TEAM NOTES

SERIES HISTORY VS. ARIZONA STATE

- Wednesday afternoon's contest marked the first football game between Texas and Arizona State since the 2007 season, when the Longhorns knocked off the Sun Devils 52-34.
- Wednesday's game marked the first-ever game between the Longhorns and Sun Devils to go into overtime.
- With Wednesday's result, Texas remains undefeated, 2-0, against Arizona State.

THE CAPTAINS

RETURNING TO THE HOUSE

- With 7:08 remaining in the first quarter, first-year Longhorn Silas Bolden returned an Arizona State punt for a 75-yard touchdown, marking the first punt return for a touchdown by a Texas player since Xavier Worthy returned a punt 74 yards at BYU on Oct. 28, 2023.
- Bolden's punt return was the longest for a touchdown by a Longhorn since D'Shawn Jamison returned a punt 90 yards for a score at Kansas State on Sept. 29, 2018.
- Overall, Bolden's punt return for a touchdown was the ninth longest punt return for a touchdown in program history and 10th longest punt return in program history.
- Bolden's first-quarter punt return for a touchdown marked his second career punt return for a touchdown, the first since Sept. 9, 2023 against UC Davis during his time at Oregon State.

LESS THAN SEVEN

- By holding Arizona State to just three points in the first quarter, the Longhorns have held their opponents to three-or-fewer points in 12 of 15 first quarters this season.
- Additionally, Wednesday afternoon's game marked the 12th time in 15 games this season that the Texas defense has held its opponent to seven-or-fewer points in a game's opening half.
- Texas has now held an opponent to three-or-fewer points in the first half on nine different occasions throughout the 2024 season.

BLOCK BY BLOCK

- In the closing seconds of the second quarter, Texas defensive lineman Ethan Burke was credited with a block on an Arizona State 36-yard field goal attempt. It was the second blocked field goal by the Longhorns special teams unit since Sept. 21, 2024, when Alfred Collins blocked a 45-yard field goal attempt by ULM's Max Larson.
- Burke's blocked field goal marked the first time Arizona State had a field goal attempt blocked since Sept. 29, 2012 against California.

BOWLING FOR SUCCESS

- With the win over Arizona State, Texas now has 32 all-time bowl wins in program history, the third most by any Division I football program behind Alabama (45) and Georgia (38).
- The win against the Sun Devils now gives Texas at least one win in every New Years Six Bowl game - Sugar (2), Fiesta (1), Orange (2), Rose (2), Peach (1) and Cotton (11) - becoming the first school to every accomplish the feat.

PICKIN' 'EM OFF

- With Andrew Mukuba's game-ending interception, the Texas defense has now been credited with at least one interception in its last nine consecutive games and 13 of its 15 on the season.

13 GOING ON 39

- By earning the win, Texas has now tied a program record with its 13th win on the season, the most since going 13-1 with an appearance in the BCS National Championship during the 2009 season.
- The win gives the Longhorns just their third all-time 13-win season: 2005, 2009 and 2024.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QUINN EWERS, QB

- With his 23-yard touchdown pass on Texas' second offensive play of the game, Ewers has now thrown at least one touchdown in his last 26 consecutive games played, the longest active streak in the FBS.
- Wednesday's game marked the sixth time over the last three seasons that Ewers has been credited with both a passing and rushing touchdown in the same game.

QUINTREVION WISNER, RB

- On a 7-yard carry with 14:32 remaining in the game, Wisner went over the 1,000 rushing yard mark for the season, marking the 27th time in program history that a Longhorn football player has rushed for 1,000-or-more yards in a single season.
- With Wisner surpassing 1,000 rushing yards on the season, it marks the 13th consecutive year a Sarkisian offense has had a 1,000-yard rusher.

JAYDON BLUE, RB

- With his 11-yard reception, Blue became just the ninth different Longhorn running back to surpass 300 receiving yards in a single season.

GUNNAR HELM, TE

- With his three receptions throughout the game, Helm now has 58 receptions this season, which is tied for the 19th most in a single season by a Longhorn player.
- Helm now has 77 career receptions, which is the fourth most by a Texas tight end throughout their playing career on the Forty Acres.

JAKE MAJORS, C

- By earning the start at center for Wednesday's game, Majors set a new program record for career starts with 56, surpassing the previous record (55) set by Jonathon Scott (OL, 2002-05) and Rodrique Wright (DT, 2002-05).

