POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QB's - This was a weakness for the Wildcats in '09 but it quickly became a strength with the new offense and Matt Johnson in his 2nd year of playing time. Last year MEAC OPOY Johnson threw for 2,053 (65.4%, 14-5) and was the #1 rusher with 700 (5.1). Life was good with Johnson who led them to a 10-2 record but now they return just 6 starters on offense and must replace Johnson. They have 2 who saw limited time LY and are fighting for the job. Jackie Wilson has a slight edge after he threw for 371 (47.4%, 3-2) LY but David Blackwell is a name to watch while PS#100 Troy Dannehower (10-14-114, 3-0) is also in the mix.

RB's - B-CU ret'd 3 of its top 4 rushers LY but was led by QB Johnson. The #1 RB was Isidore Jackson (514, 4.4) who was followed by Andreose Bell (426, 3.6). Andronicus Lovette (261, 6.7) and FB Jonathan Moment (257, 4.4) were very productive in their roles. TY they are, of course, without the team leading QB but lose only Bell among the backs. They again return 3 of their top 4 RB's making this unit equal to LY.

Rec's - The receiving corps ret'd its top 3 rec LY and after finishing '09 with 553 (14.9), UCF tran Jevaughn Reams led with 714 (17.4) earning 2nd tm MEAC. The #2 rec was Eddie Poole (550, 16.7) and #3 was Pat Brown (337, 11.2). TY they lose their #1 and #3 and joining Poole will be Maurice Francois (3st, 249, 16.6), Courtney Keith (3st, 153, 15.3) and Javaris Johnson to fill out the receiving corps. Every TE that made a start LY ret's in Randy James (7st, 24, 8.0), Jordan Murphy (2st, 77, 11.0) and Markiel Floyd (3st, 1 rec). Keep an eye on soph Preston Cleckly who was a huge surprise this spring. With the loss of the B2B #1 WR, they'll be down a couple of notches.

O-Line - The OL lost 3 starters LY but churned out an amazing ssn, improving from 152 (3.6) to 213 (4.4) rush ypg but did allow 29 sk (9.5%) despite a mobile QB. TY they lose 2 starters. The leaders of the group are C Natiel Curry (1st tm MEAC) and LT Alex Monroe (2nd tm MEAC). Joining them will again be RT Marquell Rozier (12st) while Corey Mason (4st) will slide into the starting RG spot. Pushing for a starting role is JC Stavion Lowe who RS at LSU (PS#20) in '09. Also in the mix are JC transfers Jackie Hoffman and Blake Pritchard. This is a far better group but may not match LY's numbers.

D-Line - The DL lost 2 starters LY incl a 2nd tm MEAC and the numbers slipped to allowing 147 (4.1) rush ypg while the sks improved to 26. TY they again lose 2 starters. Both DE's return in 1st tm MEAC Ryan Davis (#3 tkl'r, 6.5 sk, 7.5 tfl) and Erik Williams

(8st, 29 tkl, 6.5 tfl). Rutgers tran PS#161 Jameil Farrington (29 tkl, 3.5 tfl) looked tentative here LY but is ready to play to his potential. Also at DT are Eugene Solomon (3st, 33 tkl, 5 tfl) and Kentrell Harris (3st, 6 tkl). The unit is deep as Cornelius Wheeler (2st, 15 tkl) and Tevin Toney (21 tkl, 2.5 tfl) saw a good number of reps while the coaches said JC Harold Love has the ability to be the DL's anchor.

LB's - The LB unit ret'd 1 of 3 starters LY but improved to a recent best of all g 19.0 ppg. TY they not only does everyone return but they add Rutgers tran PS#91 Al-Ghaffaar Lane. Back are Ryan Lewis (#1 tkl'r, 5 sk, 9 tfl, 4 int), Reggie Sandilands (#2 tkl'r, 3.5 sk, 8 tfl), Rock Angrand (4st, 23 tkl) and Jarkevis Fields (33 tkl). This group will be among the MEAC's best LB corps.

DB's - The secondary has returned 3 starters each of the last 2 seasons and after all'g 143 ypg (46.4%) in '09, they allowed 17.5 ypg (49.2%) LY. This unit has had an exceptional run as in 5 of the L7Y they've all'd under 50% comp. After B2B veteran units they now lose 3 starters incl a 1st tm MEAC SS. CB Daniel Rhodes (10st, 37 tkl, 9 pbu) is the only "starter" ret but FIU tran FS Michael Williams (44 tkl, 6 int, 4 pbu) is also back after earning 1st tm MEAC honors. The open CB spot is between Dion Hanks (19 tkl) and DJ Howard (2st, 1 tkl) while the SS spot is 3-way battle between Jean Fanor who had 41 tkl in '09 but DNP LY, former Conn tran Aaron Bagsby (4st, 38 tkl) and Cincy tran PS#185 Quincy Quetan. This IS the strongest 1 returning starter secondary in the entire country.

SPECIAL TEAMS - This was a weak link for B-CU LY with Kory Kowalski handling some of the kicking and all of the punting duties. Kowalski hit 1-6 FG (L/23) and avg'd just 35.9

ypg. KR/PR Courtney Keith ret'd to give them decent ability in the return game, avg 13.7 on PR and 22.0 on KR. Everyone is back and I expect MUCH better kicking numbers.

COACHES - HC Brian Jenkins is in his 2nd yr as HC and was previously the RB coach at Rutgers (1Y) and Louisiana (7Y). Their potent offense must now go without OC Mark Orlando who left for Prairie View A&M and Jenkins was handling those duties himself in spg. Charlie Jones is back for his 2nd yr as DC.

FORECAST - This is not a winning program most can name but the Wildcats have had 10 winning ssn's the L/13Y. LY the new coaching staff raised the offensive production from 15.8 ppg to 38.2 ppg finishing #2 in the FCS. Not only did they jump out to an 8-0 record but they won each game by at least 13 points with an avg score of 44-13. B-CU's first battle was against Hampton as they trailed 10-7 at HT and 18-16 into the 4Q but pulled out the win. The next week they were outgained 389-196 vs Howard but scored 2 def td's and a ST td for the win. Their only reg season loss came in the finale as FAMU drove 53/1 pl and scored on a 3 yd td run with :28 left. In their playoff game vs NH their star QB was out (inj) and they got outscored 31-6 in the 2H. TY they are much more talented than their 12 ret starters but have a couple things working against them. They lose their OC Orlando, their star QB and benefitted from an incredible +27 in TO's LY. They do get SCSU and Hampton at home but it will be hard to duplicate LY's dream ssn.
