coach and this team each and every week. You know, we get 10 more days with each other, and that's what means the most to me, is we're going and competing for a national championship now, which is something I've

always dreamed of bringing back to Columbus since I was a little kid, throwing the football in the backyard with my dad with an Ohio State jersey on.

I'm just really looking forward to that. And I was fortunate enough to make a big-time play, like a lot of guys did and like this guy did all night long. Responding from adversity throughout the game, too.

This guy sitting right here next to me is such a good leader for this team. He runs the show on offense. I'm so proud of the way he played and the offense played and battled through adversity all game long and all year long.

We've got a good challenge in Notre Dame who is a great team, and that's what I'm most looking forward to.

Q. Jack, you and Quinn Ewers used to be roommates. You and him embraced after the game. Curious what you said to each other.

DE JACK SAWYER: Yeah, I just said great season. He's a good guy. He's a great dude. He was my roommate here. He's had a lot of success, and he's a great person. I just told him, Keep your head up. You played a great game and you've got a great future ahead of you. Stay in touch sometime soon.

Shoutout to Texas. Like me and Will have said, and Coach Day said, they're a great team. A great group of coaches are on that staff. They punched us hard a few times, and it was a battle all the way to the fourth quarter the way we knew it would be.

Q. Coach, let's go back to that Michigan game where after that game, the Michigan players stormed the field and attempted to put the flag in the middle of the field. What did you say to your team after that disheartening loss, and do you think that was a turning point in the season?

COACH DAY: Well, I think when you look at the guys that we have in our program, you see guys who are tough. You see guys who were resilient. And you see guys that care about each other. You see guys that love being Buckeyes. You're seeing two of them right here.

Both guys here have two different stories. One just got here. But when I see him get around our team, when I saw him on stage tonight, when I saw him embracing everybody in the locker room, this guy loves his teammates. He's only been here a year, but in such a short period of time, he's made such an amazing impact on our team. He's made an impact on me.

There are times where I'm coming to work and who knows, maybe I'm down, maybe I'm stressed, maybe I'm whatever, and this guy, he picks me up. He has an amazing approach on life, and I told his parents that. They've done a great job with him. But he's also done it himself, the positive mindset that he has.

We lost Seth McLaughlin in practice. It was a really tough loss for us. Seth was doing a great job, and he and Seth had a great relationship. In that practice, Will showed me some of the best leadership I've ever seen in resilience.

And the guy over there, I don't know if there's -- I mean, sure, we can argue about it, I'm sure, who loves being a Buckeye more. But this is somebody who grew up in Columbus, who has always wanted to be a Buckeye, who has always wanted for a moment like this. So to see him get the moment that he had today, I mean, he's become like family to me. He has, to me and my wife and my kids.

And so this is just two guys. Emeka [Egbuka], TreVeyon Henderson, Cody Simon, Lathan Ransom, Donovan Jackson, the story of this team is yet to be told. And no great accomplishments are ever achieved without going through adversity. That's just the truth. And so we've gone through our share of adversity, and that's life. And I've told those guys that.

So we're not focused on what's coming down the road. We're not focused on what happened in the past. We're focused on right now and being right where we are.

And then at the end, we want to be able to tell the story of this team. And that's really what this team is focused on right now.

Q. You just mentioned just now about how these two guys here have different stories and different paths. Your entire roster in this new world of college football is assembled from a national coast-to-coast level. But I'm just wondering, when Jack [Sawyer] is sitting here talking about playing football with his dad, wearing an Ohio State jersey in his front yard, in, I assume, Pickerington, how does that move you? Because you've been questioned and criticized at times for not being from Ohio, because that's been an expectation for Ohio State's coach. For somebody who is from Ohio and has become family to you, to hear that, what does it mean to this program, to you, to have an Ohio kid who has been through the wringer at times during his career to have that moment that he had?

COACH DAY: Yeah, I couldn't be prouder. Couldn't be prouder of -- I just love stories of guys who go through difficult times, stay loyal, defend the people they love the most, and then come out the back end. I just love that in life.

That's why I -- Maurice Clarett is with us, around the program now. I love guys who go through difficult times, stay strong, defend who they love, and then come out the back end. And you've got one right there with this guy right here. This guy was never stronger than when we needed him the most during difficult times.

And we've been through difficult times together. That's how you know. How do you know about someone's character? When you go through tough times with them. Everything is easy when things are going well. Everyone can be a frontrunner.