ANTHONY HILL, JR., LB

- With his two first-quarter tackles, Hill, Jr., surpassed the 100-tackle mark for the season, becoming the first Longhorn defensive player to reach the mark throughout the 2024 season. It's now the third consecutive season a Longhorn defender has surpassed 100 tackles in a season.

JAHDAE BARRON, DB

- By finishing the game with a game-high 11 tackles, Barron recorded his first double-digit tackle performance on the season and first since being credited with 11 against Oklahoma on Oct. 7, 2023.
- Following the game, Barron was named the most valuable player of the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl.

MICHAEL TAAFFE, DB

- Taaffe finished Wednesday's game with a career-high 10 tackles (six solo, four assisted), surpassing his previous mark of 9 set against Georgia on Oct. 19, 2024.

BERT AUBURN, K

- As a result of his 22-yard field goal with 8:54 left in the second quarter, Auburn pushed his season point total to 108 points, which not only ties him for 13th on the program's single-season point list, but he becomes the first player in program history to be on the list for three different seasons.

STARTING STRONG

The Sun Devils did not punt on an opening drive this season, scoring on the first drive in 11 of 14 games. They have touchdowns in eight of those (field goals against Wyoming, Iowa State, and Texas), threw interceptions on the opening drives against Utah and Texas Tech and turned the ball over on downs against UCF.

ASU scored on 78.6 percent of its opening drives this season, a total that ranks 2nd in the FBS behind only Army (12-for-14; 85.7%).

Texas gained 77 yards on its first two plays of the game before the Sun Devil defense locked in to limit the Longhorns to just 56 yards on 19 plays for the remainder of the half (2.9 yards per play).

ODDS AND ENDS

- This is Arizona State's 11th game this season with a sack, its most in a season since 2019 (also 11).
- ASU had two sacks on Texas's first drive of the second half, the third time this season ASU had two sacks in one quarter.
- Kanyon Floyd became the first Big 12 punter to complete a pass in a bowl game. He is the first ASU punter to have multiple passing completions in a season since Chris MacDonald in 2004 (also two).
- Blazen Lono-Wong became the fourth FBS defensive lineman to record a 30+ yard play from scrimmage on offense in a bowl game since 2012.
- He became just the sixth Big 12 defensive lineman since 2003 to record a offensive play of 30+ yards.
- The connection between Floyd and Lono-Wong was just the second 30+ yard play by a Big 12 team from a punter to a defensive lineman since 2003.
- Leavitt the 2nd ASU player since 1996 to have 200+ passing yards and 60+ rushing yards in a bowl game, along with Taylor Kelly against Navy in 2012.
- Sam Leavitt now has 46 passing plays this season of 20+ yards. The last ASU player with that many in a season was Manny Wilkins in 2017 (47).
- Leavitt was the first ASU player with 16+ passing attempts in a first quarter since Taylor Kelly on August 28, 2014 (17). It was the second-most for a Big 12 quarterback in a first quarter of a bowl game since 2012.
- His 27 first-half attempts were the second-most for an ASU QB since 2012 (Mike Bercovici 28 vs. UCLA in 2014).

SKATTEBO STUFF

- Skattebo accounted for 284 total yards of offense (143 rushing, 99 receiving, 42 passing). That was equal or more than 11 of Texas's 14 prior opponents' TOTAL TEAM yards of offense this season.
- Skattebo had his sixth game this season with 4+ receptions, tied with D.J. Foster for the second-most in a season for ASU behind Marion Grice's 9 since 1996.

TALKING OFFENSE

- ASU recorded 510 total yards of offense against the Longhorns - the most allowed by Texas this season. Texas entered the bowl season ranked third in the FBS in allowing just 249.5 yards per game. It was the first time Texas had given up 500+ yards of offense

since playing Washington in the CFP last season (532).

- ASU scored 31 points in the game against a Texas defense that entered the bowl season ranked second in the FBS in allowing just 12.5 points per game. It was the most allowed by the Longhorns this season.
- ASU recorded 296 passing yards against the nation's No. 1 ranked passing defense, which had allowed just 143.1 passing yards per game entering the bowl season.
- ASU had 214 rush yards against the nation's No. 15 ranked rushing defense, which had allowed just 106.4 points per game entering the bowl season. Cam Skattebo's 143 rushing yards were the most allowed to an opponent player by Texas since Kansas State's Deuce Vaughn in the final game 2021 season (also 143) - a 41-game stretch.
- ASU's 16 fourth quarter points were its third-most in a bowl game since at least 1996.

MODERATOR: Coach, just start with an opening statement and we'll go to questions.

