### **POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009**

QUARTERBACKS - Ryan Hart started 32 straight games and departed as the Knights' all-time career leading passer. In his final year ('05) he threw for 2,135 (60.8%) with an 18-8 ratio. Mike Teel, who has a stronger arm than Hart, threw for 683 (50.5%) with a poor 2-10 ratio in 3 starts in '05. Teel was 23-0 as a high school starter and finished his college career 29-13. Teel was maligned in 2006 throwing for 2,135 (55.4%) with a 12-13 ratio, Jabu Lovelace (PS#63) only played in 3 (1 pass). Mich St transfer Domenic Natale (PS#29, 2 gm '05) sat out '06 and missed '07. Teèl is a pocket passer and his longest rush was just 8 yards. Teel was #1 in the NCAA in pass eff after 3 in '07 but hurt his thumb and in the 2H of the year he threw for just 171 ypg (52.6%). He was healthy in the bowl and threw for 303. Lovelace threw for 69 (7 of 23). Last year they added true frosh DC Jefferson (PS#20) and Steve Shimko (PS#74). In the first 7 Teel had a poor 3-7 ratio. Teel was booed by the home crowd vs Morgan St and Conn but had a great 2H of the season. He set a school record with 6 TD's vs Pitt's #10 pass D (361 yd). In the final 6 he threw for 343 ypg (68.5%). He threw for 447 and matched a Big East record with 7 TD's vs L'ville and this time got a standing ovation. He then won Bowl MVP. Lovelace broke his leg early. Natale played in 5 (8 pass att, 6 rush) This year they lose their new all-time career leading passer Teel (#6DC SEA) and while the unit should have a better 1H of the year, they will not be able to match Teel's 2H numbers as this group is a lot less experienced.

RUNNING BACKS - From 2002-'04 Rutgers avg just 92 ypg rush (2.5) but in '05 true frosh Ray Rice became the 2nd 1,000 yard rusher here in 30 years (Terrell Willis '93 & '94) with 1,120 (5.7). In '06 he set RU and Big East records with 1,794 (5.4) and reset the record a year later with 2,012 (5.3). His top backup was little-used Mason Robinson (5'10" 190 Jr) who had 202 (5.6). My biggest question mark on the team in '08 was who would replace him. The coaching staff was very high on Kordell Young (PS#78) and he did have 94 vs Fresno but then missed 4 (inj). He started 7 of the last 8 and led with 554 (3.9). Jourdan Brooks (6'1" 245) gave them a big back option as he rushed for 134 (6.1) vs Navy and finished with 516 (5.2). RFr Joe Martinek (PS#49) emerged in the 2H of the year and had 404 (5.3) while Robinson (PS#59) added 139

(3.4), but worked at WR in spring. Also in the mix are FB Andres Morales (6'2" 250 the mix are FB Andres Morales (6'2" 250 Jr PS#98LB), FB Damion Moore (6'0" 220 rFr), RB Tyrone Putman (5'10" 185 So), and FB Anthony Lisanti (5'11" 210 So). This year the unit returns intact making

it vastly more experienced.

RECEIVERS - The Knights had to replace their all-time career leading receiver in Tres Moses in '06 and then their leading returning WR was lost in Wk 4 and TE Clark Harris led with 493 (14.5). The backup WR's were 5 frosh, 2 soph and a junior. Kenny Britt (PS#73) did not catch a pass until Wk 8 but still led the WR's with 440 (15.2). Tiquan Underwood had 290 (12.6) and true frosh Tim Brown, who may be the fastest player ever at Rutgers (4.29 spd), avg 25.2 on 8 rec. In '07 TE Harris departed but Underwood set a school record with 248 vs Buffalo and had 673 in the first 5. He set the single season record (Moses 1,056 '04) but he did not top it until the bowl (427 L/8). Britt then surpassed Underwood also in the bowl and finished with 1,232 (19.9!). Brown had 340 (14.2). Last year Britt reset the record with 1,371. He finished his career as the BE's all-time leader in yds (3,043 - 34 gm) and was 2nd in FBS in rec ypg (114.3). Underwood was #3 with 494 (12.4). Brown was #2 and avg'd a team high 20.9 on his 27 rec. TE Kevin Brock added 300 (11.5). This year they lose Britt (13 st, #1DC TEN), Underwood (11 st, #7DC JAC), Dennis Campbell (5 st, 13 rec) and TE's Brock (6 st) and Craig McGovern. Adding depth are TÉ's Beau Bachety (6'4" 250 rFr) Marquis Hamm (6'4" 220 rFr, PS#107DL) with true Mohamed Sanu (PS#109DB) and rFR Brandon Jones (PS#262). With the loss of their top 3 players, this group is clearly weaker.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In 2006 RU had 8 of their top 10 back and rushed for 180 ypg (4.7) while allowing only 8 sacks (#1 in IA, 2.7%). In 2007, they had to replace two starters including a #5DC and a Rimington finalist. They did get the big addition of true frosh Anthony Davis (PS#7) and he started the final 8. The Knights improved again to 198 ypg (4.8) with 11 sacks (2.9%). Last year they had to replace 3 starters. Their 28 career starts were the 10th lowest in FBS and I noted that after 4 years of improving their ypc, they would take a step back. They had 128 ypg rush (3.9) although they did allow just 19 sacks (4.6%) Last year they added another true frosh VHT in Art Forsť (PS#25) and he started 8 at RG. This year they must replace Mike Gilmartin (6 st) but have everyone else back including their star LT, C and LG making this the best OL in the Big East