And so I think we talk about those things because our story has been -- the last couple years has been ups and downs. But to see the team play the way that they did in the fourth quarter today, I think that's why that's relevant. That's why we're talking about it. Because I don't think without going through those things, we would have come through the way we did in the fourth quarter. And now we have the opportunity to play for a national championship, and I couldn't be prouder of our guys, couldn't be.

But we've got to finish this thing, and they know it. They know it, because there's so many great stories to be told.

Q. What does it feel like, you went your whole career with the whole Texas scenario, and you finally get the win. What kind of emotions are you going through right now finally getting to beat Texas?

QB WILL HOWARD: Yeah, that was a motivation for me. But, man, that didn't mean as much as getting this -- keeping this team together. And that's all we wanted to do, man. And we talked about that this whole playoffs. We're fighting for another chance to wear this jersey again and to be with this group again.

The thing that hurts me about this, the only thing that I wish I could go back and do different about my time here is I wish I had more time, you know? I wish I had more time with Coach Day. I've gotten so much better because of him and because of Coach [Chip] Kelly and because of [Keenan] Bailey and just being here.

I've gotten to be so close with guys like Jack [Sawyer] and guys like Emeka [Egbuka] and guys like Seth and all these guys that I only have one year with them. I wish that I got a chance to be with these guys longer. And we're trying to draw this thing out as long as we can; and here we are, man. But the job's not finished, and we've got to go out there and finish this thing.

It feels great to beat those guys, especially this year. They had a great team. And all the respect in the world for Sark (Steve Sarkisian) and Quinn [Ewers] and all those guys. They have a great defense. But the job's not finished, and they were standing in our way today.

Q. Will, TreVeyon's [Henderson] touchdown, what was your expectation of how that play might turn out, first of all? Comment on that.

And, Coach, what went into that call?

QB WILL HOWARD: I don't think anyone thought that that was going for 75 yards. That's kind of a drive starter in that two-minute scenario. And you run that first play. We did it in the Tennessee game where we come out and we run the ball. And if you get a positive gain, then maybe we can continue to work our two-minute drill.

But when you've got a guy like 32 (TreVeyon Henderson) that can make plays like that, I mean, Carson Hinzman made some unbelievable blocks down the field. The receivers stayed on their guys, and 32 took off, man.

That was a huge play for us, a huge swing. We talk about winning the middle eight all the time, and that was big.

COACH DAY: Yeah, I agree with Will [Howard]. That was a huge moment in the game, that and Jack's [Sawyer] play really were two big moments.

I thought the drive that the offense had there when -- you know, there was some momentum swings, and we talk about it a lot. When you have momentum, you've got to keep it. When you don't, you've got to go get it. I felt like we turned that momentum with that long drive. I don't know if it was 16 plays, but it was a bunch of plays, the one that finished with Quinshon's [Judkins] one-yard run.

They kind of went down the field. We took a stand there at the one, and then Jack's return was huge. But the screen -- we were laughing a little bit in the locker room, having some fun with it, because we do screen drill.

I think sometimes, these guys are like, are we ever going to call a screen? I actually said to the coaches, We're going to stop doing screen drill because we don't call any dang screens.

And so sure enough, what do you want to run? You want to run the ball? You want to take a knee? I said, No, just run the screen. All right, you sure? Sure enough, it went the whole distance. Went for 75, first play.

But TreVeyon [Henderson] has become a three-down back. TreVeyon is going to be a tremendous pro because not only does he do a good job running the football, but he protects at a high level, and he's a threat with the ball in his hands as a receiver. That becomes a huge threat, especially when they're looking to take away some of our receivers, in particular Jeremiah [Smith]. So hats off to him.

But very well-executed. The line got out there, and he made a great play because they brought a pressure, and he just got it off. And TreVeyon went down and caught it. Another huge play in the game.

Q. Is there kind of a feeling for both of you of everything coming full circle? Because a little over a year ago, you were sitting here talking after a really tough loss to Missouri. And here you are, you made the plays now, especially with a punt-recovery touchdown, the call right there for the screen to finally finish the drill, and win yourself a Cotton Bowl.

COACH DAY: Yeah, I mean, it's not finished, though. It's not finished. But we did just walk in here and say the same thing. What a difference a year makes, but we're not done yet.

DE JACK SAWYER: I second that.

Q. That final drive in the fourth, when you guys had about a six-minute drive. Will, you're down on one knee talking to the guys in the huddle. What did you notice in their eyes?

And for Coach, what did you notice in the offense and how calm they looked in that very important drive?