STEVE SARKISIAN: First of all, hats off to Arizona State, Coach Dillingham. They showed a ton of fight, ton of resiliency. It is a really good football team. And we went up 16 in the fourth quarter and their ability to come back and take this thing to overtime was very impressive. So congratulations to them on a heck of a season and a game played today.

As far as our guys go today, not our cleanest game of the year. And that's okay to say that. But the one thing that I know about our group is when our backs are against the wall and when our best is needed, our best shows up time and time again, and the resiliency that these guys showed today was something as a coach makes you really proud, you know, that we weren't at our best and felt like an NCAA March Madness basketball game with the swings of emotions and things, but fourth and 15 in overtime to score to come right back and score again, two-point conversion and then a great play by Andrew Mukuba, just proud of these guys, because not every game is going to be pretty and not every game is just going to go exactly how you want it to go.

And there's going to be plenty of stuff that we're going to look at this tape and say we gotta do better and be better, but the one thing I won't have to say is our toughness and fight doesn't need to be better. And if there's one thing that you want as a calling card for your team is just that.

So I think it's a tribute to these guys up here and their

leadership and the culture that we have and their ability to stay calm through the storm and execute when like I said when our best was needed.

Q. Steve, the fourth down stops, red zone stops. Can you talk about the level the defense is playing at, on the flip side, the third quarter, you only had eight yards in the third quarter play?

STEVE SARKISIAN: The third quarter in my opinion was somewhat of a by-product of the first half. We only ran 21 plays in the first half of the game. Then the third quarter comes out. We go three and out. The very next play, we get the ball back after the goal line stand. We give up the safety. They did a great job.

And we knew coming into the game that they were a tremendous ball possession team, and they do a great job of taking care of the ball. Tonight was no different. They held the ball for 398 minutes. They limit your opportunities as an offensive football team to take advantage of that and over time, what that does it their style of play is they can wear on your defense. And clearly we got fatigued some there defensively, and their play makers made some plays.

The quarterback was scrambling around, and Skattebo was as advertised. He got stronger, it felt like. You could see he was fatigued too. It was like a heavyweight fight. He made some really critical plays and obviously on the go ball, but to me, the third quarter was a little bit of a microcosm of really the first half. It almost bled all the way into the second half.

Just we didn't have a lot of opportunities, and we weren't taking advantage of things on first and second down to stay ahead of the chains. We were getting in third and longs. We were punting the ball, and it got difficult.

Q. What about the level the defense played?

STEVE SARKISIAN: It's pretty incredible. These guys do such a good job of just saying, hey, protect the end zone. And if it's six inches, one yard, four yards, whatever that looks like, they're going to stand in there.

And I think there were three of six in the red area tonight scoring, and I think that's a by-product of them trusting one another and trusting the scheme, but I think it's also a by-product of guys understanding when it's their time to make the play, they make the play.

They tackle ferociously. There's a lot of white hats getting to the ball, and they make catches tough. They contest balls when they're thrown in the air, and I think all those things showed up tonight.

Q. Coach, just looking at the resolve of this team, bend but don't break, not just in this game, college football playoff, but in general this season what you can say about your offense, your defense and your special teams and how you got to this point by bending, but never really breaking?

STEVE SARKISIAN: Yeah. I think one thing that happens is as a team, you grow through adversity as long as you handle adversity the right way. And I said to these guys a year ago today, there was a lot of tears and a lot of frustration because we weren't able to close out the semifinal to get to the National Championship game. And that started it.

And I think the way they responded to that to all the things that we went through this off season, the summer, into fall camp, losing a critical piece to this team in Cedric Baxter, one of our team leaders, to Quinn getting injured earlier in the season to losing Kelvin Banks, to losing a lot of different players along the way, Isaiah Bond, so on and so forth.

But the next guy steps up, you know, and the moment doesn't ever feel too big for our guys. As critical as a moment might be, as maybe we're not playing our best football, the one thing I know, the resolve is that they know how to really lock in and get focused and be at their best when their best is needed.

Q. Coach, fourth and 15, talk about that play call and just that throw that Quinn was able to make and maybe those throws that you made to make those dives to Gunnar and Matthew in overtime as well?

STEVE SARKISIAN: I thought there was a couple of things that were impressive. One, I thought it was a great job of preparation by our coaches in relaying that to our players. We actually practiced that play versus that exact defense during the week.

