**QB's** - Jose Moehler (1181, 59%, 5-6) won the job in 2010 but after an injury Brock Jensen came in and he started gms 4-6. He was inj'd and originally thought to be OFY but unexpectedly returned and started the L/4 throwing for 950 (45%, 7-2) while adding 231 (3.4) rushing. Jensen took control LY starting all 15 despite being hampered by turf toe. He finished with 2,524 (67.2%, 14-4) adding 173 (2.4) rushing with 9 td's and set a school record with 142 passes w/out an int. Jensen returns and very few teams can say they have back a National Championship winner at QB.

RB's -The Bison have had a 1,000 yd rusher for NINE straight seasons. DJ McNorton was #2 in '09 with 282 (4.4). He took over in '10 and led with 1,559 (5.6) and 15 td's plus 433 (17.3) rec. While McNorton topped 1,000 again LY (1,020, 5.2, 13 td) he finishèd #2. Sam Ojuri who played as a true in '09 with 144 (4.5) and RS in 10, led with 1,105 (5.9) despite making only 1 start. McNorton departs but Ojuri returns and will be spelled by Derrick Lang (142, 3.5) who was the #3 RB LY. Also back is FB Andrew Grothmann (10 st) who deserves accolades for opening holes for the school's first pair of 1,000 yd rushers. We'll call the unit even with LY's and a tenth straight season is well within reach.

Rec's - In 2010 they ret'd 6 of their top 8 rec's incl their top 3. Warren Hol loway led with 698 (14.2) while RB McNorton was #2 and they were the only ones to return LY. Holloway again led and this time topped the century mark with 1,003 (13.0). Ryan Smith was #2 with 531 (12.1) while TE Matt Veldman finished #3 (331, 12.7) taking home 2nd tm MVFC honors. This season Smith is the only rec in the top 4 to return and while 3 others are back who made at least one start at WR LY none had over 100 yds rec. Losing a 3 year starter

who led in B2B2B seasons will be tough to replace. **0-Line**-The OL opened holes for 200+ ypg rushing from '07-'09. They lost 3 starters in '10 and the numbers fell to 174 ypg (4.5) but the shocking number was 34 sks (16 more than any of the L7Y). LY they only lost 1 starter and with a pair of 1,009 drushers you would have thought they bettered their numbers that the shocking have thought they bettered their numbers with the shocking have thought they bettered their numbers which is the shocking have thought they bettered their numbers. but with 15 games played they basically stayed the same at 173 ypg. They did however improve to 4.9 ypc and allowed a respectable 18 sks. This year they lose 2 multi-year starters incl a 1st tm AA RT Paul Cornick who signed a UFA contract with the NYJ and a 2nd tm MVFC LG.

**D-Line** - After losing 2 of their 4 starters in 2010 they allowed their worst rushing numbers (172 ypg, 4.6) since their move up to the FCS but did produce 38 sks. LY they lost 1 starter who was an AA DT. All 3 back made 14 st in 10 making it a veteran unit and they produced their best numbers since 2006 allowing 119 ypg (3.5) with 41 sks. TY they lose 1 starter but it was their sk leader Coulter Boyer (9 sk, 1st tm MVFC). They are set up well to fill the big

shoes as the 2 DE's split the spot making 7 and 8 sts respectively. NDSU lost their star into LY and now do so again so we'll call the unit equal.

LB's - What a difference 2 seasons can make. In'09 they lost 2 starters (#1 & #2 tkl'rs) and allowed 28.6 ppg their worst in FCS play. In '10 they lost 1 starter but ret'd their #1 and #2 tkl'rs and improved to allowing 18.2 ppg LY they lost one starter, (#10 tkl'r) but returned their #1 and #2 plus a LB who started 3 gms but was the #3 tklr.
The unit not only improved to 12.7 ppg but that led the
FCS thanks to only allowing a total of 27 points in their
4 playoff games. TY they lose their #1 and #2 tklr's so a sizeable drop off would not surprise.

**DB's-**The unit has clearly overachieved the last several years. They lost 2 starters in 2010 yet still finished #15 in pass eff D with a 12-18 ratio. They again lost 2 starters LY but with the very effective front 7 finished #16 in pass eff D with a 14-21 ratio. TY they only lose 1 starter and ret a 2nd tm MVFC SS and 1st tm AA CB Marcus Williams (7 int). Andre Martin made 24 st at CB at UNI and tran in after grad so they move Christian Dudzik to the open FS spot basically giving them 4 starters back.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Heading into LY the Bison lost their

AAP and top 2 KR's. Matt Voigtlander avg'd 41.0 with a 36.6 net compared to 42.6 and 39.2 in 10. Ryan Jastram was 14-23 (L/51) in '10 but improved by hitting 16-18 (L/53). The PR duties for both seasons were handled by Ryan Smith who avg'd 10.7 in '10 and 10.5 LY earning 2nd tm MVFC. The KR unit got a boost as '10's top man avg'd 22.7 while AA CB Marcus Williams would have led the FCS LY with more att's avg'd 34.2 and both main return men are back. A #5 finish in '10 was followed by a #2 finish LY but with having to replace both K's we expect

a decent drop in the rankings for this year. **COACHES -** HC Craig Bohl is entering his 10th year here and has produced 8 of 9 winning seasons, B2B playoff appearances and now a Nat'l Championship. Brent Vigen is in his 3rd yr as OC and in his 15th yr overall here as an asst. Chris Kweman is in his 2nd year here and after being the DB cch in 2011 he was promoted to DC this year.

**OVERVIEW** - The Bison came into '11 off of a confidence building 9-5 season in which they made their first ever FCS playoff appearance and won a pair of post-ssn games by 26 and 25 pts before falling to the eventual Nat'l Champis in OT. They came into LY ranked #11 and blewout a pair of overmatched foes by a combined 89 pts. They stood toe-to-toe vs Minnesota and 2 def td's by AC 6B Williams opened up the door for their 2nd str upset of the Gophers. They led ISU 14-3 and got a 14 pt swing with an 82 yd int ret td to secure the win. The next week a defensive battle ensued with NDSU needing a 50/7pl 4Q drive for the 9-3 win over #17 SIU and they led SDSU 38-7 before allowing a td with :04 left. It was #2 UNI vs #3 and the game turned in the 3Q as NDSU, leading 17-13 got a 3 yd fmbl rec td. Against #17 Ind St the bend but don't break Dg ot outgained for the 4th time in 6 games but again led 27-10 before allowing a 4Q td with 3:01 left. There was nothing fluky about getting upset by YSU as they were outgained 451-293 and lost the TOP battle 37:36-22:24. They clinched the MVFC Title taking out their frustrations on WIU as they led 37-7 into the 4Q. They got progressively better in the playoffs beating #17 James Madison by 12, shutting out #6 Lehigh 24-0 and were +3 in TO's against #3 GA Southern in a 28 pt win. NDSt won 5 DII Nat'l Championships with their last in 1990 and got their 1st FCS Nat'l Championship by holding Sam Houston St to 210 yards and 31 pts below their FCS leading scoring offense. This year they return 14 starters plus a 1,000 yd rusher but thanks to 9 def/ret td's the team that only outgained its foes by 30 ypg outscored them by 18.6 ppg.
