## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

**QUARTERBACKS** - Ryan Tannehill was the #1 WR in '08 but moved to QB and had a record setting '11 throwing for 3,744 (62%, 29-15, 306 rush). He was a #1DC and st'd for the Dolphins as a rookie. In '12 it was a 3-man battle between soph Jameill Showers (PS#41, strongest arm, 5 att '11), soph Matt Joeckel (PS#53) and the athletic rF Johnny Manziel (PS#26). Despite Showers being #1 out of spring, I proj'd Manziel as the st'r and he had a storybook season. He was the first frosh QB to start an opener here s'44 and had an SEC record of 557 tll yds vs Ark. then reset the record with 576 vs LT (395 pass, 181 rush). "Johnny Football" broke the NCAA frosh QB rushing record (Brad Smith Mizzou '02) and set the SEC and NCAA frosh record for tll yds (5116, #1 NCAA ypg). Manziel threw for 3,706 (68%, 26-9) and was the #1 rusher (1410, 7.0, 21 td) becoming the first frosh ever to take home the Heisman. LY Manziel had another fantastic year throwing for 4,114 (37-13, #1 rush w/759) and he reset his own schl record by comp 69.9% (#1 SEC, min 300 att's). In 2 brief years, he set an A&M career record for tll yds (NCAA soph rec) with 9,989. Joeckel threw for 293 (59.5%, 2-0, 0 rush, 5 gm) and true frosh Kenny Hill (PS#26) played in 4 (16-22-183-1-0, 37 rush). Hill had 74 yds vs SHSt and comb w/Manziel's 426 they set a schl record w/500 pass yds. Hill's first play was a 38 yd pass. Joeckel transferred in April. I project true frosh Kyle Allen (PS#1, IFS) for the starting job. While they should put up good numbers, I doubt they will be anywhere near as impactful as Manziel (#1DC CLE) was.

**RUNNING BACKS** - A&M has had just two 1,000 yd RB rushers s'99 (for three 1,000 yd ssn's). LY they ret'd their top RB's from '12 in Ben Malena (808, 5.9) and Trey Williams (PS#4, 376, 5.8, true rush). They also added in Okla transfer Brandon Williams (PS#5) and Oregon transfer Tra Carson (PS#64). Malena led the RB's in rushing in each of the first 4, Trey Williams did so in 3 of the next 4, but the top effort all season was just 83 by Trey vs Ark. Manziel was the #1 rusher. Malena was #2 w/551 (4.8, 190 rec), Trey Williams was #3 (407, 7.0, 54 rec), Carson #4 (329, 5.3) and Brandon Williams had just 269 (6.1). Not in the PSL are Brice Dolezal (5'9" 175 Jr, 79, 3.8) and James White (6'0" 218 rF, PS#42). TY they lose Malena but without Manziel and with plenty of talent available, I look for increased production from the Aggies' RB's.

**RECEIVERS** - In '12 A&M ret'd 2nd Tm B12 Ryan Swope (schl rec 1207, 13.6 '11) but it was 65" rF Mike Evans who became Manziel's favorite target. He led w/1,105 (13.5) while Swope's numbers dipped to 913 (12.7). LY they had to replace 3 of their top 4 (comb 1737, 13.6). Evans had a phenomenal gm