And there was some moving parts to that to where Quinn had to change the protection on the play and he did. He

got us to a max protection. But even at that, there was some intricacies to handle the pressure the way it was coming inside. And so the protection, him changing it to them getting the protection and then Matt understanding why that route was going to be there predicated on the coverage, and I thought Quinn's ability to stand in the pocket and deliver the ball the way that he did was a real strike. So there was layers to the whole thing.

We guessed a little with the call thinking they might come after us, and we guessed right, and he did a great job of getting the protection right and making the play.

Q. Quinn, can you kind of speak to coming through the clutch with the two big overtime passes that you had and does your heart rate ever change?

QUINN EWERS: Well, I think just first off, that's just a testament to how mature this team is and just taking advantage of every single opportunity that we have, whether it be fourth and 15 or first and 10, whatever the situation is, just taking full advantage of the opportunity that's thrown our way.

And just so proud of the way that the entire team stayed poised and composed through the entire game, especially through overtime. And it definitely feels a lot better to be on this end of the win in overtime at the same spot for sure.

Q. (Inaudible)?

QUINN EWERS: I think that we all stay calm, and for all of us to stay calm, it kind of starts with me. And I just try to be that calm within the storm for all the guys, and I think that my relationship with Jesus has helped me in that specific way of knowing that no matter what happens, that He's going to be there for me. He's still going to love me. And the reality of it is, that's the reality of it.

Q. Quinn, after you guys tied up, what were the conversations like on the sideline knowing you had to go right back out there to try and take the lead?

And for Jahdae, your faith never wavered. What do you have to say about his clutch performance, three straight throws for scores?

JAHDAE BARRON: I mean, this starts all like during the summer. Our culture Wednesdays and again just opening up to one another, but I wish Sark could have had a card. We do these culture things on I would say Friday, but today is not Friday. So we do it Tuesday. Tuesday night, we do a team activity, and we write in the card.

And in the card, I wrote just thanking Sark and the last



bullet point was Quinn is going to play fast and the reason he's going to play fast is because of God the creator. He's going to give all his worries and everything he has and give it to him and allow him to play free. And I think that's what Quinn did. When our back is against the wall, he just kept fighting and made some big-time plays in those three throws.

Q. What were your conversation like after you guys tied it up on the sideline?

QUINN EWERS: Pretty short and simple. Let's go do it again. And Coach Sark called a great play that we run pretty often against our own defense, and it hit kind of similar. So it's funny how things work.

Q. How has Matthew stepped up over the past few weeks with Isaiah being kind of in and out and just being able to be that wide receiver one that Quinn can throw to?

STEVE SARKISIAN: I think that's probably a credit to Matthew and to Quinn. As a quarterback, you're always trying to find rapport and trust in a receiver. And as a play caller you are, too. And you earn trust, right, with consistency and time. And I think there's a level of consistency in Matthew's game that he's earned a lot of trust in myself and earned a lot of trust in Quinn that in a lot of the critical moments, it's easy to try to find him, because you know he's going to be in the right spot and you know he's going to be competitively tough and make those plays.

And I think over time, I've learned at least that the moment doesn't ever get too big for him either. He remains very poised and composed in some of the bigger moments that we've had.

Q. You've been through a lot with Quinn over the last three years. I know outside of the building takes a lot of criticism undeserved. But how would you describe the belief in him in those moments and how he's able to continuously pull you guys through?

STEVE SARKISIAN: Quinn's a G, man. He is. Like I know he doesn't always exude that, like in his body language and his demeanor because I say it about him about this all the time, like he's a steady C. He never gets really high. There's flashes of that emotion. He never gets too low.

Sure, there's moments of frustration that we all have, but the guy recalibrates so quickly, and he's so calm that it allows me to lean on him, you know, in the most critical moments, especially tonight, man.

The run game was tough, and we didn't want to get behind the sticks, and we went into overtime thinking we gotta throw it to win. And as much as I wanted to run to win, these guys will tell you, I was telling them last night I felt like in that moment, we had to throw it to win and we had to get the ball in the end zone. I just didn't want to settle for another field goal. We had to go score.

JAHDAE BARRON: Quinn's a leader. He's been leading us this whole time. We used to be roommates. He used to bully me telling me go take out the trash, screaming at me go to sleep. Just Quinn, he strives to be perfect, but he wants everybody else to be perfect.

But, again, he knows the Lord is his creator and he can give everything to him. He can just go play fast, literally go out there and play fast. We're all blessed to be here and blessed to play a game we love, but at the end of the day, you can't make a mistake in God's eyes.