DEFENSIVE LINE - In 2001 the Knights allowed 5.4 ypc rush, their worst total in over a decade but they showed improvement the next 5 years allowing 4.7, 4.2, 4.3, 3.3 and just 2.9 ypc in 2006. In 2007 they had to replace two DL starters but returned AA DT Eric Foster as well as 2nd Tm BE DE Jamaal Westerman and I expected a big impact from DE George Johnson (PS#15TE). Surprisingly, the unit regressed allowing 4.0 ypc (157 ypg). Last year they had to replace one starter (Foster) and DE Gary Watts (5 st, 4 sk in '07) took a RS. The more experienced group improved to 136 ypg (3.8) but the sacks dropped to 29. This year they lose 2nd Tm BE DE Westerman (12 st, 33 tkl, 6 sk) and DT Peter Tverdov (12 st, 44 tkl, 4 sk). Two full-time starters are back and I like the 3 deep at DT as well. Also in the mix are Evan Lampert (6'3" 250 So) and Remo Fioranelli (6'3" 255 Jr). Despite being lightly experienced, this could be an improved group.

INEBACKERS - After replacing 2 LB starters in '07, they only had to replace 1 starter last year (#4 tkl'r) and returned their #2 and #3 tacklers plus 2 projected starters who missed '07. This year they lose Kevin Malast (#1 tkl\*r, 13 st) and Marc Orosz (3 tkl, 3 gm). Not only do 5 of the top 6 return, but they get Michigan transfer Marcus Witherspoon (PS#16) and I expect a bigger season from Manny Abreu (PS#15) who is two years removed from an '07 injury



DEFENSIVE BACKS - With inexperienced secondaries in both '04 and '05 the Knights finished just #104 and #111 in my pass D rankings. With 7 of their top 8 back in 2006 they moved up to #42. In 2007 they had 3 starters back and moved up to #32. Last year they only had to replace one starter (9 st). Surprisingly Rutgers dropped to #106. This year they lose CB Jason McCourty (13 st, 52 tkl, 6 pbu, #6DC TEN), 1st Tm BE FS Courtney Greene (51 consec st, 87 tkl, #7DC SEA), S Glen Lee (11 tkl) and Davon Smart (14 tkl). This group is less experienced but could move up in my pass D rankings. SPECIAL TEAMS - RU climbed to #40 in my ST

rankings in '04 and then rose to #21 in 2005 and 2006. Jeremy Ito hit 22 of 29 FG's and his 57 career FG's made were already a school record

heading into 2007. They had to replace their P and top KR & PR but it was still surprising that they plummeted to #103 in 2007. Last year they losť K Ito and ST coach Darren Rizzi. The return game was avg but they had reservations about using starting CB Jason McCourty although he avg 25.8 on KR in the 2H of the year. In his first year as K San San Te hit 12 of 17 (long 50). Teddy Dellaganna had 1 TB on 73 KO but greatly improved the team's net punting from 30.7 to 34.3. The unit rose to #57. This year they lose their top 2 KR's but could improve.

COACHES - HC Greg Schiano enters his 9th year here after being the Miami, FL DC in 2000. Schiano is a New Jersey native who also coached in the NFL (Chicago '96-'98). Following the '02 season he received a contract extension through '07 despite a 3-20 record (0-14 BE). RU earned their first ever Top 10 ranking in 2006 and Schiano was named the FWAA's Coach of the Year. If Schiano was going to leave RU, it would have been in 2006 when Miami (FL) offered him \$2.2 mill/yr, but he signed a contract extension here through 2016. He also turned down an offer from Michigan in '07. Schiano took over the DC duties himself in 2005 after his DC left for the NFL but this year he handed over the def play calling to Co-DC's Bob Fraser (LB coach) and Ed Pinkham (DB coach). OC John McNulty left for the Ariz Cardinals this year and Schiano appointed co-OC's in Kyle Flood (OL coach) and Kirk Ciarrocca (QB coach). Flood and Ciarrocca were together for 3 years at Delaware (2002-'04).