COACH DAY: I'll just start by saying, I felt like we were stopping ourselves on offense with the penalties. And I think that was the conversation that was being had on the sideline and the locker room at halftime. We've got to stop hurting ourselves with these penalties. That was frustrating.

I felt like we had a good rhythm. We were making some nice plays, executing okay, good enough. But then you get some of these penalties -- and they were big penalties, holding, 15-yarders -- and that was really getting us behind the sticks.

So we knew we just had to buckle down. And like Will said, they were kind of keeping it in front. When you do that, you've got to execute and move the ball all the way down the field.

Now that I'm looking at it, it was 13 plays, 88 yards, took 7:45 off the clock. At that moment, I was getting a little concerned that the defense was getting worn out because we were not on the field very much. And we needed a big, long drive. And that's what these guys answered with. Obviously, Will was the leader in the huddle.

QB WILL HOWARD: Yeah, I second all of that. That was a statement drive, man. And like he said, we'd been beating ourselves. We just knew that we had to work the game and just continue to just swing and take shots and body blows.

It wasn't pretty at all times. It was taking some check-downs at fourth and two. It took a lot. 13 plays, 88 yards. We talked about it before the game, we're going to have to work this game, and we're going to have to methodically move the ball down the field.

I'm just so proud of our offense that we were able to get the game -- we talk about it all the time, get the game to the fourth quarter, and that's where we'll win it. And we leaned back on our training. And all that work that we put in, that's for that time.

And I'm just so proud of our guys. The O-line played great on that drive. Guys made some plays, and we were able to punch it in. So that was great.

COACH DAY: And like Will said, the third down, I forget what the down and distance was, but we said to them if we can get this to a fourth and manageable, we're going to go for it. And he got it to fourth and two. Big play. It's the little things that as an experienced guy you understand in that moment, and that was huge.

And then having the ability to do it with his feet on fourth and two. We went back and forth, are we going to call this one or not? He got us into the right call. And then the offensive line did a great job rocking off the ball. So that was a huge play in the game as well.

QUESTIONS FOR HEAD COACH STEVE SARKISIAN, QB QUINN EWERS, AND DB JAHDAE BARRON

CHARLIE FISS: We are now joined by Head Coach Steve Sarkisian and his student-athletes Quinn Ewers and Jahdae Barron.

Coach, we will come to you first for an opening statement about your view of tonight's game, and then we will go to questions from the floor with the media. Coach.

TEXAS HEAD COACH STEVE SARKISIAN: Yeah, hell of a football game. Two really good teams battling. They made two big plays, you know? They hit the screen at the end of the first half and got the sack fumble on fourth down there for a touchdown.

Two really good teams. Ton of credit to Ohio State. They're a very good football team, well-coached, hard-fought game. I'm really proud of our players for the resiliency they showed tonight to fight back to get into the game, to have an opportunity first to go on the one, and weren't able to put it in.

So as I told them, today's game is the life of a competitor. You put yourself in this arena. You compete your tail off. But we have nothing to hang our heads about, by the way they competed, not only tonight but this entire season.

Q. For both Quinn and Jahdae. You guys were one play away from getting to the national title game last year. Obviously so close again. How difficult is it to get that close and not be able to finish tonight?

QB QUINN EWERS: Yeah, you know, it's tough. I think Coach Sark (Steve Sarkisian) hit it. It's the life of a competitor. It sucks being on this side of things, for sure. I mean, back-to-back years pretty much a game decided in one play and it's hard.

All the work that we put in, being in the final four back-to-back years and coming up short two years, it's tough.

But I think that's how life is. You're going to get punched in the face in some hard moments.

DB JAHDAE BARRON: Yeah, it was a tough situation. I love these guys, and I love Coach Sark (Steve Sarkisian). He's changed my life, but he's always told us, Adversity will strike. You just have to respond.

But we tried to continue to just fight out there, and we came up short.

Q. For both student-athletes, for Jahdae and Quinn. I know it's tough in this moment, coming off of a loss, but what can you say about the pride that you have being a Longhorn and just what this season has meant to you, the resiliency that you guys have had, going through this season to where you are.

QB QUINN EWERS: I guess no one really at the beginning of the season thought we were going to be here. First year in the SEC. We make it to an SEC title game. Didn't go our way either.

But just, again, for us to bounce back the way that we did consistently was really cool to see throughout the entire season. Beyond proud of all of these guys. I love every single one of them: the amount of work that we put in the offseason, winter conditioning, summer workouts, all that.

We grind together, and the love grows together. And it's just been a really cool season, and I'm so proud to be a Longhorn.