Q. Only Georgia has stopped your all's running game all year and Arizona State did today. Why do you think you all have struggled so much to get your running game going?

STEVE SARKISIAN: I think, one, kind of limited ops. We played four quarters and two overtimes and only ran 60 plays tonight, and that's -- part of the run game is finding a rhythm, and we just couldn't quite get the rhythm and the flow of the game the way we wanted it to go.

I thought they did a good job with some of their movement. I thought they did a nice job kind of on the back side of things when we were ready to make some cuts. And then you feel like it's maybe a gain of six, seven, eight yards. We were getting three. And it was kind of a little frustrating.

But I think ultimately, we gotta find a way to be a little bit more efficient on first down. Four-yard runs are good for us. That's okay. I just felt like we just didn't have enough ops and that was probably the most frustrating thing to where we could really get going, you know.

I'm looking at Jaydon Blue only had four carries and Tre had 18. But we need to be better, and we gotta analyze that. They were a quick athletic front that did a nice job, as I said.

The safeties were aggressive, and they got us on the ground. I give them a lot of credit. They didn't play for over 20 days, and I thought they tackled pretty good tonight, they got us on the ground.

Q. You guys played against a lot of elite competition



in the SEC and then I'm sure the focal point of your game plan defensively this week was to stop the run for ASU, and obviously to have a guy like Cam Skattebo. So watching film of him and then actually playing against him, what was it like when facing Skattebo?

JAHDAE BARRON: As a competitor, you know, it's fun. It's fun when guys say what they say before the game and that's just his confidence level and things like that. But just to go out there with my guys and keep fighting. I think we kept fighting.

Sometimes if we had a penalty and they got another drive, another play, we just continued to fight. And I think ultimately that's what it means and that's what brotherhood means here and the culture and level of bond that we have and the level of bond that we share.

Q. Coach, something about this building, two overtime games, and this time you came out on top. Was there anything, a certain way you approach overtime, and anything you learned whether it's with the play calls or your approach from that Georgia game coming into this one because you seemed to hit those plays?

STEVE SARKISIAN: Yeah. I felt like the way the game was going tonight, I definitely wanted to stay aggressive. And even though in the first overtime, we kind of took a shot on the first play, and it wasn't quite there. And then we came back and then we get a false start after the run, and then we get the second false start and that's how we end up in the 4th and 15.

I felt like we wanted to be aggressive, and that's why when we got the first play to come back out in the second overtime, staying aggressive, trust in your best players to make plays. Between Quinn, Gunnar, Matthew, those guys have been so clutch for us all year. We find a way to get the ball in their hands and see what they could get done.

That was the mentality. I guess I'll take a third overtime if we can get back here on the 20th, right? If that's what it takes, we'll keep everybody on their toes a little bit.

Q. You mentioned the March Madness feel and you talked to basketball coaches and they say experience and being there before helps. I'm wondering how much the experience against Washington helped you all get through these moments this year?

QUINN EWERS: You can't really coach or teach experience. So just the amount of maturity and poise that we have in these games I think has definitely helped us

over time.

JAHDAE BARRON: Sark told us at halftime, this was the point where we were at last year, and we didn't handle business and just to be able to have another opportunity to go out there and go out there and handle business, that was a blessing to do that. So him just continuing to just fight us and push us through that adversity and things like that.

STEVE SARKISIAN: I'd say from a coach's perspective, the more times we get in these moments, whether it's now back-to-back years of being in the playoff, back-to-back years being in the Final Four, playing in a Big 12 Championship and winning it last year, competing in the SEC championship this year, going on the road a year ago to Alabama, going on the road this year to Michigan.

We've been in some pretty big environments, some pretty cool arenas, some pretty big games. Not to say these aren't great experiences. They are. These are amazing experiences for these guys. But the moment at this point doesn't seem too big.

We're not in awe that, hey, this is where we are. This is where we're supposed to be. And I think that they understand that and then they get back to their preparation so that we can try to play our best football.

But that's what experience gives you. It gives you being on this stage, being in the arena and understanding what it's like to be in the arena so that you can focus on your play rather than all of the other stuff that's going on.

Q. You both mentioned your faith in God and that faith in each other. Just to expound on that a little bit and why that's so important to you, and Coach, what it's like to coach guys that put God first?

JAHDAE BARRON: I mean, yesterday in Bible study with Kevin Washington, there was a few guys that went up there. Kevin asked us to tell the reason why you deeply and strongly got closer with God and why you trust God, and Cedric went up there and he told us his story, and Jake Majors went up there, and I also went up there.

