## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

**QUARTERBACKS** - In 2008 starting QB Robert Irvin (1,031, 53%, 5-5) was banged up often giving Keiffer Garton (388, 60%, 1-5) and Kyle Olson (245, 55%, 0-1) valuable experience. Both backups ret'd LY and Garton (400, 67%, 4-3) won the job but played in only 5 games with 3 starts. Olson (1,074, 52%, 7-6) made 6 starts incl the final 5 games. John Hurley (148, 52%, 0-2) also made a start. Garton and Hurley both return but each missed the majority of spring practice with inj's giving Andrew Holland and Billy Ragone all of the spring game snaps. This position has seen an incredible amount of attrition but now has 4 QB's in the mix. The coaches plan to play at least 2 QB's changing the pace with some mobility and the current leaders for the fall if healthy are Garton and Ragone.

**RUNNING BACKS** - LY this unit ret'd '08's top 6 rushers led by Mike DiMaggio (585, 4.4), QB Garton was #2 and Matt Hamscher (203, 4.1) was #3. DiMaggio (123, 2.6) started the first 6 games but was only #5 while Matt Hamscher (203, 4.1) started the final 4 and finished 3rd. The team's leader was Fr Lyle Marsh (526, 4.7) who earned 2nd Tm Ivy without making a start while Bradford Blackmon (204, 5.7) was the #2 rusher and added 24 rec (7.1). The top 8 rushers are all back this season and while FB Luke DeLuca only had 101 (3.5) he started all 10 games and earned 2nd Tm Ivy. Despite all of the exp soph Jeff Jack led the spring game in rushing. It's a pleasant problem for the staff which returns 2 all-conf players plus 2 other RB's who started.

**RECEIVERS** - LY the team ret'd 4 of their top 5 rec's losing only their TE. Kyle Derham led in both '08 (404, 13.9) & '09 (388, 11.1). Matt Tuten (379, 13.1) started all 10 and was #2 while Joe Holder (155, 15.5) was #4 and David Wurst (126, 11.5) was #5. This season they lose their 2 yr leader but return the other 6 players who had

10+ receptions. With the #1 rec not having dominant stats I'll call this unit up a little from LY.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - The '08 version of the OL ret'd only 2 starters and the rush numbers slipped to 140 ypg rush & 3.7 ypc. Big things were expected LY as they ret'd 4 starters and 5 with starting exp. The numbers only slightly improved however as the team avg'd 149 ypg & 3.7 ypc. This year they again return 4 starters incl 1st Tm Ivy C Joseph D'Orazio. The OT's are Greg Van Roten & Jared Mollenbeck who each started all 10 games LY and also back is 2nd Tm Ivy LG Luis Ruffolo who has 15 career starts. This group has the nucleus to be one of the Ivy's best and if the numbers aren't at the level of the early 2000's, it would be quite surprising.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - Penn's 5-2-4 defense continues to dominate. Despite having just 1 DL starter back in '08 the team improved and allowed 91 ypg rush & 3.0 ypc. LY they ret'd 3 starters but how much better could they get? How about allowing 63 ypg & 2.1 ypc to finish #2 in the FCS in rush D. This season they lose 1st Tm Ivy Joe Goniprow and tragically 2nd Tm Ivy Owen Thomas. Returning are DE Brian Levine (43 tkl, 3 sk, 6 tfl), DT Jared Sholly (12 tkl, 3.5 tfl, 1 int), DT Brian Wing (10 tkl, 2.5 sk) and 2 game starter Kameron Jones (1 int). They also get back a 9m starter in Drew Goldsmith who missed LY after having 26 tkl & 4 sks in '08. This unit is deep and talented but there's no way they can improve on last year's numbers, right?

**LINERACKERS** - The 2 LB's are usually the team's leading tacklers with the DL providing their lanes. In '08 they were #1 & #2 with #1 Jake Lewko returning LY. The team allowed 15.1 ppg in '08 and LY LED the FCS allowing only 9.5 ppg! Lewko was #1 tkl'r and now departs after earning Ivy's Co-MVP. Zach Heller (#2 tkl'r, 5.5 sk, 3.5 tfl) returns after earning 2nd Tm Ivy. Erik Rask (42 tkl, 1 sk, 9.5 tfl) looks to be Lewko's replacement. It is always tough to replace a conf MVP but this unit is actually in better shape than last season as the new starter has much more exp than Heller did starting LY.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - The secondary returned 3 starters in '08 and the team had a recent best of allowing 159 ypg passing (54%). LY they ret'd 2 starters incl CB Chris Wynn who was a 3 yr starter and 1st Tm Ivy in '08. The team improved again allowing 154 ypg & 52% comp. Wynn made 8 sts before an inj and departs as does 1st Tm Ivy Jonathan Moore (4 int, 7 pbu) and 2nd Tm Ivy Kevin Gray (#4 tkl'r, 5.5 tfl, 7 pbu). The lone returnee is Josh Powers (#3 tkl'r, 1 int, 4 pbu) who has 18 career starts. Three others made at least 1 start LY in CB's Anthony Marino (7 tkl) and Jon Saelinger (2 tkl, 1 sk) and S Fred Craig (14 tkl, 1.5 tfl). This is clearly the least exp'd unit on the team and defending their Ivy title may come down to how quickly this unit matures.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - The ST numbers were surprising from an 8-2 team. Top RS Wynn avg'd only 4.7 on PR's and 13.5 on on KR. The team did block 3 P's however including 1 for a TD. Brad Blackmon is back after having 5 KR's for 25.4. Both K's are back and Andrew

**IVY LEAGUE**

Samson was 1st Tm Ivy after hitting 11-21 (long 45). P Scott Lopano avg'd 37.5 with a team net of 33.8.

**COACHES** - Al Bagnoli is a legend as he's the second winningest active FCS coach and the only coach in Ivy history to win 7 outright titles. DC Ray Priore is in his 24th season here and OC Jon McLaughlin enters his 5th ssn here and 2nd as OC.

**FORECAST** - Penn fans have grown accustomed to winning under HC Bagnoli as he's had only one losing season in his 18 years here. LY was one of his finest coaching jobs as he won an unprecedented 7th Ivy Title despite an 0-2 start. The Quakers lost the opener to city rival and eventual Nat'l Champ Villanova despite finishing with a 239-187 yd edge. They trailed Lafayette 17-0 before forcing OT where they lost to fall to 0-2. They lost their starting QB but still beat Dartmouth, 30-24. They were without their TOP 3 QB's against Bucknell and the D stepped up and allowed only 196 yds. The D forced 7 TO's vs Columbia in the 27-13 win. The only TD in the game vs Yale was a pick 6 and the Quakers got their 1st shutout in 2 yrs. Penn's defense held Brown without an offensive TD then won in OT for the first time in 6 tries becoming the 1st ever program to reach 1,300 games played. The 42-7 HC win against Princeton was the largest MOV in the series since 1943. In what was basically the Ivy Championship game, Penn dominated Harvard in a rain soaked game leading 17-0 at HT in a 17-7 win. They recorded another shutout in the finale to finish as the FCS's #1 scoring defense. This team was disciplined as they led not only the FCS but the ENTIRE Div I in fewest pen & pen yds edging out Navy. With thirteen starters back and the Harvard game at home they could be considered the favorite to win B2B Ivy titles.