vs Bama with a schl record 279 then reset the record w/287 (4 td) vs Auburn. He avg'd 146 ypg and 23.8 ypc the first 7 but only 62 ypg and 14.2 ypc the L/6 finishing with a schl record 1,394 (20.2). Derel Walker (PS#50JC) was #2 (818, 16.0). Malcolm Kennedy finished #3 w/658 (11.0) and former walk-on Travis Labhart had 626 (12.3). True frosh Ricky Seals-Jones (PS#1) was OFY after 2 gms (3 rec, 28.0). At 6'5" 225 lbs, he should have a big '14. TY they lose 1st Tm AA Evans (13 st, #1DC TB), Walker (13 st), Labhart (6 st), LeKendrick Williams, (2 rec, 27.0), Gaston Lamascus (1 rec), Ja'Quay Williams (10 gm, 4 rec, trans) and TE Nehemiah Hicks (1 st, 2 rec). While they again lose 3 of their top 4, this time those 3 comb for 2,838 (16.6) so the unit looks weaker.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In '11 A&M had 9 of the top 10 back (86 car st). They improved to 199 ypg rush (5.1, #4 FBS w/9 sk). In '12 they had to replace a 2Y st'g G but had 4 st'rs back incl their OT combo of Luke Joeckel & Jake Matthews. I billed them as the SEC's #2 OL (95 car st). The "Maroon Goons" had 418 tll yds vs Bama and improved their numbers to 242 (5.9) but all'd 23 sks (4.7%). Having a 1,410 yd QB rusher helped and no starts were lost to inj. LY they had to replace a 4Y C and 1st Tm AA LT Joeckel (3Y st'r, #1DC), 2nd Tm AA Matthews moved to LT and RG Cedric Ogbuehi (NFL caliber) slid to RT as they had 73 car sts back. The Aggies dropped to 185 (5.2) as they ran the ball 68 less times (Manziel dropped to 759 rush yds). They allowed 21 sks (4.3%). TY they lose 1st Tm AA Matthews (#1DC ATL, 13 st, 4Y st'r) and bkp Shep Klinke (0 st). The car sts jump to 89 and despite losing a #1DC, this unit looks even stronger.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '11 A&M had 1 st'r back but allowed just 102 ypg rush (2.6) and led the NCAA with 51 sks. In '12 they had to replace 2nd & 3rd Tm B12 DT's and switched to a 4-3. 3rd Tm B12 LB Damontre Moore moved to DE. With the loss of a couple of 300 lb DT's, I expected the rush ypg to go up and the sks to decrease and that they did (140 ypg, 3.7, 31 sk). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm AA DE in Moore (#3DC, 12.5 sk), their NG (7.5 tfl) and a bkp (23 tkl). Kirby Ennis (11 st '12) was OFY after 4. They had planned on bringing along Isaiah Golden and Hardreck Walker slowly behind Ennis but Golden ended up starting 7. With the rotation incl 5 frosh and 2 soph, A&M all'd 222 ypg (5.4, 21 sk). TY the only loss is Ennis (4 st, 6 tkl). They should have one of the more improved D-line's in the country.

**LINEBACKERS** - LY A&M had to replace its #2 and #5 (#4DC) tkl'rs. They ret'd their #3 & #12 tkl'rs but were less exp'd. Steven Jenkins (61 tkl '11, 10 st, 79 tkl '12) was the #1 tkl' despite missing the first 2. True frosh Darian Claiborne was #1 among SEC frosh in tkl's (89, 7 tfl). TY they lose Jenkins, NB Toney Hurd (8 st, #5 tkl'r) and Nate Askew (2 st, 38 tkl). Claiborne (9 st, #3 tkl'r) was susp in the spring but has been reinstated. They can only improve upon the 32.2 ppg they allowed.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - In '12 A&M had to replace 4 DB's who comb'd for 110 car sts. I still said the less exp'd group would allow less ypg because they were leaving the then-pass happy Big 12 and they improved to #43 (58%, 17-12, 25 ypg less). LY they lost their FS (#6 tkl'r), a CB (#9 tkl'r) and 2 bkps. They did have 5 back who comb for 34 sts (like 2.5 st'rs ret) so they were far more exp'd (0 st'rs '12). Unlike '12, their front 7 was also in exp'd, so they slipped in my PD to #86 (57.3%, 31-17). TY they lose CB Tramain Jacobs (7 st, 33 tkl, 9 pd). This is their most exp'd secondary in years and they should have one of the most improved PDR's in the country.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - A&M is famous for their "12th Man" on the ST unit and has had 5 Top 10 finishes s'95. In '11 I called for the best finish in former HC Mike Sherman's 4Y

and they accomplished that (#8). Dustin Harris was #1 in the FBS in PR (18.6) and Randy Bullock won the Groza Award (29-33 fg's, car pts leader here). Sumlin's ST units at UH were #60, #29, #60 & #38. In his first year here they had to replace their P (39.8 net!) and Harris (432, 12.7). Taylor Bertolet hit 13-22 fg's (L54) in '12 but missed 7 xps. He had 65 TB on 103 KO. The Aggies finished #38 and LY Bertolet missed 3 more xp's early. Josh Lambo missed his first xp att but hit his last 50. He hit 8-10 fg's (L45). New P Drew Kaser avg 47.4 (net 39.4)

and was a finalist for the Ray Guy Award. A&M was -3.4 on PR's. Soph Trey Williams was the top KR (706, 25.2). A&M moved up to #22 and TY, with the entire unit back, will be one of the nation's top ST units.