I told all the guys like last year and the years before previously, I wanted things done on my time. But it doesn't work like that. God has everything planned. It's already written. And all you have to do is just keep going with the process and just trusting the process and then allowing everybody to be a plus in your life and trusting everybody. So just literally relying on God.

And Psalms 105:1, just "give thanks to the Lord and

 . . . when all is said, we're done.®

proclaim His greatness and show the whole world what He has done." I mean, I'm showing you all my talent, but I'll be surprised, too, when God just pushes me to go out there and allows me to make plays like that.

QUINN EWERS: It's just been super cool to see the amount of guys that have really let God come into their heart, and me being part of that and Jahdae being part of that, it's kind of like a domino effect in the locker room.

I think more guys are starting to come to Bible study, come to chapel, whatever it is. And just to see that, and I think that's what grows us closer as well is just the amount of guys that are putting their faith in the Lord has been really cool to see.

We pray after every practice as a team. And prayer is very powerful, and I really believe in prayer. And it's just been cool to see how Jesus and God have just worked in our lives throughout this year, and I think that is also a testament to how we stay level-headed and poised throughout the entirety of the game.

STEVE SARKISIAN: I think at the end of the day, it's understanding there's definitely a power greater than ourselves. And we live in a world right now in society when it's look at me, look at me, look at me, look what I did. And we try to get these guys out of that mode, and we try to get them to focus on an attitude of gratitude and an idea that serving others and what does that look like and what does that feel like.

And I see it with these guys every single day. And that's why when these moments kind of come up, I'm really not surprised because I know where their mind is at in their approach to going to do this stuff. So it's a testament to the leadership that these two have, because it goes beyond Xs and Os, right? It goes beyond.

It's the fact that there are more guys in Bible study. There are more guys going to chapel. That's leadership. That's what real leadership looks like, but then that's what comes out on game day on 4th and 15.

MODERATOR: Coach, just start with an opening statement, and we'll go into questions.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. That was one of the best teams in the country, if not the best team in the country we faced today. We started off not so great, and the way the guys battled back is remarkable.

Like I told them, if they could rewind in the locker room, I hate to lose more than anybody, but now that it's over, when you can reflect and where these guys have come is an incredible testament to the team. But, golly, that one sucks.

MODERATOR: We'll open it for questions.

Q. Obviously with Cam, everything he's done this year, but with him not doing great on the sidelines, what was going on with that and what was your reaction just him getting back in the game and helping spark that come back to even be in the position to potentially win it?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. If him being competitive and passionate on the sideline is a negative, then I'm in the wrong sport. The kid is competitive. The kid is passionate. And if that's a negative, then I don't know what a positive is because kids that care and have compassion and believe is the exact reason why we had a chance to win this football game. I love Cam, and we're going to have a relationship forever.

Q. When did you notice that things had changed, the



momentum had changed, things had shifted in that game?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: I don't really know when. Probably the safety or when we drove down the field. I mean, the punt return killed us early. That got us behind two scores early, but then from then out, it was -- we never really didn't have control of the game.

They were playing really good red zone defense. Looking back at it, I didn't put our guys in the best position to succeed too many times, and our guys deserved to win the football game. I didn't do a good enough job for them as their head coach putting them in a position to win and I'm going to reflect on that and look at how I can do better to put them in a better position to be successful.

Q. Can you take me through that fourth and 13 play, what you saw from your perspective that gave Texas a chance to score?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. To be honest, it's all on me. We're in a cover zero look. Late in the play clock, Zyrus did a phenomenal job checking out recognizing the cover zero look, checking into a max pro, and I didn't have the ability to get out of it, and that's on me. So we left our guys isoed and covered zero into a max pro there.

I gotta go into that game with an ability to get out of that call. And like I said, there's a lot of things that I gotta do better to help our guys to win the football game. That's one of the many things that as I reflect I gotta be better because our guys played good enough to win. Our guys battled good enough to win, and this game is 100 percent on me.

Q. Kenny, have you ever seen a more heroic game than somebody like Cam and is it hard not to think you had the best team today?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. At the end of the day, the best team is the team that wins the football game. Bottom line. And that's a really good football team we faced. That's one of the best teams in the country.



And they've built that thing over four years to get to where they're at. And I have the utmost respect for Sark and that football team. I know our team does as well because that was a battle. When you look at it, did we belong on the field? I think a lot of people were questioning that, and I don't think any person questions if we belonged on the field.

