

COLGATE RAIDERS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - In 2008 the Raiders were returning their starting QB, however, he was inj'd in the 1Q of the opener and Greg Sullivan, who played just 1 series in '07, took over. Sullivan threw for 1,695 (61%) with a 12-7 ratio while rushing for 898 (5.2) with 7 more TD's earning 2nd tm PL. Sullivan ret'd in '09 and threw for 1,952 (59%) with an improved 18-5 ratio while rushing for 788 (5.0) and 7 TD's. He returns and is a serious POY contender. He will be backed up by Jr Steve Rizzo and So Josh Hasenberg but neither has attempted a pass. The leadership of this team is in great shape and the QB numbers may even go higher.

RUNNING BACKS - In 2008 Jordan Scott finished a decorated career rushing for 1,148 (5.2) with 15 TD's after having 1,875 (4.6) with 20 TD's in '07. Nate Eachus was #2 with 932 (5.4) and 10 TD's and Jordan McCord was #4 with 158 (4.8). LY McCord led with 930 (4.8) and was 2nd Tm PL. Eachus played in only 8 games but finished with 919 (4.9) and 16 TD's earning 1st tm honors. Along with the QB who was 3rd, the three combined for 96% of the team's rush yards. They lose McCord but Eachus is ready to carry the full load and the staff is excited about Jr Noah Jackson (62 yds '08) who missed LY with an inj in the spring. They also return their all-important lead blocker FB Gigi Cadet & he will be spelled by Wisconsin tran FB Sam Spletz. This unit is in better shape than they were heading into LY and looks to have a star.

RECEIVERS - In 2008 Pat Simonds was the #1 rec with 1,136 (17.5) and he was followed by Doug Rosnick with 254 (11.0). The next highest rec had just 114 (8.1). Simonds led again LY with 1,012 (15.3) while having 14 TD's and earned 1st tm PL and an AA award. Rosnick was #2 with 396 (13.7) and the next highest rec had 130 (18.6). This year Rosnick is the go-to guy and the only other wideout with rec is Dan Basil (3 rec, 12.3). Starting TE Nick Cvetic, who is used mainly as a blocker, returns after having 5 rec (11.4). This unit is clearly down a few notches from the past 2 seasons and desperately needs someone to step into the starting role.

OFFENSIVE LINE - The OL had 4 starters and 7 with starting exp back in '08 and they rushed for 268 ypg & 5.1 ypc. LY was quite a performance as they lost 4 starters incl an AA & 2 1st team PL but still rushed for 250 ypg & 4.5 ypc finishing #3 in the FCS! This season they lose 2 full-time starters and one 6-game starter incl 1st tm PL LT Ryan Gross. They do return 4 players who started in

Brian Merrifield, Will Elmore, Kevin Morgan and Vittorio Ottanelli. They also return 3 additional lettermen. This unit has much more exp than LY but it will be tough to improve on the numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Last season 2 of the 4 starters ret'd and after allowing 172 ypg rush & 5.5 ypc in '08, they allowed 117 ypg & only 3.9 ypc. This year they lose 3 starters incl 1st tm PL Paul Mancuso & 2nd tm Austin Douglas. The lone returning starter is Lamont Sonds (32 tkl, 2.5 sk, 2.5 tfl). This unit will be tested as the 5 players competing for the 3 starting spots COMBINED for just 1 tackle LY. This unit is clearly much weaker and you can expect the defensive rush numbers to elevate.

LINEBACKERS - In 2008 the LB unit lost its #1 tkl'r but ret'd 2 starters and the team allowed 29.1 ppg. LY they again returned 2 starters but they were the #1 & #2 tkl'rs and the team improved by allowing 22.4 ppg. This year they lose 2 starters and they were the #1 & #3 tkl'rs. The returning starters are #4 tkl'r Zach Smith (2.5 sk, 2.5 tfl, 1 int) and he will be joined by

Mike Carbone who was the team's #2 tkl'r in '08 but only had 5 tkl's LY in an inj-plagued season. There are 4 additional returning lettermen who will be fighting throughout the fall camp for the open spot with the early lead going to Chris DiMassa (13 tkl). If Carbone is healthy, this unit is equal to last season but if not, they will be down.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Last season the secondary had to replace a pair of starters incl a 1st tm PL pick. They allowed 191 ypg passing and an excellent 48.7% completions. This season the unit loses only one starter but Uzi Idah was the team's #1 tkl'r & was 1st tm PL. Both CB's return incl LY's PL ROY Demetri Diamond (#5 tkl'r, 1 int, 5 pbu) and Corey Moses (34 tkl, 3 int, 4 pbu). Vinnie Nicosia (29 tkl, 2 tfl, 1 int, 4 pbu) will again start as FS while Mike Barry (#6 tkl'r, 1 int, 3 pbu) was very productive and made 2 sts at safety LY. This unit is much more exp'd than the last few seasons and having a pair of multi-year starting CB's allows your defense to do many things.

SPECIAL TEAMS - The ST unit underachieved last season. K Evan Colborne will try to improve on LY's 4-6 mark as he only had a long of 34 yds with no att's over 40 yds. Evan Goldszak split punting duties but avg'd 37.7 ypp which was 4.4 ypp higher than the team avg. The team's 28.95 net was 8th worst in the FCS and needs to improve. The main RS are gone but the team only avg'd 3.6 per PR while allowing 13.3 & avg'd 18.2 per KR while allowing 21.6.

COACHES - Dick Biddle is in his 15th season here as HC here. The 5th-year OC is Dan Hunt who is in his 16th season here as well.

PATRIOT

The co-DC's are Pat Foley, who coached LB's LY and is in his 2nd season here, and Ryan Knowles, who is in his 5th season here and 2nd as DC and also coaches the DL.

FORECAST - Biddle took over in 1996 after an 0-11 season which was their 5th straight losing year. Not only did he go 6-5 in his inaugural season but he's resurrected the program and has had a winning seasons 13 of 14 years - incl 6 playoff appearances. The Raiders were coming off a 2008 season in which they went 9-3 incl 5-0 in conference play. LY's season opened with the first night game in school history and after trailing Monmouth 16-14 at HT they scored 21 straight for a 35-23 win. They avenged a loss to Stony Brook in a 23-13 defensive battle. RB McCord rushed for 212 in his 2nd career start and they disposed of Dartmouth 34-15. The Raiders had a 488-329 yd edge vs Fordham but were -2 in TO's in the 20-12 win. They then had a season-high 561 yds beating Cornell by 22 pts. They were ranked #23 vs Princeton and led 7-0 in the 4Q but it went into OT at 7-7 before Colgate pulled out the 21-14 win. After beating Georgetown they had 15 straight regular season wins. Colgate dropped its 1st game of the season vs Holy Cross getting outgained 440-296. They recovered and bounced back with a 27-20 win against Lehigh. They faced Lafayette still having hopes of a conf title but lost a shootout as the teams combined for 1,063 yds. The game was tied at 7 then later at 42 but Colgate allowed 2 short (12/2pl & 38/7pl) TD drives and lost. The offense continued in the season finale as they finished with a 463-273 yd edge vs Bucknell. Both sides of the ball has holes but they returned 12 starters LY as well and went on to win 9 games.