# PHIL'S FORECAST

Coming into 2006, Rutgers had just 5 winning seasons the previous 24 years despite the fact that they are the only FBS college football team located in the highly populated NY/New Jersey area. HC Greg Sčhiáno endured a 25 game Big East losing streak. In 2004 they opened 4-2 including a loss to IAA N Hamp but lost their final 5, all to bowl squads. In 2005 I called for Rutgers to achieve their 2nd bowl game in school history. They were +70.4 ypg in BE. They went 7-4 but blew a 24-10 lead in the bowl vs Ariz St. In 2006 RU was picked #4 in the BE preseason media poll, its first ever upper half prediction. They entered the national rankings for the first time in 30 years at 4-0 and after beating L'ville, rose to #7 with talk of a possible BCS Title Game. They suffered a letdown (1 of 4 unbeatens) vs Cincy. They still could have won the Big East with a win at WV but lost in 30T's going from a possible BCS bowl down to the Texas Bowl. Schiano did a great job and they bagged their first bowl win in their 137 year history and finished #12. Their 11 wins tied the 1976 team's record. The D allowed just 14.3 ppg (best S/'80) and the off avg 29.8 ppg (best S/'93). RU doubled season ticket sales heading into '07 and made the preseason AP rankings (#16) for the first time. RU opened 3-0 and moved into the Top 10 (2nd time schl hist) but lost to Maryland. They were 7-5 but destroyed Ball St 52-30 in the International Bowl. Rutgers became the first offense in NCAA history to have a 3,000 yard passer, 2,000 yard rusher and two 1,000 yard rec in the same season. Rutgers finished in a 3-way tie for 2nd last in the Big East at 3-4. Ray Rice opted to leave for the NFL. Last year thanks in part to a soft non-conf schedule, I called for RU to get back to a bowl and said they had a shot at matching '07's 8 win total. That forecast looked dead wrong as the Knights opened the season 1-5 with 3 of their 5 losses by 2, 7 and 3 and fans were booing at home and recruits were changing commitments. They did edge past Conn 12-10 at home with UC missing a 42 yd FG at the end (phew!). Senior QB Teel exploded over the 2H and out of nowhere, a Rutgers team that averaged 13.2 ppg vs FBS foes after the 1st 7 gms would score 43.3 over the last 6. They beat Pitt by 20 on the road and USF by 33 and steamrolled L'ville 63-14. They inched past NCSt in the bowl and amazingly got back to 8 wins. RU was the first BCS conf team to go from 1-5 to a bowl S/'03 and just the 7th in FBS history. While they finished in a 3-way tie for 2nd at 5-2, RU was a BE best +62.4 ypg and ended on a 7 game win streak. They had just 6 starts lost LY to inj (5th fewest). RU has just 13 returning starters and while not a dominant team, they have enough talent to have a double digit win season vs one of the weakest schedules in the FBS. I will call for the Knights to get their first ever NY Day bowl game.



RUTGERS DRAFT FACTS:

It's hard to believe but WR Kenny Britt (30th overall), is the first player in Rutgers long history (139 years) to be selected in the 1st Round. Rutgers has had 25 players drafted since 1982 with 14 coming under HC Schiano. This year the 5 players selected are the most in RU history. Fourteen players have been chosen the last 10 years which ranks the Scarlet Knights 6th in the Big East. Fifteen of the last 21 (71%) draft choices have been from the offensive side of the ball. There are 22 current Scarlet Knights in the NFL and expect an increase in draftees as Schiano is recruiting higher caliber players.

There were a few bowl games where the key was a QB injury & this was one of them. NCSt fmbl'd on the first play of the game & RU drove 50/8pl and faked a 24 yd FG for a TD, 6-0 (xp blk'd). NCSt went 81/8pl with a 45 yd TD pass and 65/8pl for

a 32 yd FG, 10-6 1Q. RU had a 30 yd FG blk'd with 4:38 1H & the Wolfpack went 80/13pl for a TD with :38 left, 17-6. NCSt had a 269-159 yd edge 1H but Wilson was inj'd & DNP the 2H. Beck hit 0-4 passes with 1 int & Evans was 5-12 for 82 yds & 2 int. The Knights opened the 3Q with a 31 yd FG and after a blk'd punt went 16/3pl for a TD, 17-16 (6:50 3Q). RU got a 27 yd FG with 13:31 left, 19-17. Évans led NCSt 64/8pl for a TD with 9:21 left, 23-19 but surprisingly went for 2 & they failed. RU got a 42 yd TD pass to make it 26-23 (8:30). Ray Rice nearly broke the NCAA bowl rushing record & his 280 yards were the 3rd most in NCAA bowl history. Rutgers, first college football

RU rec'd a fmbl & got a 46 yd FG to make it 10-0. RU int'd a Mark Malone pass & ran 36 yds to the Sun Devil 4 yd line. The score should have been 17-0 but RU fmbl'd at the two. With 1:53 in the 1H Malone hit Bob Weathers for a 14 yd TD pass, 10-7 1H. Malone passed for a 26 & 47 yd TD's in the 3Q to MVP John Mistler to put ASU up 21-10. ASU added a 1 yd TD run early in the 4Q to make it 28-10. RU rebounded with 5:39 left with a five yd TD run & 2 pt conv, 28-18. On the KO Startzell kicked the perfect squibbler that bounced off of 2 ASU players & was rec'd by RU in the EZ. The officials were confused on what to call, luckily for them a flag was thrown upfield. RU OFFSIDES. With 4:44 left ASU took over & in the final minute Malone scored on a 4 yd TD run 34-18.