Now, there are no moral victories when the season ends. There's no such thing. This should hurt and be painful. The locker room is dreadful right now, and it should be. If it wasn't, something would be wrong.

But at the same token, now that this is over, I really am going to challenge our guys to reflect on where it all started, because it really is remarkable. And, you know, like I said, I won't be able to sleep for a while. But I will reflect immediately, because it's an incredible season, and what these two guys did this year is absolutely, I mean, unbelievable.

And everybody should have the utmost respect for what both of those guys did, not just being the players they are, but the leaders of the football team.

Q. Kenny, I was wondering after the game you went and there were some guys walking off the field and you went and kind of circled them back toward the field. What were you doing there?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. You lost the game. Doesn't mean you just get to leave. Like you shake hands. That's what you do. That's sportsmanship. Nothing more than if we would have won, you shake the team's hand. You lose, you go out there, and it's not fun, but that's part of life.

Q. Sam, this question is for you. The emotions on your face right now are obviously evident and you're obviously holding Cam's hand. This being your first college football season, what are you going to reflect the most out of today and what can you say just about the effort that went into today on the field?

SAM LEAVITT: Yeah, I mean, I just want to cherish everything that comes with the season. So special in this group of guys. It's so special, especially the two sitting next to me, the amount of time that -- sorry.

Just the amount of time that I spent with them and the work that we put in. It's just going to hurt me not to be with him next year. I still got another year, but I'm just going to go into this next season and not take anything for granted, off season workouts, the late nights in the facility and everything like that. So, yeah.

Q. When people think of the 2024 Arizona State Sun Devils, what do you want them to think of first?

CAM SKATTEBO: Undeniable. We fought through everything all season. I mean, we let them hang the whole year. We gave everything we had, and you saw it in that game. We never stopped.

I bet you nobody in this room thought we were going to even be close when we went down 17-3 in that first quarter. So we believed in ourselves. We believed in what we had going and undeniable is what this team is about because like you said, heroic, too, heroic. Everybody on this team believes in each other and that's what kept us close.

SAM LEAVITT: Crazy season. I feel like one of the best things is just passion. I feel like, you know, it's pretty special. And that stems from Coach Dillingham and the staff. We just have a different level of passion and something that I've never been a part of.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Family.

Q. Coach, the performance from Cam, the go around, the touchdown pass he threw on fourth down, just some of the plays he made were just insane. Where does that one rank for you just individual performances you've seen?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: I mean, this is just a Tuesday for Cam. (Laughs). It is. This is Tuesday.

CAM SKATTEBO: Wednesday.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. Good point. He's a special player. I mean, he's somebody -- I mean, yeah, it's just Cam. It's exactly what I expected, bottom line. You give him the ball, crazy things happen. They saw a man earlier in the game, he runs to the side, I gotta win a go bomb. I was like I agree, and we found a way to get him the go ball, and he makes the play. And that's just Cam.

Q. Cam and Sam, can you kind of talk about the first half offensive yards were kind of hard to come by and the fact that you guys didn't flinch and you're not a team that's kind of been here before. What was it like in the locker room trying to get some positive momentum going and come out in the second half?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: I'll start before. I had a bad plan going into it. I didn't put them in the best positions to succeed on offense. I gotta do a much better job with formations, motions to create some better leverages to get

these guys going.

CAM SKATTEBO: And then in the locker room at halftime, you know, we took a step back and calmed down, and we understood what we had in the locker room, and we went out there and played ball, you know, our ball. We didn't play the best ball in the first half, but we came back out and gave ourselves a chance. So that's what matters.

SAM LEAVITT: I just feel like it was red zone stuff. We moved the ball pretty effectively actually, and we just needed to convert in the red zone. I take accountability for a lot of stuff that happened. Just going back, I just want to understand that red zone things happen so fast and you have to be so precise. So that's one thing I'm going to carry over into next year.

Q. Coach, Texas came into this game running balls everybody at Georgia and you guys held them to under 50 yards today. What can you say about your defense performance?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Our defensive line, our defense in general did a phenomenal job. Our offensive line in my opinion I started to give them better chances to be successful. They did an awesome job upfront too in the running game.

Both sides of the line of scrimmage I was extremely proud of. I mean, you watch the game, and we played really, really good football for most plays. The problem with football is some plays were worth a lot more than others, and the plays that were worth a lot, they made more of them.

And but like I said, both our lines of scrimmage, I couldn't have been more proud of and the ability to get four other guys back upfront on offense and everybody but one guy back on the defensive lines and two guys in the entire front seven on defense. You know, I'm really excited of the foundation that Cam and this team and Leif has laid and to see where it can take us. Now if the Arizona Cardinals can just draft Cam so we can keep him home, that would be awesome.