DB JAHDAE BARRON: Man, just growing up in Austin and having the opportunity to wear burnt orange, it's been amazing. But just to start off, Quinn [Ewers] coming in, being my roommate. Coach Sark, he's changed my life completely. I'm totally a different person just on and off the field and how I care about myself and just carry myself and things like that.

But I was always told the purpose serves a purpose that's a lot greater than me and any individual. But these two guys, they most definitely changed my life and everybody else included on the program.

Q. Quinn, what was your sense of the strip sack? Did you not hear him, feel him? And when you saw that it was Jack [Sawyer] who got you, did you have any particular emotion about that given how close you were to him?

QB QUINN EWERS: Yeah, I felt him. I started drifting away.

I thought I was going to be able to get the ball off before he got there. Obviously, it's not like I tried to give them the game.

But I saw Jack running with the ball down the sideline. It sucks, man. But he's a great player, great individual, great person. Like you said, we were roommates when I was up at Ohio State. So, it just sucks. It sucks. Jack's a good player, and he made a good play.

Q. Jahdae, everybody in this room talked a lot about Jeremiah [Smith] and what he was able to do this season. You all really shut him down. What were some of the reasons why you were able to make his day really difficult?

DB JAHDAE BARRON: Just hats off to PK (Pete Kwiatkowski) and the game plan that we had and just mastering PK's game plan. There's a lot of things that we should have done better, obviously, to prevent some points from them scoring. But PK's game plan on that situation on No. 4 was amazing.

Q. You guys were two central figures in this rebuild from Coach Sark (Steve Sarkisian). How do you feel you're leaving the program with the talent that was displayed from guys that we know will be back next year?

QB QUINN EWERS: I think, again, it's just a testament to Coach Sark and the guys that he brought in and the coaching staff that just completely changed Texas football.

Growing up as a Longhorn and being able to play for the Longhorns and see us going to back-to-back Semifinal games has been cool to be a part of, and I hope we made the fans proud with our performances this year. We came up short, but I think we're definitely headed in the right direction as a program.

DB JAHDAE BARRON: It's going to be amazing for these guys. And the reason they're going to be amazing because Coach Sark and what he's about. It's nothing about football. It's nothing about none of this. It's culture and who you are as a person.

I know he tells y'all guys all the time, but as soon as he got here, our GPAs got better. He pushed me to graduate. I know that was hard on him. But there are amazing things that he's done, and it's beyond football.

He truly wants everybody to be a better person, and the better the person, the better the ballplayer. I know these guys, they're going to come back.

Q. Steve [Sarkisian], on first and second down, what was the thought process behind Jerrick [Gibson] on first down and the toss to Quintrevion [Wisner] on the second?

COACH SARKISIAN: Yeah really, the first two plays, we threw the ball into the end zone, we got back-to-back PIs.

When we got down to the one, we went to a heavy package, which is Jerrick's package. We ran it, and we obviously didn't get much movement at all.

And we had a plan to try to get the ball on the edge when we got down there. They went to big people. I can't quite tell -- It was on the far side of where it got leaky.

But that's one of those plays, if you block it all right, you get in the end zone, and we didn't, and we lose quite a bit of yardage.

And at that point, you're kind of stuck behind the eight ball because we knew we were in four-down territory because of the score of the game.

And I was okay even if we didn't score, not that I didn't want score, but thinking, all right, they're going to have to be backed up, and we'll probably get one more possession with good field position.

The last thing you think is the sack, and it's going to bounce right to the guy, and he's going to run for a touchdown.

So, it's unfortunate that that was the circumstances, because it was a really nice drive by the offense to get all the way down there. First and goal on the one and we don't score, you, quite frankly, probably don't deserve to win that way.

Q. Steve, obviously, Quinn [Ewers] hasn't made a decision as yet on his future. But I'm curious looking back after three years of coaching him, what do you take away most from it? And what do you think he's improved on the most?

COACH SARKISIAN: I'm super proud of Quinn. He's taught me a lot, probably unknowingly to him, because what he went through every year dealing with injury, what he goes through where I don't know if he'd ever live up to the standards of what everybody thinks he's supposed to be.

But at the end of the day, all he did was show up every day and work and be a great leader and be a great teammate. And that's a real credit to him because human nature, in this day and age, is to look at Twitter, to look at Instagram, to look at social media and articles written and fan boards and whatever else. And you can ride that emotional roller coaster of whatever you think public opinion could be, and that could be the opinion of one or a hundred or whatever.