**COACHES** - Kevin Sumlin was SEC COY his first ssn and his 20 wins in the first 2Y here is a schl record. He was the Houston HC for 4Y piloting my MIT in '11 to a 13-1 record. Prior to that Sumlin was co-OC at Okla ('06-'07) and was the OC here in '02. Jake Spavital is his 2nd year as OC (WV QB cch '11 & '12) and had stints at Okla St ('10) and Houston ('09). The DC in his 3rd season is former Marshall HC ('05-'09) Mark Snyder who spent '10-'11 as USF's DC.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

In '11 A&M could have been much better than their 7-6 final record as the story of the season was blown DD 2H leads. They led Okla St 20-3, Ark 35-17, Mizzou 28-17 and Texas 16-7 at the half but lost them all. I noted in '12 that Kevin Sumlin was taking over a team that could easily have been 12-1 in '11. Even though they were a less exp'd team with 13 ret st'rs (18 in '11) and moving up to the SEC, A&M fared better than anyone expected. Johnny Manziel had a spectacular season, won the Heisman, guided A&M to an upset of #1 Bama on the road and a 41-13 bowl win finishing 11-2 and #5. Their +153.4 ypg was #2 in the SEC and they avoided the big 3 out of the SEC East in '13. They did come up -3.0 in my Stock Market Indicator as well as on the ypg chart (pg 25) plus ret'd just 11 st'rs. The offense posted similar numbers at 44.2 ppg but the in exp'd and banged up D did them in (21.8 ppg to 32.2). They put up an amazing 628 yds vs Alabama's D and had a 14-0 lead but eventually trailed 42-21 before getting a td (which made Aggies fans happy) with :15 left to lose by 7. After a couple of expected wins, they went to the wire vs Ole Miss getting a td w/3:07 left to tie it and a 33 yd fg on the final play for the win. Auburn got a td w/1:19 left to take the lead. A&M got to the AU18 but Manziel was sk'd on 2 of the final 3 plays. They blew out their next 3 (Miss St 2 late td's only lose by 10) but then went to Death Valley, a place Les Miles says dreams come to die. That's where Manziel's repeat Heisman hopes went out the window (16-41-224). A&M had a streak of 13 str games of 40+ pts end vs an LSU D that had been allowing 27 ppg in SEC play (lost 34-10). MO needed the win to wrap up the SEC East and held Manziel to 195 pass and 21 rush but it was tied in the 4Q when the Tigers got a 57 yd td run with 3:34 left. In the bowl, they trailed Duke 38-17 at half and did not take their first lead until a 55 yd IR td with 3:33 left (outgained 661-541). They finished 9-4 and #18. TY the biggest questions are who will replace 1st Rnd DC's Manziel, WR Evans and LT Matthews? They do have 14 ret st'rs and figure to have a much improved D. They draw MO and SCar out of the East and were just +15.0 ypg (6th best) in SEC play. I don't see them matching '13's 9 win total but a stronger D should have them getting close.

First meeting. Both schools will be breaking in new QB's after losing All-SEC Johnny Manziel & Connor Shaw. Aggies are 4-7 in road/neutral openers but have won B2B gms by 45 & 12 pts.

First meeting. A&M is 24-2 in home openers (losses in '08 vs Ark St & '12 vs #24 UF). LU had no FB program from 1990-'09, since then Cardinals are 0-4 vs FBS tms (avg loss by 40 ppg).

Schools played annually from 1920-'95 as SWC members with A&M winning the L/16. LY QB Manziel DN start and A&M trailed 14-7 into the 2Q but up 7 at HT scored 24 of the 2H's first 31 pts.

The Aggies are 2-0 in SEC play. LTH both tms came in ranked, A&M won 38-13. #16 A&M led 31-0 w/12:40 left 3Q outgaining #17 MSU 466-89! Into '14, the Aggies are 6-2 on the SEC road.

A&M is 6-0 vs Ole Miss but the SEC gms have both been decided by 3 pts. LY A&M trailed 38-31 w/6:05 left. After a td they forced a 3&out and went 56/7pl hitting a GW 33 yd fg as time exp'd.

Visitor is 3-0. LTH A&M pulled the upset over #1 Bama. A&M never trailed & led 20-0 into the 2Q. Clinging to a 5 pt lead A&M had UA in a 4&gl from their 2 but got an int in the EZ w/1:36 left.

**Bonus:** Into 2014 HC Sumlin is 32-7 (L2Y here & '11 Hou) with all losses coming vs ranked foes.

A&M is 2-0 incl a 54-14 win in the last game ('07). Aggies led 41-7 into the 4Q & had a 547-348 yd edge. A&M is 12-2 vs current Sun Belt opponents (lost to ASU in '08 & ULL in '06).

Visitor has won both SEC meetings. LTH A&M led 28-0 and 49-7 early 3Q. A&M racked up 671 yds (34 FD's) which was the most yds ever allowed by Auburn (A&M 8 td drives of 58+ yds).

LY's gm was tied 3x's. At 21-21 A&M all'd a 66/3pl drive w/3:34 left. After a punt, MU ran out L/2:01.

**LSU:** A&M has dropped 3 str (L/win in '95). LY A&M trailed 14-0 & never got closer than 11 pts. The 299 offensive yds was a ssn low and the least s/'09 (226 vs OU). A&M is 5-9 in home finales but 3-1 the L4Y.