Q. Kenny, a couple of situations I wanted to ask about. The decision to punt versus go on fourth and I think five at the end of regulation, was that an easy one given the momentum that you had, and then also the targeting review that was not called targeting and you talked to the officials and what you thought about that?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. The punt was -- we were playing good defense and the score of the game. We kind

of had to in my opinion, just fourth and five low percentage, doesn't even give you -- if that go for it would have guaranteed us a win, we would have gone for it.

So plus 35 if you completed, plus 30, you complete it, you win the football game with a field goal 100 percent would have gone for it, but that go for it would not have clinched a win. So the risk/reward level just wasn't there.

In terms of the targeting, I mean, I'm going to be honest, I don't know what targeting is. We lost one of our best players in the first half for targeting, and I just don't -- I just don't know what it is.

So I don't want to comment on something that I have to get a better grasp of what it is just because it's so -- you know, I just don't quite understand it. I do want to protect the players though. So whatever rules that are put in place to protect the players, I'm all about.

Q. Sam, I know it's kind of hard right now, but thinking next year, what are the main things you're ready to work on in the off season and come back stronger?

SAM LEAVITT: I don't know. I just got done with the game, so I guess I'll go dive into some film study and stuff, but I'm just going to take the next few weeks and just relax and then I'll get to all that.

Q. Kenny, 97 plays on offense. That's a lot of plays. Would you have imagined that many plays for you and Sam both just running 97 plays in a game?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah, that's a lot of football plays, but like I said, we extended drives. We moved the ball down the field. We out gained them. We just in the low red zone, like I said, I gotta do a better job putting our guys in position to succeed in the low red zone and finish some of those drives. And, yeah.

Q. What does it mean leave better than how you found it? I saw you grabbed Kenny in the tunnel as you were walking back in the locker room. What did it mean to play for Kenny?

CAM SKATTEBO: ASU has changed my life forever in a good way. Simple. They've supported me through everything, put me in a position to be successful.

So I think everybody in the ASU community and Coach Dillingham and his staff and this kid next to me right here, they changed my life forever.

Q. Ten minutes ago, Coach Prime tweeted out how proud he is of you and how you represent the Big 12.



How does that make you feel?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah. I have a lot of respect for Coach Prime. Disappointed we couldn't win the football game, but I couldn't be more proud of our guys. They battled, battled from the beginning of the year.

Like I said, I gotta put our guys in better positions to win this football game, and there's many things I could have done that could have helped us do that.

Q. Cam, there were reports that you were ill on the sidelines during the game. Could you give us an idea of what you were going through and how much of it had to do at all in the game?

CAM SKATTEBO: Yeah, I mean, I threw up. I mean, I threw up. I drank too much water too fast, and I was kind of feeling sloshy, and then felt better after.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Puke and rally. (Laughs).

CAM SKATTEBO: I felt a lot better after throwing up, you know, and that's when it all started. I had a rough first half, and I wasn't feeling too good. That second half, it was a different ballgame.

Q. Kenny, did the emotions of this visit begin with the announcement or the release of the news of an extension for you? What does that mean for you and the players you have coming back?

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Yeah, to be honest, I wanted that to be released at a time people weren't going to talk about it. I wanted this to be about the guys, the game and the players, so we released it basically at midnight on New Years so it's not in the media because it's not about me. It's about these guys.

But I'm fired up that we can continue to build this thing, and like I said, I'm a Sun Devil, and that's awesome for me, but I didn't want that to be a distraction or people to really talk about it.

CAM SKATTEBO: Congratulations. I didn't even know.

KENNY DILLINGHAM: Exactly. It worked.

Q. Cam, I know it's just right after the game, but kind of going through the emotions in your mind like this is my last game, this is the last time I'll be with Kenny, I'll be with Sam and just the emotions on just the performance you had and just going out there with them one final time?

CAM SKATTEBO: Yeah. I mean, Coach Dillingham has got the longest future in coach history, I promise. And then this kid next to me, he's going to play on Sundays. I'm going to play on Sundays.

So us three right here, we got a long life ahead of us. This is just the beginning for us. No matter what, these guys will be in my life forever. So it's awesome that I was able to play football for and with them.

And I'm just happy to be in the position I am, and for him to put me in a role to be successful, and then Sam executing to help me be successful. Just hats off to those guys, and I love those guys forever.