But this guy never did that. All he did was come to work every day. All he did was be a great teammate. All he did was work on his craft, get himself as healthy as he could when he was injured, and then show up when it was time to show up.

Maybe outside of the first two games, I don't think he played a game this year 100% healthy. And he fought through everything. Never complained about it one time. And I think that's why he has so much respect from his teammates.

Q. Coach, you guys tied it up at 7-7. You just decided to bring a little bit of pressure, and then they busted for a touchdown. What was the thought process on bringing pressure at that point?

COACH SARKISIAN: It really was a simulated pressure. It was not like we were trying to blitz and blitz them. We were still seven guys in coverage. They called the screen, they blocked it well, and they got it in the hands of a really good playmaker. [TreVeyon] Henderson's got real speed, and they blocked it well. We were always concerned about him when he got into the open field. So it wasn't like we were bringing five or six. It was a four-man rush.

Good call by them, good execution. It's unfortunate that they hit the screen. I think there was maybe 24 seconds or something to go in the half. I don't think anybody was anticipating that. Definitely stole some momentum. But that's why I was so proud of our guys to bounce back the way that they did in the third quarter.

Q. Coach, you taught these two gentlemen the game of football, the whole entire team to be better football players. You also taught them about the game of life and how to win. How do you feel right now, and how proud are you of what you've become?

COACH SARKISIAN: I'm very proud. I told these guys in the locker room, they need to hold their heads high. There's nothing to be ashamed of for what they did this season, the work that they put in, the challenges that we were faced with. Everybody's got their own unique challenges. We had ours.

But never did anyone complain, we never got the "poor mes." They just worked. They came back to work. As a coach, that makes you proud.

But what I do know is I think that every player that leaves our program is a better man. And for these two guys right here, Jahdae [Barron] was here when I got here. Quinn [Ewers] coming in and trusting us. That permeates throughout our locker room. When you have trust from your leaders, then you get trust from the other players in that locker room.

We've got a great deal of pride. We've got a great deal of pride in this helmet. We've got a great deal of pride in being Longhorns and playing the game of football the right way. I think we do that. I think we win with class, and I think we lost with class tonight. That's something that you learn in life.

Life's not always going to go your way. But if you can do it the right way and you show some resolve and some resiliency and you be a man about it and you be accountable for your actions, you can get on the other side of that adversity and keep going forward. And that's what these two guys will do, and that's what the other 120 guys in that locker room will do.

Q. Steve, you've been through so many things in football. Can you describe what you've been through over the last month, just in terms of the emotional stakes of playing three of these playoff games? Is it different than anything you've ever been through before?

COACH SARKISIAN: Honestly, it was awesome. I loved every second of it, you know? I think these guys would probably tell you the same thing. Was it easy? No. Football is not meant to be easy. It's a tough sport. It's physically grueling. It's mentally grueling.

But I wouldn't have changed it for the world, of showing up every morning with these guys and going to work and playing in some awesome environments and some great games. Kicking off the playoff at home against Clemson, to going to Atlanta and playing a double overtime game against Arizona State, and then coming back here and playing against a great team in the Cotton Bowl.

So we got to play in some amazing environments this year, like I said, from going to Michigan, to playing in the SEC championship game, playing at Kyle Field and renewing the rivalry with A&M. There's so many great things that this season possessed that -- yeah, it hurts, it stings right now. But I'm not going to let this one game and a couple plays overshadow what we were able to accomplish this season.

Yes, we want to be champions. That's what life is about. You always want to come out on top. But there's so much that we can learn from this season, and there's so much to be proud of from this season.

CHARLIE FISS: Coach, thank you so much. Quinn and Jahdae, you had a truly outstanding season. Very proud of you. Thank you for coming.

DB JAHDAE BARRON: I just want to say one thing. I mean, it's been amazing, just the opportunity, but at the end of the day, I just want everybody to know, you know, usually sometimes you always don't come out on top. But we won. We truly know who our leader is and that's God and Jesus Christ.

And ultimately, just having the ability to use the gift that He gave us to share to the world, I mean, it's been amazing. And obviously, amazing for me just growing up in Austin and having the opportunity.

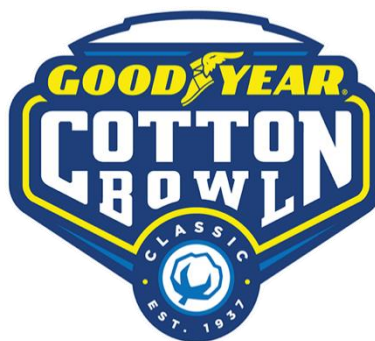
